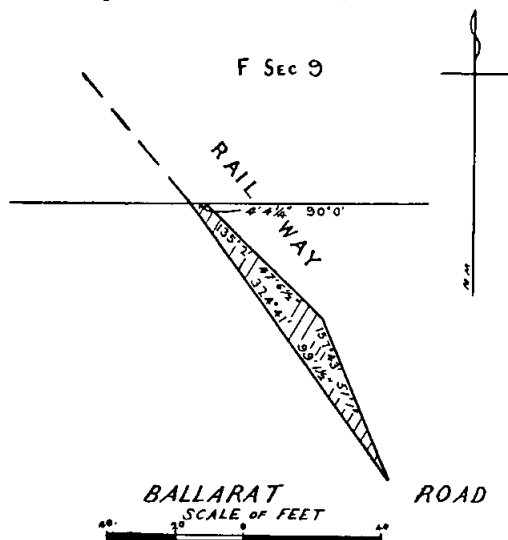

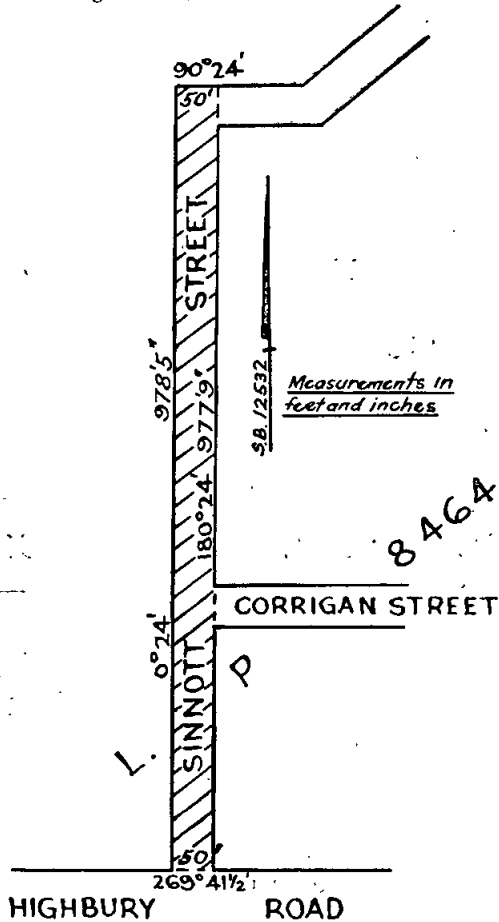

## NOTICE OF INTENTION RESPECTING NETTING RESTRICTIONS IN TAMBOON INLET.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation revoking the Proclamation made the third day of August, 1948, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the eleventh day of August, 1948, respecting netting restrictions in Tamboon Inlet and providing as follows:—

1. For the purposes of the Proclamation "Director" means the Director of Fisheries and Wildlife; "Deputy Director" means the Deputy Director of Fisheries and Wildlife; "Officer" means Fisheries and Wildlife Officer.

2. The use of nets of any kind or engines, whether fixed or unfixd, to be employed in fishing, shall be prohibited in Tamboon Inlet within an imaginary line running from the extreme seaward or outward point where the waters of such inlet enter the ocean, from the fifteenth day of October in each year to the thirtieth day of April in the following year (both days inclusive) provided that a seine or hauling net not exceeding 400 fathoms in length may be used during such period for the sole purpose of taking Australian salmon when in a large school in the said inlet, under the following conditions:—

- (a) Any licensed fisherman intending to net or attempt to net such fish when in a large school shall notify the Director or in his absence the Deputy Director of his intention at least 24 hours before netting operations commence.
- (b) On receipt of any such notification the Director or in his absence the Deputy Director shall arrange for an officer to supervise any netting operations and shall cause all such notifications to be placed in the departmental file.
- (c) Not under any circumstances whatever are any netting operations to commence unless an officer is present and has authorized the netting to proceed.
- (d) In the interests of the preservation of good order amongst fishermen, the Director or in his absence the Deputy Director shall determine the time and manner in which netting may be carried out and shall cause such determination to be placed in the departmental file.
- (e) A special return shall be submitted to the Director showing the total quantity of Australian salmon taken in any such netting operation and details as to the disposal of such fish. Such return shall be lodged at the office of the Director at Melbourne within a period of one month from the date on which such fish were netted.

3. The use of nets to be employed in fishing between the first day of May in each year and the fourteenth day of October next following (both days inclusive) shall be restricted in the above-mentioned inlet as follows:—

No person shall—

- (a) Use a "seine" or "hauling" net exceeding in length 400 fathoms.
- (b) Use a "mesh" or "set" net of any kind.

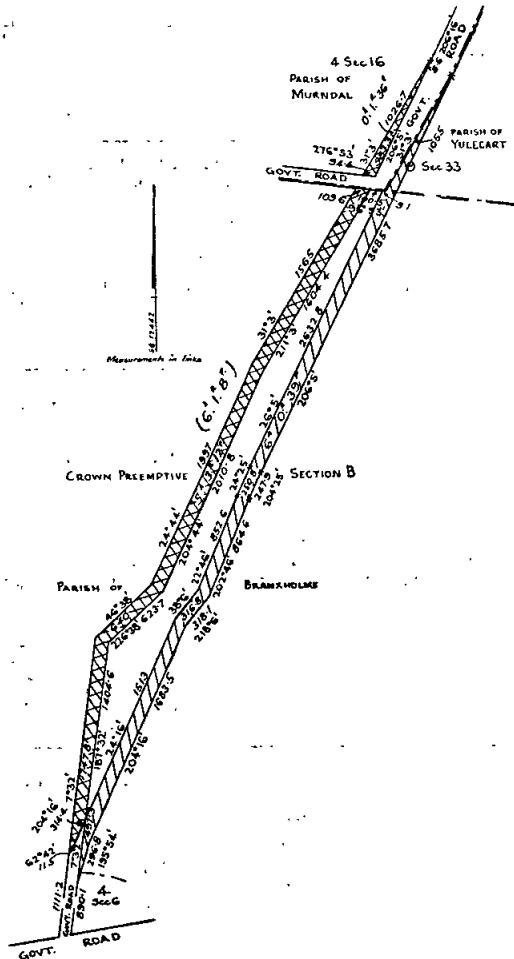

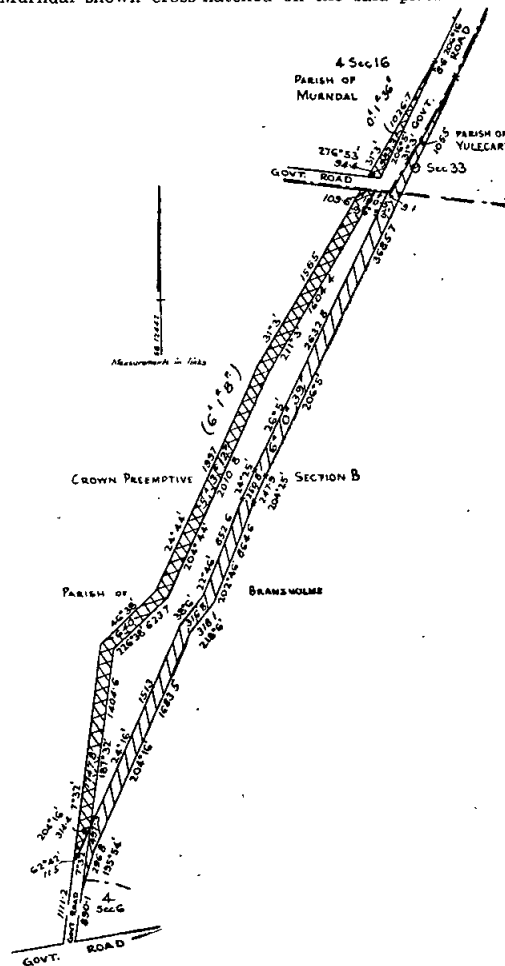

- (e) erecting a utility service structure, depot or works, constructed by a Government Department or Public Authority.

4. Nothing in this Interim Development Order shall prevent—

- (a) the continuance of the use of any land or of any existing building or works for the purposes for which the land, building or works was or were being lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order;
- (b) any dealing or the registration of any dealing with any land in any subdivision of which a plan has been sealed by the Council of the Shire of Bass and lodged with the Registrar of Titles, pursuant to section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, before the coming into operation of this Order.

5. No person shall obstruct any street or footway by standing or loitering therein or thereon whether for the purpose of selling or offering for sale any goods or otherwise.

6. No person shall throw place or leave upon any public highway any orange peel banana peel or other vegetable matter.

7. No person shall spit or expectorate on any footpath.

8. No person shall cause permit or suffer to be emitted from any land of which he is the owner or occupier any smoke dust grit ash or particles of solid matter the product of the combustion of any material in such quantities as to be an annoyance or nuisance to any other person in or upon any other land or any public highway.
