PROCLAMATION

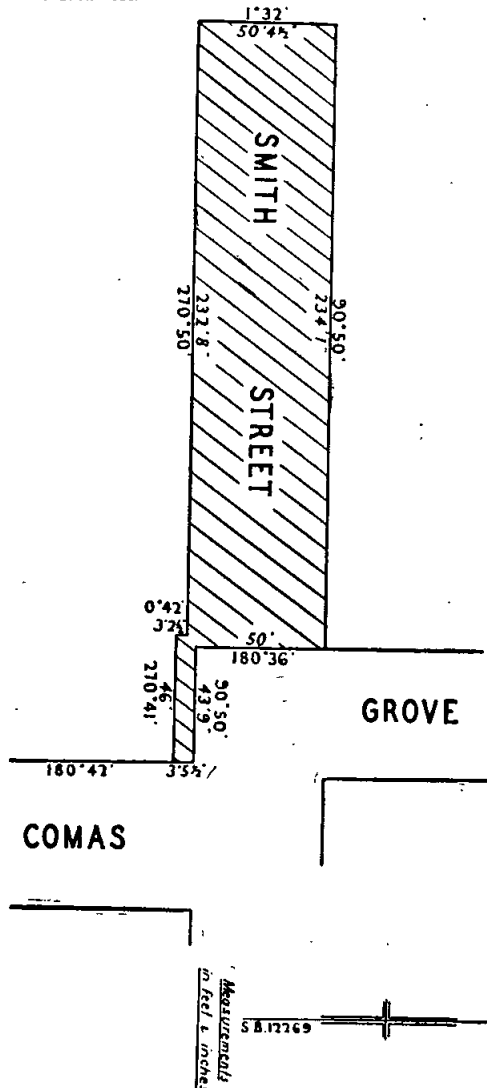
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the council of any municipal

pality, by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas, the Council of the City of Northcote requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used for a street within the said city, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that part of Crown portion 131, Parish of Jika Jika being the portion of the street known as Smith-street indicated by hatching on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

WOODEND WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT, PROCLAIMED 23RD MARCH, 1960, "VICTORIA GOVERNMENT GAZETTE No. 23", PURSUANT TO SECTION 22 OF THE SOIL CONSERVATION AND LAND UTILIZATION ACT 1958 (No. 6372).

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in section 23, sub-section (1) of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958*, the Soil Conservation Authority by Resolution dated 18th September, 1961, made a land-use determination as described in the following categories and indicated by hachure on Plan No. 946 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham-road, Kew, with respect to all that piece of land in the Parish of Newham, within the boundary of the Woodend Water Supply Catchment.

1. Land which should be permanently used for forest purposes where forestry operations shall be restricted to the minimum required for proper forest maintenance to keep the forest in good condition as imposed by the Authority, or as required by the Forests Commission acting as agent for the Authority.

2. Land which should be permanently used for forest purposes where commercial logging operations may be carried out under the supervision and control of the Forests Commission acting as agent for the Authority.

3. Forested land, which if approved by the Authority may be used for pasture or for agriculture, subject to conditions imposed according to the particular circumstances the conditions to include, among others, the degree of clearing permissible and the specification of those areas where timber shall be retained.

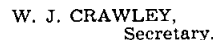
4. Cleared land at present carrying bracken or other protective vegetative cover on which there shall be no change of land-use except with the approval of and under conditions imposed by the Authority.

5. Cleared land suitable for pasture or for agriculture, subject to conditions imposed by the Authority for the particular circumstances.

6. Land within 1 chain, or such greater distance as the Authority may specify from specified streams, springs, off-takes and storages on which land-use shall be subject to conditions imposed by the Authority, but in no circumstances shall cultivation or erection of buildings be permitted.

7. Land which may be used for residential purposes, subject to provisions of other relevant Acts.

8. Land reserved for roads and other public purposes on which any changes from the existing nature and conditions shall be made only after consultation with the Authority.



IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1958*, as amended, the Governor in Council, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, on the 17th October, 1961, approved a Planning Scheme entitled the *City of Ararat Planning Scheme 1953, Amendment No. 1, 1961*, in respect of part of the municipal district of the *City of Ararat*.

SHIRE OF MORNINGTON.—ORDER CONFIRMED.

THE Minister of the Crown administering the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, on the 6th day of October, 1961, confirmed the Order hereinafter referred to, in pursuance of section 514 of the said Act, namely:—

An Order of the Council of the Shire of Mornington made on the 8th September, 1961, for the purpose of providing a place of public resort and recreation and for acquiring for that purpose all that piece of land being part of Crown allotment 33, section 22, Parish of Moorooduc, commencing at a point on the south-western building line of Separation-street distant 25 ft. 4 in. from the intersection of the said building line with the south-eastern building line of Iluka-place; thence bearing 147 deg. 55½ min. for 66 ft. 2½ in., 238 deg. 1 min. for 160 ft. 1½ in., 327 deg. 48 min. for 61 ft. 11 in. and thence 56 deg. 29 min. for 161 ft. 2 in. to the point of commencement.

LAND SURVEYORS ACT 1958.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Land Surveyors Act 1958* and all other powers it thereunto enabling, the Surveyors Board, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations shall be cited as the Land Surveyors (Amending) Regulations 1961.

2. These Regulations shall amend the Land Surveyors Regulations, Part 1, published in the *Government Gazette* dated the twentieth day of June, 1952, in the manner hereinafter set forth.

3. For Regulation 2 there shall be substituted the following Regulation:—

"2. (1) A person entering into Indentures of Apprenticeship on or before the 30th of June, 1963, shall prior to so entering produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Board that he has passed—

- (a) the matriculation or entrance examination of a University, or
- (b) an examination accepted by a University as being equivalent to the matriculation or entrance examination:

Provided that the examination passed by the candidate shall include a pass in the subjects, English, Algebra, Geometry, and Trigonometry at a standard not below that of Leaving Certificate examination of the University of Melbourne.

(2) A person entering into Indentures of Apprenticeship on or after the 1st of July, 1963, shall prior to so entering produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Board that he has passed—

- (a) a Degree or Diploma in surveying granted by a University which, in the opinion of the Board, provides sufficient training and instruction in the principles and practice of surveying and in which a representative of the Board, or of a reciprocating Board, acts as co-examiner in those subjects relating to surveying, or
- (b) a Degree or Diploma in surveying granted by an Institute of Technology, which, in the opinion of the Board, provides sufficient training and instruction in the principles and practice of surveying and in which a representative of the Board, or of a reciprocating Board, acts as co-examiner in those subjects relating to surveying, or
- (c) a Degree or Diploma in surveying granted by a State Department of Education, which in the opinion of the Board, provides sufficient training and instruction in the principles and practice of Surveying and in which a representative of the Board, or of a reciprocating Board, acts as a co-examiner in those subjects relating to surveying.

Provided that the examination passed by the person shall include a pass in the subject English Expression at Matriculation standard of the Melbourne University or its equivalent.

4. In Regulation 3, for the words "three months" (where twice occurring), there shall be substituted the words "six months".

5. In sub-regulation (2) of Regulation 4, for the words "three months", there shall be substituted the words "six months".

6. For paragraph (a) of sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 8, there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

- "(a) An experience approved by the Board of not less than twelve months in the field under the supervision of a civil engineer or licensed surveyor. six month's professional service in the field."

7. In sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 16, before the word "Surveyors" there shall be inserted the word "Land".

8. For sub-regulation (5) of Regulation 19 there shall be substituted the following sub-regulations:—

"(5) *Astronomy.*

Spherical trigonometry; azimuth, altitude, hour angle, time, right ascension, declination and the relation between them; use of the Star Almanac for Land Surveyors; corrections to star or sun observations; effect of errors of adjustment of instruments; determination of azimuth, longitude, latitude and time.

"(5A) *Geodesy.*

Figure of the earth; reduction of length to sea level; corrections for curvature and refraction, trigonometrical heights of stations; spherical excess; calculations of geodetic latitude and

longitude; reverse azimuth and convergence of meridians; laying down parallels of latitude; elements of map projection with special emphasis on the Transverse Mercator and Lambert's conformal projections; calculations for co-ordinates of the Transverse Mercator and Lambert's conformal projections from latitude and longitude and vice versa; zoning and the scale factors involved; principles of and the general procedure for first and second order and minor triangulation, including reconnaissance, observing, beaconing and permanent marking; field book practice, summaries and strength of figures; visibility of stations; base nets, resections; computations connected with triangulation and the use of tables of radii and curvature.

Special formulae in Geodesy and Map projections will be supplied in the Examination.

9. Regulation 21 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) For sub-regulation 4, there shall be substituted the following sub-regulation:—

“(4) A candidate who submits satisfactory evidence of having passed the University examinations in a Degree Course in Surveying or in any subject in any other examination which, in the opinion of the Board, is equivalent to a subject of the Land Surveyors Examinations, as conducted by it, may at the discretion of the Board, without further examination be credited with a pass in such subject.

(b) Sub-regulation (5) is revoked.

Pursuant to the provisions of section 16 (1) of the *Land Surveyors Act 1958*, the Governor in Council hereby approves of the Surveyors Board making the above Regulations.

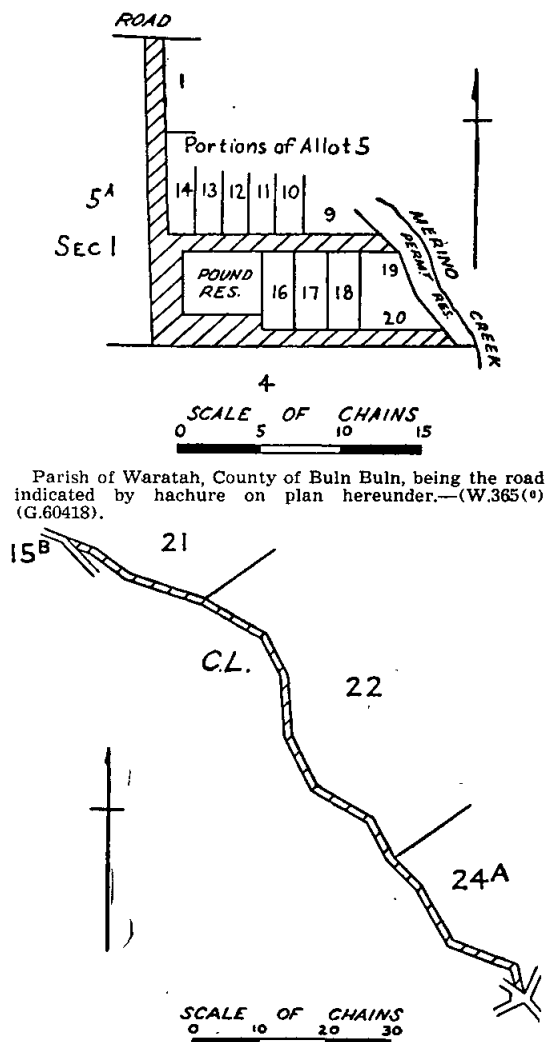

PROPRIETARY MEDICINES REGULATIONS 1961.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1958*, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Proprietary Medicines Regulations 1961, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.
2. The Proprietary Medicines Regulations 1948, are hereby repealed.
3. In these Regulations the *Health Act 1958*, is called the principal Act.
4. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter "Committee" means the advisory committee constituted under Division 3 of Part XIV. of the principal Act.

5. Subject to the provisions of sub-section (9) of section 260 of the principal Act the chairman of the Committee may and when required by the Chief Health Officer shall convene a meeting by notice, in writing, sent to each member at least three days before the date fixed for that meeting.

6. Each member of the Committee other than the chairman shall be entitled to receive a fee of Five pounds five shillings for each meeting attended by him, but so that no member shall receive by way of such attendance fees more than Two hundred and sixty-two pounds ten shillings in any one financial year.

7. Every wholesale dealer applying for the registration of a proprietary medicine pursuant to the provisions of Division 3 of Part XIV. of the principal Act shall make his application in the form contained in the First Schedule hereto.

8. The fee to be paid upon application for registration of a proprietary medicine shall be as follows:—

(1) Where the application relates to a proprietary medicine made by a registered pharmaceutical chemist and sold by him only by retail at his place of business as such pharmaceutical chemist—

- (a) for a single application: Ten shillings
- (b) for two applications lodged at the same time by an applicant: Fifteen shillings
- (c) for each application in excess of two lodged at the same time by an applicant: Five shillings

(2) Where the application relates to a proprietary medicine other than one referred to in sub-regulation (1) hereof— One pound.

9. Every appeal against a determination of the Chief Health Officer made pursuant to the provisions of section 264 of the principal Act shall be made by the applicant within twenty-eight days after receiving the notice, in writing, of that determination.

10. The register kept in compliance with the provisions of sub-section (1) of section 265 of the principal Act shall record in respect of each registered proprietary medicine the particulars set forth in the Second Schedule hereto.

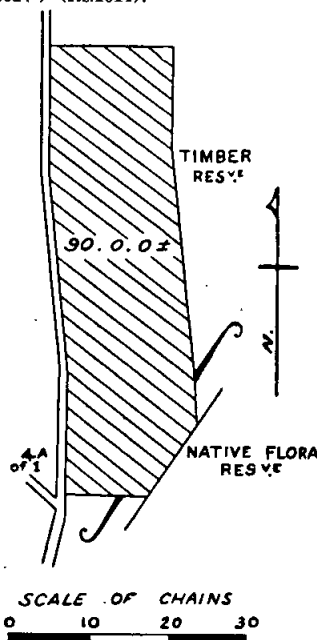

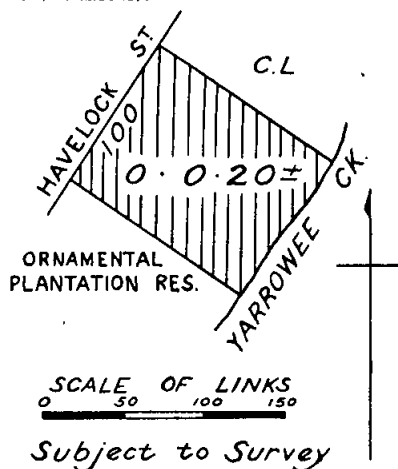

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "WALWA CAMPING RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portion of the permanent reservation along the River Murray in the Parish of Walwa as is indicated by red colour on plan marked

"W" over 30.552 attached to Lands Department correspondence C.91855, and known as the "Walwa Camping Reserve (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee"), with full power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall interfere with, move, damage or destroy any shrub, tree, plant, grass, flowers, or any property, or enter on any flower bed or borders, or light fires within the Reserve.
2. No person shall throw stones or missiles of any kind within the Reserve.
3. No person shall climb on any portion of any building, balustrade, or property in the Reserve, or jump over any fence or hedge thereon.
4. No person shall affix or interfere with any placard, bill, notice or marking of any kind on any building, structure, tree, constructed surface, or anything within the Reserve.
5. No person shall enter or travel over the Reserve with or on any motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle, except on such portions thereof provided for wheeled traffic, and the driver of such motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle shall be guided and directed, and shall abide by any notice, post, or sign, marking or barrier guide which has been marked or erected for the purpose of traffic guidance, control or direction.
6. No person shall drive a motor car, motor cycle, bicycle, or other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly, or at a speed or in a manner dangerous to the public, or likely to cause any damage to anything within the Reserve.
7. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or seats, or any wall, structure, or property within the Reserve.
8. No person in a state of intoxication, or who is disorderly, or is not decorously dressed, shall enter or remain in the Reserve, and no person shall commit therein any nuisance or any indecent or offensive act.
9. No person shall remain within the Reserve, or on any property therein, when lawfully directed to leave the same by any bailiff of Crown lands, or member of the Police Force, or authorized officer of the Committee.
10. No person shall hawk or sell, or offer for sale, within the Reserve any goods, fruit, or merchandise, or anything or solicit or gather money therein, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee.
11. No person shall give out, or distribute, any hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers in the Reserve without the authority, in writing, of the Committee.
12. No person shall litter the Reserve by scattering or throwing down hand-bills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets, or papers.
13. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless securely held by a chain, cord, or leash.
14. No person shall bring in or allow to remain in the Reserve any horse, cow, sheep, pig, or goat, and any such animal found wandering therein shall be liable to be impounded or destroyed.
15. No person shall make or cause to be made any violent outcry, noise, disturbance, or sound, or shall play upon any musical or noisy instrument, or sing within the Reserve, without the authority, in writing, of the Committee.—(C.91855.)

Health Acts.

SHIRE OF BERWICK.

By-law Relating to the Keeping of Poultry.

(No. 43.)

PART I.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Health Acts and any other power enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Berwick in the name of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district, except to premises registered as a poultry killing premises and poultry sale-yards when so exempt in writing by the Council.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter:—

“Approved materials” means material approved by the Council.

“Dwelling” shall include a living-room, sleepout or tent, and all rooms used for sleeping, living or cooking.

“Litter” includes wood shavings, tan bark, straw or dry grass clippings or other similar suitable clean material.

“Battery cage” means a wire and metal mesh cage divided into one or more compartments in which poultry is kept.

“Person” includes the owner or occupier or the person in charge of premises.

“Poultry” includes fowls, turkeys, ducks and geese.

PART II.

This part shall apply to areas zoned as residential under the Town and Country Planning Acts.

1. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any premises in an area zoned as residential a number of fowls greater than twenty-five (25) mature birds.

2. No person shall keep in any poultry-house or similar structure a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry-house or similar structure by four unless confined in approved battery cages.

3. No person shall keep or cause or permit to be kept on any one property more than two (2) turkeys, ducks or geese.

4. No person shall keep any poultry on any premises in an area zoned as residential, otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or an enclosure or battery cage, and unless such poultry-house or similar structure or enclosure or battery cage is—

(a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the premises has a frontage;

(b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street or road of a greater width than twenty-five (25) feet;

(c) distant at least five (5) feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than twenty-five (25) feet or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;

(d) distant at least forty (40) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining allotment.

5. Every poultry-house or similar structure, except approved battery cages, shall be roofed with approved material and paved with approved impervious material and the surface level of the floor shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground and shall be constructed so as to hold six (6) inches in depth of litter.

6. Every poultry-house or similar structure, except approved battery cages, shall be rendered rat-proof by placing galvanized iron, jointed brick-work, cement sheet or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least eighteen (18) inches below ground level, and all walls shall be constructed of approved rat-proof material.

7. Every battery cage system in which poultry is kept in an area zoned as residential shall have a permanent roof and any walls to be constructed of approved materials and having a floor raised at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

PART III.

Provisions Relating to Poultry Farms.

In this section, unless inconsistent with the context of subject-matter—

“Poultry Farm” shall mean any premises on which there is kept at any time a greater number of mature birds than twenty-five (25).

1. No person shall keep poultry on any poultry farm otherwise than in a poultry-house or similar structure or enclosed poultry-run or battery cage system.

2. Where the number of mature birds is at any time greater than twenty-five (25) every poultry-house or similar structure or any enclosed poultry-run or any battery cage system shall be—

(a) distant at least seventy-five (75) feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the building has a frontage;

(b) distant at least ten (10) feet from any other street;

(c) distant at least ten (10) feet from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land;

(d) distant at least one hundred (100) feet from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land, except only that the owner or occupier may erect incubators or brooder houses not less than forty (40) feet from his own dwelling.

3. Every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be roofed with approved material with guttering leading to water tanks or to adequate storm-water drains.

4. The ground surrounding every poultry-house or similar structure or battery cage system shall be well drained.

5. The floor beneath any battery cage system and the floor of any poultry-house or similar structure shall be built up so that the surface shall be at least three (3) inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

PART IV.

General Provisions.

These provisions shall apply to all premises on which poultry are kept except those exempted by Part 1 (2).

1. The owner or occupier shall keep the area of land within five (5) feet of any fowl-house, similar structure, enclosure or battery cage system free of all dry grass, weeds, refuse or other materials capable of harbouring rats or other vermin.

2. The owner or occupier shall cause the poultry house, similar structure or enclosure or battery cage system to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.

3. No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any property where poultry is kept any food for consumption by poultry unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles or rat-proof buildings.

4. Poultry droppings, litter and refuse shall be moved from the premises from time to time as Council directs so as not to cause a nuisance or offensive conditions.

5. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this by-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.
