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MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act* 1958, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulations:—

- 1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 8th August, 1956, approved by the Governor in Council on the 4th September, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th September, 1956, are hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Regulations".
 - 2. Regulation 168 of the Principal Regulations is amended as follows:-
 - (i) Section VI. is repealed and the following section VI. is substituted therefor:—

"SECTION VI.—GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR INSTALLATION AND OPERATION OF OIL PIPE-LINES.

- (1) The following provisions shall apply to pipe-lines and flexible oil hose for the transmission of liquids derived from petroleum coal and/or shale from the point of discharge from or intake of the vessel to or from the storage point or to any pipe-line for the transmission of liquids derived from petroleum coal and/or shale laid anywhere within the port.
- (2) The various directions and requirements in this section contained shall be read as addressed to the owner of the pipe-lines valves hoses or other appliances referred to except where specifically stated otherwise and except where specifically otherwise stated such owner shall be entirely and solely responsible for the full and complete observance thereof.

SUB-SECTION A.—CONSTRUCTION AND INSTALLATION.

- (a) Any proposals for the installation of new pipe-lines shall be submitted to the Commissioners together with all relevant details before installation commences and pipe-lines shall not be installed or put into use until approval thereof is given by the Commissioners.
- (b) When an existing pipe-line is to be relaid or renewed or any major repairs to be effected, such pipe-line or such section thereof as the Commissioners may determine shall be classified as a new pipe-line and shall conform to this section. Major repairs include any repairs or alterations involving welding.
- (c) Where the Commissioners are of the opinion that it is in the interests of public safety so to do they may by notice in writing given to the owner of a pipe-line require such owner to relay, renew or repair such pipe-line.
- (d) Pipe-lines, valves, flanges and fittings shall comply with the relevant requirements of British Standards, British Institute of Petroleum Safety Codes, American Petroleum Institute Specification for Line Pipe or other specification approved by the Commissioners.
- (e) Joints in pipe-lines shall be welded wherever practicable and otherwise shall be made with flanged ends or other means approved by the Commissioners.
- (f) Where pipe-lines are supported by a wharf they shall be secured in an adequate manner, proper provision being made for expansion, movement and anchorage.
- (g) Where valves and outlets in pipe-lines are placed below the deck of a wharf, access openings with covers shall be provided to them.
- (h) Pipe-lines on wharves shall be fitted with a stop valve at the outer or seaward end and an approved non-return valve shall be placed immediately behind the connexions between the flexible hose and the shore pipe-line and also at the shore end of the wharf.
- Rising spindle gate valves of a type approved by the Commissioners shall be used at pipe-line control points.
- (j) Pipe-lines used for the transmission of inflammable liquid with a flash point less than 150 deg. Fah. shall be suitably bonded and earthed in a manner approved by the Commissioners.
- (k) The seaward end of pipe-lines and hoses left connected thereto on wharves shall be made liquid tight by fitting with (a) blank flanges properly secured and fastened by at least four bolts, or (b) screwed caps.

- (1) Pipe-lines and the control valves shall be marked as required by the Commissioners.
- (m) Pipe-lines not situated on wharves shall be laid above ground wherever possible. Such pipe-lines shall be properly supported at a height of not less than 6 inches above ground but shall not rest directly on wood. Proper provision shall be made for expansion, movement and anchorage.
- (n) Pipe-lines shall receive adequate protection against corrosion and/or other injury.
- (o) If so required by the Commissioners any pipe-line laid under water shall be afforded cathodic protection in an approved manner.
- (p) Pipe-lines laid under railway tracks, roads or streets or where they may be subjected to heavy loading, shall be installed in accordance with the plans and specifications of the 'Recommended practice on form of agreement and specifications for pipe-line crossings under railroad tracks' issued by the American Petroleum Institute (A.P.I. Code No. 26) or other specification or proposal in regard to sleeving or culverting approved by the Commissioners.
- (q) Pipe-lines laid in ground, the surface of which is subject to loading of vehicular traffic, shall have at least 2 feet of approved cover over the top of the pipe, excluding flanges; proper access pits, with covers, shall be provided for valves and flanged joints shall be readily accessible. Access pits shall be vapour tight when closed, properly ventilated and kept closed when unattended.
- (r) When first installed pipe-lines shall be tested to a pressure of 300 lb. per square inch with water in sections over the full length of the pipe-line, each section not exceeding distance between consecutive flanged joints. Full pressure shall be maintained for the period of each test with a minimum period of 30 minutes.
- (s) Provision shall be made to relieve excessive pressure due to temperature variations in pipe-lines left full of liquid.
- (t) Pipe-lines shall have legibly stencilled to the satisfaction of the Commissioners identification marks in approved colours. Such marks shall be placed every 200 feet along the pipes and shall consist of letters and numerals of not less than 3-inch block type. Where there are several adjacent pipe-lines of different ownership the marks on such pipe-lines shall be placed in corresponding rows the positions of which shall be as determined by the Commissioners. The identification marks shall indicate the name of the owner of the pipe and the type and description of product to be pumped. Should a pipe be intended to be used for a variety of products it shall be classified 'General Purposes' and marked 'G.P.'. In the event that a number of pipe-lines are owned by one owner, each such pipe-line shall be marked with an identifying number as well as with the name of the owner.

SUB-SECTION B .- MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION.

- (a) Underground pipe-lines between the wharf, storage tanks and any pipe-line laid anywhere within the port shall be examined by the owner at intervals not exceeding three years and a certificate forwarded to the Commissioners that the pipe-lines are in good order and condition. Such certificate shall state the basis on which it is issued, e.g., visual examination, pressure tests or metal thickness tests.
- (b) Valves and other appliances used during pumping operations shall be inspected to ensure certainty of operation on each occasion before pumping commences.
- (c) Flexible hoses used in connexion with the-
 - (i) pumping of liquids derived from petroleum, coal and/or shale to or from a vessel shall be of approved quality with a safe working pressure of at least 100 lb. per square inch.
 - (ii) Such flexible hoses shall be fitted with Turk's Heads of hemp or sisal rope or other approved means of protection at intervals of 3 feet.

- (iii) The number of the hose, the safe working pressure and the ownership thereof shall be indicated on each such flexible hose by means of an engraved metallic plate incorporated in and forming part of such hose, or in such other manner as may be approved by the Commissioners.
- (iv) Such flexible hoses shall be so fitted as to ensure complete electrical connexion between the pipe-line and the vessel which is being discharged or loaded. The method adopted shall require the use of $44/\cdot012$ copper wire mechanically connected to the metallic fittings at each end of the hose, or other method approved by the Commissioners.
- (d) Flexible hoses used in connexion with the pumping of liquids derived from petroleum, coal and/or shale to or from a vessel shall be tested under working conditions at intervals of not more than six months to at least 25 per cent. in excess of the actual maximum working pressure under which it is operated. The results of such test shall be recorded in a register to be kept by the owner, and such record shall be made available for examination by the Commissioners as required. A report on tests of hoses used by an owner shall be provided to the Commissioners in January and July of each year and such report shall be in the form of the certificate in clause (3) of this section provided. Such flexible hoses shall be properly and adequately supported to prevent chafing and kinking during pumping operations.
- (e) Pipe-lines used in connexion with the pumping to or from a vessel of liquids derived from petroleum, coal and/or shale having a flash point of over 150 deg. Fah. and unrefined crude petroleum shall be provided with drip trays or drums under the seaward end of the pipe-line of a type approved by the Commissioners.
- (f) Pipe-lines and fittings shall be inspected each time before use in loading or discharge and tested to a pressure 25 per cent. in excess of normal operation pressure at twelve-monthly intervals in January of each year and a report of such test in the form of the certificate in clause (4) of this section provided shall be forthwith forwarded to the Commissioners. In the case of a pipe-line for which no certificate has been forwarded showing test for pressure in excess of 300 lb. per square inch as laid down in subsection A (r) the working pressure shall not be permitted to exceed 240 lb. per square inch.
- (g) Electrical equipment on oil wharves or located within 50 feet of shore terminal valves in pipe-lines shall comply with the appropriate section of the Wiring Rules of the Standards Association of Australia and the requirements of the proper local electrical authority and shall be inspected at intervals of not more than six months to ensure their continued compliance with such rules or requirements. Forthwith upon the completion of each such inspection a report indicating whether such compliance has or has not in all respects been established shall be forwarded to the Commissioners.
- (h) Pipe-lines for transmission of inflammable liquid with a flash point less than 150 deg. Fah, shall be tested at intervals of not more than twelve months to ensure that they are suitably bonded and earthed as required by the Commissioners. Forthwith upon the completion of each such test a report indicating whether or not suitable bonding and earthing has been established shall be forwarded to the Commissioners in the form of the Certificate in clause (4) of this section provided.
- (i) At the commencement of pumping of inflammable liquids having a flash point less than 150 deg. Fah., and after each change of grade of liquid at which water clearance is employed, the velocity in the pipe-lines shall be restricted to a maximum of 3 feet per second for a period of 30 minutes or sufficient time to clear the pipe-line twice whichever is the longer.

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This slow pumping rate shall also be observed when filling empty tanks until the fill pipe is covered. When pipe-lines vary in bore the limiting rate shall be applied to that part having the smallest bore.

- (j) During pumping operations pipe-lines shall be regularly patrolled throughout their full length so that any leakage may be detected and facilities in the form of walkways, lighting and telephones to assist efficient patrolling shall be installed to the satisfaction of the Commissioners. Where the Commissioners are not satisfied with the manner in which any pipe-line is patrolled they may themselves employ patrolmen for the purpose at the cost of the owner of the pipe-line (such cost shall constitute a debt due to the Commissioners).
- (k) During the whole period of pumping operations the terminal valves on wharf or jetty and the delivery or control valve on the vessel shall be closely watched by competent persons (employed by the owner) who shall close the valves in the event of any untoward occurrence.
- (1) Pipe-lines, valves, hoses and other appliances used for transferring inflammable liquids with a flash point less than 150 deg. Fah. shall be maintained free from leakage and gas-tight and unless otherwise authorized by the Commissioners on the completion of loading or unloading shall be thoroughly freed of inflammable liquid and the hoses disconnected from the shore pipe-lines. Pipe-lines, valves, hoses and other appliances used for transferring oil with a flash point not less than 150 deg. Fah. shall be kept in good condition and free from leakage and all due precautions shall be taken to prevent any oil escaping into tidal water.

The maximum working temperature of any pipe-line or flexible oil hose shall not exceed 160 deg. Fah.

- (m) Necessary precautions shall be taken to ensure that boats, barges or other small craft shall not moor under or remain near the wharf where pumping operations are being carried out.
- (n) No naked light, matches or other source of ignition shall be brought within a distance of 50 feet of shore terminal valves or pipe-lines when pumping operations are being carried out. Any torch used shall be of flameproof construction and any artificial light used shall also be of flameproof construction unless mounted at least 25 feet above the level of the wharf when it shall be of a type approved by the Commissioners.
- (o) An officer or officers appointed by the Commissioners at the cost of the owner of the vessel (which cost shall constitute a debt due to the Commissioners) shall be stationed in the vicinity of the vessel during pumping operations and in such number as the Commissioners may require.
- (p) A responsible representative of the master of the vessel and a representative of the installation to which or from which the inflammable liquid is being transmitted by pipe-lines shall be on duty at all times at the point of discharge from or intake of the vessel during preparation for and pumping operations.
- (q) The owner of the vessel and of the installation to or from which pumping operations will be made shall ensure in his respective sphere that sufficient fire-fighting equipment as approved by the Commissioners is available for immediate use should such be required.
- (r) Any untoward occurrence shall be reported immediately to the Commissioners and a written report thereof shall be forwarded to the Commissioners as soon as practicable.
- (s) The approval of the Commissioners shall be obtained on each occasion in respect of each particular vessel before pumping operations commence and any additional conditions stipulated by them shall be observed.

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- (t) Should the Commissioners consider such course necessary in the interests of safety they may direct that operations shall be discontinued and operations shall forthwith be discontinued
- (u) When pumping operations cease temporarily, valves on the vessel and on the shore pipe-line shall be closed.
- (v) On completion of pumping operations, pipe-lines outside storage installations and used for the transmission of inflammable liquids with a flash point less than 150 deg. Fah. shall be thoroughly cleared of the inflammable liquid by flushing with water and shall be kept full of water.
- (w) When any oil pipe-line or any flexible oil hose is tested as required by these Regulations it shall be tested at a temperature 25 per centum in excess of maximum working temperature. The maximum working temperature and temperature at time of test shall be shown on the appropriate certificate.
- (x) Notwithstanding the requirements of paragraph (v) above the Commissioners may grant exemption from this provision in the case of underwater pipe-lines used for the transmission of crude oil having a flash point of less than 73 deg. Fah.
- (y) Except with the approval of the Commissioners, on completion of pumping operations, pipe-lines shall be cleared of oil with flash point of not less than 150 deg. Fah. from the point of loading or discharge to the non-return valve at the shore end of the wharf.
- (z) Subject to the written approval of the Commissioners liquids derived from petroleum, coal and/or shale may be pumped to or from a vessel after sunset provided that the following conditions and such other conditions as may be stipulated by the Commissioners are complied with:—
 - (a) Pipe-lines, hoses, valves and other appliances shall be coupled up and pumping commenced at least one hour before sunset, and such pipe-lines and hoses shall not be uncoupled or otherwise interfered with except in daylight unless with special permission of the Commissioners and in the presence of their representative.
 - (b) Adequate lighting of an approved type shall be provided to the satisfaction of the Commissioners.
- (aa) Arrangements shall be made by the master of the vessel to ensure that there shall be sufficient staff of officers and men available at all times to ensure the efficient carrying out of the work, or to remove the vessel if so required.
- (bb) The ground under pipe-lines and for 3 feet on either side of pipe-lines shall be kept free from rubbish and inflammable materials, grass and weeds or other vegetable matter shall be removed or kept cut short.
- (3) The certificate in sub-section B, paragraph (d), required shall be in the following form:—

DONALD WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1960.

THE Donald Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Two shillings in the pound of the net annual value of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Donald Urban District.

N pursuance of the powers conferred by the Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1958, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke the Regulations made under the said Act on the 12th day of January, 1960, and doth hereby amend the Regulations made under the Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928 on the 9th day of November, 1932, as amended, as follows (that is to say):-

Regulation 17. (a) The sample of milk or cream secured for testing by the Babcock method for its butterfat contents shall in the case of cream be weighed by the weights, and in the case of milk measured by the measures herein specified.

(b) The measure used for the purpose of taking samples of milk for testing by the Babcock method for butterfat shall be the 17.6 ml. pipette as specified in Regulation 49.

(c) The weights used for weighing samples of cream for testing by the Babcock method for butterfat contents shall be nine (9) grammes.

(d) The Babcock test bottles used in milk testing shall be the 8 per cent. type as specified in Regulation 47.

(e) The Babcock test bottles used for cream testing shall be the 60 per cent. 9 gram type as specified in Regulation 48.

(f) The specific gravity of the sulphuric acid for use with the Babcock test shall be 1.827 at a temperature of 60 degrees

 \cdot (g) The reading of the fat shall be made at a temperature between 120 and 140 degrees Fahrenheit.

(h) Before reading the butterfat column in the Babcock cream flask a tester shall add to the contents thereof a white mineral oil coloured with alkanet root or other approved colouring, and shall thereupon make his reading from the bottom of the fat column to the top thereof. Where the percentage of butterfat as read on the neck of the test flask is an exact whole number such number shall be recorded as the result of the test, but where it is not an exact whole number the result shall be recorded as the whole number next below the actual reading. The reading of the butterfat column in the Babcock milk flask shall be from the bottom of the fat column to the top of the meniscus.

(i) The solution used for the determination of acid in any dairy produce shall be a deci-normal solution of caustic soda.

The Babcock milk test bottle shall be the 8 per cent. type and shall comply in all respects with the standard specification for this type in section 1 of Australian Standard No. N.26, 1958, "Australian Standard Specification for Glassware and Methods for the Determination of the Percentage of Fat in Milk, Skim Milk, Separated Milk, Butter Milk, and Cream by the Babcock Method" published by the Standards Association of

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "PORTARLINGTON FORESHORE RESERVE".

THE Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it, doth hereby amend the regulations made on the 20th December, 1950, for the care, protection and management of such portions of the land permanently reserved for public purposes in the Township of Portarlington as are indicated by red colour on the plan marked P/26.4.50 attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs.6395, and known as the "Portarlington Foreshore Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve", by rescinding Regulations Nos. 6 and 7 of such Regulations and by making the following Regulations in lieu thereof:—

REGULATIONS.

6. No person shall bring any dog into the Reserve and all dogs found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.
7. (a) No person shall camp in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained provided nevertheless that no camping shall be permitted during the period 15th May to 15th August in each year. in each year.

(b) No person shall erect in the Reserve any building, booth or other structure, nor shall any article be offered for sale or hire in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, provided nevertheless that no building, booth or other structure shall remain in the Reserve during the period 15th May to 15th August in each year.—(Rs.6395.)
