AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

METROPOLITAN FIRE BRIGADES BOARD.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Metropolitan Fire Brigades Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that on the request of the council of any municipal district and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, declare that any such municipal district, or any portion thereof, shall be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District, and that thereupon such municipal district, or portion thereof, shall for the purpose of the said Act, be included in and

form part of such fire district: And whereas the Council of the municipal district of the Shire of Whittlesea has requested that a portion of such district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board that it is desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Whittlesea comprised within the boundaries set forth hereunder shall, from the first day of September in the year One thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine be added to and form part of the Metropolitan Fire District, viz.:—

Commencing at a point on the boundary of the metropolitan fire district at the intersection of Hume Highway and Somerton-road (also known as Bons-lane) thence generally northerly by the said highway to a point 1,159 feet 9 inches north of Cemetery-road thence by a line due east to the Merri Creek thence generally southerly along such creek to Cooper-street thence westerly by Cooper-street to the Hume Highway thence generally northerly along such highway to the point of commencement.

NEERIM SOUTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE PERIOD 10TH AUGUST, 1959, TO 31ST DECEMBER, 1959.

THE Neerim South Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Three shillings and six pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuations of lands and tenements to be rated within the Neerim South Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than on land on which there is no building) be less than Six pounds fifteen shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Two pounds ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the period from the 10th day of August, 1959, to the 31st day of December, 1959, both days inclusive, and shall be payable on the 14th day of August, 1959, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in the period without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and nine pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said period.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and nine pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

YALLOURN NORTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW 1959.

THE Yallourn North Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Yallourn North Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Five pounds six shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Two pounds ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing 1st January, 1959, and ending the last day of December, 1959, and shall be payable on the 1st day of September, 1959, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

RATING BY-LAW No. 2.






SHIRE OF BROADMEADOWS PLANNING SCHEME 1949 REVOCATION SCHEDULE — PLAN A




SHIRE OF BROADMEADOWS PLANNING SCHEME 1949 REVOCATION SCHEDULE — PLAN B







AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act* 1958 and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby further amend the Country Fire Authority Compensation Regulations as follows (that is to say):—

After clause 8 the following clause shall be inserted:—

“8A. (1) If an injury by accident in respect of which compensation is payable under these Regulations is caused under circumstances which create a legal liability in some person other than the Authority to pay damages in respect of the injury—

- (a) if the volunteer officer or fireman to whom the injury is caused has before being awarded damages received the whole or part of the compensation to which he is entitled under these Regulations, he shall on receiving the damages awarded to him repay to the Authority such amount of the compensation received as does not exceed the amount of the damages received and, if he has received part only of the compensation to which he is, apart from the provisions of this Regulation, entitled, shall not be entitled to receive any further compensation under these Regulations unless he pays to the Authority the whole amount of the damages so received;
- (b) if the volunteer officer or fireman to whom such injury has been caused has not received compensation under these Regulations before being awarded damages he shall be entitled to receive only such part of the compensation to which he would apart from the provisions of this Regulation be entitled as exceeds the amount of the damages received.

(2) If an injury by accident in respect of which compensation is payable under these Regulations is caused under circumstances which create a legal liability in the Authority to pay damages in respect of the injury the volunteer officer or fireman who recovers damages from the Authority in respect of the injury shall not be entitled to receive compensation under these Regulations in respect of the same injury and any sum received by him under these Regulations in respect of such injury prior to the award of damages shall be deducted from the amount of damages recoverable from the Authority.

(3) For the purposes of this Regulation payments made by the Authority in respect of medical, hospital, nursing and ambulance services shall be deemed to have been received by the volunteer officer or fireman to whom such services were rendered.

(4) In this Regulation the references to the volunteer officer or fireman to whom the injury is caused shall, when the volunteer officer or fireman is dead, include a reference to his legal personal representative and to his wife family or dependants to whom compensation is payable under these Regulations.”
