

A By-law for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year Commencing on the 1st day of July, 1960.

GELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1958 and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area, supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works, or any extension of such works. such works.

- 1. The following rates are hereby made, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area, and supplied with water for domestic and/or other purposes:—
  - (a) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building), the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £13.—Twenty shillings per annum.
  - (b) On any such tenement, the annual valuation whereof exceeds £13.—One shilling and seven pence in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.
  - (c) On any land on which there is no building, the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £6. Ten shillings per annum.

- (d) On any such land on which there is no building, the annual valuation whereof exceeds £6.— One shilling and seven pence in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.
- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1960, and ending on the 30th day of June, 1961, and shall be payable on the 10th day of September, 1960.
- 3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose, shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.
- 4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district in which such lands and tenements are situate, shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements respectively; but it any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rates, be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Acts by the Council of such municipality on the written application of the Trust as provided for in such case by the Water Acts.



LEAVE CONDITIONS: EMPLOYEES UNDER THE "VERMIN AND NOXIOUS WEEDS ACT 1958".

WHEREAS by virtue and in exercise of the powers contained in the Vermin and Novious Weeds Act 1958 (No. 6409), the Secretary for Lands has recommended to the Governor in Council that various persons and classes of persons employed under the said Act shall be granted long service leave recreation loave side.

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act and upon such recommendation consent and by this Order hereby grant various persons employed under the said Act such long service leave, recreation leave, sick leave, and special leave due to war disabilities.

#### SCHEDULE "A".

Leave Conditions of Persons Employed Full Time by Government Departments who do not come within the Definition of "Employee" in Section 3 of the Public Service Act 1958".

1. These conditions are divided into parts, as follows:-

Part 1.—Long Service Leave.
Part 2.—Recreation Leave.
Part 3.—Sick Leave.
Part 4.—Special Leave Due to War Disabilities.

- 2. Definition.-Herein unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-
  - "Employee" means a person employed full time by a Government Department who does not come within the definition of employee in section 3 of the Public Service Act 1958.
  - "Minister" means the Minister for the time being administering the Department in which the person is employed.

    "Retrenchment" means the termination of the
  - services of any employee by the Department for reasons (other than for misconduct or any other cause within his own control) which in the opinion of the Department are considered to warrant a discontinuance of the services of such
  - "Pay" means the wage or salary rate which an employee would have continued to have received in the normal course if he had remained on duty during the period of his long service leave; provided that there shall not be included in such wage or salary rate any payment for overtime, or travelling allowance or incidental expenses or any payment of a temporary character in the nature of a reimbursement of expenditure incurred.

# PART 1.-LONG SERVICE LEAVE.

3. Every employee who has served for twenty years in a Department shall be entitled subject to the provisions of this part to be granted by the Minister six months' long service leave with pay in respect of that period of twenty years' service, and three months' long service leave with pay in respect of each additional period of ten years' completed service:

Provided that any person employed at the Government Cool Stores who

- (i) has had aggregate service of less than twenty years but not less than ten years; and
- (ii) has been employed at the Government Cool Stores over a period of at least twenty years; and
- (iii) when not employed at the Government Cool Stores has remained on call for employment thereat as and when required—

shall be entitled to be granted long service leave with pay in accordance with these conditions on a pro-rata basis:

Provided further than in the case of any employee of a Department on the 4th February, 1948, who had served for twenty years or more, that service shall count as twenty years only, and additional periods shall be calculated only in respect of service after the said date.

4. The Minister shall have discretion to grant such leave so that the Department will not be unduly affected by the granting of such leave to numbers of employees at or about the same time.

- 5. No such leave shall be granted to any employee who attained the age of 65 years prior to the 4th February, 1948
- 6. Any employee who has attained the age of 60 years b. Any employee who has attained the age of 60 years shall be entitled, if he desires so to do, to retire. Except as determined by the Minister, the services of an employee shall not be retained or commenced after attainment of the age of 65 years.
- 7. Where on account of age, ill health or retrenchment the services of an employee are terminated that employee may by notice in writing to the Minister elect to take pay in lieu of the whole or any part of any such leave to which he is then entitled and the Minister shall grant him pay in lieu thereof accordingly.
- 8. Where an employee entitled to such leave dies before or while taking such leave the Minister shall to the extent that pay in lieu thereof has not already been granted to that employee grant pay in lieu of the whole or part of the leave not taken to the legal personal representative of the deceased employee.
- 9. In determining the eligibility of an employee for long service leave pursuant to these conditions, the aggregate periods of service of such employee shall be taken into consideration.
- 10. (1) For the purpose of the preceding clause 9, "service" of an employee shall include any period or periods of service in a Department or where so determined by the Minister under any other Victorian Government instrumentality or authority.
- (2) In computing the duration of the service of an employee-
  - (a) there shall be included as a period of service any period or periods during which such employee has been absent from duty on recreation leave or on sick leave or on special leave due to war disabilities or on such other leave as the Minister may determine in any particular case; but lar case; but
  - (b) there shall not be included as a period of service any period or periods of service served by him
    - ny period or periods of service served by him—

      (i) prior to his having voluntarily left his employment, or having been dismissed therefrom for misconduct or any cause within his own control: Provided that an employee who has left his employment for the purpose only of taking up other employment in a Department, or under any other Victorian Government instrumentality or authority determined by the Minister, pursuant to sub-clause (1) of this clause, shall not be deemed to have voluntarily left his employment; or his employment; or
    - (ii) prior to his absence from any such employment for any continuous period of five years or more (otherwise than on special leave) or on such other leave as the Minister may determine, or by reason of retirement on account of ill health.
- 11. The pay to which any employee shall be entitled in respect of any period of long service leave shall be computed on the basis of the relevant award determination or other proper authority operative during such period of long service leave, and shall be payable fortnightly, except that with the consent of the Minister the amount due may be paid in a lump sum at the commencement of such long service leave.
- 12. Where any employee, or the legal personal representative of any deceased employee, is granted pay in lieu of the whole or part of any long service leave to which such employee is or was entitled, the amount of such pay shall be determined in accordance with the preceding clause as if the period of long service leave in respect of which pay is granted commenced on the date of retirement, termination of the services or the death (as the case may be) of such employee, but no increase in such amount shall be payable as a result of any variation in the relevant award or determination to which such employee would have been entitled during such period had he continued to be employed by a Government Department.
- 13. Any questions arising as to the construction or interpretation of the provisions of this part shall be submitted to the Public Service Board for decision.

#### PART 2.—RECREATION LEAVE.

14. Every employee who has completed five years' continuous service shall be granted three weeks' recreation leave with respect to his sixth year of service and each subsequent year of service: Provided that, where the period of recreation leave is calculated on a calendar year basis, such recreation leave for the period worked to 31st December in the sixth year of service shall be granted on a pro-rata basis.

#### PART 3.-SICK LEAVE,

15. Every employee who has completed five years' continuous service, hereinafter referred to as the qualifying period, shall be granted sick leave as prescribed by the Governor in Council from time to time by regulations under Part III. of the Public Service Acts.

Provided that, upon the completion of the qualifying period, the calculation of the total credit shall be as follows:—

- (a) Sick leave credits granted with respect to the two years of service immediately preceding the completion of the qualifying period shall be cancelled and there shall be substituted there. for a sick leave credit calculated as if such two years' service were regarded as service as an employee under the Public Service Acts;
- (b) to the credit established under paragraph (a) there shall be debited against such credit any sick leave taken during such two years of service;
- (c) to the credit calculated under paragraphs (a) and (b), there shall be added any other sick leave standing to his credit in respect of service prior to such two years of service, pursuant to any award, determination or other proper authority.

The provisions of this part shall not apply to any employee who receives a loading as part of his weekly or hourly wage in lieu of sick leave.

# PART 4.—SPECIAL LEAVE DUE TO WAR DISABILITIES.

16. Where the employing Department is satisfied that the illness of an employee is directly attributable to or is aggravated by his service in the war which commenced in the year One thousand nine hundred and fourteen or in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine, such an employee may, apart from any sick leave which may be standing to his credit, be granted special leave with full pay up to but not exceeding eight days during each calendar year of service. Such special leave shall be cumulative provided that the total of the accumulated leave standing to his credit shall not at any time exceed 60 days.





Government Gazette and shall take effect as from the day specified in the Order in that behalf, or, if no day is specified, as from the day of publication of the Order in the Government Gazette:

And whereas requests were submitted to the Governor in Council in accordance with the provisions of the said Act for the severance of portions of the municipal districts of the Shires of Flinders and Frankston and Hastings and constitution of such portions as a separate municipality:







REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE PRINCETOWN RESERVES. WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore

the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved Crown lands in the Township of Princetown indicated by yellow, blue, and red colours on plan marked P.11.8.60 with Lands Department correspondence C.76060, and together known as the Princetown Reserves (hereinafter referred to as "Reserves").

The Reserves have been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

#### REGULATIONS.

- 1. The Reserves shall be open to the public at all times, free of charge, except on such days not exceeding twenty-six (26) in any one year as any portion of the Reserves exclusive of the beach, may be set aside for purposes consistent with the reservation and with the consent of the Committee.

5. No person shall remove from the Reserves any gravel, stone, shellgrit, sand, or loam.

6. No person shall grave of the reserves any gravel, stone, shellgrit, sand, or loam.

6. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move, or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

7. No person shall put or graze in the Reserves any

cattle, goats, pigs, horses, sheep or any other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee

being first obtained.

8. (1) No person, without the consent in writing of the 8. (1) No person, without the consent in writing of the Committee, shall cause or suffer or knowingly permit any dog belonging to him, or in his charge to enter or remain in the Reserves unless such dog be and continues to be under proper control on a chain, cord or leash, and be effectively restrained from causing annoyance to any person, or from damaging or interfering in any way with the property of the said Committee, or bring into the Reserves any dog for training or exercising for coursing or other purposes of sport.

(2) Any dog found in the Reserves, except as provided in these Regulations, shall be liable to be seized and/or destroyed by the Committee, and the owner or any person having custody of any dog so found shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations, and may be required to make compensation for any damage done to the property of the said Committee by such dog.

9. No person shall camp or erect any tent or other structure on any site on any portion of the Reserves, except on such portion as may be specially set apart for the purpose and then only with the consent, in writing, of the Committee, and on payment of such fees, and subject to such conditions as the Committee may determine.

10. No person shall erect any bathing box, boathouse, 10. No person shall erect any bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection, or booth, on any site on the Reserves without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, fees, and conditions as may be deemed reasonable and advisable by the Committee consistent with these Regulations, but no person shall use or cause to be used or knowingly permit to be used any such bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection, or booth for residential purposes.

11. The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserves of any bathing box, boathouse.

The Committee shall have full power to order the removal from the Reserves of any bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection, or booth, which has been placed, erected, or established without its consent, or which has not been properly erected, or properly painted, or which in its opinion has not been satisfactorily maintained or kept in repair, or in respect of which the term of permission for the use of the site has expired, or the permission to use the site for a building or buildings has expired or been withdrawn.

12. No person shall neglect or refuse to remove any bathing box, boathouse, shed, or other building, structure, or erection, or booth erected or placed by him on any site, in or on the Reserves within fourteen (14) days after the Committee has sent by registered post to his last known address, a notice requiring such person to remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth. Such notice may be signed by either the chairman or secretary for the time being of the said Committee.

In the event of any such neglect or refusal as above-mentioned continuing after the expiration of the said fourteen (14) days, the Committee may remove such bathing box, boathouse, shed, or any other building, structure, or erection or booth, and recover the cost and/or expense of such removal from the person so neglecting or refusing to remove the same, but without prejudice to proceedings by way of information for breach of these Regulations being taken against such person so neglecting or refusing.

BY-LAW No. 220.

Keeping of Poultry.

PART I.

#### Introduction.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and of any other power enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the City of Heidelberg in the name of the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the said City for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their sweighting made the following Dr. law Mo. within their jurisdiction, made the following By-law No.

- (1) By-laws Nos. 104 and 106 are hereby repealed.
- (2) This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- (3) This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district except to premises registered as a poultry killing premises and poultry sale-yards when so exempt, in writing, by the Council.
- (4) In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
  - "Approved materials" means material approved by
  - "Dwelling" shall include a living-room, sleepout or tent, and all rooms used for sleeping, living, or cooking.
  - 'Litter" includes wood shavings, tan bark, straw or dry grass clippings, or other similar suitable clean material.
  - Battery cage" means a wire and metal mesh cage divided into one or more compartments in which
  - poultry is kept.
    "Person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of premises.
  - "Poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks, and geese.

## PART II.

This part shall apply to areas zoned as residential under the Town and Country Planning Acts and By-laws.

- (1) No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any premises in an area zoned as residential a number of fowls greater than twenty-five (25) mature birds.
- (2) No person shall keep in any poultry-house or similar structure a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry-house or similar structure by four unless confined in approved battery cages.
- (3) No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any one property more than two (2) turkeys, ducks or geese.

- •

- (4) No person shall keep any poultry on any premises—in an area zoned as residential—otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or an enclosure or battery cage and unless such poultry-house or similar structure or enclosure or battery cage is—
  - (a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the premises has a frontage;
  - (b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street or road of a greater width than twentyfive (25) feet;
  - (c) distant at least five (5) feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than twentyfive (25) feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
  - (d) distant at least forty (40) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining allotment.
- (5) Every poultry-house or similar structure, except approved battery cages, shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material, and the surface level of the floor shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed so as to hold six (6) inches in depth of litter.
- (6) Every poultry-house or similar structure, except approved battery cages, shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brick-work, cement sheet or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least eighteen (18) inches below ground level, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.
- (7) Every battery cage system in which poultry is kept in an area zoned as residential shall have a permanent roof and any walls to be constructed of approved materials and having a floor raised at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

### PART III.

#### Provisions Relating to Poultry Farms.

In this section unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—  $\ \,$ 

- "Poultry Farm" shall mean any premises on which there is kept at any time a greater number of mature birds than twenty-five (25).
- (1) No person shall keep poultry on any poultry farm otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or enclosed poultry-run or battery cage system.
- (2) Where the number of mature birds is at any time greater than twenty-five (25) every poultry-house or similar structure or any enclosed poultry-run or any battery cage system shall be—
  - (a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage;
  - (b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street;
  - (c) distant at least ten (10) feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
  - (d) distant at least one hundred (100) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land, excepting only that the owner or occupier may erect incubators or brooder houses not less than forty (40) feet from his own dwelling.
- (3) Every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be roofed with approved material with guttering leading to water tanks or to adequate stormwater drains.
- (4) The ground surrounding every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be well drained.
- (5) The floor beneath any battery cage system and the floor of any poultry-house or similar structure shall be built up so that the surface shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

#### PART IV.

## General Provisions.

These provisions shall apply to all premises on which poultry are kept except those exempted by Part I. (3).

- (1) The owner or occupier shall keep the area of land within five (5) feet of any fowl house similar structure, enclosure or battery cage system free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse or other materials capable of harbouring rats or other vermin.
- (2) The owner or occupier shall cause the poultry-house, similar structure, or enclosure or battery cage system to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean, wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.

- (3) Ne person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry is kept any feed for consumption by poultry unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles or ratproof buildings.
- (4) Poultry droppings, litter and refuse shall be moved from the premises from time to time as Council directs so as not to cause a nuisance or offensive conditions.
- (5) Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred nounds

Occupancy shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Horsham.
- 3. Clause 6 of By-law No. 45 of the City of Horsham is hereby repealed.
- 4. Clause 7 of By-law No. 45 of the City of Horsham is hereby repealed.
- 5. For Clause No. 7 of By-law No. 45 repealed by this By-law there shall be substituted the following clause:—
  - 7. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of these Regulations, the requirements of clause 813 of the Regulations requiring rear access to buildings of Class IV. Occupancy are hereby dispensed with.
- 6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the municipal district of the City of Horsham.

- 2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane, or passageway within the Shire of East Loddon.
- 3. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land within the Shire of East Loddon.
- 4. (1) The Council hereby requires every owner or occupier of any land to remove or destroy all refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 48 of the *Health Act* 1958).

- (2) Every such owner or occupier who fails to remove or destroy any such refuse or rubbish within seven days after notice, in writing, from the Council over the signature of the Shire Secretary has been served on him requiring him to so do, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.
- (3) An offence shall be deemed to have been committed under sub-clause (2) hereof upon non-compliance with such notice after the expiration of seven days from the date on which the said notice would in the ordinary course of post have reached the said owner or occupier, or from the date of personal service of the said notice on the owner or occupier as the case may be.
- 5. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 and not more than £20, and to a further penalty of not more than £1 for each day on which the offence against the By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court.

- 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government
- 3. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the following areas in the Shire of Marong except to premises registered as a poultry killing premises and poultry sale-yards when so exempt in writing by the Council:—

  - Council:—

    (a) The whole of the Township of Raywood.

    (b) That portion of the Township of Bridgewater comprising sections 1 to 20 inclusive and 22.

    (c) That portion of the Township of Marong comprising sections 1 to 7, Crown allotments A6, 1, 1A, 1C, 3D, 3E, Z, 10, 11 and pt. 9 and the area bounded by High-street, Adams-street, Bullock Creek and the railway line.

    (d) The whole of the Township of Kangaroo Flat.

    (e) That portion of the Parish of Sandhurst comprising Crown allotments 16, 16A, 16B, 16C, 34A, 34B, 34C, 34D, 34K, 88, 88E, 88A, 88B, 88C, 88D and 89, all in section 18.

    (f) All that portion of the Parish of Mandurang bounded on the north by Wesley-street; thence by a line south along the Calder Highway to the south-west corner of allotment 1, section D; thence east along the southern boundary of

the said allotment to the Melbourne-Bendigo railway line; thence south along the said railway line to the north-east corner of allotment 71, section D; thence south-westerly and westerly by a road to its junction with the Calder Highway; thence north to Furness-street; thence west along that street to the south-east corner of allotment 75a, section D; thence north along road to its junction with the Crusoe-road at the north-west corner of allotment 93a, section D; thence north-west along Crusoe-road to the north-east corner of allotment 59, section E; thence west along road to the continuation of Morrison-street; thence north-east along Morrison-street as far as the south-eastern corner of allotment 37, section E; thence west along Queen-street to the south-west corner of allotment 34c, section E; thence north along the western boundary of the said allotment to Wesley-street.

- 4. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—  $\,$ 
  - "Approved materials" means material approved by the Council.
  - "Dwelling" shall include a living-room, sleepout or tent, and all rooms used for sleeping, living or cooking.
  - "Litter" includes wood shavings, tan bark, straw or dry grass clippings or other similar suitable clean material.
  - "Battery cage" means a wire and metal mesh cage divided into one or more compartments in which poultry is kept.
  - "Person" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of premises.
  - "Poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese.
    "Adult poultry" means poultry 41 months old or older.

### PART II.

This part shall apply to areas zoned as residential under the Town and Country Planning Acts or by any Council By-law.

- 1. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any premises in an area zoned as residential a number of fowls greater than twenty-five (25) adult birds.
- 2. No person shall keep in any poultry house or similar structure a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry-house or similar structure by four unless confined in approved battery cages.
- 3. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any one property more than two (2) turkeys, ducks or geese.
- 4. No person shall keep any poultry on any premises—in an area zoned as residential—otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or an enclosure or battery cage and unless such poultry-house or similar structure or enclosure or battery cage is—
  - (a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the premises has a frontage;
  - (b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street or road of a greater width than twenty-five (25) feet;
  - (c) distant at least five (5) feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than twenty-five (25) feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
  - (d) distant at least forty (40) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining allotment.
- 5. Every poultry-house or similar structure, except approved battery cages, shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material and the surface level of the floor shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed so as to hold six (6) inches in depth of litter.
- 6. Every poultry-house or similar structure except approved battery cages shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brick work, cement sheet or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least eighteen (18) inches below ground level or to solid rock, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.
- 7. Every battery cage system in which poultry is kept in an area zoned as residential shall have a permanent roof and any walls to be constructed of approved materials and having a floor raised at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

#### PART III.

#### Provisions Relating to Poultry Farms.

In this section unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—  $\,$ 

- "Poultry Farm" shall mean any premises on which there is kept at any time a greater number of adult birds than twenty-five (25).
- 1. No person shall keep poultry on any poultry farm otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or enclosed poultry-run or battery cage system.
- 2. Where the number of adult birds is at any time greater than twenty-five (25) every poultry-house or similar structure or any enclosed poultry-run or any battery cage system shall be—
  - (a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage;
  - (b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street;
  - (c) distant at least ten (10) feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
  - (d) distant at least one hundred (100) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land, excepting only that the owner or occupier may erect incubators or brooder houses not less than forty (40) feet from his own dwelling.
- 3. Every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be roofed with approved material with guttering leading to water tanks or to adequate stormwater drains.
- 4. The ground surrounding every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be well drained.
- 5. The floor beneath any battery cage system and the floor of any poultry-house or similar structure shall be built up so that the surface shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

## PART IV.

#### General Provisions.

These provisions shall apply to all premises on which poultry are kept except those exempted by Part I. (3).

- 1. The owner or occupier shall keep the area of land within five (5) feet of any fowl house similar structure, enclosure or battery cage system free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse or other materials capable of harbouring rats or other vermin.
- 2. The owner or occupier shall cause the poultry-house similar structure or enclosure or battery cage system to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.
- 3. No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry is kept any food for consumption by poultry unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles or rat-proof buildings.
- 4. Poultry droppings, litter and refuse shall be moved from the premises from time to time as Council directs so as not to cause a nuisance or offensive conditions.
- 5. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5) but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds (£100).
