Refinery Pier.—Construction of Additional Berthing Head.

Position.—Fixed Red Light—Extremity Refinery Pier. Lat. 38 deg. 05 min. 28 sec. S., Long. 144 deg. 23 min. 24 sec. E. (Approx.).

Details.—A new berthing head is under construction commencing at a point 315 deg. distant 1,141 feet from the above position, proceeding in a 225 deg. direction for a distance of 506 feet, thence in a 150 deg. direction for 957 feet to its Seaward Extremity.

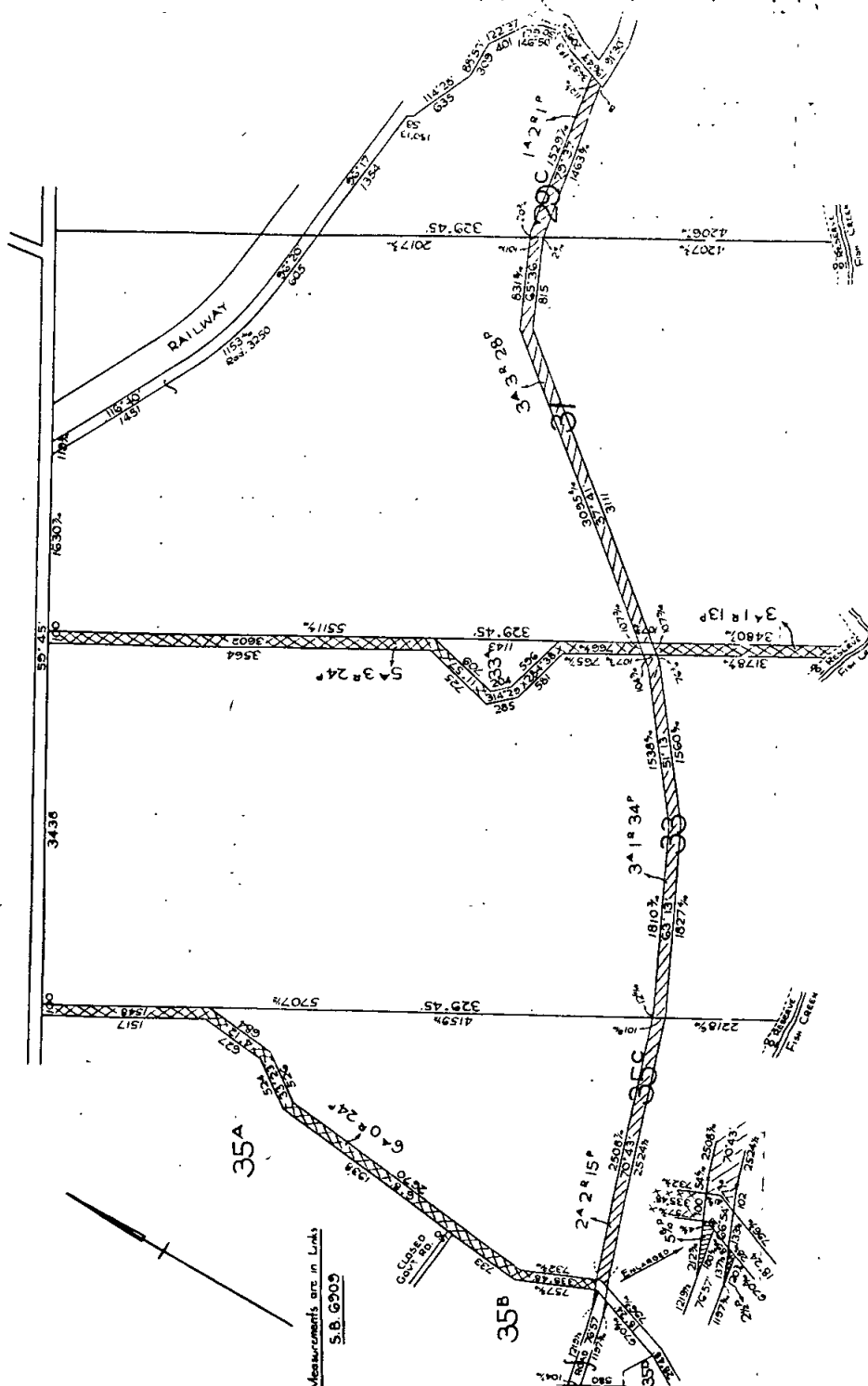

MINT REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers conferred by Royal Proclamation, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby order that the Regulations for the Receipt and Coinage of Gold at the Melbourne Branch of the Royal Mint dated 11th October, 1955, be revoked from and inclusive of 30th May, 1960, and that the following Regulations be made with effect from and inclusive of that date.

REGULATIONS FOR THE RECEIPT AND COINAGE OF GOLD AT THE MELBOURNE
BRANCH OF THE ROYAL MINT.

Gold can be deposited at the Mint, in small or large parcels, subject to the following charges, allowances, and conditions:—

Charges.

1. For a deposit containing 5,000 ounces gross or over, Four pence per ounce.
2. For a deposit containing 1,000 ounces gross or over and less than 5,000 ounces gross, Five pence per ounce.
3. For a deposit containing 950 ounces gross or over and less than 1,000 ounces gross, a charge of £20 16s.
4. For a deposit containing 900 ounces gross or over and less than 950 ounces gross, a charge of £20 3s.
5. For a deposit containing 850 ounces gross or over and less than 900 ounces gross, a charge of £19 11s.
6. For a deposit containing 800 ounces gross or over and less than 850 ounces gross, a charge of £18 18s.
7. For a deposit containing 750 ounces gross or over and less than 800 ounces gross, a charge of £18 5s.
8. For a deposit containing 700 ounces gross or over and less than 750 ounces gross, a charge of £17 12s.
9. For a deposit containing 650 ounces gross or over and less than 700 ounces gross, a charge of £17.
10. For a deposit containing 600 ounces gross or over and less than 650 ounces gross, a charge of £16 7s.
11. For a deposit containing 550 ounces gross or over and less than 600 ounces gross, a charge of £15 14s.
12. For a deposit containing 500 ounces gross or over and less than 550 ounces gross, a charge of £15 1s.
13. For a deposit containing 450 ounces gross or over and less than 500 ounces gross, a charge of £14 9s.
14. For a deposit containing 400 ounces gross or over and less than 450 ounces gross, a charge of £13 16s.
15. For a deposit containing 350 ounces gross or over and less than 400 ounces gross, a charge of £13 3s.
16. For a deposit containing 300 ounces gross or over and less than 350 ounces gross, a charge of £12 11s.
17. For a deposit containing less than 300 ounces gross, Ten pence per ounce, provided that—
the minimum charge for any one deposit shall be Twenty-one shillings.

The above charges will be made on the gross weight before melting.

18. If a deposit contains more than 2 per cent. of base metal, an extra charge, to be fixed by the Deputy Master, will be made for its extraction.

Provided that of these charges One penny per ounce standard shall be considered to be an assay and coinage charge.

Allowance.

Silver in a deposit will be allowed for, at a rate to be fixed periodically by the Deputy Master, as follows:—

In a deposit of less than 500 ounces gross—all silver in excess of 8 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

In a deposit of 500 ounces gross or over and less than 5,000 ounces gross—all silver in excess of 6 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

In a deposit of 5,000 ounces gross or over—all silver in excess of 5 per cent. of the weight of the deposit after melting.

Mode of Payment.

Deposits will be paid for by cheque and will be due for payment eight working days after the date of lodgment.

Payment can be obtained for gold deposits as soon as they have been assayed and valued by paying a discount charge, to be fixed from time to time by the Deputy Master, for the unexpired days.

N.B.—These arrangements respecting payment will be carried out as far as possible, but the Deputy Master cannot be held responsible for their absolute performance, and shall have power to postpone the date of payment.

Conditions.

1. Each parcel for which a separate assay is required shall be considered as a separate deposit: Provided always that the value of all deposits shall be determined upon the report of the Assay Department of this Branch of Her Majesty's Mint, which shall be final, and that the Deputy Master may refuse any deposit which he may deem unsuitable for treatment; and that it shall be in his discretion to make exceptional arrangements in cases in which he may consider it desirable to do so for the advantage of the Public Service.

2. The receiving office at the Mint will be open daily for the receipt and issue of bullion from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m., except on Saturdays and holidays.

NOTE.—Gold and silver bullion can be obtained at the Mint, to a limited extent, at such price as the Deputy Master may think proper to accept, but in no case shall the price for gold be below £3 17s. 10½d., the ounce standard.

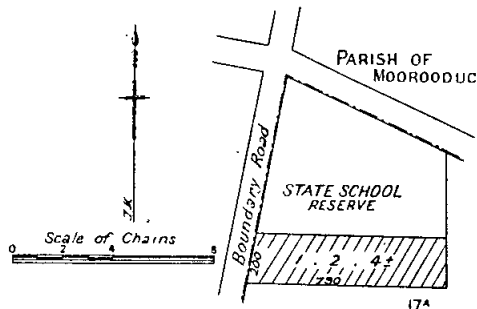

Minimum Area, Depth and Width of Frontage.
