Myrophine (myristyl ester of Benzylmorphine) and declare that Division 2 of Part III. of the Poisons Act 1958 shall apply to the said substance in the same manner as it applies to the substances and preparations already listed in the said Schedule.

PROCLAMATION



THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958, do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as the Tyers River Water Supply Catchment. The Catchment is all that land as included in the following boundary:—

Commencing at the pumping station in Crown allotment 1, section A, Parish of Tanjil East on the Tyers River, and following the watershed of the Tyers River upstream from the pumping station through the Parishes of Tanjil East, Tanjil, Moondarra, Bundowra, and Telbit West to Mt. Baw; thence along the common boundary of the Parishes of Telbit West and Fumina North to the boundary of the Parish of Baw Baw; thence through the Parishes of Telbit West and Telbit to Mt. Erica; thence through the Parishes of Telbit, Moondarra, Numbruk, Tanjil East and Boola across the Tyers River into the Parish of Tanjil East and to the point of commencement.

This area is more particularly defined on plan No. 1136 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at the Head Office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham-road, Kew, E.4.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to determination by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of section 23 (1) (a) of the Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958 (No. 6372). Land-use may thereby be subject to certain limitations and landholders contemplating any changes in land-use particularly on forested land or on land within 1 chain of a watercourse should consult the Soil Conservation Authority.

The minimum charges provide for one tapping only The minimum charges provide for one tapping only of the Trust's water main, and for each additional tapping there shall be a minimum charge of £2 10s., except in cases where there is more than one residence upon the holding concerned, in such cases, if required, a further tapping to serve each additional house will be allowed without a further increase in the minimum

4. The maximum allowance of water to be supplied per annum in respect of the minimum annual charge shall in each case be the quantity which if charged at Two shillings and six pence (2s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to such minimum annual charge, and for all water supplied in excess of such allowance the charge shall be Two shillings and six pence (2s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons.


SCALE OF CHAINS




Parish of Myrrhee, County of Delatite, being the road indicated by hachure on plan hereunder.—(G.131(3) (M.297(5) (H.027451).





A By-law of the City of Coburg, made under section 197 (1) (xxxviii) (a) and section 228 (1) of the Local Government Act 1958, and numbered 96 for the purpose of amending By-law No. 41 (a By-law made under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1915) for the purpose of-

(a) regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections and hoardings;
 (b) requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections or hoardings;

- buildings, erections or hoardings;

 (c) authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law, or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections or hoardings, and in paying into the municipal fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof;

 (d) apportioning fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such Regulation, and for any permit or licence to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Coburg order as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall be read and construed as one with By-law No. 41.
- 2. Clauses 20 and 21 of Part VI. of By-law No. 41 are hereby repealed.
- 3. The area within the municipal district as specified in Schedule B to By-law No. 41 shall be and it is hereby prescribed as a residential area within which the use of any land or the erection, adaptation for use or use of any buildings for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures or businesses is hereby prohibited.
- 4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the preceding clause the erection of any shop or shop and dwelling combined will be permitted in those streets set out in Schedule D to By-law No. 41.

The Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on 10th September, 1962, and confirmed on 8th October, 1962.

Citizens of the City of Coburg order as follows:—

1. Wherever appearing throughout this By-law unless otherwise stated or inconsistent with the context, the word "Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Coburg; the word "baths" shall include the swimming pool, showers, dressing-rooms, conveniences, passageways and the grounds fenced in with and known as the Pascoe Vale Swimming Pool and the premises thereof; the words "baths attendant" shall include the Council's employees or employees in charge of the baths; words in the singular shall include the plural; words in the plural shall include the singular and words importing the masculine gender shall include females.

- No person shall enter upon any portion of the baths without having paid the fees chargeable or being otherwise authorized by the Council.
- 3. No person shall use the baths unless he be properly attired in a bathing costume so as to preserve public decency.
- 4. No child under the age of eight years will be admitted to the baths unless in the opinion of the baths attendant such child is in the care of a responsible person.
- 5. No person shall use the swimming pool whilst in an uncleanly condition, nor any portion of the baths while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease.
- '6. No person shall wilfully interfere with the use and enjoyment by any person of the baths, and any person so doing or otherwise behaving in an unseemly, offensive, insulting or improper manner shall immediately leave the baths upon being requested so to do by the baths attendant or any officer of the Council; and such baths attendant may refuse to sell a ticket of admission to any person whom he may consider undesirable.
- 7. No person shall enter or remain in any portion of the baths whilst in a state of intoxication and no person shall at any time introduce into the baths or consume or cause to be consumed any spirituous or intoxicating liquor in any portion of the baths.
- 8. No person shall bring into the baths premises or have in his possession or custody or under his control in the baths premises any bottle or can.
- 9. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with the due and efficient action of any lock, tap, valve, pipe, work, engine or machinery in connexion with the baths, or carelessly or negligently defile, injure or destroy any furniture, fittings or conveniences in any part of the baths and shall not by cutting or writing thereon deface any wall, fittings or any portion of the baths.
- 10. No person shall at any time while being upon any portion of the baths use any indecent, insulting or offensive language or behave in an indecent, insulting, offensive or riotous manner.
- 11. No person shall spit in the swimming pool or on the floors or walls of any portion of the baths.
- 12. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person or under his control to enter or remain in any portion of the baths.
- 13. Any person finding any article which may have been left in any portion of the baths shall at once deliver the same to the baths attendant who shall thereupon register a description of the same in a book-kept for that purpose and any person claiming such article shall upon giving satisfactory proof of ownership receive such article from the baths attendant upon entering his signature and address in the book referred to.
- 14. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with any attendant, officer or servant employed at the baths in the performance of his duty at the baths.
- 15. The Council will not be responsible for articles lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.
- 16. No person shall offer any goods for sale in any portion of the baths without the consent, in writing, of the Council.
- 17. Betting or playing cards or any game of chance for money is strictly prohibited in any portion of the baths.
- 18. No person shall dispose of any cigar, cigarette, pipe ash or match within the baths premises except in the receptacles provided therefor,
- 19. No person shall drive a vehicle or ride a bicycle in the grounds of the baths at a speed exceeding five miles per hour.
- 20. Every person offending against any of the provisions of this By-law shall upon conviction for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
