Forests Act 1958 (No. 6254).

VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION RELATING TO THE PROHIBITED PERIOD.

WHEREAS by section 3 of the *Forests Act 1958* it is enacted that the Minister of Forests may from time to time by notice published in the *Government Gazette* declare any period to be a prohibited period in respect of any fire-protected area (other than a State forest or national park), and without affecting the generality of the foregoing may from time to time by notice so published declare different prohibited periods in respect of different parts of the fire-protected area (other than a State forest or national park):

And whereas by the said section, it is further enacted that any declaration so published may subsequently be revoked, amended or varied by the Minister of Forests by notice so published:

And whereas by Proclamations issued on the 20th and 27th November, 1962, and published in the *Government Gazettes* on the 21st and 28th November, 1962, respectively, a prohibited period expiring on the 30th April, 1963, was proclaimed in respect of portion of the fire-protected area (other than State forests or national parks) including the areas specified in the Schedule hereto:

Now therefore, I, Lindsay Hamilton Simpson Thompson, Her Majesty's Minister of Forests in the State of Victoria, do by this notice declare that a prohibited period in respect of the parts of the fire-protected area (other than a State forest or national park) situated in such municipalities as are specified in the Schedule hereto shall not be in force after midnight between the 29th and 30th days of March, 1963.

WILD FLOWERS AND NATIVE PLANTS PROTECTION ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Wild Flowers and Native Plants Protection Act 1958* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may notify by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* that any wild flower or native plant specified in the Proclamation is protected under the said Act in any part or parts of Victoria specified in the Proclamation and that such protection may be for a limited or unlimited period as is specified in the Proclamation:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation notify that on and after the twentieth day of March, 1963, the wild flower specified in the Schedule hereunder shall be and the same is hereby protected in all parts of the State of Victoria throughout every month in each year.

DECLARING A PROCLAIMED AREA.

PROCLAMATION

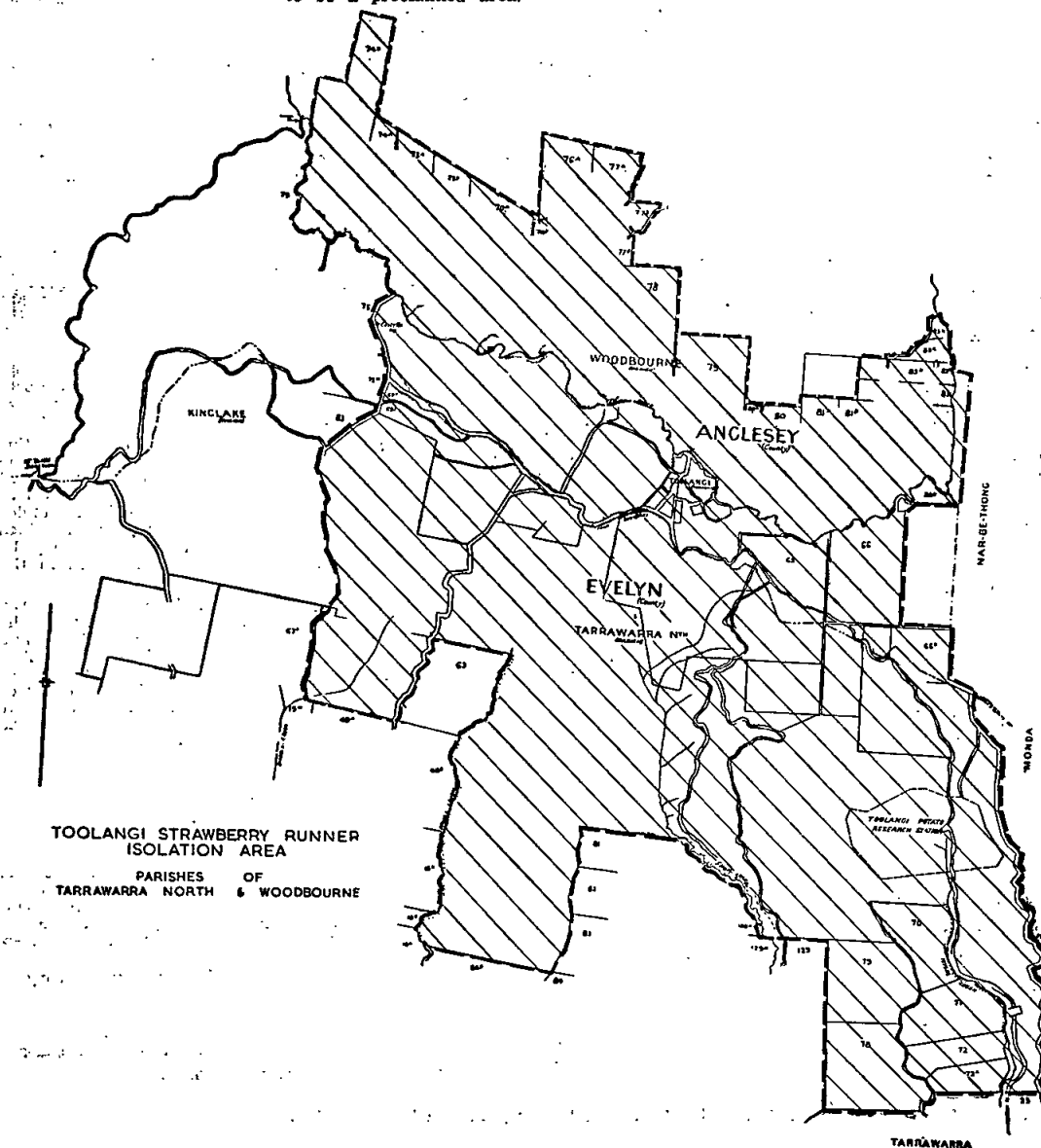
By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 (1) of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 (No. 6407)*, it is provided that the Governor in Council by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* may either absolutely or subject to any Regulations prohibit the importation, introduction or bringing into Victoria or any portion of Victoria specified in such Proclamation of any tree plant or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in Council likely to introduce any disease into Victoria or any portion of Victoria: And whereas by section 4 (2) of the said Act it is provided that the Governor in Council by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* may either absolutely or subject to any Regulations prohibit the bringing into any portion of Victoria from any other portion of Victoria specified in such Proclamation of any tree plant or vegetable which is in the opinion of the Governor in Council likely to spread any disease in Victoria: And whereas by the said Act it is further enacted that disease means any disease affecting trees plants or vegetables and which the Governor in Council from time to time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declares to be a disease within the meaning of Part 1 of the said Act: And whereas all viruses affecting trees plants or vegetables have been declared by Proclamation dated 31st January, 1962, to be a disease within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas virus diseases affecting strawberry plants are in my opinion likely to be introduced into a certain portion of Victoria by the importation introduction or bringing into that portion of Victoria of certain trees plants and vegetables: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation hereby—

1. Declare that portion of Victoria—

Within the Counties of Anglesey and Evelyn and including portions of the Parishes of Tarrawarra North, Woodbourne and the Township of Toolangi as indicated by hachure on the plan hereunder—

to be a proclaimed area.



2. Prohibit the importation introduction or bringing into that part of Victoria specified by this Proclamation from any other part of Victoria or from outside Victoria of any plants of the genus *Fragaria* (commonly known as strawberries) or genus *Potentilla* unless they are accompanied by a certificate in the form or to the effect of the Schedule hereto.

or (2) the plants were grown under insect proof conditions from mother plants which had been tested for the presence of virus diseases by an officer of the Victorian Department of Agriculture and found by him to be free of all known virus diseases, and to the best of my knowledge, neither the mother plants nor the plants described in the certificate have at any time been exposed to infection by virus diseases.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 24 of the *Mental Health Act 1959* (No. 6605) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim one or more buildings or places provided by the State for the treatment of the mentally ill to be a mental hospital and may by a like Proclamation vary or revoke any Proclamation of any such building or buildings or places as a mental hospital;

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation—

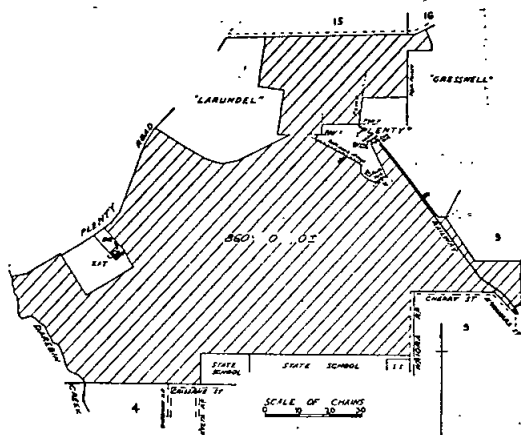
- (a) declare the places described in the Schedules hereto to be Mental Hospitals under the respective names set out in such Schedules as on and from the first day of April, 1963; and
(b) as on and from the said date declare the Order proclaiming the Mont Park Mental Hospital made and effective on and from the twenty-third day of April, 1912, and varied by the Proclamation of the Mental Hospital Larundel made on the ninth day of June, 1953, and effective on and from the fifteenth day of June, 1953, to be revoked.

The whole of the area in the Parish of Keelbundora, County of Bourke indicated by hachure in the plan of the Mont Park Mental Hospital hereunder.

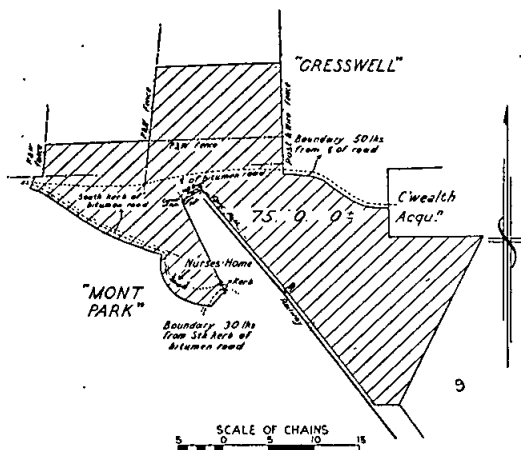
PLAN OF MONT PARK MENTAL HOSPITAL

PORT PHILLIP.—SOUTH CHANNEL LIGHT-BEACON TO BE CONSTRUCTED.

Date.—On or about 4th April, 1963.

Position.—South Channel Pile Light, Lat. 38 deg. 19 min. 54 sec. S., Long. 144 deg. 51 min. 09 sec. E. (approximately).

Details.—Pile-driving operations for the construction of a new light-beacon will commence at approximately 300 deg. 20 min. distant 1.4 miles from the above position. During construction, a flashing RED light every 10 seconds thus --- flash 0.5 seconds, eclipse 9.5 seconds, will surmount the structure.

Remarks.—The light-beacon will be constructed on the northern side of the South Channel, approximately 295 deg. 40 min. distant 1,250 feet from No. 9 Buoy. Further notice will issue on establishment of the light.

Caution.—Mariners are requested to keep well to the southward and to proceed at the minimum speed consistent with safe navigation when passing vessels engaged on the above construction. Small craft are warned of the existence of submerged cables and anchors to the north, east and west of the site which should be given a berth of at least 500 feet.

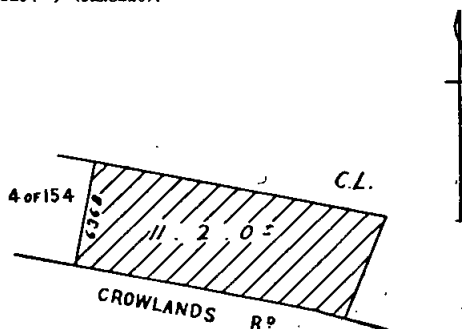

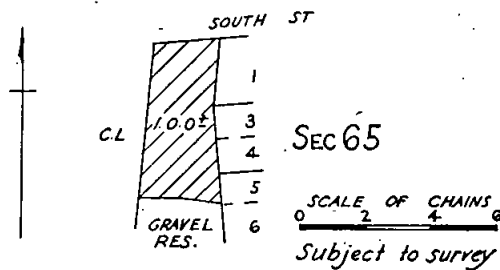

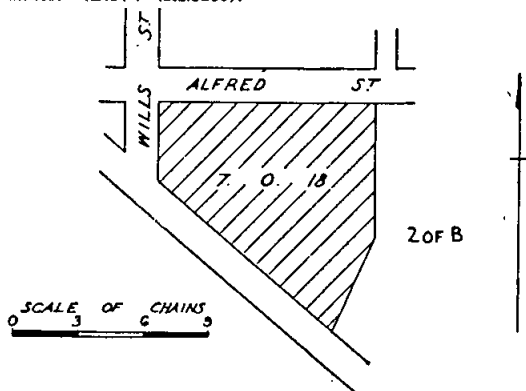


SCALE OF CHAINS

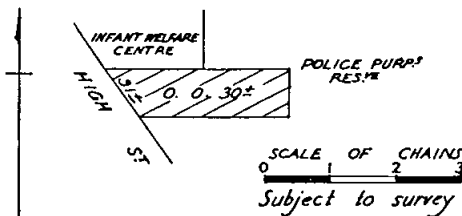

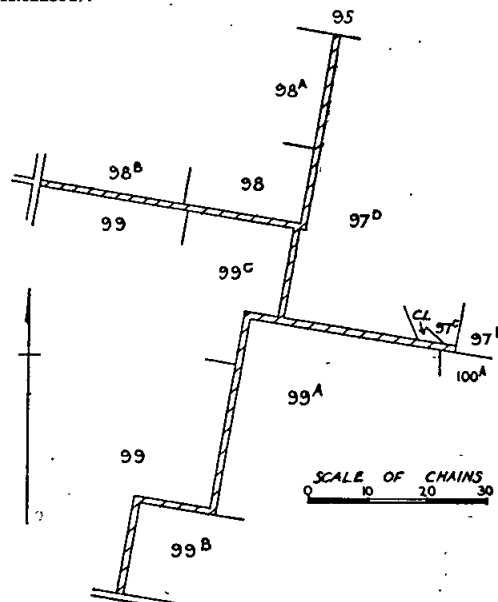

The security must be completed and the contract signed within five days of acceptance of the tender, failing which the contract may be again advertised, or another tender accepted.

The lowest or any tender will not necessarily be accepted.

In the event of tenderers withdrawing or attempting to withdraw their tenders before notification of acceptance of same, or failing to take up their accepted tenders within the prescribed period after notification of acceptance, they may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contracts for Government supplies for a period of twelve months, such disqualification to date from the notification of acceptance of tender. It is also stipulated that, if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual and that, for a breach of this condition, the tender will be declared informal.

Preference will be given by the Tender Board, provided the quality of the articles offered is satisfactory and the rates tendered are considered reasonable—

- (a) to tenders for articles manufactured within the Commonwealth;
- (b) to tenders for articles manufactured within any other part of the British Empire.

Rates tendered must include T.T. exchange ruling at time of tendering.

Tenders enclosed in a separate envelope, and having the words, "Tender for Supplies to the Government Printer" written thereon, must be deposited in the Tender Box at the Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, or, if sent by post, postage must be prepaid, and the tenders addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, Tender Board Offices, Macarthur-street, Melbourne, C.2, which office they must reach not later than by first post on the date of closing of tenders.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title, or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "schedule" shall mean and embrace the schedule or schedules hereunto annexed.

2. *Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract.* In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

3. The Government will order from the contractor those articles enumerated in the schedule for which his tender is accepted.

4. The first delivery under this contract, equal to one-half the quantity contracted for, shall be made not later than 30th November, 1963, and the remainder shall be delivered not later than 28th February, 1964. Permission may be given to deliver the whole quantity contracted for by the date first specified.

5. The supplies are to be in accordance with schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

6. Bales are to be supplied in standard mill packs, i.e., four bales to the ton. The number of reams in each bale to be consistent for each item.

Number of each bale and number of reams in each bale to be clearly marked on the outside.

7. All packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor. The net weight only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

8. All supplies shall be made to the Government Printer.

The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce an invoice and

specification showing the number and contents of each package in duplicate to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores delivered by him.

9. All papers must be supplied in reams and must be according to the specification as set out in the schedule and cut to the true size ordered. Each ream must contain 500 sheets, and must be supplied flat, unless otherwise specified. No creased, damaged, or retree paper will be accepted. Paper to be ream-wrapped in single stacks in bales.

10. Each package shall be branded "O.H.M.S., The Government of Victoria, The Government Printer, Melbourne," and numbered consecutively, and each package shall also be marked with the number of the contract and contents of same, for identification purposes.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, such expenses to be deducted as in clause 12. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense deducted as in clause 12.

12. In the event of the goods not being delivered within the time stated the Government Printer may, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, purchase the supplies or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

13. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Government Printer to the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding One hundred pounds for each and every default, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as set out in clause 12. It will also be in the power of the Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

14. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

15. In the event of any alteration in the duty of Customs or Telegraphic Transfer Exchange which may effect any of the items included in the contract, the Government or the contractor, as the case may be, will make a proportionate allowance by way of deduction from or increase of the price of the item so affected, and the contractor shall, if called upon, submit such documentary evidence as may be required by the Government to permit of the calculation of any such allowance.

16. The contractor shall not insure the material against war risk: Provided the material is consigned on a separate bill of lading to the Government of Victoria, any loss or damage in transit occasioned by any war risks to which the material may be subject whilst on board ship shall be to Victorian Government account, subject to the production by the contractor of documentary evidence satisfactory to the Tender Board.

17. All goods forwarded under this contract shall, wherever railway facilities are available, be consigned by rail.

18. Every account shall be in the prescribed form, setting out the contract and item numbers, and shall furnish full details of how it is made up.

19. Payment for supplies will be made in Melbourne when same have been accepted.

BY-LAW No. 65.

A By-law of the City of Wangaratta made under the provisions of Part IV. of the *Health Act* 1958, and numbered 65 for the purposes of making provisions for the use and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and prescribing the type of receptacles to be used and for the preventing and regulating the deposit of refuse and rubbish upon streets or other places.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by section 93 of the *Health Act* 1958, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Wangaratta order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall have application to the whole of the City of Wangaratta.

3. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

(a) "Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, the occupier or any person having the management or control thereof.

(b) "Refuse or garbage" shall mean all waste matter which is ordinarily produced in connexion with the preparation of food but does not include trade waste from food manufacturing or processing plants.

(c) "Wet refuse" shall mean any fluid matter and water shall have the same meaning.

(d) "Ashes" shall mean the residue of any combustible matter after burning.

(e) "Rubbish" shall mean refuse, trade waste or any other material.

4. The proprietor of every house, building or premises shall provide and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building or premises.

5. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle. Provided that receptacles and the accompanying lids may be made of tough plastic material not less than nine hundredths of an inch thickness and shall be of strong and sturdy construction.

6. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 4 cubic feet and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

7. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

8. Such receptacles shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacles and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some

efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

9. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any wet refuse, slops or liquid waste in such receptacle nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any hot ashes in such receptacle.

11. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse such receptacle to be deposited close to the kerb line or on the nature strip in such a position so as no obstruction to traffic will be caused in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

12. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

13. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council.

14. Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week or at such greater frequency as council may direct, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance danger to health or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

18. Such vehicle when full shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the tip, incinerator or destructor where, as soon as practicable the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by means of fire or such other method as may be approved by the Commission and in such manner as not to create a nuisance.

19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner.

21. No person shall either directly or indirectly in any manner whatsoever deposit or leave or cause to be deposited or left any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane or any land within the City of Wangaratta, except upon an authorized tip site.

22. The owner or occupier of any land on which refuse or rubbish has been deposited shall, if so requested by notice, in writing, authorized by Council under the signature of the Town Clerk or any authorized person acting on his behalf, cause such refuse or rubbish to be removed or destroyed within seven days of the receipt thereof.

23. If such notice as aforesaid is not complied with the Council may authorize a person or persons to enter upon the land and cause such refuse or rubbish to be removed or destroyed, the cost of such action to be recoverable from the owner or occupier in a court of competent jurisdiction notwithstanding any penalty already imposed under this By-law.

24. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed of grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

25. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable

to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and in the case of a continuing offence, a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

SHIRE OF WALPEUP.

BY-LAW No. 30.

A By-law Relating to the Collection, Removal and Disposal of Refuse.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1958, and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Walpeup, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say).

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Council" means the Council of the Shire of Walpeup.

"Street, road, lane or passage" means a street, road, lane or passage actually existing, whether it is or is not a public highway or passage way.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises.

2. By-laws numbered 15 and 19 are hereby repealed.

3. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that part of the Ouyen Riding of the Municipal District of the Shire of Walpeup which is within the Township of Ouyen, Parish of Ouyen, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building and premises therein.

5. The proprietor of every house, building or premises shall provide, keep and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 2 cubic feet, shall not taper towards the top, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse is being deposited therein or

discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an in-offensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall he deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and inoffensive, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

12. The proprietor (at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse) shall cause such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception. Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as the Council directs, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

18. The person in charge of such vehicle shall cause it to be taken when full by the shortest practicable route to the tip, provided for the disposal of garbage.

19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. Refuse disposed of at the tip shall be deposited and covered in accordance with Schedule 4 of the General Sanitary Regulations 1950 or any amendment thereof.

21. Land upon which refuse has been deposited shall be seasonably planted or sown with seed or grass or any forage or cereal crops or other such vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve.

22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.
