AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

NURSING COUNCIL REGULATIONS 1960 (No. 3).

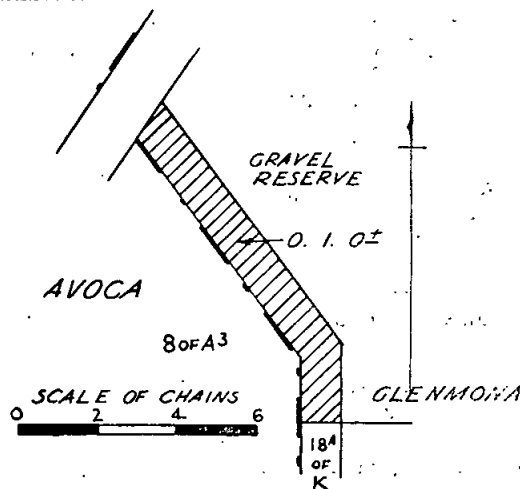

PURSUANT to the powers in that behalf conferred by Section 110 of the *State Electricity Commission Act* 1958 (No. 6377) as amended by any Act His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby, on the recommendation of the State Electricity Commission of Victoria make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Falls Creek Tourist Area (Amendment) Regulations 1961 and shall be read as one with the Falls Creek Tourist Area Regulations 1959 and shall come into operation upon publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The map in the schedule hereto is substituted for the map in the schedule to the Falls Creek Tourist Area Regulations 1959.

3. (a) In Regulation 4 (c) (i) of the Falls Creek Tourist Area Regulations 1959 the word "November" is substituted for the word "March".

(b) The members of the Committee appointed on the nomination of the Licensees pursuant to the Falls Creek Tourist Area Regulations 1959 and holding office at the commencement of these regulations shall continue subject otherwise to the said Regulations to hold such appointment until the first day of November, 1961.

4. Sub-paragraphs (c) (ii) (iii) and (iv) of Regulation 4 shall be deleted and the following substituted therefor—

"(ii) Not later than the 31st day of July in each year the Construction Engineer shall send by properly prepaid post to each licensee addressed to the address of such Licensee set out in the lease or licence under which he they or it uses or occupies land as aforesaid a notice calling for the submission on or before the 31st day of August next ensuing of names and addresses of candidates for appointment to the Committee on the nomination of the licensees.

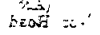
(iii) Any such submission shall be in writing signed by—

(a) If the licensee is an individual such licensee.

(b) If such licensee is a number of persons other than a number of persons being or forming an unincorporated body or the committee or other controlling group of an unincorporated body the person whose name first appears in the document creating such lease or licence.

- (c) If such licensee is a body corporate the secretary of such licensee.
- (d) If such licensee is an unincorporated body or the Committee or other controlling group by whatever name called of an unincorporated body the secretary or the person by whatever name called performing the functions of such body. A Certificate purporting to be signed by the Chairman of any such body stating that the person named therein is the Secretary thereof shall be prima facie evidence that such person is the secretary thereof.
- (iv) If no more than two names are submitted as aforesaid to the Construction Engineer on or before the 31st day of August aforesaid then such persons shall be deemed to have been nominated by the licensees for appointment to the Committee and the Commission shall appoint them accordingly for the year commencing on the 1st day of November next after such submission.
- (v) If more than two names are submitted as aforesaid the Construction Engineer shall cause ballot papers to be prepared containing all the names so submitted in alphabetical order and the address of each such candidate and identifying the licensee by whom each name was submitted. One such ballot paper shall be posted by prepaid post to each licensee at the aforementioned address of such licensee on or before the 15th day of September next ensuing. Such ballot paper shall be returned to the Construction Engineer by prepaid post on or before the 30th day of September next ensuing.
- (vi) Each licensee shall be entitled to one vote in such ballot and such vote shall be exercised by striking out the name or names on the said ballot paper other than the two names for whom such licensee votes. The ballot paper before being returned to the Construction Engineer shall be signed by the person required to sign the submission of names of candidates hereinbefore referred to.
- (vii) The Construction Engineer immediately after such 30th day of September shall count the votes contained in all ballot papers received by him on or before the said 30th day of September and the two persons receiving the highest number of votes and the next highest number of votes shall be the persons nominated by the licensees for appointment to the Committee and the Commission shall appoint them accordingly for the year commencing on the 1st day of November next ensuing.
- (viii) In the event of more than two persons receiving an equal highest number of votes or more than one person receiving an equal next highest number of votes after the highest number for any one candidate the Construction Engineer shall forthwith prepare ballot papers containing the names of all persons receiving the like number of votes as aforesaid and post by prepaid post one such ballot paper to each licensee at the aforementioned address of such licensee on or before the 14th day of October next ensuing. Such ballot paper shall be returned to the Construction Engineer by prepaid post on or before the 22nd day of October next ensuing. Each licensee shall be entitled to one vote in such ballot and such vote shall be exercised by striking out the name or names on the said ballot paper other than the two names or the one name as the case may be for whom such licensee votes. The ballot paper before being returned to the Construction Engineer shall be signed by the person required to sign the submission of names of candidates hereinbefore referred to. The Construction Engineer immediately after such 22nd day of October shall count the votes contained in all the ballot papers received by him on or before the said 22nd day of October and the person receiving the highest number of votes and (if two nominations are required) the person receiving the next highest number of votes shall be the person or persons nominated by the licensees for appointment to the Committee and the Commission shall appoint him or them accordingly for the year commencing on the 1st day of November next ensuing.
- (ix) If after such second ballot an equality of votes still exists then the Construction Engineer shall determine by lot which of the persons holding an equal number of votes shall be deemed to be nominated as aforesaid and the Commission shall appoint the person or persons so determined to the Committee accordingly for the year commencing on the 1st day of November next ensuing."

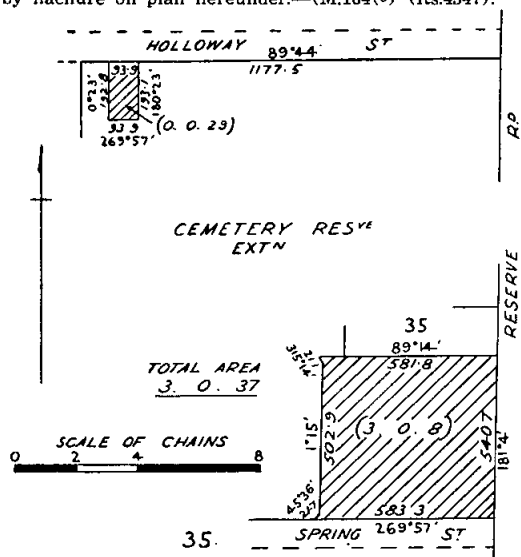

 - (2) to reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by or under any By-law made under paragraph (c) hereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of East Loddon order as follows:—

1. That this By-law shall come into effect immediately after its publication in the *Victoria Government Gazette*.
2. No person shall on any property situate at the junction of streets or roads use any portion of such property which is within a distance of 30 feet from such

junction for the growing of any trees, shrubs, or hedges unless for a distance of 30 feet from such junction each part of any such tree, shrub, or hedge shall be kept at a height not greater than 3 ft. 6 in. above the surface level of the street or road nearest to such tree, shrub, or hedge.

3. The owner of any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads upon which property any trees, shrubs, or hedges are growing within a distance of 30 feet from such junction shall, if such trees, shrubs, or hedges be of a greater height than 3 ft. 6 in. from the surface level of the street or road nearest to any such tree, shrub, or hedge upon notice in writing under the hand of the Shire Secretary of the said Shire, and within the time therein specified remove or lop, or cause to be removed or lopped all trees, shrubs, or hedges (whether planted before or after the commencement of the *Local Government Act 1958*), to such extent as may be necessary to bring such trees, shrubs, or hedges into conformity with the requirements of the preceding clause hereof.

4. The owner of any private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads upon which private property there is a fence within 30 feet from the junction of such streets or roads shall, if such fence be of a greater height than 3 ft. 6 in. from the surface level of the street or road nearest to such fence, upon notice in writing under the hand of the Shire Secretary of the said Shire, and within the time therein specified, cause to be reduced to a height not exceeding 3 ft. 6 in. above the surface level of the street or road nearest such fence any portion of such fence within 30 feet of the junction of such streets or roads.

5. Upon default being made by the owner of private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads in complying with any notice under this By-law and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty the said Council may, by its Engineer, or other authorized officer, enter upon such private property with a sufficient number of workmen and may remove or lop such trees, shrubs, or hedges growing or being thereon which have not been removed or lopped as required by such notice, or reduce in height any portion of a fence which has not been reduced in height as required by such notice, and the expenses incurred by the said Council in so doing shall be forthwith paid by the owner of such private property to the said Council and in default of such payment may be recovered by the said Council as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

6. For the purpose of this By-law—

(a) the word "junction" shall mean the point at which the building line of a street or road meets the building line of another street or road, and in cases where the corner has been rounded off or splayed, the word "junction" shall mean and include the whole of the arc or line to which such corner has been rounded off or splayed;

(b) the word "surface level" shall mean—

(i) where the footway on the side of the street or road which abuts on the private property in question is paved, the level of that part of the paved portion of such footway nearest to the private property in question,

(ii) if such footway is not paved and the level of the street or road abutting on such private property has been fixed in accordance with the provisions of Division 9 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, or any previous or subsequent Act of Parliament of a like nature, the level as so fixed of that part of such street or road nearest to the private property in question,
