Land Act 1958.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF PART XLIII. TO THE MUNICIPAL DISTRICT OF THE SHIRE OF KEILOR.

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 824 of the *Local Government Act* 1958 provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, extend the operation of Part XLIII. of the Act to any city or town, or at the request of the council concerned, to any other municipality or part thereof:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation do hereby extend the operation of Part XLIII. of the *Local Government Act* 1958 to the municipal district of the Shire of Keilor.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I GILBERT LAWRENCE CHANDLER, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be Fifty-seven point eight one per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of February, 1961.

CHEESE QUOTA.

I GILBERT LAWRENCE CHANDLER, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of cheese at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured hereby determine a quota for cheese as follows:—

The proportion shall be Fifty-seven point one four per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of February, 1961.

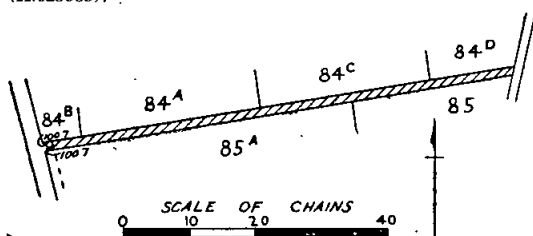

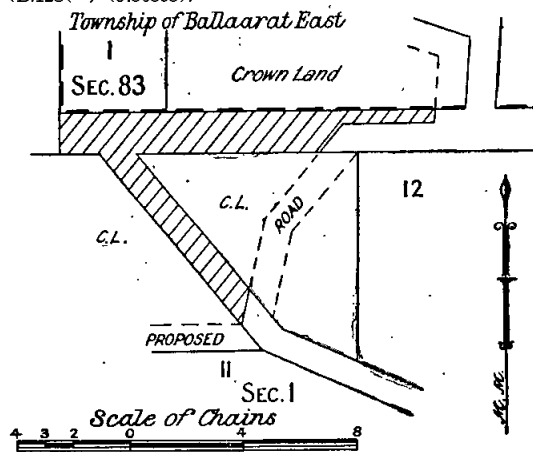

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, in pursuance of the provisions of section 17 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and in compliance with the prayer of a petition signed by twenty-five ratepayers resident in portion of the Shire of Mirboo do, by this Order, proclaim as the Township of Mirboo North that portion of the Shire of Mirboo defined hereunder:—

Commencing at the south-western angle of allotment 102, Parish of Allambee East; thence southerly by a road to the north-eastern angle of allotment 7A, Parish of Mardan; thence westerly by a road to the north-western angle of allotment 7; thence southerly by the western boundary and easterly by the southern boundary of that allotment, further easterly by the southern boundary of allotment 7B and northerly by a road to the north-western angle of allotment 41, Parish of Mirboo; thence by the northern boundary of that allotment and a line in continuation thereof bearing east 7,385 links; thence by lines bearing north 875 links, south 75 deg. 29 min. east 1,240 links, north 62 deg. 38 min. east 3,145 links and east 2,060 links; thence north-easterly by a road to the eastern angle of allotment 10, section A (Gravel Reserve); thence north-westerly by a road, south-westerly by the north-western boundary of allotment 18 and westerly by the northern boundaries of allotments 13 and 14, and the northern boundary of allotment 7A and a line in continuation thereof to the Railway Reserve; thence north-easterly by the Railway Reserve to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 120C, Parish of Mirboo; thence westerly by a line, the said boundary, the southern boundary of allotments 120F and 149 and the southern boundary of allotment 102, Parish of Allambee East, to the commencing point.
