AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time, diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the, classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Marine Act 1958. REGULATIONS. ---

AMENDMENT OF PILOTAGE RATES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 79 of the Marine Act. 1958, and all other powers it in that 1958, and all other powers it in that behalf enabling, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine-

That on and after the date of publication in the Government Gazette, Schedule (c) of the "Regulations Relating to Pilots and Pilotage 1931" shall be amended as follows:-

. . II. Other Ports.

The maximum amount payable for pilotage services inward or outwards of the Port of Portland shall be increased from Twelve pounds ten shillings (£12 10s.) to Twenty pounds (£20) each way, and the minimum amount payable shall be increased from Four pounds (£4) each way to Five pounds (£5) each way.

The foregoing ordinance and determination was passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held on the 29th day of July, in the year of our. Lord One thousand nine hundred and sixty.

BUTTER QUOTA.

WARRANDYTE WATERWORKS TRUST. By-LAW No. 1.

Standing Orders for Regulating and Appointing the Place and Hour of Meetings of the Warrandyte Waterworks Trust, and Providing for the Management and Conduct of Business Thereat.

THE Warrandyte Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authorities conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for its Waterworks District:

- 1. In all cases not provided for by the Acts of Parliament of Victoria relating to authorities, or by this By-law, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Trust.
- 2. Place and Hour of Meetings.—Meetings of the Trust shall be held periodically on the second Thursday in the month, at Eight o'clock p.m., at the Mechanics' Institute, Warrandyte. Upon notice of motion the time, day, and hour of the meeting may be altered by a majority of the Commissioners. A notice of every regular meeting of the Commissioners shall be, by the Trust Secretary, delivered or sent by post, addressed to the usual address of the Commissioner, three clear days at least prior to the day on which such intended meeting is to be held.
- 3. Meeting, Resolutions at, Not to be Revoked.—No resolution at any meeting of the Commissioners shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting, unless notice of intention to propose such revocation or alteration be given by the Trust Secretary to each of the Commissioners seven days at least before holding the meeting, nor unless such revocation or alteration be determined upon by a majority consisting of at least two-thirds of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting (if the number of the Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be not greater than the number present when such resolution was come to), or by majority if the number of Commissioners present at such subsequent meeting be greater than the number present at such former meeting.
- 4. Business, &c., Order of, Minutes.—At every meeting of the Commissioners the first business thereof shall be reading and putting a question for the confirmation of the minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the rough minutes of the proceedings of the Commissioners at any meeting shall be read at the close of such meeting, if required by any Commissioner present at such meeting.
- 5. After the signing of the minutes by the Chairman, the order of the business of any ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable; but for the greater convenience of the Commissioners at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:-
 - Reading of copies of letters sent by the authority
 of the Commissioners, if called for.
 Reading letters received, and considering and
 ordering thereon.

 - Reception and reading of petitions and memorials. Receiving deputations from the ratepayers.
 - (5) Presentation of reports of committees and officers.

 (6) Payments.
 (7) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
 (8) Ordinary business and any business which the Chairman may think desirable.
 (9) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.

 (10) Notices of motion.
- 6. The order of business at a Special Meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.
- 7. Ordinary business shall, amongst other matters, include the following:—
 - (a) Superintending the conduct of the officers of the
 - (b) Inquiring into the conduct of contractors or other persons employed by the Council to execute
 - any works.

 (c) Inquiring into the state and progress of such works.
 - (d) Generally giving such directions from time to time as may be necessary for carrying into effect the purposes of the Water Acts.
- 8. Titles, Official.—The Commissioners, in meeting, shall designate each other by their official titles, namely, that of Chairman or Commissioners, as the case may require.

- Who to Speak.—If two or more Commissioners rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to priority.
- 10. Chairman to Rise Whilst Addressing Meeting .-The Chairman shall rise in addressing the Commissioners to discuss any question, and shall not leave the Chair on such occasions.
- 11. Commissioners Not to Speak Twice on the Same Question.—No Commissioner shall speak twice on the same question, unless entitled to reply, or in the explanation when he has been misrepresented or misunderstood.
- 12. Points of Order.-The Chairman, when called upon to decide on points of order or practice, shall state the provision, rule, or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final,

Commissioners Not to Digress or Impute Improper Motives.—No Commissioner shall digress from the subjectmatter of the question under discussion, nor impute improper motives, and all personal reflections on Commissioners shall be deemed disorderly, and every Commissioner so doing shall, upon being called to order by the Chairman, apologize for such conduct, and withdraw such imputations or reflections, as the case may be.
- 14. A Commissioner called to order shall sit down, unless permitted to explain.
- 15. Persons Not Commissioners to Leave when Requested.—No person not being a Commissioner who, having been admitted to any meeting of the Commissioners, shall be guilty thereat of any improper or disorderly conduct, and every such person shall leave such meeting when requested by the Chairman to do so.
- 16. Call of the Commissioners.-No Commissioner shall absent himself from any meeting held in compliance with an order for a call of the whole Commissioners without reasonable excuse to the satisfaction of the majority thereof.
- 17. Documents to be Produced.—Any Commissioner may of right demand the production of any of the documents of the Trust applying to the question under discussion.
- 18. Motions, Amendments, and Notice Thereof.—All notices of motion shall be in writing, dated, and numbered, and given by the intending mover to the Trust Secretary at the close of meeting of the Commissioners, or if not given at the meeting then seven days prior to the day on which the next meeting of the Commissioners is to take place, and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book, in the order in which they may be received. may be received.
- 19. No Motion Without Notice.—No Commissioner shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion, except in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.
- 20. Motions on Petitions.—No motion, except that for receiving the same, shall, unless under most urgent circumstances, be made on any petition, memorial or other like application until the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners after that at which it has been presented.
- 21. Motions to be Moved in Order.-Except by leave of the Commissioners, motions shall be moved in the order in which they have been received and recorded by the Trust Secretary in the notice of motion book, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.
- 22. Motions Not to be Proceeded with in the Absence of the Mover.—No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with in the absence of the Commissioner who gave notice of the same, unless by some other Commissioner producing written authority from him to that effect.
- 23. No motion for an address or petition shall be entertained unless the mover shall, at some previous meeting, have submitted a draft of the same.
- 24. Mover of Motion or Amendment Not to be Interrupted.—Any Commissioner desirous of making a motion or amendment, or taking part in discussion thereon, shall rise and address the Chairman, and shall not be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down until the Commissioner calling to order shall have been heard thereon, and the question or order disposed of, when the Commissioner in possession of the Chair may proceed with the subject. proceed with the subject.
- 25. Nature of Motion to be Stated.—Any Commissioner desirous of proposing an original motion or amendment must state the nature of the same before he addresses the Commissioners thereon.

- 26. Leave to be Obtained Before Motion Withdrawn.—No motion or amendment shall be withdrawn without the leave of the Commissioners.
- 27. Motions to be Seconded Prior to Discussion.—No motion or amendment shall be discussed or put to the vote of the Commissioners unless it be seconded; but a Commissioner may, however, require the enforcement of any standing order of the Commissioners by directing the Chairman's attention to the infraction thereof.
- 28. Mover and Not the Seconder Held to Have Spoken.

 —A Commissioner moving a motion shall be held to have spoken thereon, but a Commissioner merely seconding shall not be held to have spoken upon it.
- 29. Motion to be in Writing.—At every meeting of the Commissioners, all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced to writing, signed by the mover, and be delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.
- 30. Amendments.—No second or subsequent amendment, whether upon an original proposition or on an amendment, shall be taken into consideration until the previous amendment is disposed of.
- 31. Amendment to Become the Question.—If an amendment be carried, the amendment shall become itself the question, whereupon any further amendment upon any portion of the question may be moved.
- 32. Second Amendment May be Moved.—If an amendment be negatived, then a second may be moved to the question to which the first-mentioned amendment was moved, but only one amendment shall be submitted to the Commissioners for discussion at a time.
- 33. Right of Mover to Reply.—The mover of every original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which question shall be put from the Chair, but no Commissioner shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain or the attention of the Chair be called to a point of order.
- 34. Adjournment Motion for.—No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the Commissioners, but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration, the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence before any subsequent motion of adjournment be made.
- motion of adjournment be made.

 35. Protest, Commissioners May.—Any Commissioner may protest against any resolution of the Commissioners, and notice of intention to protest shall, in every case, be given forthwith on the adoption of the resolution protested against, and the protest shall specify the reasons for protesting, and shall be entered three days at least before the next ordinary meeting of the Commissioners by the protesting Commissioner in a book to be kept for that purpose in the Trust Secretary's office, and signed by such Commissioner, and shall also be entered in the minutes of the meeting at which notice of the intention to protest shall have been given previously to the confirmation thereof; but such protest may be expunged from the minutes if declared by a majority of the Commissioners to be not in accordance with truth or in its terms disrespectful to the Commissioners.
- 36. Lapsed Questions.—If a debate on any motion moved and seconded be interrupted by the number of Commissioners present becoming insufficient for the transaction of business, such debate may be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted on motion upon notice.
- 37. Order of the Day to be Restored.—If a debate on any order of the day be interrupted by such insufficiency of numbers as aforesaid happening, such order may be restored to the notice book for a future day on motion upon notice, and then such debate shall be resumed at the point where it was so interrupted.
- 38. Voting.—Whenever a division shall be demanded by any Commissioner, the Commissioners voting in the affirmative shall first hold up their hands, and all those voting in the negative shall then hold up their hands, and result be declared by the Chairman. The Chairman shall have a deliberate vote, and in case of an equal division he shall have a casting vote, and every Commissioner present shall vote except he be disabled by law from doing so.
- 39. Questions to be Put.—The Chairman shall, in taking the sense of the Commissioners, put the question first in the affirmative, then in the negative, and the result thereof shall be recorded in the minutes.

- 40. Contents of Petitions.—It shall be incumbent on every Commissioner presenting a petition to acquaint himself with the contents thereof, and to ascertain that it does not contain language disrespectful to the Commissioners, and that the contents do not violate any By-law or any provision thereof.
- 41. Name at Beginning of Petition.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall write his name at the beginning thereof.
- 42. Petition to be in Writing.—Every petition shall be in writing and not printed or lithographed, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioner at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one person on every sheet on which it is written.
- 43. How Signed.—Every petition shall be signed by the persons whose names are appended thereto by their names or marks and by no one else, except in cases of incapacity by sickness.
- 44. No Letters, &c., to be Attached.—No letters, affidavits, or other documents shall be attached to any petition.
- 45. Presentation of Petitions.—Every Commissioner presenting a petition to the Commissioners shall confine himself to a statement of the persons from whom it comes, of the number of signatures attached to it, of the material allegations contained in it, and to the reading of the prayer thereof.
- 46. Deputations.—Deputations from the ratepayers wishing to be heard before the Commissioners in support of any petition, or otherwise, must send in an application in writing, to the Trust Secretary, at least three clear days before the meeting of the Commissioners at which such petition is intended to be presented.
- 47. Cheques to be Signed.—All cheques shall be signed by two Commissioners, and countersigned by the Secretary.
- 48. Appointment to Permanent Office.—No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the Commissioners shall take place until seven clear days' public notice shall have been given by advertisement in one or more newspapers circulating in the Township of Warrandyte and Warrandyte North, inviting applications from qualified candidates for same.
- 49. Salaries to be Fixed.—The salary or allowance attached to all offices and places at the disposal of the Commissioners shall, in all cases, be fixed before they proceed to appoint any person to fill the same.
- 50. Commissioners, &c.. Not to be Surety.—No Commissioner or officer of the Commissioners, and no assessor or auditor shall be received as a surety, for any officer appointed by the Commissioners, or for any work to be done for the Commissioners.
- 51. Contracts.—In all cases of security being given for the faithful performance of any contract, the expenses of preparing such security shall be borne by the person providing the same.
- 52. Plans, &c.—All the plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Commissioners at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any Commissioner during that time, except in cases of emergency.
- 53. Secretary to Expend Moneys.—It shall be lawful for the Secretary from time to time, on the written order of the Chairman, to disburse such moneys as shall have been appropriated by the Commissioners for the purposes of this clause, and as shall be required for any necessary occasion, not exceeding in the whole in an interval between two ordinary meetings of the Commissioners the sum of Ten pounds.
- 54. Addresses to the Governor, &c.—All addresses to the Governor shall be presented by the Chairman and Trust Secretary, unless otherwise ordered by the Commissioners.
- 55. Suspension of Regulations.—Any one or more of the rules and provisions herein contained may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice being given, and shall not otherwise be suspended except by a unanimous vote of the Commissioners.
- 56. Penalty.—Every person who shall so offend against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence.
- 57. Common Seal.—The common seal of the Trust shall be kept in a locked box, of which the key shall be kept by the Trust Secretary, and the corporate seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the Chairman of the Trust and the Secretary, or in the absence of the Chairman, unless two Commissioners and the Secretary be present.

BOOLARRA WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1960.

THE Boolarra Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a By-law and direct as follows:—

1. The said Boolarra Waterworks Trust doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of Forty-eight pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of land and tenements liable to be rated within the Boolarra Waterworks District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land upon which there is no building) be less than Four pounds, and in respect of land on which there is no building less than One pound ten shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the period commencing on the 1st day of January, 1960, and shall be payable on the 10th day of October, 1960, at the office of the said Trust.

- 2. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Twenty-one pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.
- 3. The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Twenty-one pence per 1,000 gallons.
- 4. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.
- 5. The Secretary and/or Rate Collector of the Trust is hereby authorized to demand and receive, collect and recover the rates and charges aforesaid and each of them.

be done to that land or any works thereon owing to erosion or conditions conducive to erosion on other land the Authority may serve notice on the owner or occupier of the other land requiring him within a time to be specified in such notice to take such remedial measures as are set out in the notice.

- 3. Any notice pursuant to Regulation 2 of these Regulations may be served upon any owner or occupier of land-
 - (a) by delivering the notice to him personally;
 - (b) by sending the notice by registered post and addressed to him at his last or most usual place of abode or business; or
 - (c) in any case where the owner or occupier of any land cannot after reasonable enquiry and search be found or his place of abode or business be ascertained by affixing the notice to the land to which the notice relates. 4 . . . ; ,
- 4. Every notice of appeal pursuant to the provisions of sub-section (4) of section 14 of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958—
 - (a) shall be in writing signed by the owner or occupier (as the case may be);

 - (b) shall state the grounds of the appeal; and (c) shall be lodged with the Registrar of the County Court at Melbourne not more than fourteen days after the receipt by or service upon the owner or occupier of any condition imposed direction given or assessment made pursuant to the provisions of section 14 of the said Act.
- 5. Within three days after lodging any notice of appeal pursuant to the provisions of the last preceding Regulation, the owner or occupier shall send or cause to be sent to the Authority a copy of the notice of appeal so lodged.
- 6. The time and place for the hearing of the appeal shall be fixed by the Judge of the County Court and notice thereof shall be given to the Secretary of the Authority and the appellant.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BENDIGO PUBLIC OFFICES RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 8th January, 1929, as a site for Public Offices in the Parish of Sandhurst, City of Bendigo, and known as the "Bendigo Public Offices Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

- 1. No person shall interfere with, move, damage or destroy any shrub, tree, plant, grass, flowers, or any property, or enter on any flower bed or borders, or light fires within the Reserve.
- 2. No person shall throw stones or missiles of any kind within the Reserve.
- No persons shall climb on any portion of any build-ing, balustrade, or property in the Reserve, or jump over any fence or hedge thereon.
- 4. No person shall affix or interfere with placard, bill, notice, or marking of any kind on any building, structure, tree, constructed surface, or anything within the Reserve.
- 5. No person shall enter or travel over the Reserve with 5. No person shall enter or travel over the Reserve with or on any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle, except on such portions thereof provided for wheeled traffic, and the driver of such motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle shall be guided and directed, and shall abide by any notice, post, or sign, marking or barrier guide which has been marked or erected for the purpose of traffic guidance, control or direction. direction.
- 6. No person shall drive a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public, or likely to cause any damage to anything within the Reserve
- 7. No person or persons, except as hereunder provided, shall park any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle within the Reserve.
- 8. Any person having immediate official business within the Reserve may park therein any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle by which he has entered such Reserve, and then only for such time as such business occupies
- 9. The Board may permit employees of the Crown using so the Crown using motor cars, motor cycles, bicycles, or other vehicles in course of their duties, or as a means of transport to and from their duties within the Reserve, to park such vehicles therein for such time as such employees may be considered to be on duty, and such vehicles shall only be parked within an area or areas within the Reserve as may be prescribed from time to time, and then so as not to interfere in any way with or obstruct the free passage of any other person or vehicle engaged in lawful business within the Bessen or business within the Reserve.
- No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats, or any wall, structure, or property within the Reserve.
- 11. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or is not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Reserve, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.
- 12. No person shall remain within the Reserve, or on any property therein, when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown lands, or member of the Police Force, or authorized officer of the Board.
- 13. No person shall hawk or sell, or offer for sale, within the Reserve any goods, fruit, or merchandise, or anything, or solicit or gather money therein, without the authority, in writing, of the Board.
- 14. No person shall give out, or distribute, any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Reserve, or litter the same by scattering or throwing down hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.
- 15. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless securely held by a chain, cord, or leash.

- 16. No person shall bring in or allow to remain in the Reserve any horse, cow, sheep, pig, or goat, and any such animal found wandering therein shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed.
- 17. No person, except on lawful occasions, may enter any enclosed area or any building, garage, or shed, or other structure within the Reserve.
- 18. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing within the Reserve.—(Rs.3805.)

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "RINGWOOD EAST RECREATION RESERVE".

RECREATION RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the lands temporarily reserved by Orders in Council dated the 5th October, 1885, 22nd July, 1908, and the 10th June, 1931, as a site for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Parish of Ringwood, and known as the "Ringwood East Recreation Reserve", hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve". The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management hereinafter referred to as the "Committee".

REGULATIONS.

- 1. Upon the coming into operation of these Regulations, the Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works in respect of the Reserve on the 8th June, 1932, shall be
- 2. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Ten shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve
 - 3. No person shall-
 - (a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.

 (b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state

 - of intoxication.

 (c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

 - (d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

 (e) Carry or discharge any firearms or air guns in the Reserve, or shoot, snare, or destroy any game or birds therein.
- 4. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.
- 5. The Committee shall have power to enter into agreements with any club, association, society or person in regard to any position of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game, sport, entertainment or recreational activity for any term not exceeding seven years, and

subject to payment of such fees and on such conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

- 6. The Reserve shall be divided as follows:-
 - 1st -The Cricket Ground, including the Grandstand.
 - 2nd—The Bowling Green. 3rd—The Croquet Green.
 - 4th—The remainder of the Reserve.
- 7. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such
- 8. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, which reserves the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.
- 9. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 10 No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 11. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure, on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury, or loss, from the sum making good such damage, injury, or loss, from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.
- 12. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein. or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or post bills or advertisements, or any like sign, on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or in any part of the Reserve.
 - 13. No person shall, in the Reserve-

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- (a) Light a fire without the consent of the Committee.
- (b) Deposit or leave any broken glass, garbage, or litter of any kind, except in a place set apart or in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.
- 14. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 15. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 16. No person shall camp in the Reserve, or erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 17. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.
- 18. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.
- 19. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 20. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve
- 21. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.

- 22. No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the Reserve or in any shed, or other buildings upon the Reserve.
- 23. No person shall use any of the closets, urinals, or dressing sheds in the Reserve or any portion of the closets, urinals, or dressing sheds for any other purpose than that for which they are constructed.
- 24. No person shall defecate or urinate in any part of the Reserve except in the closets and urinals provided therein for these purposes.
- 25. No person shall obstruct or interfere with the passage of members of the public using the Reserve, or wilfully obstruct in the execution of his duty or insult any employee of the Committee or any member or employee of such Committee.
- 26. Any person committing any breach of these Regulations who refuses to state his name and place of abode to any member of the Committee or to an employee of such Committee or who, in the opinion of such member or employee, states a false name or place of abode, shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.—

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the Land Act 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "LAKE BOGA WATER SUPPLY AND PUBLIC PARK RESERVES".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purposes whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved Crown lands coloured red and bordered red on plan marked K.B. over 48.60, attached to Lands Department Correspondence Rs.6286, and known as the "Lake Boga Water Supply and Public Park Reserves".

REGULATIONS.

- . 1. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:--

text or subject-matter:—

"Committee" means the persons, council or body appointed by the Governor in Council, or the Board of Land and Works, to be the Committee of Management of the Reserves hereinafter referred to.

"Organization" means any group collection or association (whether temporary or not) of persons and/or bodies (whether corporate or not) acting together for a purpose.

"Organized Event" means any affair, enterprise or action undertaken by any organization as herein defined in furtherance of any purpose of such organization and (without limiting the generality of this definition) includes any gathering of persons intended, planned or brought about by any such organization for any purpose of such organization.

"Reserves" means the lands referred to in the preamble to these Regulations.

- 2. Upon the coming into operation of these Regula-tions, all previous Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works in respect of the Reserves shall be rescinded.
- 3. The Reserves shall be open to the public at all times and no charge shall be made for admission thereto, except on such days (not exceeding 52' in any one year) as the same or any portion thereof may be

- set apart by the Committee for sports, carnivals, regattas, fêtes or holiday amusements of any kind on any of which days a sum not exceeding Ten shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserves, or to the portion thereof at that time set apart for the purposes aforesaid.
- No person shall enter or remain in the Reserves who may in any respect offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- 5. No person shall leave or deposit or cause to be left or deposited on or in any part of the Reserves any broken glass or crockery or any tins, bottles, cartons, waste paper or other litter or rubbish or any food scraps or other garbage, except in receptacles provided by the Committee for that purpose and marked "Rubbish".
- 6. No person shall on any part of the grounds of the 6. No person shall on any part of the grounds of the Reserves without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained play, practice or engage in any game or sport, and then only on such part or parts of the said grounds as may be stipulated by the Committee for the purpose: Provided always that no such consent shall be deemed to authorize anything which may be a danger, inconvenience or annoyance to any other person or persons in the Reserves.
- 7. No person shall throw or project in or across any part of the Reserves any stone or other hard object or missile.
- 8. No peron whilst in the Reserves shall commit any uisance or behave in such manner as to cause any nuisance or behave in such manner as to cause any danger, inconvenience or annoyance to any other person or persons in the Reserves.
- 9. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained operate, or use in, or bring into the Reserves or any part thereof, any loud speaker, amplifier or broadcasting or public address equipment (whether mechanical or electrical) for equipment (whether mechanical or electrical) for broadcasting music, speech or other noises or sounds on the Reserves or any part thereof: Provided always that nothing in this Regulation contained shall be deemed to prohibit the bona fide and reasonable use by officials of any sporting body lawfully using the Reserves or any part thereof of any such equipment for the purpose of conducting sporting events.
- 10. No person shall clean fish in any part of the Reserves or fish at any point within the Reserves at on or within 100 yards of any pier, jetty or swimming pool.
- 11. No person whilst in the Reserves shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained carry, use or discharge any firearm, air gun or other lethal weapon or carry, use, explode or light any fireworks or explosives: Provided always that nothing in this Regulation contained shall be deemed to prohibit the bona fide use by officials of any sporting body lawfully using the Reserves or any part thereof of any starter's pistol or starting gun in the conduct of sporting events.
- 12. No person whilst in the Reserves shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained sell or offer for sale or hire any goods, wares, merchandise, produce or other articles.
- 13. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained camp in any part of the Reserves and then only in such part of the Reserve as may be stipulated by the Committee for the purpose.
- 14. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained light any fire in any part of the grounds of the Reserves and then only in such place in the Reserves as may be stipulated by the Committee for the purpose.
- 15. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained erect or install any booth, stall or shelter or any pier, jetty, landing or ramp or any other structure whatsoever and then only in such manner and in such places as may be stipulated by the Committee.
- 16. No person shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained bring into the grounds of the Reserves or any part thereof any motor vehicle or horse-drawn vehicle, and then only into such part or parts of the said grounds and for such purpose or purposes only as may be stipulated by the Committee.
- 17. No person shall ride or propel any bicycle or motor cycle in, along, across or through the grounds of the Reserves or any part thereof: Provided always that bicycles may be parked in such racks, stands or areas as may be set apart by the Committee for such purposes and to enable the same to be so parked or taken out

- of the Reserves after having been so parked, but for no other purpose may be propelled by hand from the nearest point of access by land to the grounds of the Reserves to the place where they are so parked or from such place to the nearest point of egress by land from the said grounds (as the case may be) without contravening this Regulation.
- 18. (a) No person shall bring or cause to be brought into the grounds of the Reserves or any part thereof any horse, cattle, dog, sheep, pig, goat or other animal, goose, duck, fowl or other poultry, nor shall any person suffer to be brought or to be in or upon the Reserves or any part thereof any horse, cattle, dog, sheep, pig, goat or other animal, goose, duck, fowl or other poultry belonging to him or in his charge.
- (b) The owner of any horse, cattle, dog, sheep, pig, goat, or other animal or of any goose, duck, fowl, or other poultry found wandering in any part of the Reserves shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations, and in addition to any other penalty or penalties, be liable to make compensation to the Committee for any damage done by such animal or poultry to the Reserves, or any part thereof or anything therein, and any and all such horses, cattle, dogs, sheep, pigs, goats, or other animals, and any and all such geese, ducks, fowls, or other poultry may be impounded or dealt with by the Committee, or by any of its officers or by any of its servants thereunto authorized by it as by any law

by the Committee, or by any of its officers or by any of its servants thereunto authorized by it as by any law for the time being in force provided.

(c) Notwithstanding anything in this Regulation contained, the Committee in its own discretion may at any time depasture or authorize the depasturing of live stock on any part of parts of the grounds of the Reserves, and may charge agistment fees therefor.

- (d) This Regulation shall not apply to any horse whilst harnessed to any horse-drawn vehicle entering the grounds of the Reserves or any part thereof under the authority of the Committee pursuant to Regulation 16 of these Regulations.
- 19. No person or organization or person or persons acting on behalf of any organization shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained and without first paying to the Committee such fees therefor as the Committee may demand, enter or remain in the grounds of the Reserves, with or in or from any part of the said grounds set up, conduct or operate, or take any part in the setting up conduct or operation of any side-show or any device, machine or operate, or take any part in the setting up conduct or operation of any side-show or any device, machine or equipment of, or in the nature of a merry-go-round, swinging-boat, oceanwave, miniature-railway, shooting-gallery, water-boat, or any other device, machine or equipment (whether of the same or similar nature or not) usually run by professional side-show proprietors for the amusement of the public for reward.
 - 20. No person whilst in the Reserve shall-
 - (i) remove or displace or deface or otherwise damage in any way whatsoever any notice or sign, or any board, tablet, or plate, or any support or fastening or fitting used or constructed or adapted to be used for the exhibition of any notice, sign or placard and fixed or set up by the Committee, or any buoy flag or marker lawfully fixed or set up by any club or other body:
 - (ii) climb, jump over, or swing on any of the trees gates, barriers, railings, or fences, or any of the said buoys, flags, or markers in or around the Reserves or any part thereof;
 - (iii) paint, fix, write, cut, carve, or in any way in-scribe or engrave letters, figures, or marks upon or otherwise disfigure any tree, wall, seat, fence, building, pier, jetty, or other structure in the Reserves;
 - (iv) post, stick, or otherwise affix to anything in the Reserves, any advertisement, bill, placard, or other notice;
 - (v) spit or expectorate on any path or lawn or other area in the Reserves;
 - (vi) enter any plot or other area within the grounds of the Reserves for the time being enclosed for the planting or protection of trees, shrubs, or grass, or go upon any cultivated area, or garden bed within the said grounds or pick or break any flower or shrub or tree therein;
 - (vii) without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained dig or otherwise make or excavate any hole in any part of the grounds of the Reserves or interfere in any way with the surface of the grounds thereof:

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- 21. No person or organization shall be entitled to use any part of the grounds of the Reserves for the purpose of conducting any organized event unless such person or organization or the person or persons acting on behalf of such organization shall first deposit with the Committee in cash (in addition to any fees for user which may be payable) the deposit moneys hereinafter mentioned to be applied as hereinafter provided, that is to say:
 - (a) In the case of the use of any part of the grounds of the Reserves without the use of any building, stand, booth, stall, ramp, pier, jetty, or other structure within the Reserves being the property of the Committee or appertaining to the Reserves such sum (if any) not exceeding Twenty-five pounds as the Committee may demand; or
 - (b) in the case of the use of any part of the grounds of the Reserves and also of any building stand, booth, stall, ramp, pier, jetty, or other structure as aforesaid such sum (if any) not exceeding Fifty pounds as the Committee may demand.

demand.

The deposit moneys so paid shall upon such person or organization (as the case may be) vacating the Reserve be applied by the Committee first in or towards satisfaction of the cost of restoration of or compensation for any damage whatsoever done to or suffered by the property of the Committee or appertaining to the Reserves during the conduct of any such organized event by whomsoever or whatsoever done, and also in satisfaction of the cost of cleaning up; any rubbish or litter resulting from such use, and the balance (if any) thereof shall then be refunded to the payer or payers of the said deposit moneys. The determination as to whether or not any such damage has in fact been done or suffered and of the amount or value of the said restoration or compensation, shall be in the sole, absolute and conclusive discretion of the Committee, and all persons and all organizations and the persons by or on whose behalf any such deposit moneys shall have been paid shall be deemed to have expressly agreed to the provisions of this Regulation.

- . 22. No person or organization shall be entitled to use any part of the grounds of the Reserves for the purpose of conducting any organized event unless such person or organization or the person or persons acting on behalf of such organization shall first pay to the Committee for user such fee (if any) not exceeding the sum of Ten pounds as may be demanded by the Committee.
- 23. Where any person or organization seeking to use any part of the grounds of the Reserves for the purpose of conducting any organized event seeks to make any profit in so doing, such person or organization shall also be liable to pay to the Committee for user in addition to such fee (if any) as may have been demanded by the Committee pursuant to the last preceding Regulation, such percentage not exceeding 50 per centum of the net profits (if any) earned in the conduct of such organized event as may be demanded by the Committee. In such case the Committee may require any such person or organization prior to the commencement or during the conduct of any such organized event at the option of the Committee to lodge with the Committee either such guarantee for the due payment of any such percentage or such reasonable sum as security for the due payment of any such percentage as the Committee may determine and no person or organization shall be entitled to use or to proceed with the use of any part of the Reserves or to conduct or to proceed with the conduct of any organized event therein while any of the 'said requirements which may have been made by the Committee pursuant hereto shall remain in any respect unsatisfied.
- 24. Every person who rows, drives, sails, or handles any boat or other craft upon the water area of the Reserves recklessly or negligently or in a manner which if dangerous to any other boat or leraft or to any other person or persons having regard to all the circumstances of the case shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 25. Every person who in driving or sailing or handling any motor boat or sailing boat upon the water area of the Reserves commits any breach of any of the Steering and Sailing Rules set out in the Schedule hereto, shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.
- 26. Every person who having driven any motor boat within a distance of 100 yards of any person bathing near the shore line or in or at any swimming pool or jetty or within the said distance of any boat or craft which is not a motor boat has done so at a speed or in a manner as to cause a wash which is a nuisance or

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annoyance to the person so bathing, or to any person or persons rowing, sailing, or handling such last-mentioned boat or craft (as the case may be) having regard to all the circumstances of the case shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

¹ 27. The Committee shall have power from time to time to make and amend rules not in conflict with these Regulations governing the handling of water-ski boats and power-boats, the use of water-ski jumps and the conduct of water ski-ing and power-boat racing, and to repeal such rules or any of them.

28. Nothing herein contained shall render unlawful any act, matter, or thing, lawfully done or omitted to be done by any person, club, or other organization, or any member of any such club or organization under or by virtue of the terms of any existing licence or agreement lawfully given or made by the Committee to or with any such person, club or other organization.

29. Every person who shall commit any breach of any of these Regulations may be removed from the Reserves or from any place therein or directed forthwith to leave the Reserves or the said place by any officer or employee of the Committee thereunto authorized by the Committee or by any member of the Police Force, and every such person who shall fail to comply forthwith with any such direction shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

THE SCHEDULE REFERRED TO IN THE FOREGOING REGULATIONS. Steering and Sailing Rules.

- 1. When two sailing boats are approaching one another so as to involve risk of collision, one of them shall keep out of the way of the other as follows, viz.:—
- (a) A boat which is running free shall keep out of the way of a boat which is close-hauled.
- (b) A boat which is close-hauled on the port tack shall keep out of the way of a boat which is close-hauled on the starboard tack.
- (c) When both boats are running free with the wind on different sides, the boat which has the wind on the port side shall keep out of the way of the other.
- (d) When both are running free with the wind on the same side, the boat which is to windward shall keep out of the way of the boat which is to leeward.
- (e) A boat which has the wind aft shall keep out of the way of the other boat.
- 2. When two motor boats are meeting end on or nearly end on, so as to involve risk of collision, each shall alter its course to starboard so that each may pass on the port side of the other.
- 3. When two motor boats are crossing so as to involve risk of collision, the boat which has the other on its own starboard side shall keep out of the way of the other.
- 4. When a motor boat and a sailing boat are proceeding in such directions as to involve risk of collision, the motor boat shall keep out of the way of the sailing boat.
- 5. Where by these Rules one of two boats is to keep out of the way, the other shall keep its course and speed.
- 6. Every boat which is directed by these Rules to keep out of the way of another boat shall, if the circumstances of the case admit, avoid crossing ahead of the other.
- 7. Every motor boat which is directed by these Rules to keep out of the way of another boat shall on approaching it, if necessary, slacken its speed or stop.
- 8. Notwithstanding anything contained in these Rules, every boat overtaking any other shall keep out of the way, of the overtaken boat.
- 9. In obeying and construing these Rules, due regardshall be had to all dangers of navigation and collision, and to any special circumstances which may render a departure from the above Rules necessary in order to avoid immediate danger.—(Rs.6286.)
