AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 91 of the Country Roads
Act 1958 it is provided that the Governor in Council
may on the recommendation of the Country Roads Board
made after consultation with the Minister of Forests and
the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey and on
the recommendation of the Commissioner of Public Works
by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette
proclaim any road or any part of any road to be a Forest
road for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas the
Country Roads Board (after consultation with the

Minister of Forests and the Commissioner of Crown Lands and Survey) and the Commissioner of Public Works have recommended that the road described in the Schedule hereunder be so proclaimed: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria. by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby preclaim the scild road to be a Executive Council. thereof doth hereby proclaim the said road to be a Forest Road for the purposes of the said Act.


RIDDELL'S CREEK WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT PROCLAIMED 13th JANUARY, 1960, "VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE, No. 4", PURSUANT TO SECTION 22 OF THE SOIL CONSERVATION AND LAND UTILIZATION ACT 1958 (No. 6372).

Notice of Determination of Land-use.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in section 23, sub-section (1), of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, the Soil Conservation Authority by Resolution dated 18th July, 1960, made a land-use determination as described in the following categories and indicated by hachure on plan No. 769 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham-road, Kew, with respect to all that piece of land in the Parish of Kerrie, within the boundaries of the Riddell's Creek Water Supply Catchment.

LAND-USE CATEGORIES.

- 1. Land which should be permanently used for forest purposes where forestry operations shall be restricted to the minimum required for proper forest maintenance to keep the forest in good condition as imposed by the Authority, or as required by the Forests Commission acting as agent for the Authority.
- 2. Forested land, which if approved by the Authority, may be used for pasture or for agriculture, subject to conditions imposed according to the particular circumstances, the conditions to include, among others, the degree of clearing permissible and the specification of those areas where timber shall be retained.
- 3. Cleared land at present carrying bracken or other protective vegetative cover on which there shall be no change of land-use except with the approval of and under conditions imposed by the Authority.
- 4. Cleared land suitable for pasture or for agriculture, subject to conditions imposed by the Authority for the particular circumstances.
- 5. Land within 1 chain, or such greater distance as the Authority may specify from specified streams, springs, offtakes and storages on which land-use shall be subject to conditions imposed by the Authority, but in no circumstances shall cultivation or erection of buildings be permitted.
 - 6. Land which may be used for residential purposes, subject to provisions of other relevant Acts.
- 7. Land reserved for roads and other public purposes on which any changes from the existing nature and conditions shall be made only after consultation with the Authority.

Every statement of objections made pursuant to sub-section (3A) of section 14 of the Act shall be in the form set out in the Fifteenth Schedule hereto.
 - (3) Where the Responsible Authority determines to refuse a permit it shall in the notification of such determination give the reasons for the refusal.
 - 11. (1) Any appeal to the Minister against the refusal or failure within a period of two months or, where notice of the application was given or published as aforesaid, three months of a Responsible Authority to grant a permit under its Interim Development Order or against the conditions specified in any permit granted or determined to be granted shall be lodged with the Minister within two months of—
 - (a) the receipt from the Responsible Authority of-
 - (i) notification of the determination refusing to grant a permit; or
 - (ii) the permit granted or notification of the determination to grant a permit in which are specified or to be specified any conditions by which the applicant is aggrieved;
 - (b) the expiration of the period of two months or three months (as the case may be) within which the Responsible Authority has failed to grant a permit.
 - (2) Any appeal to the Minister against a restriction resulting from or arising under any By-law made by a council pursuant to sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (xxxviii) of sub-section (1) of section one hundred and ninety-seven of the *Local Government Act* 1958, may be lodged with the Minister at any time.
 - (3) Any appeal to the Minister by a person who, being an objector, feels aggrieved by a determination of the Responsible Authority to grant a permit under its Interim Development Order shall be lodged with the Minister within fourteen days of the receipt of notification from the Responsible Authority of such determination.
 - (4) Every appeal to the Minister shall be made in writing and shall state the grounds of such appeal.

- 3. (a) The areas set out and described in the Third Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Class II. Occupancy shall contain not more than two flats.
- (b) No person shall in any area set out and described in the Third Schedule hereto construct any building of Class II. Occupancy which shall contain more than two
- 4. (a) The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in Column 5 of Table 804 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria (hereinafter called "the Regulations"), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class I. Occupancy shall be constructed in that portion of the municipal district set out and described in the Fourth Schedule hereto. the Fourth Schedule hereto.
- (b). The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in Column 4 of Table 804 of the Regulations are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district other than that portion thereof set out and described in the Fourth Schedule hereto. hereto.

- 5. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy from frontage is hereby specified as 20 feet.
- (b) No person shall construct any building of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy closer to the frontage of any land than 20 feet.
- 6. (a) In those portions of the municipal district specified in the Fifth Schedule hereto any building of Class VIII. Occupancy exceeding one story in height shall be of type 2 construction as defined in the Regulations and any building of Classes II., III., IV., VI., VII., VII. or VIII. - 7. The owner or occupier of any land shall remove or destroy all refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish, the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act* 1928).
- 8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Rosedale.
