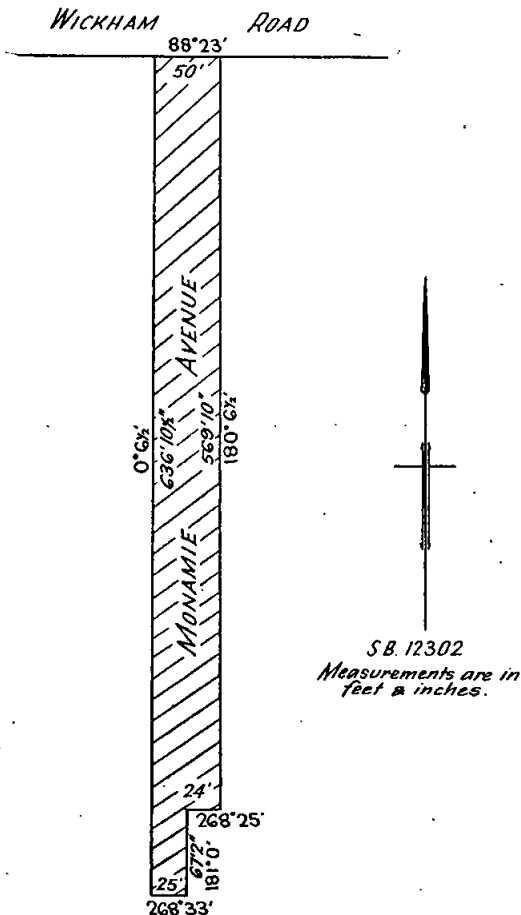
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act* 1958, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Moorabbin requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said City, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that part of Crown portion 37, Parish of Moorabbin, being the street known as Monamie-avenue indicated by hatching on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

PROCLAMATION OF PROHIBITED PERIOD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 3 of the *Forests Act* 1958, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the period commencing at midnight between the fifteenth and sixteenth days of December, 1961, and ending at midnight between the fifteenth and sixteenth days of April, 1962, to be the prohibited period in respect to any fire protected area other than a State forest or national park in the State of Victoria situated in such municipalities as are specified in the Schedule hereto.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 6802. An Act to amend the *University Act* 1958 in relation to the Appointment of Pro-Vice-Chancellors and Deans of Faculties.
- No. 6803. An Act to permit the purchase of Lands or Buildings for the purposes of or for the Efficient Working of the State Accident Insurance Office, and for other purposes.

No. 6804. An Act to vest portion of the Bed Soil and Banks of the Yarra River in the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works and for other purposes.

No. 6805. An Act to make Provision with respect to the Establishment of a Scheme for Providing Legal Assistance for Poor Persons.

No. 6806. An Act to amend the *Crimes Act 1958*.

No. 6807. An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Four million four hundred and sixteen thousand five hundred and ninety-five pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and sixty and One thousand nine hundred and sixty-one.

SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958* it is enacted that the Chief Secretary of Victoria, after consultation with the Minister of Forests, may, from time to time by declaration published in the *Government Gazette* declare any period to be the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria, or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may declare different periods to be the summer period in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, Arthur Gordon Rylah, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, do hereby declare the period commencing at midnight on the fifteenth day of December, 1961, and ending at midnight on the fifteenth day of April, 1962, to be the summer period in respect of the parts hereinafter specified of the country area of Victoria, that is to say:—

The Fifth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Cities of Hamilton and Warrnambool, the Boroughs of Koroiit and Port Fairy and the Shires of Belfast, Dundas, Minhamite, Mortlake, Mount Rouse and Warrnambool;

the Sixth Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the City of Colac, the Town of Camperdown and the Shires of Colac, Hampden, Heytesbury and Otway, except those portions of the said Sixth Fire Control Region comprising the land under the control of the Soldier Settlement Commission, which the Governor in Council has consented to being used for settlement under the *Land Settlement Act 1959* and being all such land situated—

(a) in the Parishes of Wiridjil, Waarre and Paaratte, County of Heytesbury;

(b) in such portion of the Parish of Coradjil, County of Heytesbury as lies to the south-west of the Cobden-Kennedy's Creek road;

(c) in such portions of the Parish of Latrobe as lie (i) to the west of the Old Princetown-road; and (ii) to the east of the Old Princetown-road and within 3 miles from such road;

the Eleventh Fire Control Region comprising the municipal districts of the Shires of Bairnsdale, Omeo, Orbost and Tambo; and

those portions of the Ninth Fire Control Region comprised by the Shires of Buln Buln, Korumburra, Mirboo, Narracan, South Gippsland, Warragul and Woorayl.

GEELONG HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

PORT OF GEELONG.

1. *Refinery Pier—Construction of New Berthing Head Completed.**Former Notice.*—No. 4 of 1960.

Position.—Fixed Red Light—south-eastern extremity Refinery Pier. Lat. 38 deg. 05 min. 28 sec. S.; Long. 144 deg. 23 min. 24 sec. E. (approx.).

Details.—A new berthing head has been completed to the southward of the existing Refinery Pier. Commencing at a point 315 degrees distant 1,141 feet from the above position, proceeding in a 225 degrees direction for a distance of 506 feet; thence in a 150 degrees direction for 957 feet to its seaward extremity.

Lighting.—During the hours of darkness the seaward extremity of the New Pier is marked by two Red lights vertically disposed, 3 feet apart, the lowest light being at a height of 18 feet above high water level.

Dredged Area.—The new berthing head is dredged to a depth of 36 feet over the following area. From a position 109 deg. 14 min. 35.6 sec. distant 45 feet from No. 9 beacon, Corio Channel, in a 351 deg. 38 min. 06.3 sec. direction for a distance of 1,160 feet; thence in a 060 deg. 00 min. 00 sec. direction for a distance of 750 feet; thence in a 107 deg. 22 min. 42.6 sec. direction for a distance of 308 feet to merge with the dredged cut inner limit of the northern berthing head.

Numbering of Berths.—In future berths will be designated by numbers commencing with No. 1 on the north side of the most northerly berth; and thence No. 2, No. 3 and No. 4 berth on the south side of the south berthing head.

2. *Dangerous Wreck Removed.**Former Notice.*—No. 17 of 1961 hereby cancelled.

Position.—Point Wilson Beacon. Lat. 38 deg. 05 min. 36 sec. S.; Long. 144 deg. 30 min. 27 sec. E. (approx.).

Details.—The dangerous wreck 098 degrees distant 13,270 feet from the above position has been removed.

Remarks.—Area is now clear of obstructions.

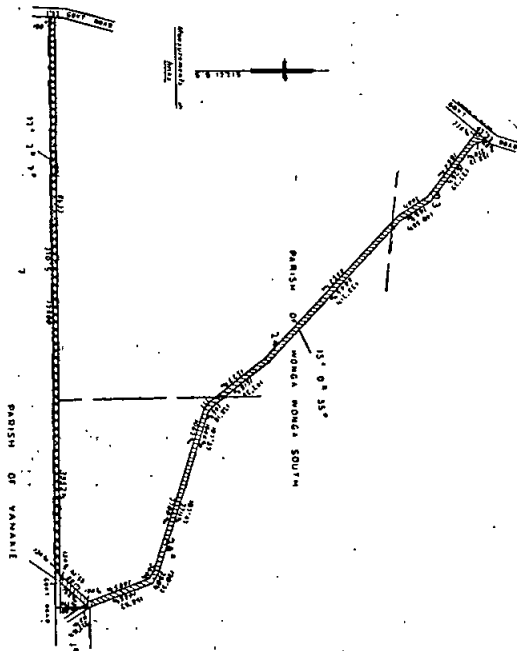

AMENDMENT OF HAIRDRESSING TRADES APPRENTICESHIP REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Apprenticeship Act 1958*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Hairdressing Trades Apprenticeship Regulations as follows, that is to say:—

(1) Sub-clause (1) (c) of Regulation 4 shall be rescinded as from the first day of April, 1962.

(2) Regulation 8, shall be rescinded, and the following substituted therefor:—

“Minimum Rates of Wages for Apprentices.”

8. As from the beginning of the first pay period to commence on or after the 1st day of November, 1961, the minimum rates of wages to be paid to apprentices in the said trades shall be as follows:—

(a) *Ladies' Hairdressing*—

1st year—at the rate of £4 0 0 per week

2nd year—at the rate of £5 5 0 per week

3rd year—at the rate of £7 10 0 per week

4th year—at the rate of £10 10 0 per week

(b) *Men's Hairdressing*—

1st year—at the rate of £5 3 0 per week

2nd year—at the rate of £7 2 0 per week

3rd year—at the rate of £10 10 0 per week

4th year—at the rate of £15 13 0 per week

(c) *Ladies' and Men's Hairdressing*—

1st year—at the rate of £5 3 0 per week

2nd year—at the rate of £7 2 0 per week

3rd year—at the rate of £10 10 0 per week

4th year—at the rate of £15 13 0 per week

5th year—at the rate of £17 12 0 per week

(3) Regulation 10 shall be rescinded and the following substituted therefor:—

“Proportion of Apprentices to Journeymen.”

10. (1) Subject to sub-regulation (2) of this Regulation—

(a) the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the trade of Ladies' Hairdressing shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to each journeyman employed by such employer in such trade;

(b) the number of apprentices who may be employed by any employer at any time in the trade of Men's Hairdressing and Ladies' and Men's Hairdressing shall not exceed the proportion of one apprentice to every three or fraction of three journeymen employed by such employer in such trades.

(2) With the consent of the Commission and upon satisfying the Commission that he has the training facilities deemed adequate by the Commission for the training of each apprentice concerned, an employer may employ in the said trades such number of apprentices as the Commission may determine in excess of the proportion prescribed by sub-regulation (1) hereof. Any apprentice employed pursuant to this sub-regulation shall not be included for the purpose of ascertaining the number of apprentices who may otherwise be employed in accordance with the provisions of sub-regulation (1) hereof.

(3) For the purposes of this Regulation—

(a) an employer working at the trades shall be deemed to be a journeyman;

(b) the number of journeymen employed at any time shall be deemed to be the average per working day of the number of journeymen employed in the said trades by such employer during the period of six months immediately preceding such time;

(c) 'apprentices' means apprentices or probationers and 'journeymen' means journeymen or journeywomen."

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REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "YEUNGROON CAMPING AND WATERING RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act 1958*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the remaining portion of the land in the Parish of Yeungroon, temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 4th February, 1878, as a site for Camping and Watering purposes, hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve".

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

2. No person shall bathe from the Reserve unless decently attired in a suitable bathing costume.
3. No person shall climb on or in any manner deface, damage or interfere with any buildings, fences, gates, structures, fixtures, equipment, posts, trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve.
4. No person shall remove from the Reserve any gravel, stone, sand or loam.
5. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move or displace any tree, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.
6. No person shall discharge any firearm or air-gun in the Reserve.
7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, goats, pigs, or other animals except sheep, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.
8. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone or other substance in the Reserve.
9. No person shall on the Reserve—
 - (a) Light a fire or burn any material except with the consent of the Committee, or in the places set apart for the purpose, by the Committee.
 - (b) Break glass of any kind or leave or deposit any matter or thing injurious to persons.
 - (c) Deposit or leave any bottles, glass, tin, can, waste paper, garbage or litter of any kind, except in the receptacles provided for that purpose by the Committee.
10. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve while in a state of intoxication.
11. No person shall offer for sale or hire any article within the Reserve or within any tent, booth or other structure thereon, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee.
12. The Committee shall have the right to refuse the entry of caravans.
13. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee or by any member of the Police Force to leave the Reserve.—(Rs.8099.)

TEACHING SERVICE (CLASSIFICATION, SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES) REGULATIONS.

AMENDMENT No. 25.

THE Teachers Tribunal, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Teaching Service Act 1958*, hereby amends the Teaching Service (Classification, Salaries and Allowances) Regulations in the manner following, that is to say:—

PART II.—SECONDARY SCHOOLS DIVISION.

In sub-clause 4 (b), immediately before the word "Camberwell", insert the word "Balwyn".

(To take effect from and including the 1st January, 1962.)

PART III.—TECHNICAL SCHOOLS DIVISION.

In sub-clause 5 (b), immediately before the words "Caulfield" and "Yallourn", insert the words "Brighton" and "Warrnambool", respectively.

Any permit granted by the Council for the carrying on of excavating operations for the removal of rock, stone, gravel, clay, soil or sand from land may, if the Council thinks fit, be renewed by the Council from time to time, but no such renewal shall be for a period in excess of one year from the expiration of the permit or any renewal thereof, as the case may be.

Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained clauses 3 and 4 of this By-law shall not apply to any land in which any excavating operations were commenced before the 10th day of November, 1938, and have since that date continued without substantial interruption nor to any other land on which excavating operations were being carried on at the commencement of the Local Government (Amendment) Act 1954, unless the Minister, in writing, approves of the application of this By-law to such other land.
