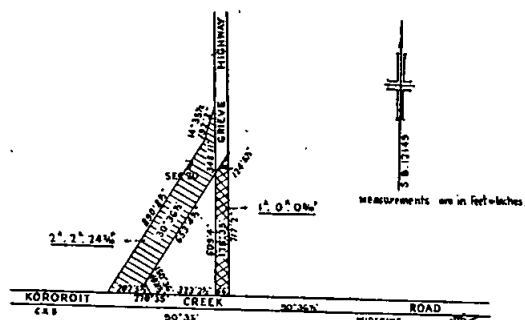

#### TOORA WATERWORKS TRUST. RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1963.

THE Toora Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts hereby makes the following rates for the supply of water for domestic and ordinary purposes on the land and tenements liable to be rated within the Welshpool Urban District:—

On such lands and tenements a rate of Three shillings in the £1 on the amount of the annual municipal valuation.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Five pounds, and in respect of any land on which there is no building be less than One pound.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of such lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1963, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1963, and shall be payable on the 1st day of June, 1963, at the Trust office.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged is fixed at 5,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by the Trust by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

## RULES OF THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

## RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION AND ADMISSION OF CANDIDATES.

“53. Upon application being made to it the Board may, by unanimous decision of those present either absolutely or where the circumstances so require conditionally upon compliance with conditions imposed by it—  
(a) dispense with compliance by the applicant with any provision relating to his case contained in these Rules if it appears that compliance with any such provision is then impossible or would occasion undue hardship and that the failure to comply with it has not substantially diminished or, if conditions imposed by the Board are complied with, will not substantially diminish, the value of the training and qualifications required by these Rules;  
(b) exempt the applicant from passing any subject which he would, save for the operation of paragraph (2) of Rule 20 have passed or be exempted under Rule 19 from passing or be deemed under Rule 19 to have passed, if it appears that the operation of paragraph (2) of Rule 20 would occasion undue hardship and that the value of the training or qualifications required by these Rules will not be substantially diminished if such exemption is granted or is granted subject to compliance with any conditions imposed by the Board as the case may be.”
5. By deleting from the heading to the form of Affidavit Verifying Articles set out in Schedule B. of the Rules, the words—  
“and Articled Clerk”  
and substituting therefor, the words—  
“an Articled Clerk”.
6. By substituting for paragraph 3 of the form of Certificate as to Character set out in Schedule G of the Rules, the following paragraph:—  
“3. We believe that he is of good fame and character.”

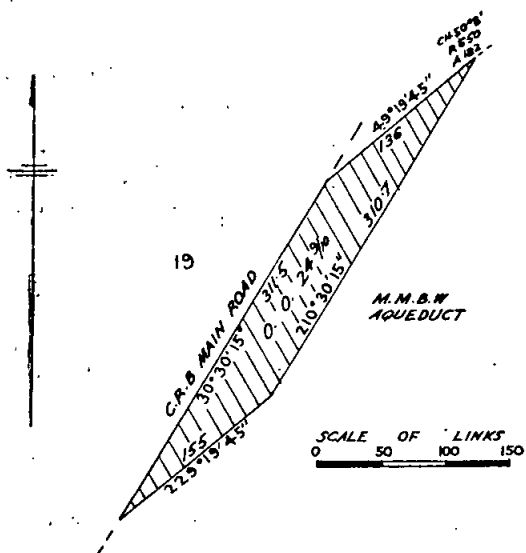

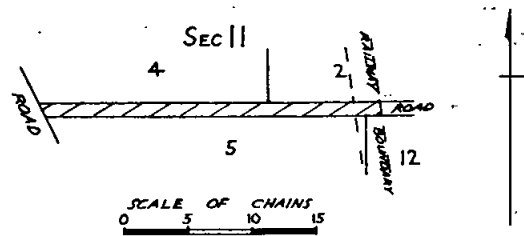

ORDER APPROVING THE WIDENING OF AN

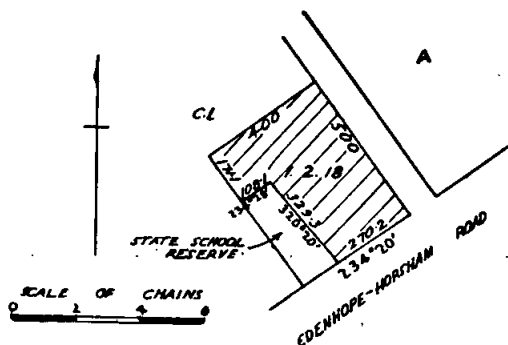

**REGULATIONS.**

1. 2. No person shall—

  - (b) enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication;

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.
4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.
5. No person, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.
6. No person shall park a motor car, vehicle, or motor cycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.
7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
9. No person shall play, practise or engage in any organized game or sport within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.
10. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.
11. No person shall, in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats or other structures therein.

12. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

13. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person shall play, practise or engage in any sport, including tennis, cricket, quoits, hockey, or any other games, or foot-racing, except in the portions of the Reserve set apart for that purpose, and then only with the permission of the Committee first obtained, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms and conditions as the said Committee may determine.

17. No person shall enter the Reserve or pass over the playing area or oval, with any vehicle or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

18. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

19. No person, club or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

20. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl or gravel from the Reserve.

5. No person except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

7. No person shall play, practice, or engage in any organized sport or game within the Reserve at any time without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sport, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care may be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring, shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

9. No person shall in the Reserve interfere with, break, or damage any of the trees, plants or shrubs, or pluck any flowers or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or any other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins, or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

10. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

11. No persons shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

The Reserve has been placed under control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

All previous Regulations made in respect of the said land are hereby revoked.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. That portion of the Reserve, commonly known as "The Hill", shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge.

2. The Committee shall have power to let that portion of the Reserve, commonly known as the "Recreation Ground", to any club, association, person or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, sports and the like, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations.

3. Any person committing on any part of the Reserve or in any of the rooms, buildings or structures, or erections or enclosures for the time being thereon, any of the following offences shall be guilty of breach of these Regulations:—

4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs or flowers in the Reserve, and no fires shall be lighted without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

5. No person shall climb or jump over fences or gates in or around the Reserve nor leave any glass, paper or rubbish on the Reserve.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission of the Committee first obtained in writing.

7. No person shall camp in any buildings or structures or on any part of the Reserve.

8. No person shall erect any building or structure without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained. All applications for the use of the Reserve must be lodged, in writing, with the Secretary of the Committee at least seven days prior to the ground being required.

10. No person shall bring into the Reserve or use or carry therein any firearm or offensive weapon without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

11. Persons renting or hiring any building or enclosure on the occasions of any cricket, football matches, sports or other entertainment may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such building or enclosure or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee.

12. No person shall on any portion of the Reserve cause or permit any sound or noise to be emitted from an amplifier, loudspeaker, public address system or like instrument without first obtaining the written permission of the Committee, and such permission may be granted subject to such terms, conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Committee.

13. No person shall graze in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, pigs or goats without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained:—

- (a) The Committee shall have the power to charge an amount to be fixed according to the circumstances and upon such conditions as they may from time to time determine.
- (b) The stock owner shall be responsible for any damage or injury caused by his stock to any of the buildings, gates, fences, trees or sporting equipment.
- (c) The Committee will not be responsible for any injury to any animal grazing on the Reserve nor shall they be responsible for any stock wandering from such Reserve as the result of broken fences or open gates.

14. No persons, club or other body shall without the consent of the Committee first obtained grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

15. No person shall enter the recreation ground or pass over the playing area or oval with any vehicle or on horseback without the permission of the Committee first obtained, nor ride or drive amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

*Uniform Building Regulations.*

A By-law of the Shire of Colac made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations and numbered 128 for determining applying dispensing with or regulating such matters as under the said Regulations are left to be determined applied dispensed with or regulated by the Council of the said Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Colac order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation on the day after the day of publication hereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the parts of the municipal district described in the Schedule hereto.

3. In this By-law:—

(a) The expression "the Uniform Building Regulations" or "the Regulations" means the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, as amended by any amending regulations for the time being in force;

(b) The expressions Class I., Class II., Class III., Class IV., Class V., Class VI., Class VII., Class VIII. and Class X. have the same meanings as in the Regulations; and

(c) The expression "outbuilding" includes stable, workshop, shed, laundry, motor garage, sleepout and any other building of Class X. occupancy.

4. The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in column 3 of Table 804 of the Regulations are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which buildings of Class I. and Class II. occupancy shall be constructed throughout the parts of the municipal district described in the Schedule hereto.

5. (a) The minimum distance from the frontage of any land of the outer walls of any building of Class I. or Class II. occupancy and of any outbuilding appurtenant thereto is hereby specified as 20 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building of Class I. or Class II. occupancy nor any outbuilding appurtenant thereto closer to the frontage of any land than 20 feet.

(c) The provisions of this clause so far as they relate to outbuildings shall be read and take effect subject to any contrary provisions contained in the Regulations.

6. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations and subject to the regulations made pursuant to section 65 of the *Housing Act 1958*.

(a) In any case where on the date of commencement of this By-law any land having less area, depth or width of frontage than specified in column 3 of table 804 existed as a separate allotment and has not subsequent to such date been reduced in area the Council may permit the construction of a building of Class I. occupancy on such land and may permit such building to be constructed nearer to any boundary than prescribed by Clauses 806 and 807 of the Regulations.

(b) In any case where on the date the Uniform Building Regulations came into force in those parts of the municipal district described in the Schedule hereto any land existed as a separate allotment and has not subsequently been reduced in area the Council may permit the construction thereon of a building of Class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy or a building to which a building of Class IV. occupancy is attached notwithstanding that such land has less area or width of frontage than specified in clause 809 of the Regulations.

(c) In this clause "separate allotment" shall have the same meaning as in Clause 816 (c) of the Regulations.

7. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations the requirements of clause 813 of the Regulations may be dispensed with by resolution of the Council if it is satisfied that section 452 (3) of the *Health Act 1958* can be otherwise complied with.

WHEREAS by section 219 of the Land Act 1958 it is enacted that where, under the provisions of any act relating to Crown Lands, the Governor in Council has reserved from sale permanently any Crown lands for any public purpose whatsoever or for any of the purposes specified in section 14 of such Act and has vested such land in trustees or jointly in the Board of Land and Works and trustees it shall be lawful for the trustees of any such land with the approval of the Governor in Council to make Rules and Regulations for all or any of the purposes mentioned in sub-section 1, of the section specified: And whereas a Crown Grant has issued in favour of the Board of Land and Works and the President, Councillors and Ratepayers, of the United Shire of Beechworth in respect of the Reserve in the Parish of Beechworth for Racecourse and General Recreation purposes: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works and the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Beechworth do hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the said Reserve for Racecourse and General Recreation purposes, hereinafter designated "the Reserve", in lieu of all previous Regulations which are hereby disallowed and annulled.

The Reserve has been placed under control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter designated "the Committee") with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

## REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve (but not to any stand or building erected thereon) shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except as hereinafter provided.
2. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainment or performances in the Reserve and may appoint days upon which the Reserve or some well defined part thereof may be set aside for the purpose of holding sports, fêtes, horse-races, shows, games or holiday amusements, and on any of the days so set apart the following charges may be made and taken, namely:—

- (a) For the admission of any person, motor vehicle, or other vehicle to the Reserve, such sum as the Committee may from time to time determine, not exceeding One pound.
- (b) The fee for permission to exercise or train horses on the Reserve shall not exceed £2 for each horse for each year or part of a year and such exercise or training will only be permitted on the portion of the Reserve set aside for such purposes by the Committee. Such permission to train or exercise horses shall not be unreasonably or arbitrarily withheld by such Committee of Management, or any body or persons duly authorized by the said Committee of Management, but such Committee, body or persons may, by notice posted on the said Reserve, forbid the training or exercise of horses thereon on any day when, in the opinion of the said Committee or such body or persons, such use would be detrimental to the condition and maintenance of the training track or other improvements, or when the Reserve or part thereof is required for other purposes.

3. Except when a race-meeting is being held thereon, no person shall bring any racing horse or trotting horse onto any part of the Reserve without the consent in writing of the said Committee or such body or persons as may be authorized for that purpose by the said Committee. When a race-meeting is being held thereon, no person shall bring any racing horse or trotting horse without the consent in writing of the Committee of Stewards of the body conducting galloping or trotting on the day, or some person duly authorized in writing by such Committee.

4. No person shall use the Reserve for the purpose of racing horses or for any other purpose whatsoever without the permission in writing of the Committee of Management being first obtained and then only on such terms and conditions as may be considered reasonable and consistent with these Regulations. Upon such person being duly authorized in writing by the Committee of Management the applicant shall pay a due proportion of the following fees:—

- (a) For each race-meeting a fee not to exceed £25.
- (b) For each trotting-meeting a fee not to exceed £25.
- (c) For any other sports, show or holiday amusement a fee (if any) not to exceed £10 per day.

5. No persons shall carry on the business or calling of a bookmaker except in and upon such portions of the Reserve as may be set aside for that purpose, and then only when he shall have complied with the following conditions:—

- (a) That he has registered as a bookmaker by such body or persons as are duly authorized in writing by the Committee of Management on payment of a fee not to exceed £5 for any race-meeting or sporting event held on the Reserve.
- (b) During the time he shall be on the Reserve carrying on the business or calling of a bookmaker he shall wear a ticket supplied by the body of persons authorized by the Committee of Management which shall be visible to the public and shall have thereon his name.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to enter into agreements with any racing club—

- (a) For granting to such racing club the right, whether exclusive of other racing clubs or not, to conduct race-meetings on the Reserve during such limited number of days in each year as the Committee of Management and such racing club may agree and on such financial terms (comprising fees to be paid by such racing club, to the Committee of Management, receipt by the racing club, of admission fees, training fees, bookmakers' registration fees, &c.) and for such period of years as the Committee of Management and such racing club may agree.
- (b) For permission to such racing club to construct at its own expense buildings and other improvements on the Reserve for the purpose of race-meetings and other incidental purposes and for giving such racing club such rights to remove the same as may be agreed; and
- (c) For such other purposes consistent with these Regulations as may be considered by the Committee of Management to be reasonable for the purpose of providing facilities for the holding of race-meetings and for rendering the race track and appurtenances suitable and convenient therefor.

7. No person shall cross or trespass upon the course, or any part of it, during a race-meeting or when the horses or motor vehicles are prepared to start or are running for any race, or shall trespass upon the playing field during the progress of a cricket match, or any sport or function.

8. Upon application, in writing, not less than fourteen days prior to the required date, any club, association, society or person may be granted exclusive use of the Reserve or any well-defined part thereof for the holding of any sports, fêtes, horse-races, shows, games or holiday amusements and may charge for the admission thereto, subject to the provisions of these Regulations and shall, if required, pay to the Committee such charges as the Committee may from time to time deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, such charge to be paid upon application being granted. The Committee may, however, refuse to grant any such application.

9. The Committee may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful games, recreations or sports, and from time to time grant to any person, club or association, upon such terms and conditions as it may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the ground so set apart.

10. No person shall put or bring into the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs or other animal without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

11. No person shall train or exercise any horse in the Reserve without the consent, in writing, of the Committee, first obtained, and the payment of the fee as here before provided.

12. The Committee shall have power to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be deemed to be the occupier of the Reserve (with all power incidental to that status) within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purpose of this clause "cattle" has the same meaning as in section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1958*.

13. No person shall park any motor vehicle or other vehicle in the Reserve, except at such place or places set apart for that purpose by the Committee.

14. (a) No person shall mark, write on or deface or in any way damage any tree, plant, shrub, flower, fence, gate, seat, building, stand or structure, or any turf, or

jump or climb upon or over, or stick bills upon any of the buildings, fences or gates in or around the Reserve, or leave or deposit any rubbish, paper, glass or other debris in the Reserve, or roll or throw any stone or missile of any kind therein.

(b) Affix any bill, sign or notice-board to any tree or structure within the Reserve without permission in writing of the Committee first obtained.

15. No person shall play or perform in any band of music, or deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon or address of any kind, sing any sacred or secular song, enter into any public discussions, or hold or take part in any public assemblage at any entertainment, sports, ceremony or meeting on the Reserve, except with the consent of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.

16. No person shall wilfully obstruct or interrupt or in any way interfere with any officer, member, employee or appointee of the Committee in the proper execution of his or her work or duty within the Reserve.

17. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct and for maintaining good order in the Reserve, the Committee or any person authorized by the Committee may refuse any person admission to the Reserve or any structure therein.

18. No person shall light any fire in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, except in the fireplaces as provided by the Committee.

19. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or leash.

20. No person shall without the permission, in writing, of the Committee, hawk, sell or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or article, or offer any goods or other article for hire.

21. No person shall spit or expectorate or commit any nuisance on the paths or in or on any building, structure or erection in the Reserve.

22. No person shall bring into or sell or distribute in the Reserve any intoxicating liquor, unless authorized in writing by the Committee and holding any licences or permit required pursuant to the *Licensing Act 1958* for the sale or drinking of intoxicating liquor therein, or employed by or acting on behalf of or delivering intoxicating liquor to any person so authorized and licensed or holding a permit, and then only in such portions of the Reserve as may be set apart for the purpose or in such booths, buildings and kiosks therein wherein the sale or drinking of intoxicating liquor is permitted by the Committee and licences or permits granted pursuant to the *Licensing Act 1958*.

23. No person shall have in his possession or control or consume or drink in the Reserve any intoxicating liquor unless authorized, in writing, by the Committee, save and except in such portions of the Reserve and in such booths, buildings and kiosks therein as may from time to time be licensed premises within the meaning of the *Licensing Act 1958* or in respect of which permits permitting the drinking of intoxicating liquor have been granted pursuant to the *Licensing Act 1958*.

24. No person shall camp in the Reserve or on any portion of the Reserve or in any building on the Reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, and then only upon payment of such fees and upon such conditions as the Committee may determine. Such written permission shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee to demand the production of same.

25. No person shall, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained, erect in the Reserve any post, rail, fence, pole, tent, booth, stand, building or other structure.

26. Any person committing any of the following offences within the Reserve shall (in addition to any other penalty to which such person may be liable therefor) be liable to be ejected from the Reserve, namely:—

- (a) Being under the influence of intoxicating liquor.
- (b) Using profane, abusive, insulting, threatening, indecent or obscene language.
- (c) Assaulting any person or behaving in a riotous or disorderly manner.
- (d) Wilfully interfering with or disturbing any entertainment, performance, game, sports, horse-race, motor-race, show, amusement, match or tournament to the annoyance, detriment or discomfort of any person or persons engaged or taking part in such entertainment, performance, game, sports, horse-race, motor-race, show, match, amusement or tournament.



(e). Obtaining admission to or being found in any part of the Reserve when not entitled to admission thereto under these Regulations.

27. The Committee shall not be held responsible in any way for any accident or injury sustained by or to any person or persons whilst within the boundaries of the Reserve.

28. No seasonal or monthly tickets shall be transferable and any holder of a seasonal or monthly ticket who allows any other person to use the same shall immediately forfeit such ticket and all moneys paid thereon and all the rights and privileges given by such ticket.

29. No male over the age of six years shall enter or use any place, room, convenience or building or any separate passage or approach thereto set apart for the use of females and no females shall enter or use any place, room, convenience or building or any separate passage or approach thereto set apart for the use of males.

30. No person shall enter on the Reserves with a caravan unless the consent in writing of the Committee is first obtained.

31. The owner or driver of any vehicle shall park such vehicle within the Reserves in such place and manner as directed by the duly appointed officer of the Committee.

32. Persons renting or hiring any stand or building, erection or enclosure on the occasion of fêtes, sports or holiday amusements or otherwise, may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding £100 by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection or enclosure, and such Committee may in its absolute discretion make good any damage or other injuries sustained by such stand, building, erection or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management. If no money is deposited as aforesaid or if the money deposited is insufficient to recompense the damage, the Committee of Management may recover the amount of the damage or the deficiency, as the case may be, from the person committing any such damage as aforesaid.

33. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of any young trees or shrubs.

34. No person, other than the players and the officials connected with any game, or officials or competitors at any race-meeting or sports gathering, shall intrude upon any playground or oval or track during the course of such games and sports.

35. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee or any officer thereof or any member of the Police Force, produce such receipt or permission.

36. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor cycle or horse except on a road or parking area made for the purpose in the Reserve and then only as near as practicable to the left hand side of such road.

37. No person shall drive any motor car or other vehicle of any kind or ride any bicycle, motor cycle or horse within the Reserve or in any parking area or along any road therein recklessly or at a speed or in a manner which is dangerous to the Public having regard to all the circumstances of the case including the nature and the amount of traffic which actually is at the time on which might reasonably be expected to be on such road, parking area or in the Reserve. The maximum allowable speed, motor-races excepted, at any time is 10 m.p.h.

38. No person, club, or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

39. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl or gravel from the Reserve.

40. No person shall make any wager for money unless at a registered sports meeting by a licensed bookmaker or play any unlawful game within the Reserve.

41. No person shall give out or distribute any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers in the Reserve without permission of the Committee first obtained, or litter same by scattering or throwing down any handbills, placards, notices, advertisements, books, pamphlets or papers.

42. No person shall throw or deposit any glass, filth, rubbish, refuse, junk, building material or waste material of any kind, or cause any glass, filth, rubbish, refuse, junk, building material or waste material of any kind to fall or to be thrown or deposited upon or in the Reserve.

43. Persons using the Reserve for any purpose shall, prior to leaving the area, collect and remove or cause to be collected or removed, all waste material, scraps, bottles, glass or litter of any kind brought or made by them.

44. Nothing in these Regulations shall prevent the Committee closing the Reserve or portion thereof and excluding the public therefrom whenever it shall think fit.

45. Every person to whom a ticket has been issued authorizing such person to enter upon the Reserve shall, upon demand, produce and, if required, surrender such ticket to any gatekeeper or other person duly authorized to demand such production or surrender of tickets.

46. No person shall in or upon the Reserve, kill, wound, trap or snare, or attempt to kill, wound, trap or snare, any bird or other native game, or have any dead bird or other native game, or the skin or pelt thereof, in his possession.

47. No person shall remove or displace any board, plate or fitting for the exhibition of any Regulations, neither shall any person remove or displace any notice fixed or set up in the Reserve by the Committee.

48. No person or organization or person or persons acting on behalf of any organization shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained and without first paying to the Committee such fees therefor as the Committee may demand, enter or remain in the grounds of the Reserve, with or in or from any part of the said grounds set up, conduct or operate, or take any part in the setting up, conduct or operation of any side-show or any device, machine or equipment of, or in the nature of a merry-go-round, swinging-boat, oceanwave, miniature-railway, shooting-gallery, water-boat, or any other device, machine or equipment (whether of the same or similar nature or not) usually run by professional side-show proprietors for the amusement of the public for reward.

49. No person whilst in the Reserve shall without the consent, in writing, of the Committee first had and obtained carry, use or discharge any firearm, air gun or other lethal weapon or carry, use, explode or light any fireworks or explosives; Provided always that nothing in this Regulation contained shall be deemed to prohibit the bona fide use by officials or any sporting body lawfully using the Reserve or any part thereof of any starter's pistol or starting gun in the conduct of sporting events.—(Rs.4249.)
