PUBLIC HIGHWAYS.—SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the lands hereinafter mentioned, which have been reserved for streets within the said Shire, be so declared to be public highways:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do, by this Proclamation declare that all those pieces of land reserved for streets and being described hereunder shall be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, namely:—

(a) *Gill-street.*

All that piece or parcel of land shown as a street on lodged plan of subdivision No. 44150 commencing at a point reached by lines bearing respectively North 89 deg. 33 min. West 110 ft. 10 in., South 0 deg. 35 min. West 692 feet from the North-east angle of Crown allotment 1 Township of Cranbourne, Parish of Cranbourne, County of Mornington, and thence bounded by lines bearing South 45 deg. 31 min. West 14 ft. 2 in., North 89 deg. 33 min. West 232 feet, North 44 deg. 29 min. West 14 ft. 1 in., South 0 deg. 35 min. West 70 feet, North 45 deg. 31 min. East 14 ft. 2 in., South 89 deg. 33 min. East 232 feet, South 44 deg. 29 min. East 14 ft. 1 in., North 0 deg. 35 min. East 70 feet to the commencing point.

(b) *McLaren-avenue.*

Land Act 1958.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

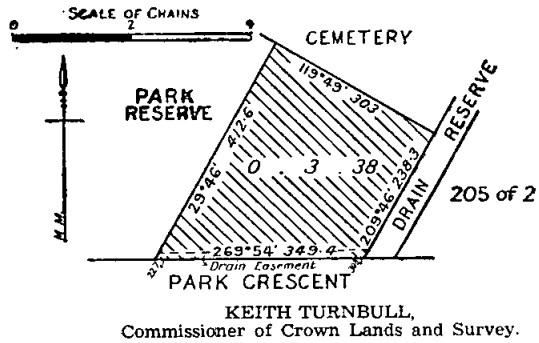

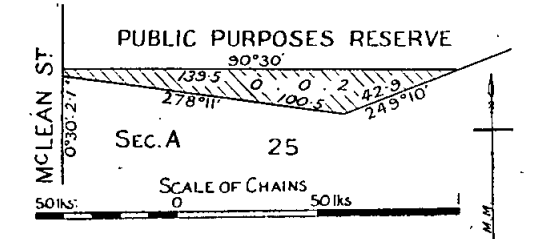

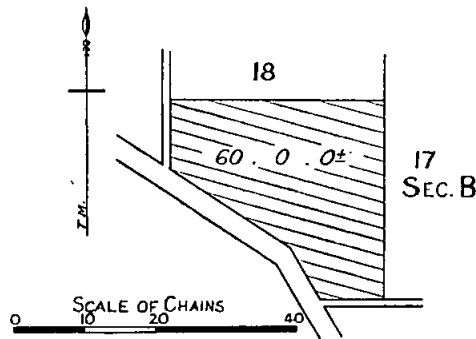

The owner of any private property upon any such part of which as is described in the preceding clause any trees or shrubs or hedges are growing to a greater height than 3 ft. 6 in. above the surface level of the street or road nearest to such trees or shrubs or hedges shall upon being given notice, in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk of the said Borough and within the time therein specified, remove or lop or cause to be removed or lopped all such trees or shrubs or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the *Local*

Government Act 1934) to such extent as may be necessary to bring such trees or shrubs or hedges into conformity with the requirements of the preceding clause thereof.

3. The owner of any private property situate at the junction of any street or road upon which private property there is a fence within 30 feet from the junction of the building alignment of such property along each of such streets or roads shall if such fence be of greater height than 3 ft. 6 in. upon notice, in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk of the said Borough and within the time therein specified clause to be reduced in height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. any portion of such fence within 30 feet of the junction of the said building alignments.

4. Where any owner or occupier of private property situate at the junction of streets or roads or within 30 feet from the junction of any streets or roads fails upon receipt of written demand from the Council to comply with any order given under the provisions of clauses 1, 2 or 3 of this By-law, the Council may at the expense of such owner or occupier—

(a) Remove or lop trees, shrubs or hedges growing or being on private property so situate which are not removed or lopped as required by or under this By-law.

(b) Reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under this By-law.

BY-LAW No. 36.

A By-law of the Shire of Korumburra, made under section 326 of the *Health Act 1958*, and numbered 36, for the regulation and management of the portion of the South Gippsland Meat Area situated within the municipal district of the said Shire as at present constituted, and for—

- (a) prescribing the conditions on which animals may be received into or supplied or removed from the abattoir therein situate;
- (b) fixing the rates of fees or dues payable to the Council of the said Shire, under Part XV. of the *Health Act 1958*;
- (c) prescribing the times for selling and for slaughtering animals and for selling carcasses or meat at the said abattoir;
- (d) the feeding, watering, and tending, and the preventing of cruelty to and overcrowding of animals in the said abattoir; and

- (e) stopping temporarily the manufacture of and the sale of smallgoods in the circumstances in which danger to the consumer is apprehended owing to uncleanness or to the presence of infection on or about the premises where such manufacture or sale is carried on.

IN exercise of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958* and of every and any other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Korumburra hereby order as follows:—

(1) In this By-law—

“The Council” means the Council of the Shire of Korumburra.

“The meat inspector” means the meat inspector appointed and/or provided by the Council for inspection and supervision of any abattoir in the meat area.

“The meat area” means the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Korumburra.

(2) This By-law shall apply to the meat area as defined in clause 1 hereof, and such area shall, as to the enforcement of the Meat Supervision Regulations therein, be under the direction of the meat inspector.

(3) This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

(4) The times for slaughtering animals in the meat area shall be between the hours of 6 o'clock a.m. and 5 o'clock p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays in each week. No animal shall be slaughtered in the meat area on Saturdays, Sundays, or gazetted holidays, unless with the consent in writing of the meat inspector, or Shire Secretary or other Shire officer appointed for that purpose, to whom at least 24 hours' notice of intention to slaughter on those days must be given. All expenses incurred by reason of such slaughtering on Saturdays, Sundays, or gazetted public holidays shall be paid by the person obtaining consent.

(5) No animal shall be slaughtered before it has been examined on the hoof in the meat area by the meat inspector on the days and within the times set out in clause 4 hereof.

(6) No animal visibly known to be affected by any contagious or infectious disease shall be received into any abattoir in the meat area, except with the express permission of the meat inspector.

(7) No person shall remove or permit to be removed from any abattoir in the meat area any carcass or part of a carcass of any animal slaughtered thereat until the same has been examined by the meat inspector and passed by him as fit for human food and branded by him with the regulation brand or rendered unfit for human consumption in the manner prescribed by the Meat Supervision Regulations.

(8) No sheep shall be removed from any abattoir in the meat area with the head attached.

(9) The fees payable to the Council for examining and branding carcasses, parts of carcasses, or meat by or under the direction of the meat inspector shall be as follows:—

In this By-law “bobby calf” means a calf not more than six weeks old.

In addition to these fees and the expenses referred to in clause 4 hereof, a fee of 10s. shall be paid by any person slaughtering animals on any Saturday, Sunday, or gazetted public holiday.

The said fee shall be paid by the proprietor of any abattoir carried on in the meat area to the Council, and shall be paid by the proprietor thereof to the Shire Secretary of the Shire of Korumburra at the office of the Council at Korumburra at least once in every month, and the amount of each such payment shall correspond with and be accompanied by a voucher from the meat inspector.

(10) The proprietor of any abattoir in the meat area shall not, nor shall any person having the management or control of any animal or animals in the abattoir—

- (a) suffer any cruelty to take place towards any animal at any time in the abattoir;
- (b) suffer animals to be overcrowded in the abattoir.

(11) If the meat inspector, the health inspector of the Council, or the Council's Medical Officer of Health shall at any time find a condition of uncleanness or the presence of infection on or about the premises within the meat area where the manufacture or sale of smallgoods is carried on in circumstances in which danger to the consumer of such smallgoods is apprehended by such inspector or officer, such inspector or officer may, by notice in writing under his hand directed to the proprietor of such premises, prohibit the manufacture thereat and/or the sale therefrom of smallgoods until such condition of uncleanness is rectified or such infection is removed, and any such notice may be served in the manner provided by section 425 of the *Health Act 1958*.

(12) Any person who shall by wilful act or default contravene any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

1. That By-laws numbered 28, 29, 31 and 32 of the Shire of Korumburra are hereby repealed.

Brick Areas.

2. The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as Brick Areas, and no person shall in any such area construct or cause to be constructed any building the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone or concrete.

Minimum Area, Depth, Width of Frontage, and Minimum Distance of Outer Walls from Boundaries.

3. The minimum area, depth, width of frontage, and minimum distance of outer walls from boundaries specified in column 3 of Table 804 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, width of frontage, and minimum distance of outer walls from boundaries for land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the area proclaimed as set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

4. (a) In any case where—

On the date of commencement of this By-law adopting column 3 of Table 804 which specifies a greater area, depth or width of frontage than those specified in column 5 thereof, any other land having less area, depth or width of frontage than specified in such column or By-laws (as the case may be)—

existed as a separate allotment and has not subsequent to such date been reduced in area, the Council may permit the construction of a building of Class 1 Occupancy on

such land, notwithstanding that such land has less area, depth or width of frontage than specified in the relevant column of Table 804, or in the By-laws (as the case may be) and may permit such building to be constructed nearer to any boundary than prescribed by Clauses 806 and 807.

(b) In any case where on the date the Regulations came into force in a municipality any land existed as a separate allotment and has not subsequently been reduced in area, the Council may permit the construction thereon of a building of Class III, V., VI., VII. or VIII. Occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV. Occupancy is attached, notwithstanding that such land has less area, depth or width of frontage than specified in Clause 809.

(c) For the purpose of this clause, land shall be deemed to have existed as a separate allotment—

- (i) if it was shown as a separate allotment on any plan of subdivision lodged in the Office of Titles; or
- (ii) if the Council is satisfied that on the relevant date such land existed as a separate allotment, whether by ownership, occupation, use or otherwise.

Rear Access.

5. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Such portions of the municipality as are included in the areas described hereunder, namely:—
