#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1958 to such parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Otway as are described hereunder, and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the aforementioned parts of the municipal district thereof on publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 7th January, 1960, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided further, that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 7th January, 1960:

#### Hairdressers Registration Act 1958.

#### HAIRDRESSERS REGISTRATION REGULATIONS 1959.

THE Hairdressers Registration Board of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Hairdressers Registration Board of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the Hairdressers Registration Act 1958 (No. 6267) as amended, doth hereby make the Regulations following, that is to say:-

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1959, and shall be read and construed as one with the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937 and all Regulations amending the same.
- 2. Regulation 5 of the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937, is hereby repealed and the following Regulation is substituted therefor:
  - "5. The fees to be paid to the members of the Board shall be as follows:-

The Chairman—£300 per annum payable monthly.

Other members-Four pounds four shillings (£4 4s.) for attendance at any one meeting, payment not to exceed One hundred and five pounds (£105) per annum."

- 3. (i) Regulation 32 of the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937 and Regulation 14 of the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1940, are hereby repealed.
- (ii) After Regulation 31 of the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937, there shall be inserted the following Regulation:—
  - "32. (1) When any school is sold or transferred, or a change of ownership takes place, the former owner or occupier and the transferee shall immediately notify the Board, giving the name and particulars of the transferee and the date of the transfer.
  - (2) The owner or occupier of every school shall keep or cause to be kept a register of daily attendance of students and shall at the beginning of each month submit to the Board a return in the prescribed form certified by him as correct setting out the attendance of each student during the preceding
  - (3) Any Inspector of the Board may at any time during the ordinary teaching hours of a school require production of such register for examination and for the purpose of making copies of entries therein.
  - (4) No person shall be registered or continue to be registered as the owner or occupier of a school if he or she is at the same time directly or indirectly concerned or interested in the conduct of a hairdressers shop.
  - (5) No person shall be or continue to be the owner or occupier of a school unless he or she is registered as a teacher under the Act or unless a principal nominated, pursuant to sub-clause 6 hereof is at all times in charge of the conduct of the school.
  - (6) At any school in respect of which the owner or occupier is not registered as a teacher, it shall be lawful for him or her to nominate a principal in respect of such school by notifying the Board in writing of such nomination setting out the full name and address of the principal. Such principal shall be present and in control of the conduct of the school at all times during which the same is being carried on and shall be responsible for compliance with all the provisions of the Act and these Regulations relating to the conduct of the school. If the principal so nominated ceases to act as such the owner or occupier shall within seven days thereafter notify the Board of the fact.
  - (7) No person other than a teacher registered under the Act shall teach any student or class of students. The owner or occupier of any school shall not permit any student or class of students to be taught other than under the immediate supervision of a teacher so registered.
  - (8) Should, because of illness or other unavoidable cause, no teacher registered under the Act be in attendance at any school the owner or occupier thereof shall be entitled to close the school for a period or periods not exceeding one month in any one year and in such event he shall provide each student without further charge with an additional period of tuition equal to the period during which the school has been so closed.
  - (9) The owner or occupier of a school shall provide not less than one teacher for each twenty full-time students.
  - (10) No person shall teach or give experience in hairdressing to any student other than in a school.
  - (11) No person shall employ a student whether for reward or otherwise in a hairdressing shop.
    - (12) The Board may:
      - (a) inspect any school from time to time;
      - (b) from time to time require the owner or occupier of any school to submit to it a plan of the school and the owner or occupier shall submit the same accordingly;

- (c) by Resolution from time to time fix or vary the maximum number of students permitted to be taught in any school. The owner or occupier shall not at any time permit a greater number of students than the said maximum number then so fixed to be taught in such school.
- (13) 'Student' in these Regulations shall mean a student at or of a school registered under the Act."

- (2) The owner or proprietor of every hairdressing business shall nominate a principal or principals (as the case may require) in respect of each premises in which such owner or proprietor carries on business, and shall notify the Hairdressers Registration Board of such nomination in the form prescribed in Clause 2 of the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1955 (No. 2) setting forth the full name and address of each principal so nominated.
- (3) If a principal so nominated ceases to act as principal, such owner or proprietor shall within seven days notify the Board of the fact and furnish it with the particulars required by these Regulations in respect of the principal appointed in his place.
- (4) This Regulation shall not apply in the case of a business of which the owner or proprietor thereof or one of the owners or proprietors thereof is during business hours in direct personal control as a principal and as a principal is registered in respect of the prescribed class or classes of hairdressing practised in connexion with the said business."
- 6. Part IX.—SUPPLEMENTARY—of the Hairdressers Registration Regulations 1937, is hereby repealed and the following Part is substituted therefor:—

#### "PART X.-GENERAL.

- 66. A printed copy of these Regulations shall be conspicuously displayed in every school and in every hairdresser's premises to which they or any of their provisions apply."





- 2. No owner or occupier of private property shall use any such property situate at the junction of streets or roads for the growing of trees, shrubs or hedges abutting on any such street or road or within 10 feet therefrom or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads.
- 3. (a) The Council may cause to be served on the owner or occupier of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads a notice in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk requiring such owner or occupier to remove or lop trees, shrubs or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the Local Government Act 1958) from or on private property so situate within the time limited in such notice, not being less than seven days from the service thereof, where such trees, shrubs or hedges abut on or are within 10 feet of such street or road or within a distance of 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads.
- (b) If any such owner or occupier shall refuse or neglect within the time limited in such notice to remove or lop trees, shrubs or hedges growing or being on private property so situate, the Council may by its officers, servants or agents at any time thereafter enter upon such land and remove therefrom such trees, shrubs or hedges so growing or being on such private property, and may recover the cost thereof in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
- 4. (a) The Council may cause to be served on the owner or occupier of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads a notice in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk requiring such owner or occupier to reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any portion of a fence within 30 feet of the junction of any streets or roads within the time limited in such notice, not being less than seven days from the service thereof.
- (b) If any such owner or occupier shall refuse or neglect within the time limited in such notice to reduce to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in, any portion of a fence so situate, the Council may by its officers, servants or agents at any time thereafter enter upon such land and reduce in height to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any portion of a fence so situate, and may recover the cost thereof in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
- 5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Broadmeadows.
