YARRA RIVER IMPROVEMENT TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW 1963.

THE Yarra River Improvement Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the River Improvement Act 1958, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rate, to be called the "Yarra River Improvement District River Improvement Rate", is hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all properties within the Yarra River Improvement District which are rateable to any municipality:—

A rate of Nine pence (9d.) in the pound on the net annual municipal value of such properties. Provided that the sum of One shilling shall be the minimum amount of rate in respect of any property liable to be rated in the said district.

- 2. Such rate is made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st January, 1963, and ending with the 31st day of December, 1963, and shall be payable on the 27th day of May, 1963, at the office of the Yarra River Improvement Trust, at Healesville.
- 3. Such person or persons as the Yarra River Improvement Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate.

A By-law of the City of Caulfield made under section 197 of the Local Government Act and numbered 129 for prohibiting or regulating the leaving standing of caravans on streets or roads and the placing of caravans on private property.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Govenument Act 1958 and of every other power enabling them in this behalf the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Caulfield do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. (a) In this By-law "Council" means the Council of the City of Caulfield.
- (b) Words or expressions used in this By-law shall have the same meaning as the same words or expressions when used in the Local Government Act 1958.
- No person shall leave standing or permit or suffer to be left standing any caravan on any street or road.
- 3. Subject to the proviso hereinafter contained no person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed-
 - (a) any caravan upon any private property in the one ownership or occupation if thereby there will then be more than one caravan upon such property, or

(b) any caravan upon any private property in the one ownership or occupation in such a position that any part of such caravan is within a distance of 25 feet from the frontage to such property or is within a distance of 5 feet from any other boundary thereof.

Provided however that notwithstanding anything here-inbefore in this clause contained the Council may subject to such conditions as it may deem fit permit more than one caravan to be placed upon any private property and within lesser distance from the frontage or other boundary than that hereinbefore prescribed if the owner or occupier thereof is engaged in carrying on within such property the business of selling or hiring caravans.

- 4. No person shall place or permit or allow to be placed on any private property for the purposes of accommodating any person or permit or allow any caravan to con-tinue to be placed upon any private property if such caravan is used for the purposes of accommodating any person unless a permit, in writing, issued by the Council shall have been first obtained and then only during the duration of such permit and upon the conditions (if any) specified therein.
- 5. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 or more than £20 and to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order is made by any Court.
- 6. This By-law shall apply to and have the force of law throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.


