AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

NEERIM SOUTH WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 2. FIXING CHARGES FOR WATER.

THE Neerim South Waterworks Trust in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Neerim South Waterworks District, except within any Urban District thereof.

2. Minimum annual charges for water supplied by measure from the works of the Trust except in cases of special agreement with the Trust, shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto. Such charges shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Neerim South Waterworks Trust.

The minimum charges provide for one tapping only of the Trust's water main, and for each additional tapping there shall be a minimum charge of £2 10s., except that in all cases where there is more than one residence upon the holding concerned there shall be an additional minimum annual charge of £5 for each additional residence supplied, and that in such cases, if required a further tapping to serve each additional house will be allowed without further increase in the annual charge.

3. After the 1st day of January, 1961, the maximum allowance of water to be supplied per annum in respect of the minimum annual charge shall in each case be the quantity which, if charged for at Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to such minimum annual charge, and for all water supplied in excess of such allowance the charge shall be Two shillings (2s.) per 1,000 gallons.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO RESTRICT THE METHODS OF FISHING IN INLAND AND CERTAIN OTHER WATERS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation providing as follows respecting the methods of fishing in inland and certain other waters:—

1. Revoking the Proclamation made the twenty-third day of April, 1918, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 1st day of May, 1918, respecting methods of fishing restricted in inland and certain other waters.

2. Revoking the Proclamation made the twenty-fourth day of September, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the first day of October, 1930, respecting the prohibition of more than two rods and lines or hand lines in fishing.

3. Prohibiting fishing or the taking of fish by any method or in any manner except by rod and line or hand line with not more than two hooks attached from inland waters and also other waters in which the use of nets is or may be hereafter prohibited for the whole year, provided that—

(a) the hooks forming part of each spinner, spoon, flash or other artificial bait shall be considered as one hook;

(b) a rod and line or hand line with more than two hooks attached may be used in waters directly affected by tidal influence.

4. Prohibiting any person using at the same time more than two lines whether attached to rods or not for the purpose of fishing in or taking fish from any inland water.

5. Prohibiting fishing or the taking of fish by any method or in any manner in any marine waters in which netting is or may be hereafter prohibited during any portion of any year, except—

(a) by rod and line or hand line;

(b) by a spear, whether powered or not; provided—

(i) that a hand-propelled spear shall have not more than two prongs, each of which shall be without barbs of any type, and

(ii) that a spear propelled by a spring, rubber in any form, mechanism of any kind or used with a bow shall have not more than two prongs with not more than two floppers attached.

NOTE.—The use of a spear or any similar device in the waters of Corner Inlet and Port Albert and Shoal or Shallow Inlet is prohibited during the whole of each year, except in a portion of such waters generally northerly from St. Margarets Island in which the spearing of fish is permitted during the whole year.

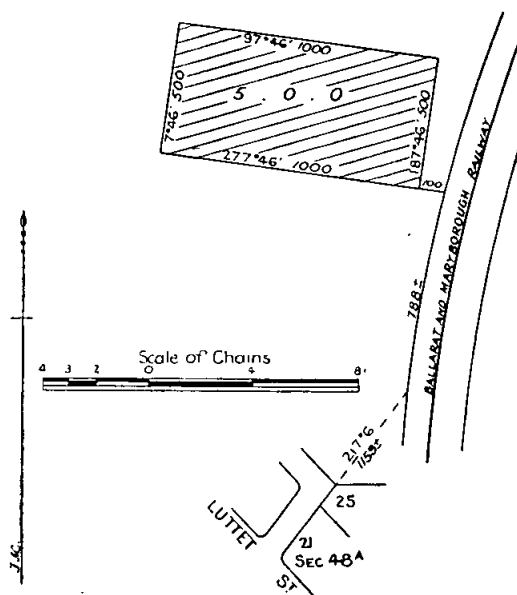

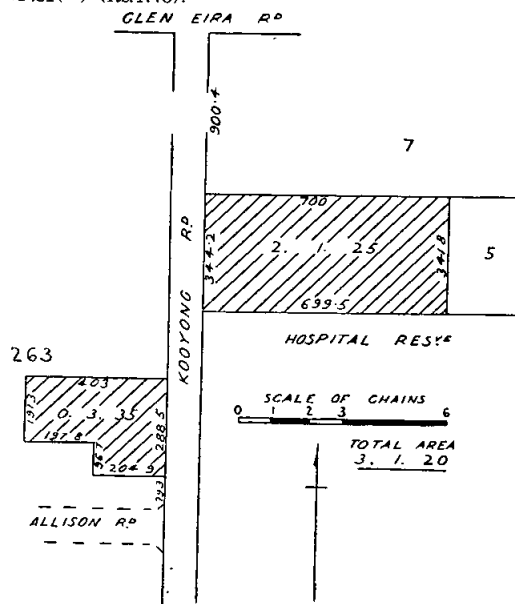

(b) That Clause No. 10 be amended to read as follows:—

Reception of Animals into Establishment.

10. Animals intended for slaughter may be received into the establishment on any day except Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, from the hours of 7.30 a.m. till 5 p.m.

(c) That Clause No. 19 be amended by deleting the words "during the last hour before the closing time hereinbefore prescribed" and substituting "after 4 p.m. in the forenoon".

(d) That Clause No. 30 be amended as follows:—

Deposit of Offal &c.

30. Any person who shall deposit or cause to be deposited any blood, offal, filth, or refuse matter upon any portion of the establishment or any road or land abutting thereon save in the pits, bins or receptacles provided for same shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

2. (a) That Clause No. 8 of By-law No. 107 passed by the Warrnambool City Council on the 17th day of August, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th October, 1954, shall and is hereby repealed, and that the following be substituted therefor:—

- (a) increasing the area of an existing allotment;
- (b) erecting one only additional dwelling-house;
- (c) erecting a hall, church and building principally used for religious purposes;
- (d) erecting a school and buildings principally used for educational purposes; and

(e) erecting a utility service structure, depot or works, constructed by a Government Department or Public Authority.

4. This Interim Development Order shall not prohibit the continuance of the use of any land or buildings for the purposes for which such land or buildings were lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order.

5. Every application for a permit under the provisions of this Order shall be made on the prescribed form, copies of which may be obtained from the office of the Responsible Authority, at 441 Moorabool-street, Geelong.
