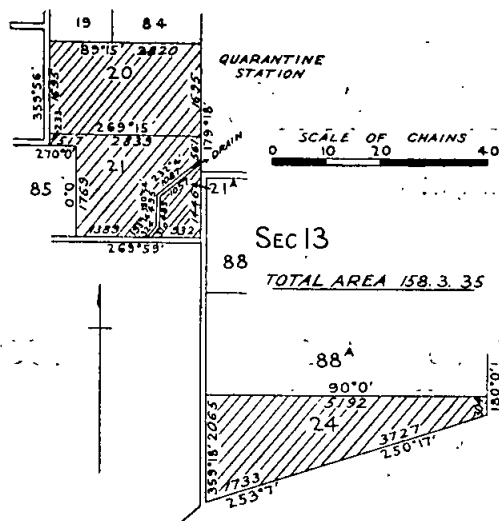

### APPRENTICESHIP COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 13 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1958* provides, *inter alia*, that after the Minister has taken into consideration any recommendation made by the Apprenticeship Commission the Governor in Council, for the purposes of the said Act, may from time to time by Proclamation proclaim any trades to be apprenticeship trades:

And whereas the Apprenticeship Commission, having notified in the manner prescribed by the said Act its intention to recommend that the trades of Instrument Making, Instrument Repairing, Instrument Making and Repairing, as carried on in the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District, be so proclaimed, and having received no representations by or on behalf of employers or employees in the said trades against such Proclamation, has recommended to the Minister that the said trades be so proclaimed:

And whereas the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the trades set out hereunder as carried on in the whole of the State of Victoria outside and excepting the Metropolitan District, to be Apprenticeship trades, viz.:

INSTRUMENT MAKING  
INSTRUMENT REPAIRING  
INSTRUMENT MAKING AND REPAIRING

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Supreme Court Act 1958* the *Commonwealth Matrimonial Causes Act 1958* and the Matrimonial Causes Rules made under the said *Matrimonial Causes Act 1959* and all other powers hereunto enabling the following amendment to Chapter II. to Rules of the Supreme Court is made.

At the end of Rule 150 there shall be inserted the following heading and rules:—

DESIGNATIONS PURSUANT TO THE MATRIMONIAL CAUSES ACT 1959 OF THE COMMONWEALTH AND TO THE MATRIMONIAL CAUSES RULES MADE PURSUANT TO THAT ACT.

150A. Melbourne Ballarat Bendigo Geelong and Sale are hereby designated as court towns for the purposes of the Matrimonial Causes Rules.

150B. The offices of Master of the Supreme Court are hereby designated pursuant to sub-rule (1) of rule 5 of the Matrimonial Causes Rules as offices the holders of which each may exercise or perform any power or function in relation to proceedings in the Court which is conferred on a registrar by the Matrimonial Causes Rules."

## Legal Profession Practice Act.

## SOLICITORS (AUDIT AND PRACTISING CERTIFICATES) RULES.

PURSUANT to section 88 of the *Legal Profession Practice Act* 1958 and all other provisions in that behalf enabling the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria doth hereby make the following rules of the Institute:—

1. These rules may be cited as the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1960 (Number 2) and shall be read and construed with the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1960 which rules and these rules may be cited as the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules.

2. These rules shall come into operation on the 1st day of February, 1961.

3. The Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1960 are amended—

(a) by deleting from Rule 19 all the words following the words "the auditor shall (a)" and preceding the words "certify under his hand in the register";

(b) by inserting after Rule 19 the following additional rule:—

"19A. The auditor shall retain the statement produced to him by the solicitor pursuant to Rule 27 of these rules until he has completed his audit of the trust accounts of the solicitor for the next succeeding year.";

(c) by deleting paragraph (c) of Rule 27;

(d) by inserting after Rule 32 the following additional rule:—

"32A. (1) Every solicitor shall at the end of each period of three months ending on the 30th day of September, the 31st day of December, the 31st day of March and the 30th day of June respectively prepare a statement reconciling the balances in his trust ledgers with the balances of his trust bank accounts and shall keep the reconciliation statement for each quarter in some appropriate book.

(2) It shall be a sufficient compliance with this rule if the list of ledger balances in the statement comprises merely the separate amounts standing to the credit of each ledger account in the same sequence as they appear in the ledger and the total of such balances without setting forth the names of the respective clients on whose behalf such moneys are held."

##### SHIRE OF HASTINGS.

##### INTERIM DEVELOPMENT ORDER.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Town and Country Planning Acts and of every other power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Hastings (hereinafter referred to as the Responsible Authority) having commenced the preparation of a Planning Scheme in accordance with the said Acts on the 2nd day of November, 1960, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any buildings or works on any land within the area described or shown on the map as the Schedule hereto.

1. After the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order no person shall use or develop any land or erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works on any land within the area included in the Schedule, except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the Responsible Authority.

2. Any application for a permit to use or develop any land or to erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works, shall be accompanied by a sketch plan or copy of certificate of title of the land and a description of the proposed use or development, and type and construction of any buildings or works proposed to be erected, constructed or carried out, and such other particulars relating to the application as the Responsible Authority may require.

3. This Interim Development Order shall not prevent the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purposes for which such land or buildings were lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

##### 4. SCHEDULE.

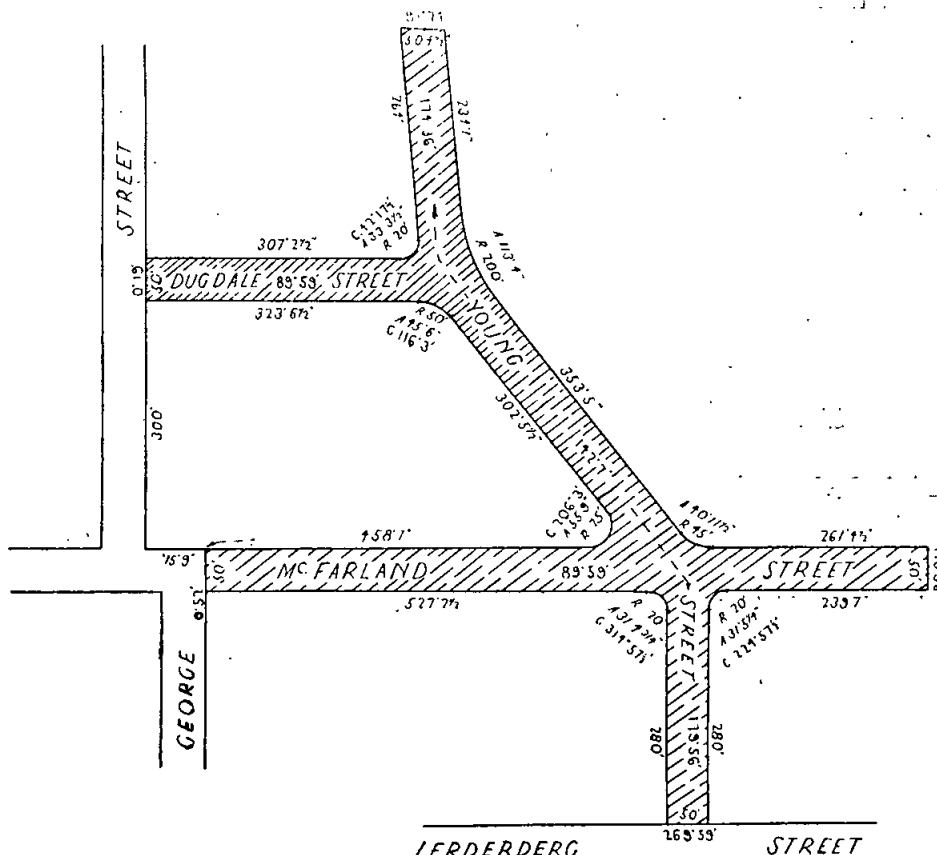

## AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 132 (1) of the *Coal Mines Act* 1958, No. 6221, Part III., the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby amend the Regulations made under the *Coal Mine Workers Pensions Act* 1942, as amended, that is to say:—

1. Clauses 18 to 20 inclusive are hereby rescinded and in lieu thereof there shall be substituted the following clauses 18 to 20:—

*"Contributions by Individual Mine Workers.*

18. (a) The Registrar as soon as practicable after any variation is made in the rate of contribution payable by each individual mine worker shall, in writing, notify each respective owner of the amended rate of contribution and the date from which such contribution shall be payable by individual mine workers.

(b) The amount of the weekly contribution from time to time payable by each individual mine worker, and notified by the Registrar, shall be deducted by each owner on each pay day from the amount payable by such owner to any mine worker employed by him.

(c) Within three days (or such further time as the Tribunal may approve) after the deduction by any owner of the amount of any weekly contribution payable by a mine worker such owner shall complete and forward to the Registrar a return of mine workers' contributions in such a form as the Tribunal shall direct and shall with such return forward to the Registrar all mine workers' contributions deducted by him for the period covered by the return.

*Certain Contributions Due and Unpaid by Mine Worker.*

19. Where through no fault of a mine worker his contributions fall into arrear, the Tribunal on his application may permit the amount of such arrears to be paid in instalments or in such other manner as it may determine: Provided that no mine worker shall be required to pay in any one week an amount in excess of double the normal rate of his contribution.

*Contributions by Individual Owners.*

20. (a) Within three days (or such further time as the Tribunal may approve after any owner by these Regulations is required to deduct from each mine worker employed by him the amount of such worker's contribution, such owner shall forward to the Registrar an amount of Two pounds, for each week, for each worker employed by him in such week.

(b) The first of such weeks shall end on the eleventh day of June, 1960.

(c) At the end of each financial year the Registrar shall calculate the amount of the contributions which should have been paid by the owners pursuant to section 121 of the *Coal Mines Act* 1958 by halving the difference between the total amount estimated by the Actuary pursuant to sub-section (1) of the said section 121 and the total amount of contributions paid by the workers to the Tribunal during that financial year. If the contributions actually paid by the owners for that financial year are less than the amount so calculated each owner shall, upon being requested by the Registrar so to do, pay an amount in respect of each worker sufficient to bring the total contributions by the owners to the required amount. If the contributions paid by the owners exceed the amount so calculated the Registrar shall refund to the owners the amount of the excess paid in respect of each worker."

(ii) paragraph (a) of Regulation 171 of these Regulations, only in that, the operation of re-zeroising having been commenced but not completed, the motor may be started and liquid delivered from such instrument with the indications of price and quantity becoming obscured and remaining obscured until the re-zeroising cycle has been completed and the indications of price continuing further to be obscured until they become visible in a subsequent normal delivery—

but which otherwise complies with these Regulations may be verified until the first day of January, 1962.”

- (i) a proprietary preparation consisting of or containing any of the sulphonamides or substituted sulphonamides which is not intended for human use, if such preparation is packed in a container labelled in accordance with the provisions of the Poisons Regulations and bears in addition the words ‘For Veterinary Use Only—not intended for use by human beings’ in prominent letters;
- (ii) a preparation of penicillin and/or streptomycin sold specifically for intramammary use in the treatment of bovine mastitis if the container of such preparation is prominently labelled ‘For Veterinary Use Only—not intended for use by human beings. Wear rubber gloves when applying. This preparation must not be used after the date of expiry thereon.’ together with a statement by the manufacturer or packer of the date of manufacture and the date of expiry; and”

(a) If an adult to be appointed to the office of Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade II., or

(b) If a minor, to be appointed to the office of Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade I., and be paid a standard salary appropriate to one year in advance of her age, and on attaining the age of 21 years, to be appointed to the office of Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade II.

(2) Pending permanent appointment any employee who is qualified as aforesaid may, as from the date of passing such test or the date of commencing duty, whichever is the later, be paid with the approval of the Board a total emolument equivalent to the salary to which she would have been entitled in terms of the preceding sub-regulation.

120 Words a Minute.

## Regulation 56—

(3) No officer or person shall be eligible to be appointed to the office of Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade III., unless she has satisfied the Board, by test, of her ability to write shorthand at the rate of 120 words a minute.

(4) Any Shorthand Writer and Typist (Female), Grade II., who satisfies the Board by test, of her ability to write shorthand at the rate of 120 words a minute shall be eligible from the date of passing such test, to receive an allowance at the rate of £16 a year.

Only permanent officers classified as Shorthand Writers and Typists, Grade II., may sit for the test at 120 words a minute.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under the provisions of the Local Governments Acts, and numbered 204, for the purpose of prohibiting the leaving standing of derelict or unregistered motor cars on streets or roads and providing for the removal and disposal of such motor cars and the imposition of charges for such removal and disposal.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation and have effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In this By-law—

“Council” means the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn.

“Derelict” means a motor car which is apparently abandoned.

“Motor Car” means a motor car within the meaning of the *Motor Car Act 1958* or any amendment thereof.

“Owner” means the owner as defined in the *Motor Car Act 1958* or any amendment thereof.

“Removed motor car” means a motor car removed pursuant to this By-law.

“Street” means a street or road as defined by the *Local Government Act 1958* or any amendment thereof.

“Unregistered motor car” means a motor car which is not registered in accordance with the provisions of the *Motor Car Act 1958* or any amendment thereof.

3. No person shall leave a derelict or unregistered motor car standing on any street or allow the same to remain standing on any street.

4. The duly appointed officer or officers of the Council may cause to be removed by such means as may be deemed fit any derelict or unregistered motor car left standing on a street.

5. The Council shall appoint a place or places to which removed motor cars shall be taken.

6. When such derelict or unregistered motor car has been removed as aforesaid, the Council shall, after reasonable inquiries have been made, cause to be served on the person who appears to the Council, or its duly appointed officer or officers, to be the owner of such removed motor car a notice in the form of the Schedule hereto and such notice may be served by posting the same in a prepaid envelope to such person at the address ascertained as aforesaid, but if the name and address of the owner of such removed motor car cannot be ascertained as aforesaid the Council shall cause a notice in the said form to be inserted in a newspaper generally circulating in the municipal district.

7. Unless some person proves to the satisfaction of the Council that he is the owner of the removed motor car within fourteen days after the service of such notice or such publication and pays the appropriate charge prescribed by this By-law, the Council may cause such removed motor car to be sold either by public auction or by private contract or otherwise disposed of as the Council may see fit.

8. The proceeds of such sale shall be applied in payment of the expenses incurred by the Council by such sale and the charge for removal and the residue (if any) shall be payable to the person who appears to the Council or its duly appointed officer or officers after reasonable inquiry to be the owner of such removed car if such person and his address can be so ascertained. If the owner and his address cannot be so ascertained or if within three months after the date of such sale no person shall have claimed such residue and produced such proof of ownership as aforesaid to the Council, such residue shall be paid into the municipal fund.

9. The Council shall release any removed motor car to any person who proves to the satisfaction of the Council or its duly appointed officer or officers that he is the owner thereof upon payment of the charge for removal and any other expenses properly incurred by the Council.

10. Any person who commits a breach of clause 3 hereof shall be guilty of an offence under this By-law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

11. The charge for the removal of any motor car removed pursuant to the provisions of this By-Law is hereby prescribed as Five pounds and such charge together with the expenses, if any, incurred in connection with the sale or disposal of the removed motor car may be recovered from the owner in any Court of Petty Sessions as a debt due to the Council by the owner.

12. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Hawthorn.

Notice is hereby given that the undermentioned derelict or unregistered motor car was removed from street on the day of 19 to the Council's premises in street, Hawthorn, pursuant to the provisions of By-law No. 204 of the City of Hawthorn.
