Land Act 1958.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

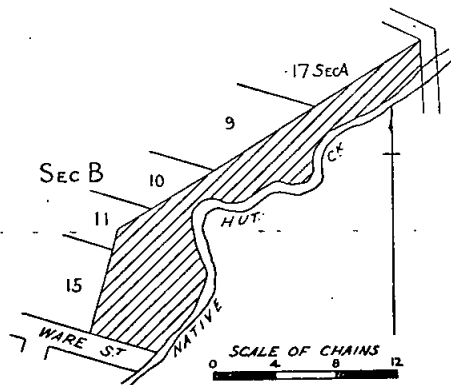

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

By His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 928 (2) of the *Local Government Act 1958*, provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality, not being a city or town, extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And where by Proclamations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 5th September, 1951, and the 7th September, 1960, the operation of the Uniform Building Regulations was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Avon:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Avon has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to that part of the municipal district to which the operation of the Regulations has not previously been extended:

Now, therefore, I, the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Avon to which the operation of the Regulations has not previously been extended and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned part of the municipal district thereof on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 8th June, 1961, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided, further, that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 8th June, 1961.

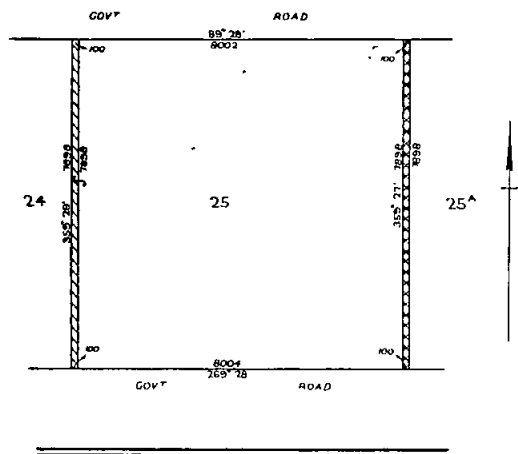

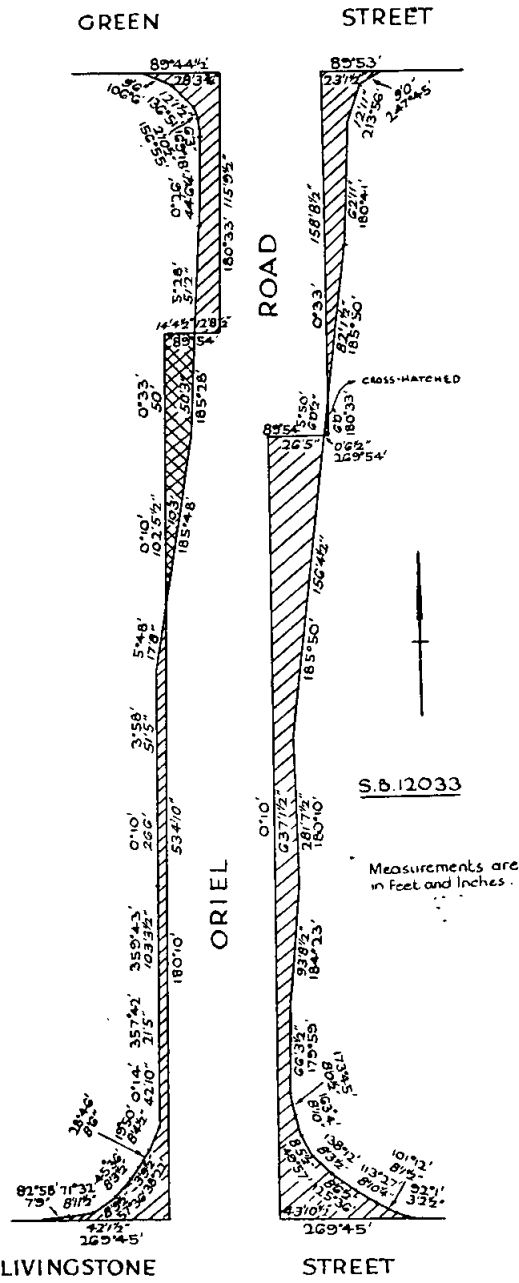

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation revoking the Proclamation made the fourth day of May, 1915, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th day of May, 1915, prohibiting the sale of trout not indigenous to Victoria and prescribing the methods of and Regulations for consigning, selling, marketing, storing and distributing non-indigenous trout of all kinds whether taken in Victoria or elsewhere and the treatment of non-indigenous trout of all kinds whether taken in Victoria or elsewhere for consigning, selling, marketing, storing or distributing as follows:—

(1) No person shall consign, sell, market, store or distribute any non-indigenous trout of any kind whether taken in Victoria or elsewhere unless—

- (a) Every such trout has been raised, produced and processed on a Commercial Fish Farm.
- (b) All such trout have the gills and gut removed.
- (c) All such trout are packed in cardboard, cellophane or wooden containers which have imprinted thereon the processor's name and also the name and locality of the fish farm on which they were raised and processed.

(2) Any person in Victoria who is treating non-indigenous trout of any kind whether taken in Victoria or elsewhere for consigning, selling, marketing, storing or distributing shall forward to the Director of Fisheries once in every month a true statement, in writing, of all such trout so consigned, sold, marketed, stored or distributed during the preceding month.

Explanatory Note.—These provisions do not apply to any angler storing fish for his own use nor to any processed trout imported into Australia from any other country.

INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1958* (as amended), and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Heidelberg (hereinafter referred to as the Responsible Authority) having commenced the preparation of a planning scheme, in accordance with the said Act, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any buildings or works on any land within the area described in the Schedule hereto.

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order no person shall use or develop any land or erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works on any land within the area included in the Schedule, except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the Responsible Authority.

2. Any application for a permit to use or develop any land or to erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works shall be accompanied by a sketch plan or copy of certificate of title of the land and a description of the proposed use or development and type of construction of any buildings or works proposed to be erected, constructed or carried out and such other particulars relating to the application as the Responsible Authority may require.

3. This Interim Development Order shall not prevent the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purposes for which such land or buildings were lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

AMENDMENT OF THE DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS.

2. Regulation 34 of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1930 is hereby amended by inserting in item 4 of sub-regulation (7), after the words "antibiotic metabolites" the words "except cycloserine".

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Racing Act 1958* and all other powers him thereunto enabling, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by

and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Totalizator (Totalizators Extension) Regulations" and shall come into operation on the ninth day of March, 1961.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Act" means the *Racing Act* 1958.

"Board" means the Totalizator Agency Board constituted pursuant to the Act.

"Manager" means the Manager of the Board appointed by the Board pursuant to the Act.

3. (1) Every office and every agency of the Board shall be open for the convenience of the public on such days as the Board determines for the receipt of bets and such other business as is authorized by Division 2 of Part V. of the Act.

(2) Every such office and agency shall be under the management or control of an officer, employee or agent of the Board appointed by the Manager to have the management or control of such office or agency.

(3) Every officer, employee and agent appointed by the Manager to have the management or control aforesaid shall be in attendance at the office or agency during the time such office or agency is open for the business of the Board.

4. The closing time for the receipt of bets at offices and agencies of the Board shall be a time determined by the Rules of the Board, which—

(a) in the case of a bet on a win totalizator or a place totalizator shall be not more than forty minutes before the advertised time of starting the race in respect of which the bet is made;

(b) in the case of an all up bet as defined in the Rules made by the Board shall be not more than sixty minutes before the advertised time of starting the first race in respect of which the bet is made;

(c) in the case of a bet on a quinella totalizator such time not being more than three hours before the advertised time of starting the race in respect of which the bet is made.

5. (1) The Manager shall cause a separate identification mark to be supplied to every person who makes or offers to make a bet with the Board by letter or by telephone.

(2) Every bet made with the Board shall be acknowledged to the person making such bet or bets by such means as the Board by its Rules determines.

(3) The Board shall keep a register of bets in which shall be entered details of every bet made by the Board including—

(a) the date and place of the race-meeting;

(b) the race on which bet is made;

(c) the name or names of the horses on which the bet is made.

6. Every officer, employee or agent of the Board having the management or control of an office or agency shall, in accordance with the Rules made by the Board, transmit all bets received to the Board.

7. The Board shall transmit to the appropriate totalizator on the racecourse on which the race-meeting is being conducted all bets received at all offices and agencies of the Board.

8. If at any time before the Board transmits any bet to the appropriate totalizator as provided in the preceding Regulation, the Board receives information that any horse has become a non-starter, the Board shall refund to the person offering to make the bet on such horse the amount of the bet.

9. Within seven days after the end of every calendar month the Board shall submit to the Minister a return of all moneys received by the Board from the appropriate race club which are payable by way of dividend and of all amounts of such moneys which have been paid or credited.

10. Any person who is guilty of a contravention of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

11. These Regulations shall be read as in aid of and not in derogation from the Totalizator Regulations 1955.

LONG LAKE WATERWORKS DISTRICT SUBDIVIDED,
AND LONG LAKE NORTH AND LONG LAKE SOUTH
WATERWORKS DISTRICTS, CONSTITUTED THERE-

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, on the recommendation of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, doth hereby declare, order, and direct as follows:—

(1) That as from the 30th day of June, 1961, the Long Lake Waterworks District be subdivided, and that two Waterworks Districts be constituted thereout, to be known respectively as Long Lake North Waterworks District and Long Lake South Waterworks District, and that the boundaries of the said Long Lake North Waterworks District (hereby constituted) shall be those set out and described in the First Schedule hereto; and that the boundaries of the said Long Lake South Waterworks District (hereby constituted) shall be those set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto.

(2) (a) That the scheme of works for the service of the Long Lake North Waterworks District consists of a system of channels with appurtenant structures.

(b) That the scheme of works for the service of the Long Lake South Waterworks District consists of a system of channels with appurtenant structures and a pumping plant.

(3) (a) That the total estimated cost of the scheme in respect of Long Lake North Waterworks District is £121,500.

(b) That the total estimated cost of the scheme in respect of Long Lake South Waterworks District is £283,500.

(4) That the sources from which the Long Lake North and the Long Lake South Waterworks Districts are to be supplied with water are the Wimmera River and the Gramplains reservoirs.

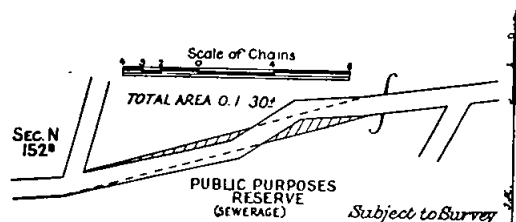

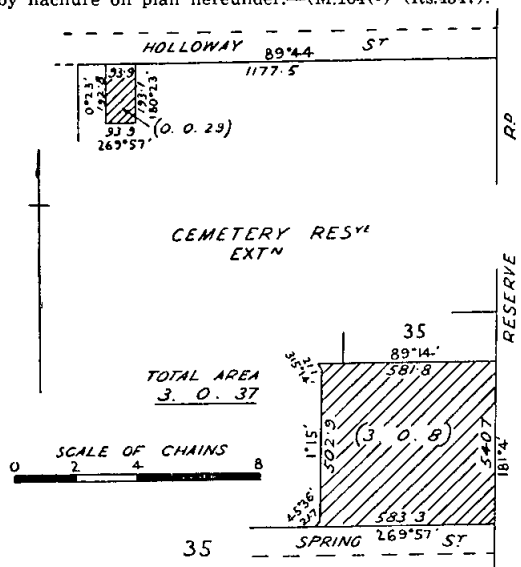

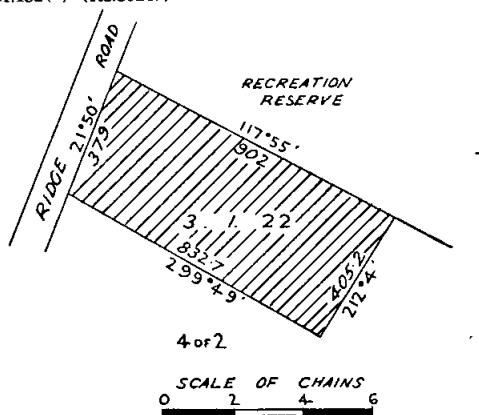

3. The owner or occupier of any premises permitting any person on such premises to contravene the provisions of the preceding clause shall be also guilty of an offence against this By-law.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Sandringham.

5. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not less than Three pounds and not exceeding Twenty pounds for each and every offence and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
