Land Act 1958.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c. WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, Section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the *Milk Pasteurization Act 1958* (No. 6319) it is provided that a day be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* in relation to a prescribed district: And whereas areas known as the Barwon Heads District, the Torquay District and the Anglesea-Airey's Inlet District have been prescribed as Districts for the purposes of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday, the first day of November, 1961, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed districts set out above—

- (a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or
- (b) (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises.

Weights and Measures Act 1958.

ADDITION TO THE SOUTHERN WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Weights and Measures Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that, at the request of the Councils of all the municipalities concerned, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that any municipality specified in such Proclamation shall be added to and form part of a Union:

And whereas the Cities of Chelsea, Dandenong, Moorabbin, Mordialloc, Springvale and Waverley, the Borough of Wonthaggi, and the Shires of Bass, Berwick, Cranbourne, Fern Tree Gully, Flinders, Frankston, Mornington and Phillip Island do constitute a Union under the title of "Southern Weights and Measures Union" for the purposes of the *Weights and Measures Act 1958*:

And whereas the Councils of each of the said municipalities and the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Hastings have requested that the Shire of Hastings should be added to and form part of the said Union:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare that, as from and inclusive of the first day of October, 1961, the Shire of Hastings shall be added to and form part of such Union and do fix as follows the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving on the Union under the said Act:—

Regulation No. 6 made under section 4 of Part VI. of the Thirteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1903* for appointing the times and hours during or at which respectively any registered hall or other building used for public meetings or any building or any ground in which public amusements are conducted shall be used for the purposes for which it is registered or shall be closed is hereby repealed.

2. In this Regulation the expression "registered premises" shall mean any hall or other building used for public meetings or any building or ground in which public amusements are conducted registered pursuant to the said Part VI. and also public buildings registered with the Commission of Public Health under the *Health Act 1958*.

3. The times and hours during or at which respectively any registered premises may be used for the purpose for which such premises are registered shall be as follows:—

On Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday in each week from the hour of Eight o'clock in the forenoon until the hour of Twelve o'clock midnight next following; and on Saturday in each week from the hour of Eight o'clock in the forenoon until the hour of half-past Eleven o'clock in the afternoon next following.

4. Every registered premises shall be closed between the hours of Twelve o'clock midnight on the night of Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday in each week and Eight o'clock in the forenoon of the next succeeding day and between the hours of half-past Eleven o'clock in the afternoon of Saturday in each week and Eight o'clock in the forenoon of the next succeeding Monday, provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to any ball, private party or private social held in any hall or other building registered as aforesaid on any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday or Friday nor to any religious service conducted on any Sunday.

REGULATION No. 12.

Libraries.

A Regulation of the City of Camberwell, numbered 12, made under section 2 of Part IV. of the Fifteenth Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1958* in force in the City by virtue of a By-law of the City of Camberwell, numbered 89, for the proper management and control of public libraries belonging to the municipality of the City of Camberwell, or under the control or management of the Council thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Camberwell make the following Regulation, which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district:—

Repeal.—Regulation No. 9 of the City of Camberwell made by the Council on the 15th August, 1955, is hereby repealed.

1. **Definition.**—In these Regulations, unless the context or subject matter otherwise indicates or requires:—

- (a) "Librarian" includes the person appointed by the City of Camberwell City Council for the time being in charge of the library generally, or any portion or section thereof.
- (b) "Ratepayer" is any person who is an owner, lessee, or occupier of any rateable property within the City of Camberwell and is liable to pay rates on same.

2. **Use of Library.**—(a) Services of the Library on the premises will be available to everyone irrespective of residential qualifications, in accordance with the *Free Library Service Act*.

(b) No person shall without the Librarian's permission use the Library for any other purpose than reading, consulting, or borrowing the books of the Library.

3. **Reading in the Library.**—Any person wishing to use the Library may be required—

- (i) To register himself by completing a written form which shall state his name, address, and such other particulars as may be specified therein. Such form shall be prescribed by the Council, and a copy thereof shall be displayed in the Library.
- (ii) To accept a card, ticket, or token to be presented or surrendered as a condition of entry into the Library for the use of any book.

(iii) To make written application for any book for which the Librarian may require written application.

4. *Hours of Opening.*—The Library will be open to all borrowers in the various sections at such times as the Council may determine from time to time.

5. *Membership.*—Subject to the approval of the Librarian, any person in the following categories is entitled to borrow books for perusal:—

(a) Adult—

ratepayers (see definition) of the City of Camberwell, irrespective of where they live;

residents of the City of Camberwell who are not ratepayers, if guaranteed by a ratepayer of this City;

non-residents who are employed within the municipality provided they are guaranteed by their employer.

students, sixteen years or over, who are non-residents but attend school in the area, provided they are guaranteed by a ratepayer of the City of Camberwell.

non-residents who do not come under any of the above categories, who are residents of the municipalities whose boundaries join with the City of Camberwell, and whose municipality provides a Library Service in conformity with the Free Library Service Board and provides a reciprocal service to residents in the City of Camberwell may join on the completion of an "Application for membership form" from their own library, obtaining the written certification of their librarian and presenting it together with the necessary information completed on a Camberwell application form.

(b) *Teenage*—for boys and girls who live, work or attend school in the City of Camberwell, or who reside in an adjoining municipality offering reciprocal library service and who are not less than thirteen years of age or who attend 8th grade of a State School or 1st year of a High School on completion of the appropriate application form and obtaining the signature of a parent of the applicant.

Members of the Teenage Library may borrow from the Adult Library if they obtain the written approval of a parent of the applicant.

(c) *Junior*—any boy or girl who lives or attends school in the City of Camberwell, or who resides in the municipality offering reciprocal library service, and being between the age of eight and thirteen years, on filling in the appropriate card and obtaining the signature of a parent of the applicant.

(d) *Tinies*—any boy or girl, 3 to 7 years, of a parent who is eligible for membership may join, but the parent is required to supervise the child and is held responsible for books in his or her care.

6. *Borrowing.*—No person shall take away any book or other library property unless he has:—

(a) Made application for registration in a written form and become a registered borrower.

(b) Satisfied the Council by such evidence as the Council may require that he is a fit and proper person to be so registered.

(c) Signed an undertaking in a form which shall be prescribed by the Council, or if he is under seventeen years of age presented such an undertaking signed on his behalf by a parent, guardian, or other person who may be acceptable to the Council, that he or the person giving the undertaking on his behalf, as the case may be, will—

(i) Make good the loss of or damage to any book set or series whilst in his use or possession and pay any charges or fines incurred under these Regulations.

(ii) Notify the Librarian of any change in his address.

(iii) Not transfer to any person any book of the Library.

(iv) Not aid or abet any person in the use of the Library in his name except as an agent.

(v) Obey all regulations, ordinances, by-laws, and rules which may apply to the Library and any reasonable direction of the Librarian.

A copy of such application form shall be displayed in the Library.

7. *Condition of Books.*—Before using or removing any book from the Library for his use, a reader or borrower shall examine it and report any mark, blemish, or defect to the Librarian.

8. *Record of Loan.*—No person shall take any book from or hold any book out of the Library unless the Librarian has consented thereto and such record has been made in connexion therewith, as the Librarian may require.

9. *Period of Loan.*—No books shall be deemed to have been returned to the Library unless it has been handed to the Librarian or left in a place or receptacle in the Library designated for the return of books, or despatched to the Library in a manner and by means previously approved by the Librarian:—

(a) The time within which any book shall be returned to the Library by any registered borrower of the Library shall be fourteen days, Sundays and holidays included, from the date of the borrowing of the said book. Provided that where the last day for the return of the book is a public holiday or any other day on which the Library is closed, the book may without charge be returned on the first day thereafter on which the Library is open.

(b) A borrower may extend the period of loan for books or magazines issued to him by letter, telephone or personal call, provided that the book is not bespoken by another borrower, by giving the relevant information concerning the record of the loan. Books and magazines may not be extended by letter or telephone on more than two consecutive occasions without first returning them to the place of issue.

(c) Where a book is not returned as aforesaid the book shall be deemed to be overdue.

(d) Subject to the proviso in paragraph (a) of this Regulation, if a book is not returned to the Library within the time fixed by the Council, the borrower may be charged a sum not exceeding one penny (or such an amount as the Council shall determine) for each and every day (Sundays and holidays included) the book is retained beyond that time. No person shall be liable under this paragraph to be charged any sum greater than the value of the book concerned. Any borrower who loses or damages his Membership card or any stationery in the book used for recording the record of the loan will be required to pay the sum of 1s. for each and every item of stationery damaged or missing from the borrowed book and in the event of the loss of the Membership card a lapse of seven days may be required before a replacement will be issued.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Regulation, a borrower shall return any book borrowed by him within 24 hours after receipt by him of a notice by post or otherwise from the Council calling upon him to do so.

10. *Non-return of Books.*—(a) If a book is lost or stolen from a borrower, or is overdue, he shall replace it or pay to the Librarian the full value of such a book as the Librarian may decide. In the event of the book being part of a set or series, and the book becoming overdue, or the borrower being unable to replace the same in consequence of it having been lost or stolen, the borrower shall pay to the Librarian the full value of the whole set or series.

(b) The Council may take action for the recovery of a book, or the value thereof, at any time after the book has become overdue.

11. *Good Behaviour.*—No person shall—

(a) Enter or remain in the Library whilst suffering from any contagious or infectious disease.

(b) Enter or remain in the Library improperly or partially dressed, or discard or remove any part of his clothing therein, without the permission of the Librarian.

(c) Enter or remain in the Library whilst offensively unclean in person or clothing.

(d) Bring into the Library or keep with him or permit to accompany or remain with him in the Library any animal.

(e) Smoke, light, or use in any way tobacco or any similar substance in the Library.

(f) Eat or drink or prepare for drinking any beverage, food, medicine, or the like in the Library.

- (g) Interfere in any way with the comfort and convenience of other persons using the Library.
- (h) Use offensive or obscene language in the Library.
- (i) Make disturbing noises in the Library by speech or otherwise.
- (j) Deface, mutilate, or mark by cutting or tearing or by writing or by improper folding or otherwise any part of any book belonging to the Library.
- (k) Use in the Library any writing, drawing, or painting materials, or trace on or from any book, without permission from the Librarian.
- (l) Deface or mark by writing or otherwise, or damage or in any way misuse any fixture, furniture, or record of the Library.
- (m) Misplace or secrete a book or any record of a book in the Library with intent to hold its use from others.
- (n) Use the Library in any way in the name of another person, except as agent of such person.

12. *Offence*.—Any person who commits any offence against these Regulations shall, on being requested by the Librarian to do so, forthwith leave the Library and shall not thereafter, without permission of the Librarian, enter or use the Library.

13. *Name and Address*.—Notwithstanding any other provision of these Regulations, any person who is in the Library shall give his name and address to the Librarian on being requested by the Librarian so to do.

14. *Penalty*.—Any person who commits an offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

(3) In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Approved materials” means material approved by the Council.

“Dwelling” shall include a living-room, sleep-out or tent, and all rooms used for sleeping, living or cooking.

“Litter” includes wood shavings, tan bark, straw or dry grass clippings or other similar suitable clean material.

“Battery cage” means a wire and metal mesh cage divided into one or more compartments in which poultry is kept.

“Person” includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of premises.

“Poultry” includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese.

PART II.

This Part shall apply to all premises except “poultry farms” as defined under Part III. of this By-law.

(1) No person shall keep in any poultry-house or similar structure a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry-house or similar structure by four, unless confined in approved battery cages.

(2) No person shall keep any poultry on any premises, otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or an enclosure or battery cage, and unless such poultry-house or similar structure or enclosure or battery cage is—

(a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the premises has a frontage;

(b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street or road of a greater width than twenty-five (25) feet;

(c) distant at least five (5) feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than twenty-five (25) feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;

(d) distant at least forty (40) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining allotment.

(3) Every poultry-house or similar structure, except approved battery cages, shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material and the surface level of the floor shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed so as to hold six (6) inches in depth of litter.

(4) Every poultry-house or similar structure, except approved battery cages, shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brickwork, cement sheet or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least eighteen (18) inches below ground level, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.

(5) Every battery cage system in which poultry is kept shall have a permanent roof and any walls to be constructed of approved materials and having a floor raised at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

PART III.

Provisions Relating to Poultry Farms.

In this Part, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Poultry farm” shall mean any premises on which there is kept at any time a greater number of mature birds than twenty-five (25).

(1) No person shall keep poultry on any poultry farm otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or enclosed poultry-run or battery cage system.

(2) Where the number of mature birds is at any time greater than twenty-five (25) every poultry-house or similar structure or any enclosed poultry-run or any battery cage system shall be—

(a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage;

A By-law of the Borough of Eaglehawk, made under section 93 of the *Health Act 1958*, and numbered 39, for the regulation of the keeping of poultry.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958* and every other power it thereunto enabling, the

- (b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street;
 - (c) distant at least ten (10) feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
 - (d) distant at least one hundred (100) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land, excepting only that the owner or occupier may erect incubators or brooder-houses not less than forty (40) feet from his own dwelling.
- (3) Every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be roofed with approved material with guttering leading to water tanks or to adequate storm-water drains.
- (4) The ground surrounding every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be well drained.
- (5) The floor beneath any battery cage system and the floor of any poultry-house or similar structure shall be built up so that the surface shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

PART IV.
General Provisions.

These provisions shall apply to all premises on which poultry are kept, except those exempted by Part I. (2).

- (1) The owner or occupier shall keep the area of land within five (5) feet of any fowl-house, similar structure, enclosure or battery cage system free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse or other materials capable of harbouring rats or other vermin.
- (2) The owner or occupier shall cause the poultry-house, similar structure or enclosure or battery cage system to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean, wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.
- (3) No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry is kept any food for consumption by poultry, unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles or rat-proof buildings.
- (4) Poultry droppings, litter and refuse shall be moved from the premises from time to time as Council directs so as not to cause a nuisance or offensive conditions.
- (5) Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

BOROUGH OF EAGLEHAWK.
BY-LAW NO. 40.

A By-law of the Borough of Eaglehawk, made under section 93 of the Health Act 1958, and numbered 40, for the regulation of the collection, removal and disposal of refuse.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958 and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Borough of Eaglehawk order as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette.
- 2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Eaglehawk, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every-house, building and premises therein.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

- “Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, the occupier or any person having the management or control thereof.
- “Refuse” includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building or premises.
- “Approved material” means material approved by the Council.

4. The proprietor of every house, building or premises shall provide, keep and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building or premises.

5. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24-gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

6. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet and shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles to make it capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

7. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

8. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall he deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.

9. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

10. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside of the entrance to such house, building or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

11. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

12. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council. Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

13. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

14. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered, except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

15. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered water-tight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

16. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.

17. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry or indented, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the conclusion of each day's depositing the contractor or the person or persons authorized or employed by the Council shall bind the surface with clean earth, lime or other approved material so as not to create any nuisance.

18. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

BY-LAW No. 46.

By-law Relating to the Keeping of Poultry.

PART I.—INTRODUCTION.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and of any other power enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Maffra in the name of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire for purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. The provisions of By-law No. 32—so far as they relate to the keeping of poultry are hereby repealed, immediately this By-law comes into effective operation.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district except to premises registered as a poultry-killing premises and poultry saleyards when so exempt, in writing, by the Council.

4. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—

"Approved materials" means material approved by the Council.

"Dwelling" shall include a living-room, sleepout or tent, and all rooms used for sleeping, living or cooking.

"Litter" includes wood shavings, tan bark, straw or dry grass clippings or other similar suitable clean material.

"Battery cage" means a wire and metal mesh cage divided into one or more compartments in which poultry is kept.

"Persons" includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of premises.

"Poultry" includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese.

PART II.

This part shall apply to areas zoned as residential under the Town and Country Planning Acts.

1. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any premises in an area zoned as residential a number of fowls greater than twenty-five (25) mature birds.

2. No person shall keep in any poultry-house or similar structure a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry-house or similar structure by four unless confined in approved battery cages.

3. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any one property more than two (2) turkeys, ducks or geese, that is to say, a total of two (2) birds of any of the said varieties.

4. No person shall keep any poultry on any premises—in an area zoned as residential—otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or an enclosure or battery cage and unless such poultry-house or similar structure or enclosure or battery cage is:—

(a) Distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the premises has a frontage;

(b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street or road of a greater width than twenty-five (25) feet;

- (c) distant at least five (5) feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than twenty-five (25) feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
- (d) distant at least forty (40) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining allotment.

5. Every poultry-house or similar structure, except approved battery cages, shall be roofed with approved material and paved with impervious material and the surface level of the floor shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed so as to hold six (6) inches in depth of litter.

6. Every poultry-house or similar structure except approved battery cages shall be rendered rat-proof to the satisfaction of the Building Surveyor or Health Inspector, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.

7. Every battery cage system in which poultry is kept in an area zoned as residential shall have a permanent roof and any walls to be constructed of approved materials and having a floor at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

PART III.

Provisions Relating to Poultry Farms.

In this section unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Poultry farm” shall mean any premises on which there is kept at any time a greater number of mature birds than twenty-five (25).

1. No person shall keep poultry on any poultry farm otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or enclosed poultry-run or battery cage system.

2. Where the number of mature birds is at any time greater than twenty-five (25) every poultry-house or similar structure or any enclosed poultry-run or any battery cage system shall be—

- (a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage;
- (b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street;
- (c) distant at least ten (10) feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;
- (d) distant at least one hundred (100) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land, excepting only that the owner or occupier may erect incubators or brooder-houses not less than forty (40) feet from his own dwelling.

3. Every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be roofed with approved material with guttering leading to water tanks or to adequate storm-water drains.

4. The ground surrounding every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be well drained.

5. The floor beneath the battery cage system and the floor of any poultry-house or similar structure shall be built up so that the surface shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

PART IV.—GENERAL PROVISIONS.

These provisions shall apply to all premises on which poultry are kept except those exempted by Part I (3).

1. The owner or occupier shall keep the area of land within five (5) feet of any fowl-house, similar structure, enclosure or battery cage system free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse or other materials capable of harbouring rats or other vermin.

2. The owner or occupier shall cause the poultry-house, structure or enclosure or battery cage system to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean and wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.

3. No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry is kept, any food for consumption by poultry unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles or rat-proof buildings.

4. Poultry droppings, litter and refuse shall be moved from the premises from time to time as Council directs so as not to cause a nuisance or offensive conditions.

5. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

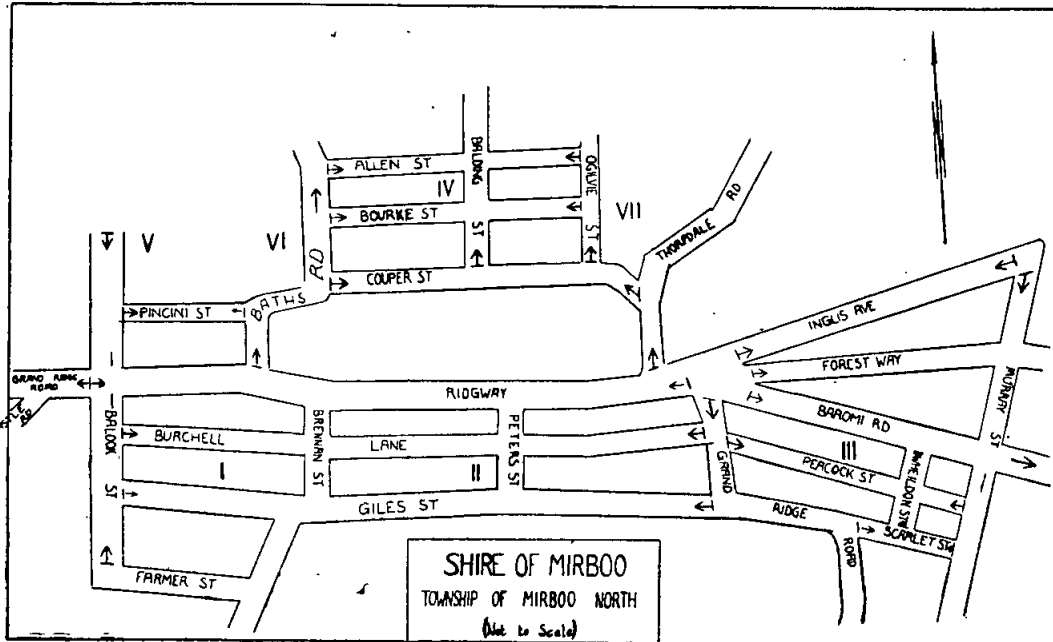
