



### LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTS.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 928 (2) of the Local Government Act 1958 provides—inter alia—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of any

municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas by Proclamations published in the Government Gazettes of the 4th November, 1946, and 1st March, 1950, the operation of the Uniform Building Regulations was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Tullaroop:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Tullaroop has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to those parts of the municipal district to which the operation of the Regulations has not previously been

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council toria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the \*Local Government Act 1958 to those parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Tullaroop to which the operation of the Regulations has not previously been extended and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned parts of the municipal district thereof on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 7th January, 1960, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Councils of the said municipalities to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further, that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 7th January, 1960.

#### FREE PLACES AT THE UNIVERSITY.

A PPLICATIONS are invited from persons (other than teachers) in the employment of the Government of Victoria for Free Places at the University of Melbourne to be awarded from the beginning of 1960.

A Free Place will not be awarded to an officer whose own department provides similar facilities for University education, by way of some training scheme or the like for which he is eligible to apply.

Consideration will be given to age, suitability, qualifica-tions, period of service of the applicant and a report and recommendation of his permanent departmental head and, if necessary, a personal interview with the Selection Committee.

Applicants must satisfy the following requirements:-

- (a) They must be in the permanent service of the Government of Victoria.
- (b) They must have matriculated. (Candidates for the Matriculation examination this year may, however, apply.)

Free Places are tenable for the full length of an approved course for any degree, diploma or licence. A successful applicant will be granted such leave of absence on fully pay as may be prescribed to enable him to attend essential lectures, practical and other work, and examinations. He will be admitted, without fees, to all lectures and examinations of his course. lectures and examinations of his course.

The holder of a Free Place will be required to enter into an agreement that he will remain in the service of the Government of Victoria for five years after the termination of his Free Place.

Applications must be submitted to the Permanent Head of the department in which the applicant is employed at least one week before the closing date, the 25th November, 1959. #### RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Act 1958 and all other powers hereunto enabling, the following amendments to Chapter 1 of the Rules of the Supreme Court are made:—

- 1. In Rule 1 of Order XI .-
  - (a) for paragraph (e) there shall be substituted the following paragraphs:—
    - "(e) the action is one brought to enforce rescind dissolve annul or otherwise affect a contract or to recover damages or other relief for or in respect of the breach of a contract—
      - (i) made within the jurisdiction;
      - (ii) made by or through an agent trading or residing within the jurisdiction on behalf of a principal trading or residing outside the jurisdiction; or
      - (iii) which is governed by the law of Victoria;
    - (ea) the action is brought in respect of a breach committed within the jurisdiction of a contract wherever made even though that breach was preceded or accompanied by a breach outside the jurisdiction which rendered impossible the performance of the part of the contract which ought to have been performed within the jurisdiction:
    - (eb) the action is founded on a tort committed within the jurisdiction;".
  - (b) at the end of paragraph (h) there shall be inserted the following paragraph:—
    - "(i) the action is brought under the Civil Aviation (Carriers' Liability) Act 1959 of the Commonwealth of Australia or under any corresponding previous enactment."
- 2. At the end of Rule 1 of Order XI, there shall be inserted the following Rule:—
  - "1A. (1) Where the parties to a contract upon which an action is brought have agreed---
    - (a) that the Court shall have jurisdiction to entertain an action in respect of that contract;
    - (b) that service of a writ of summons or notice of a writ of summons in that action may be effected at a place within or outside the jurisdiction on a party, or on a person on behalf of a party, or in any other manner—

service effected in accordance with the agreement shall be deemed to be good and effective service.

(2) Where the parties have agreed that the Court shall have jurisdiction to entertain an action in respect of the contract but no such agreement as to the manner of service has been made, service outside the jurisdiction of the writ or notice of the writ may be ordered."

# FERN TREE GULLY DISTRICT PLANNING SCHEME. INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Act 1958 and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Town and Country Planning Board (hereinafter referred to as the responsible authority) having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme in accordance with the said Act on the 23rd day of September, 1959, hereby makes this Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining and prohibiting the use or development of land and the erection, construction or carrying out of any buildings or works, that is to say:

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE MARNOO PUBLIC HALL RESERVE.

RESERVE.

- 3. No person shall enter or remain in any portion of the Reserve or in any building thereon who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.
- 4. No person shall interfere with, damage or destroy the vegetation or any buildings in the Reserve nor throw stones or other missiles, nor light fires, except in fireplaces specially provided by the Committee, nor deposit litter or refuse of any kind therein.
- 5. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals nor permit the same to enter, without the permission of the Committee being first obtained, otherwise the same may be impounded by the Committee.
- 6. No person shall erect any tent, booth or other structure nor offer any article for sale or hire in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee being first obtained.
- 7. No person shall use, or cause to be used any structure, tent, caravan, or any vehicle of any description in the Reserve for camping or living therein.
- 8. No person shall have use of the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee being first obtained. Such permission shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld but shall be subject to such conditions as the Committee may consider reasonable.
- 9. Persons renting or hiring the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure in the Reserve may be required to deposit any sum of money which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure, and the Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any loss, damage or injury sustained by the Hall or any stand, erection or enclosure, or anything

contained therein, during such renting or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss, damage or injury from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all such persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.—(Rs.7830.)



  - (a) the regulating of the keeping of any animals (including birds) and the regulating or pro-hibiting of the keeping of any place, or the storage of any things, which in the opinion of the Council, may be offensive, injurious to health or dangerous;

- (b) fixing the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal, or to store any such thing;
- (c) fixing the limits within which it shall be unlawful to keep swine or pigsties; and
- (d) the suppression of nuisances

In pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act Act 1958 and any, other power enabling them in that behalf, the Councill of the Shire of Healesville, in the name of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

- 1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and operate throughout the whole of the Shire of Healesville, but shall not extend to such parts of any premises (if any) registered with the Council as poultry killing and/or poultry sale-yards and exempted in writing by the Council. Any person may continue to operate a commercial poultry farm established before the coming into operation of this By-law or may establish a commercial poultry farm, provided the Council consents thereto in writing with or without such conditions as the Council may, think fit, and provided still further that the person applying for such consent shall further that the person applying for such consent shall-
  - (i) make application in writing to the Council;
  - (ii) with the application supply plans and specifications and particulars of all structures erected or to be erected on the land, the subject-matter of the application; and
  - (iii) supply such further or other information and do such further acts or things as the Council requires.
- 3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-
  - "Animal" means and includes cow, bull, bullock, horse or mare, goat, swine or pig, sheep, and the young thereof;
  - 'Bird" means and includes bird of either sex and the young thereof;
  - "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Healesville:

  - "Dog" means and includes a dog of either sex over the age of six months;
    "Pen", "shed" or "structure" means and includes any building, erection, enclosed run used or intended to be used for the purpose of confining, protecting or sheltering any animal or bird;
    "Poultry" means and includes any fowl, turkey, goose, duck, pigeon, squab, and any class of bird.
  - " Poultry "
- 4. No person shall cause, permit or suffer any pen, shed or structure used for the keeping of any animal, dog or bird, to be other than in a clean, wholesome and sanitary state and condition, and in a state of good repair.
- 5. No person shall cause, permit, or suffer any animal or poultry, to remain or wander other than within the confines of approved pens, sheds or structures.
- 6. Every, pen, shed or structure, in which live poultry are kept, shall be constructed of galvanized iron, or fibro-cement sheets, or such other material as might from time to time be approved by the Council with such wire netting as shall be necessary, and shall be roofed with galvanized iron sheets or such other approved material, and shall be paved with concrete and the surface level of the floor shall be at least 3 inches above the level of the surrounding ground.
- 7. No person shall keep any poultry in any pen, shed, structure, unless the same shall be rendered ratproof.
- 8. No person shall construct, use, or maintain any fowl-run, unless the same shall be securely enclosed with wire netting to the approval of the Council.
- 9. No person shall keep or allow to be kept any animal on any land having an area of less than 1 acre, without the consent in writing of the Council.
- 10. The occupier of any land or premises on which is erected any structure for the keeping, housing or sheltering of any animal shall—
  - (a) cause all manure, refuse and rubbish produced or accumulated therein to be placed temporarily in a properly constructed fly and vermin-proof receptacle of impervious walls, together with an impervious floor, and shall—

(i) maintain such receptacle in a good state
i of repair so as to prevent the escape
or leakage of the contents;

- (ii) keep such receptacle covered constantly and from time to time as may be required by the Council effectively deodorize the contents thereof or such receptacle;;
- (iii) cause the contents of such receptacle to be removed and disposed of to the satisfaction of the Council at least once in every week and/or at such other times as may be directed by the Council; provided that any manure accumulated on any premises may be kept on such premises if to be used on such premises, conditionally that the manure be kept on as not to create a manure be kept so as not to create a nuisance or be liable to be dangerous to health;
- (b) cause the floor of any such structure to be paved with concrete or other approved impervious material, and properly graded and drained to an approved silt-trap and outlet;
- (c) keep such structure in a state of good repair and in a clean and sanitary condition;
- (d) not keep or allow to be kept or erect or allow the erection of any structure, or any part thereof, or keep or allow to be kept any animal or bird within any structure-
  - (i) within 50 feet of the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage;
  - (ii) less than 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet;
  - (iii) less than 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet;
  - (iv) less than 5 feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
  - (v) less than 30 feet from any dwelling, whether on the same or adjoining land;
  - (vi) so as to be a nuisance or dangerous to health or offensive.
- 11. No stable loose-box shelter, pen or shed, nor any part thereof, shall be erected or placed in any premises, unless a plan and description thereof is first submitted to and approved by the Council in writing.
- 12. Any swine kept on any premises shall be kept not less than 100 feet from any dwelling and under such conditions as are in full compliance with the provisions of the Health Act and Offensive Trades Regulations relating to the maintenance and construction of piggeries, and the keeping of swine or any amendments thereof.
- 13. If any pen, shed or structure be erected on any premises contrary to the provisions of this By-law, or any structure be not maintained in compliance with the provions of this By-law, the Council may, in writing, order the removal of such structure, and if any structure be not removed within a specified number of days, not less than seven days, from the date of such order, the Council may, if it sees fit, remove such structure at the expense of the owner or occupier of the premises and recover the cost from such person before any justice, in addition to any penalty or penalties for any default or act contrary to this By-law.
- 14. Where any animal or bird is kept on any premises where the consent in writing of the Council is required, the Council may grant such consent under such conditions as it thinks fit and such consent may be cancelled at any time, but shall not be granted for any period longer than twelve months, or the Council may refuse to grant or renew such consent as it thinks fit so to do.
- 15. Where any animal or bird is kept on any premises where the consent in writing of the Council is required under this By-law, the Council may grant such consent under such conditions as it thinks fit, and such permit shall be subject to revocation by the Council at any time.
