PROCLAMATION

No. 6774. An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Thirty-four million seven hundred and sixty-one thousand three hundred and thirty pounds to the service of the year. One thousand nine hundred and sixty-one and One thousand nine hundred and sixty-two.




And whereas the Soldier Settlement Commission after consultation with the councils of the municipalities concerned, has so certified:

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 (No. 6304). DECLARING THAT EGGS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

 WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

 (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith, upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof; and

 (b) make such further provision as will enable the
 - absolute property of the board as the owner thereof; and

 (b) make such further provision as will enable the board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner, and to deal with the same: And whereas by a Proclamation made on the 16th day of June, 1936, under the provisions of section 7 of the said Act, the Governor in Council declared eggs to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on 8th February, 1937, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing board in relation to eggs and egg pulp and assigned to such board the name of "The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board": Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on from and after the sixteenth day of August, 1961, all eggs shall, subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958, be divested from the producers of eggs and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any eggs coming into existence within two (2) years from the sixteenth day

of August, 1961, they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as the owner thereof, and to enable The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such eggs shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to The Egg and Egg Pulp marketing Board or its authorized agent within such_times at such places and in such manner such times at such places and in such manner as The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

By-LAW No. 80.

Water Supply.

MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS (hereinafter called "the Board"), pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred upon the Board by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958 (as amended), and in exercise and execution of any powers and authorities in anywise enabling the Board in that behalf doth hereby make the By-law following, that is to say:—

- 1. This By-law is to be read and construed as one with By-law No. 56 duly made and passed by the Board on the 7th day of October, 1952, and published in the Government Gazette on the 17th day of December, 1952, as amended by By-laws numbered 58, 59, 68, 72, 73, 74 and 77, all of which have also been duly made, passed and published in the Government Gazette (the said By-law as so amended being hereinafter referred to as "the said By-law").
- 2. The said By-law is hereby further amended as follows:—
 - (i) In clause 2 for the expression "Section 73 of the Board's Acts" there shall be substituted the expression "Section 69 of the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Act 1958".
 - (ii) In clause 10 (a) for the words "one shilling and six pence" there shall be substituted the words "two shillings".
 - (iii) In clause 10 (b) for the words "two shillings and three pence" there shall be substituted the words "three shillings" and for the words "four shillings and six pence" there shall be substituted the words "six shillings".
 - (iv) In clause 11 for the words "thirty shillings" there shall be substituted the words "two pounds".

- (v) For clause 13 there shall be substituted the following clause:—
 - "13 (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-law, the Board may supply water other than by measure for the purposes or in the circumstances hereinafter described upon the charges (payable always in advance) calculated or specified as hereinafter prescribed, that is to say. that is to say:
 - (a) For the making and mixing of concrete, for masonry and brickwork and for consolidating materials at the rate of Two pence per cubic yard of such materials as measured in the work.
 - (b) For general building purposes at such of the following rates as may be applicable upon the estimated assessable value of the completed building:-
 - (i) Buildings other than wooden buildings at the rate of One shilling and four pence in the pound during the period (from date of commencement) of three months where the abovementioned value does not exceed Fifty pounds; of four months where such value exceeds Fifty pounds but not One hundred pounds; and six months where such value exceeds One hundred pounds.
 - (ii) Wooden buildings at the rate of Eight pence in the pound during the periods specified in paragraph (b) (i) hereof.
 - (iii) From the termination of the period during which either of the above rates are applicable until the valuation of the teneuntil the valuation of the tene-ment with the building erected thereon is returned to the municipal council or a sup-plementary valuation thereof is made by such council or by the Board, at a rate equivalent to the water rate then made and levied by the Board.
 - (c) Through a hose to a garden not exceeding 100 square yards in area at a charge 100 square yards in area at a charge of One pound per annum, provided that the measurement of such area shall include all paths and portions of paved areas within three feet of any cultivated area, and shall include all areas which, in the opinion of the Engineer-in-Chief, are capable of cultivation.
 - (d) For work carried out or for any appliance or appliances affixed other than in or upon any tenement at the rate of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons of the esti-mated consumption of water.
 - (e) For other than domestic purposes to a tenement upon which a water rate is levied a charge of Twelve shillings and six pence per annum."
 - "13 (2) For the purposes of this clause 'estimated' means estimated by the Treasurer or other responsible officer of the Board."
- (vi) In clause 56 (a) for the words "fifteen shillings" wherever therein appearing there shall be sub-stituted the words "twenty shillings".
- (vii) In clause 57 (c) for the expression "the Water Act 1928" there shall be substituted the expression "the Water Act 1958".
- (viii) The Fourth and Fifth Schedules to the said By-law shall be deleted.

The said By-law as hereinbefore amended is hereby ratified and confirmed.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "PICNIC POINT RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the Land Act 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under ment of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the Parish of Drouin West temporarily reserved by Order in Council as a site for Public Recreation, and known as "Picnic Point Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

These Regulations are in lieu of the Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works on 7th March, 1929, in respect of the said land, which are hereby revoked.

REGULATIONS.

- 1. No person in the Reserve shall behave in a noisy or disorderly manner or create or take part in any disturbance or commit any act of indecency or offence against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
- 2. No person shall place in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 3. No person shall discharge any gun, pistol, rifle, air gun or any firearm, or any shanghai, catapult or other offensive weapon in or upon the Reserve.
- 4. No person shall in or upon the Reserve kill, wound, trap or snare, or attempt to kill, wound, trap or snare, any bird, kangaroo, wallaby, wombat, kangaroo rat, echidna, platypus or other native game, or have any dead bird, kangaroo, wallaby, wombat, kangaroo rat, echidna, platypus or other native game, or the skin or pelt thereof, in his possession.
- 5. No person shall in or upon the Reserve cut down, ringbark, destroy or damage any tree or plant growing thereon.
- 6. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve, except in a place set apart for that purpose by the Committee, and no person shall leave any fire which has been lighted by

him until the same shall have been thoroughly extinguished. No refuse material shall be burnt on the Reserve, except by a representative of the Committee, and then only in a place set apart for that purpose.

- 7. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.
- 8. No person shall erect any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure in the Reserve without the permission of the Committee or its representative, and any such tent, booth, stand, building or other structure may be erected only on the site allotted by the Committee or its representative. representative.
- 9. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
- 10. The Committee shall have power, from time to time, by resolution, to fix and regulate the fees to be paid for the use of the Reserve, or for the use of any conveniences provided therein.
- 11. A charge fixed by the Committee may be made for the admission of any car or vehicle to the Reserve.
- 12. The Committee shall have power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle,-(Rs.1507.)

BY-LAW No. 20.

A By-law of the Shire of Mirboo, made under the Health Act 1956, and numbered 20, for the purpose of providing for the collection, removal and disposal of refuse.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Act 1 1956, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Mirboo, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

- 1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the Mirboo North Township area, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.
- 3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter-
 - "Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.
 "Refuse" in
 - includes all wastes (except sewerage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises but but does not include garden clippings.
- The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.
- 5. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.
- 6. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 21 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.
- 7. Every proprietor shall be entitled to the clearance of one standard garbage container weekly.
- 8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an informative condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in papers.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

12. The proprietor (at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse) shall cause such receptacle to be deposited close to the street, lane or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

- 14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as the Council directs, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.
- 15. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.
- 16. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.
- 17. The person in charge of such vehicle shall cause it to be taken when full by the shortest practicable route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor.
- 18. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant, and maintained in a proper state of repair.
- 19. The contractor appointed by Council, or any other person or persons shall tip refuse, to the approval of the duly appointed officers of the Council, over the face of the refuse tip. Penalty for failure to carry out this clause shall render offenders liable to a penalty not exceeding £10.
- 20. Where refuse is authorized to be disposed of at a tip the proprietor thereof shall cause it to be deposited and covered in accordance with Schedule 4 of the General Sanitary Regulations 1950 or any amendment thereof.
- 21. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.
- 22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Fine pounds. not more than Five pounds.
