Country Fire Authority Act 1958.

VARIATION OF SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREA OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1958* it is enacted that the Chief Secretary of Victoria, after consultation with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by declaration published in the *Government Gazette* declare any period to be the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria, or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may declare different periods to be the summer period in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said section it is further enacted that any declaration so published may be revoked, amended, or varied by a subsequent declaration so published:

And whereas by declaration issued on the eleventh day of December, 1962, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twelfth day of December, 1962, different summer periods expiring on the thirtieth day of April, 1963, were declared in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in the Schedule hereto:

And whereas it is deemed expedient that the aforesaid declaration should be varied in the manner hereinafter described:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, do by this my declaration vary the aforesaid declaration by declaring that the summer period in respect of the parts of the country area of Victoria specified in the Schedule hereto shall end at midnight on the nineteenth day of April, 1963.

AMBULANCE SERVICE.

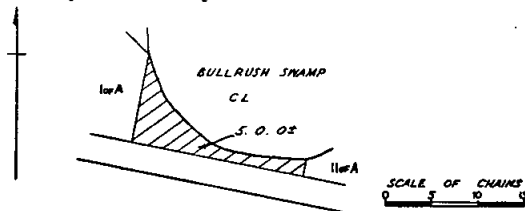

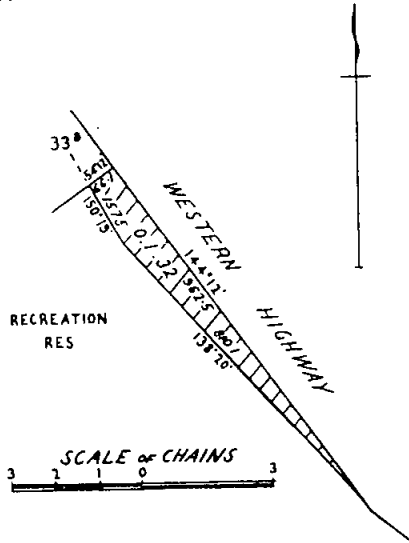
