PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Weights and Measures Act 1958.

ADDITION TO THE CENTRAL GIPPSLAND WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Weights and Measures Act 1958*, it is amongst other things enacted that, at the request of the Councils of all the municipalities concerned, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that any municipality specified in such Proclamation shall be added to and form part of a Union:

And whereas the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, in respect of the Yallourn Works Area, the Borough of Moe, and the Shires of Alberton, Buln Buln, Korumburra, Mirboo, Morwell, Narracan, South Gippsland, Traralgon, Warragul and Woorayl, do constitute a Union under the title of "Central Gippsland Weights and Measures Union" for the purposes of the *Weights and Measures Act 1958*:

And whereas the State Electricity Commission of Victoria, in respect of the Yallourn Works Area, the Councils of each of the said municipalities and the Council of the municipality of the Borough of Traralgon have requested that the Borough of Traralgon be added to and form part of the said Union:

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare that, as from and inclusive of the first day of October, 1962, the Borough of Traralgon shall be added to and form part of such Union and do fix as follows the apportionment among such municipalities and the Yallourn Works Area of the expenses devolving upon the Union under the said Act:—

1. Each such municipality shall contribute one twenty-sixth part of the expenses devolving on the Union.

2. The Yallourn Works Area shall, in addition to the amount specified in clause 1 hereof, contribute an amount which shall bear the same proportion to the expenses devolving upon the Union and not contributed in accordance with clause 1 hereof as the number of persons residing in the Yallourn Works Area bears to the total number of persons residing in all the municipalities of the Union.

3. Of the expenses devolving upon the Union and not contributed in accordance with clauses 1 and 2 hereof:—

(a) One-half shall be contributed by the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area) in such manner that the amount to be contributed by each municipality in accordance with this sub-clause shall bear the same proportion to the total expenses to be contributed in accordance with this sub-clause as the number of persons residing in each such municipality bears to the total number of persons residing in all the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area); and

(b) the other half shall be contributed by the municipalities (other than the Yallourn Works Area) in such manner that the amount to be contributed by each such municipality in accordance with this sub-clause shall bear the same proportion to the total expenses to be contributed in accordance with this sub-clause as the total net annual values of properties in the municipal district of each such municipality (other than the Yallourn Works Area) bear to the total net annual values of properties in all the municipalities of the Union (other than the Yallourn Works Area).

4. For the purposes of clause 2 and of sub-clause (a) of clause 3, the number of persons residing in each such municipality shall be deemed to be the number of persons residing therein as disclosed by the last periodical census conducted by or on behalf of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia.

5. For the purposes of computing the amount to be contributed by a municipality, pursuant to sub-clause (b) of clause 3 hereof, during any period ending on the thirtieth day of September in any year, the net annual values of properties in such municipality shall be deemed to be the net annual values of properties in the municipal district of such municipality during the twelve months next preceding the period for which the amount of contributions are being computed.

6. The foregoing provisions relating to the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving on the Union shall have effect from the first day of October next after the declaration or publication by or on behalf of the Commonwealth of

Australia of the result of the periodical census showing the number of persons residing in each such municipality:—

Provided that from the date of admission of the Borough of Traralgon to the Union until the thirtieth day of September next after the declaration or publication of the result of the census aforesaid, the apportionment among such municipalities of the expenses devolving upon the Union shall be as follows, (that is to say):—

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 (No. 6304).

DECLARING THAT MAIZE SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE MAIZE MARKETING BOARD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958*, it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

(a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith, upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on, from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and

(b) make such further provision as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same;

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the fifth day of May, 1936, under the provisions of section 6 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, the Governor in Council declared maize to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the second day of November, 1936, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing Board in relation to maize and assigned to such Board the name of the "Maize Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three all maize shall subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958* be divested from the producers of maize and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any maize coming into existence within two (2) years from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Maize Marketing Board

as the owner thereof: And to enable the Maize Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such maize shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to the Maize Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times, at such places and in such manner as the Maize Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

Provided that the sum of One shilling shall be the minimum amount payable in respect of any property liable to be rated in the said Division.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the period beginning on the 1st day of January, 1963, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1963, and shall be payable on the 8th day of May, 1963, at the office of the Mitchell River Improvement Trust, Nicholson-street, Bairnsdale.

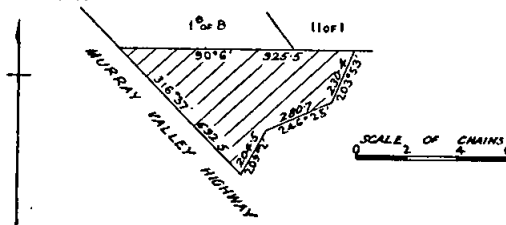

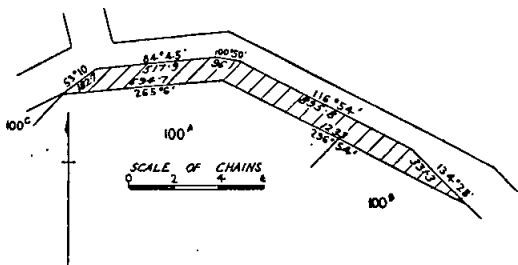

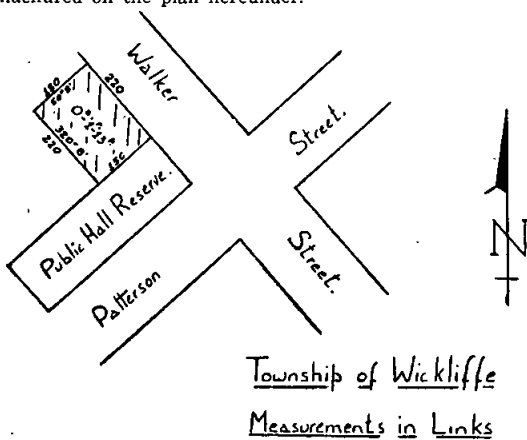

- (f) that no person other than the holder of a permit under the By-law or a metropolitan hawker's licence may sell any goods in any street, road or public place within the city.

CITY OF NORTHCOTE.

BY-LAW No. 162.

A By-law of the City of Northcote, made under section 197 and Part XXXV. of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 162, for repealing By-law No. 153, and for imposing, collecting and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations or persons using or entering in or upon certain lands provided by the Council of the City of Northcote as places of public resort or public recreation, and also for regulating the conduct of persons using or being upon or in such grounds or places, and for preventing damage to any building belonging to the said Municipality or to the furniture and fittings thereof, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Northcote order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 153 is hereby repealed.
2. "Park", wherever used in this By-law, shall mean and include the land, grounds or places set apart as or reserved for a golf course or golf links situate along the eastern bank of the Merri Creek south of Normanby-avenue.
3. The park shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset daily.
4. No person not authorized by the Council shall enter or remain in the Park or in any building erected thereon at any time at which the Park is not open to the public.
5. No person shall enter or remain in the Park or in any building erected thereon who offends against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.
6. No person shall climb upon or get over, injure, cut down, destroy, damage or in any way interfere with or disturb any tree, shrub, plant, fence, building, property, improvement, chattel, effect or thing in the Park.
7. No person shall kindle or make any fire in the Park.
8. No person shall throw or deposit any filth, litter, rubbish or refuse whatever, or cause any filth, litter,

rubbish or refuse to be thrown upon or deposited upon the Park except in the containers provided for that purpose.

9. No person not authorized by the Council shall at any time in the Park—

- (a) enter any area enclosed for a plantation of young trees, shrubs or plants; or
(b) walk or run over or stand or lie upon any flower bed or any ground in the course of preparation or cultivation; or
(c) interfere in any way with any bird.

10. No person shall ride, lead, bring on to (or tether or cause to be tethered on) any part of the Park any animal. Any animal found in the Park may be seized by any authorized person or employee of the Council who may place such animal at some place of safe custody.

11. No person not authorized by the Council shall ride, drive or propel into or on the Park any conveyance or vehicle except into such portion of the Park as shall be prescribed or set apart by the Council for the parking of vehicles.

12. No person shall camp in the Park or erect therein any tent, booth, stand, building or other structure.

13. Except with the consent in writing of the Council first had and obtained, no person shall, in the Park or in any building erected thereon, hawk, sell, offer or expose for sale or let to hire, or offer or expose for letting or hire, any commodity or article.

14. No person shall write, paint, print, stencil, place or affix any letter, figure, device, poster, sign or advertisement upon any footpath in the Park or upon any wall or fence in or enclosing the Park or to or upon any tree, building, railing, seat, structure or erection in the Park.

15. No person shall throw or discharge in the Park any missile to the damage, danger or annoyance of any person, but this clause shall not apply to the driving or hitting of a golf ball by any person while in the act of playing or practising the game of golf upon such parts of the Park as are set aside for the playing or practising of the game of golf.

16. No person shall throw, distribute, deposit, or cause to be thrown, distributed or deposited in or upon the Park or in any building erected thereon any handbill or other printed matter.

17. Except with the consent in writing of the Council, no person shall dispense in the Park or any building erected thereon any fermented or spiritous liquor.

18. No person or persons shall assemble in the Park or in any building erected thereon for fetes, picnics or concerts or for the purpose of public worship, preaching or public speaking of any kind or meetings of a like character without the authority of the Council in writing first obtained.

19. No person shall play any musical instrument or take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Park or in any building erected thereon without the authority of the Council in writing first obtained.

20. No person shall bet in any part of the Park or in any building erected thereon, and any person found betting therein shall be liable to expulsion therefrom.

21. No person shall carry on the trade, business or calling of a bookmaker in the Park or in any building erected thereon.

22. No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain in the Park or in any building erected thereon, and any person found in the Park or in any such building in a state of intoxication shall be liable to be forthwith removed therefrom.

23. No person shall dig or remove from the Park any soil, sand or other material.

24. No person shall play or practise in the Park any game save and except the game of golf.

25. No person shall in the Park or in any building erected thereon wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Park or any such building, or wilfully obstruct, disturb or interrupt any servant of or person acting under authority of the Council in the proper execution of his duty or work in the Park or in any such building.

26. No person shall damage any furniture or fittings in or upon any building erected on the Park.

27. No person shall use the Park for playing or practising the game of golf without first paying a fee appropriate to the proposed use in accordance with the Schedule hereunder.

- (a) For each person per one round of the golf course (nine holes) 4 0

PLAN OF SURVEY

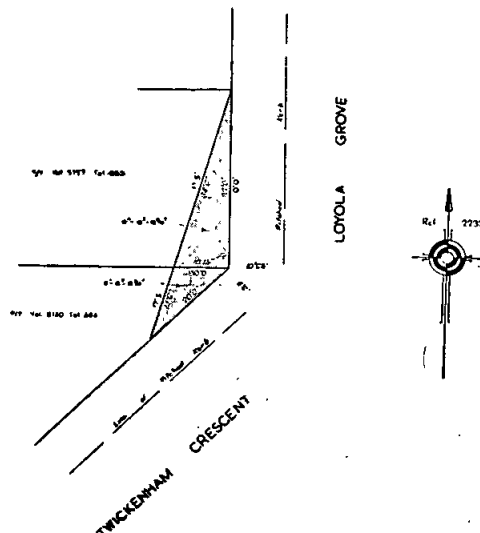
PART OF CROWN ALLOTMENT 16 SECTION 37

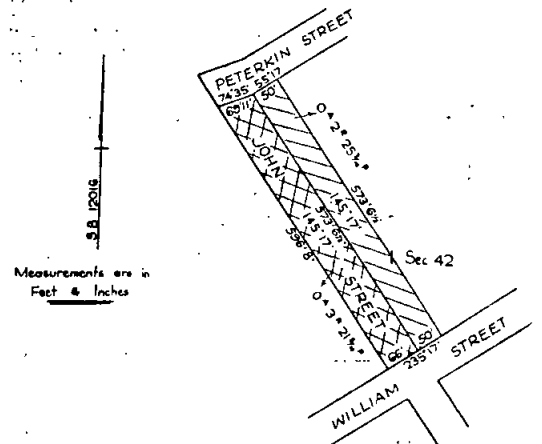
