A rate of Thirty-two pence (32d.) in the pound on the net annual municipal value of all properties in the Sixth Division, being those properties shown coloured red on the said plan.

A rate of Twelve pence (12d.) in the pound on the net annual municipal value of all properties in the Seventh Division, being those properties shown coloured blue on the said plan.

In respect of those properties in the Fifth Division shown coloured purple and Eighth Division shown uncoloured on the said plan, no rate shall be made or levied.

Provided that the sum of One shilling shall be the minimum amount of rate in respect of any property liable to be rated in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Sixth, and Seventh Divisions of the District.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of January, 1963, and ending with the 31st December, 1963, and shall be payable on the 1st day of July, 1963, at the office of the Snowy River Improvement Trust, at 86 Nicholson-street, Orbost.

3. Such person or persons as the Snowy River Improvement Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rate.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1963.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust, Shire Hall, Rutherglen.

with the Registrar of Titles, pursuant to section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, before the coming into operation of this Order.

4. Schedule—those portions of the Municipal District of the Shire of Altona, (a) within the area bounded by Railway-street south, Bent-street, The Esplanade, Pier-street, Queen-street and Sargood-street; and (b) the land facing Pier-street between Railway-street north and Civic-parade described as lots 64 and 63 of lodged plan 7931, and lots 238 to 245 inclusive, lots 152 and 153, and lots 226 to 235 inclusive of lodged plan 2102.

The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset, free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding 52 in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum, not exceeding Five shillings may be charged and taken for admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall—

(a) Enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, or who may behave in a disorderly, unseemly, or offensive manner, or create or take part in any disturbance.

(b) Enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

(c) Bring any intoxicating liquor on to the Reserve without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

(d) Exercise or train any horse or pony on the Reserve, or any part thereof, without the consent of the Committee first obtained.

3. The Committee shall have power to hold entertainments, shows, or performances on the Reserve, and to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided.

4. The Committee shall have power to let any portion of the Reserve to any club, association, person, or society for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances, shows, or sports, subject to the payment of such fees and on such terms as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, and to authorize any club, association, society, or person to make a charge for admission thereto as hereinbefore provided in these Regulations.

5. No persons, except the Committee or its officers or employees on duty, shall enter any part of the Reserve on an occasion when a charge is made for admission thereto without first paying the fees chargeable for such admission.

6. No person shall park a motor-car, vehicle or motorcycle in the Reserve, except at such places as are set apart for the purpose by the Committee, who reserve the right to make a parking charge not exceeding Two shillings for each vehicle.

7. No person shall play or engage in any organized sport, game, or competition within the Reserve on Sundays, Good Friday, or Anzac Day without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

8. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosure on the occasion of any sports, fêtes, or holiday amusements may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee may at any time determine by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such damage, injury or loss from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations, and by any order given by the Committee.

9. No person shall in the Reserve, interfere with or break or damage any of the trees, plants, or shrubs, or pluck any flowers, or climb, jump, or get over or under any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein, or roll or throw stones or other missiles, or leave any bottles, broken glass, paper, orange peel, banana skins,

or any refuse or rubbish whatever therein, or post bills or advertisements on any of the fences, gates, seats, or other structures therein.

10. No person shall light a fire in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee.

11. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

12. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

13. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building or any booth for the purpose of offering for sale any article, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

14. No person shall enter the Reserve, or pass over the playing area or oval with any vehicle, or on horseback, without the permission of the Committee first obtained; nor drive or ride amongst or to the danger or annoyance of persons assembled on any part of the Reserve.

15. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, without permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

16. No person, club or other body shall, without the consent of the Committee first obtained, grade or scrape the ground off or cut or burn any grass growing on any part of the Reserve.

17. No person shall remove any earth, sand, stone, marl, or gravel from the Reserve.—(Rs. 8195.)

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "PSYCHE BEND PUBLIC PURPOSES RESERVE".

WHEREAS by section 218 of the *Land Act* 1958 power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection and management of any Crown land which has been reserved under the Land Acts for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the power conferred aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the reserved Crown Land in the Parish of Mildura, shown bordered red on plan M/17.10.61, attached to Lands Department correspondence C.98042, and known as "Psyche Bend Public Purposes Reserve" (hereinafter referred to as the "Reserve").

The Reserve has been placed under control of a Committee of Management (hereinafter referred to as the "Committee") with power and authority to enforce these Regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language or conduct.

2. No person shall climb or jump over the seats or fences in or around the said Reserve or lie on the seats or stick bills on the fences, gates, posts or trees, or cut letters or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts or fences or otherwise deface the same or write thereon.

3. No person shall discharge any firearm or air gun or pea rifle, or take, displace or remove any bird's nest or nest or any animal, in or from the Reserve.

4. No person shall cut, saw, dig, move or displace any trees, bough, live or dead timber, wood or other material which may be in or around the Reserve, without the consent, in writing, of the Committee.

5. No person shall remove any stone, soil or sand from the Reserve.

6. No person shall throw or cause to be thrown any stone or other substance or play football, cricket, hockey or any other game with a hard or semi-hard ball on the Reserve, except in portions set apart for the purpose.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless led by a chain or cord. No dog shall be allowed in the Reserve, except as above provided, and all dogs, goats, pigs and poultry found in the Reserve shall be liable to be destroyed.

8. No person or persons shall ride a horse, bicycle or motor cycle or drive a motor vehicle or any other vehicle within the Reserve recklessly or in a manner which is dangerous to the public, having regard to all the circumstances of the case.

9. No person shall on the Reserve—

(a) Light a fire or burn any material, except with the consent of the Committee or in the places set apart for the purpose by the Committee or its duly appointed officer.

(b) Break glass of any kind or leave or deposit any matter or thing injurious to persons.

(c) Deposit or leave any bottles, glass, tin can, waste paper, garbage or litter of any kind, except in a receptacle provided for that purpose by the Committee.

10. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve whilst in a state of intoxication.

11. No person shall erect any tent, booth or other structure, nor offer for sale or hire any article within the Reserve or within any tent, booth or other structure thereon, without the permission of the Committee first obtained.

12. The Committee may set apart a portion or portions of the Reserve as and for the purpose of a caravan park and may fix and collect fees or other charges for entering and use of any such area. Such fees being those fixed by the Committee from time to time not exceeding 10s. per day or £3 per week for each caravan.

13. The owner or driver of any vehicle shall park such vehicle within the Reserve in such place and manner as directed by the duly appointed officer of the Committee.

14. No person shall park a caravan or camp on or use any portion of the Reserve, except such portion or portions thereof as are specially set apart by the Committee for the purpose and then only in such place or places as directed by its duly authorized officer.

15. No persons shall park a caravan on or use a camping area or any building or convenience appurtenant to a camping area, except during the period covered by the permission, in writing, of the Committee or its authorized officer, and then only on the payment of such fees as are fixed by the Committee, and any such permission may be granted subject to conditions deemed reasonable by the Committee.

16. The person to whom permission is issued by the Committee or its authorized officer to use a site in a caravan park area, shall be deemed to be the person who parked a caravan pursuant to such permission, and such person shall keep the site thus occupied in a clean, sanitary and tidy condition, and having vacated such site shall collect and place in the receptacle provided for the purpose, all refuse, litter or garbage from the same.

17. No person other than a person desirous of holidaying in the Reserve shall bring a caravan therein, nor shall any person sublet a caravan therein.

18. No person shall use a caravan within the Reserve for a period of more than 28 days at any one time unless with the special consent, in writing, of the Committee and no person shall use a caravan within the Reserve for more than two periods of 28 days in any one calendar year.

19. Every person holding or purporting to hold any receipt or permission, in writing, issued by the Committee shall, on demand by any member of the Committee or any officer thereof or any member of the Police Force, produce such receipt or permission.

20. No person, except workmen employed on the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantation of young trees, shrubs or grass.

21. No person shall play or perform in any band of music or deliver or read any public speech, lecture, prayer, sermon or address of any kind, sing any sacred or secular song, enter into any public discussions, or hold or take part in any public assemblage on the Reserve, except with the consent of the Committee, in writing, first obtained.

22. The Committee shall have the power to hold entertainments or performances in the Reserve and to make a charge for admission thereto, such charge being that fixed by the Committee from time to time not exceeding 5s. for every adult person.

23. The Committee shall have the power to let with or without the payment of a fee the Reserve, except that portion or those portions set apart as and for the purposes of a caravan park, to any club, association or person for the purpose of holding entertainments, performances or sports; the fee to be charged for the letting of the Reserve shall be that deemed by the Committee to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations and shall not exceed £10 for any one day, and the Committee may authorize such club, association or person to make a charge for admission thereto, such charge not to exceed 5s. for each adult person.

24. No person, except the members of the Committee of Management, the officers and employees of the Committee on duty, shall enter any portion of such Reserve when a charge is made for admission without first paying the fee charged, unless otherwise authorized by the Committee.

25. No person, unless he be guilty of an offence under this Regulation, shall be required to leave during any entertainments or sports after he has paid for admission, unless he has been tendered the amount of the admission fee paid by him.

26. No person shall by unseemly conduct, interfere with any entertainments, programmes or sports or interfere with the comfort and enjoyment of others within such Reserve.

27. No person shall interfere with or in any way hinder or interrupt in their work employees engaged in the Reserve by conversation or otherwise.

28. No person shall remain in the Reserve at any time when lawfully directed by any officer or employee of the Committee or by any member of the Police Force to leave the same.

29. No person shall bring or deposit any filth or rubbish of any sort in any portion of the Reserve.

30. Any constable or officer of police or any duly authorized officer of the Committee may order any person who in his opinion is not sufficiently or decently dressed, or who, clad in bathing costume, acts in an indecent manner, uses indecent language, or in any way offends against these Regulations, to resume his or her ordinary dress, and he or she shall forthwith comply with such order.—(C.98042.)

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII, Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 436 to amend By-law No. 405 and to prohibit or regulate within such part of an area prescribed by the said By-law No. 405 as a residential area as is specified the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building or portion of a building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses or public amusements as are specified.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf the Council of the City of Melbourne doth Order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall from and after the date of coming into operation, be read and construed as one, with By-law No. 405 intituled—

“A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII, Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 405 to prescribe areas within

the municipal district as residential areas and to prohibit or regulate within the whole or such part or parts as are specified of those areas the use of any land or the erection (including adaptation for use) or the use of any building or portion of a building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses or public amusements as are specified, and for other purposes."—and any By-laws amending the same.

2. By-law No. 405 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) By adding the following Schedule immediately following the Twelfth Schedule:—

"THIRTEENTH SCHEDULE.

Part of Residential Area 'C'.

All that piece of land bounded by Cathedral-place, Lansdowne-street and Parliament-place."

(b) By inserting in paragraph (b) of clause 4 after the words—"residential area" the following words:—

"other than that part of residential area 'C' which is described in the Thirteenth Schedule hereto."

(c) By inserting in paragraph (b) of clause 4 after the words "the Eleventh Schedule hereto" the following words:—

"other than that part of residential area 'C' which is described in the Thirteenth Schedule hereto."

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII, Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 439 to prescribe the terms and conditions and the fees to be charged for the use of closets privies urinals or conveniences provided by the Council and regulating the conduct of persons using the same.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf the Council of the City of Melbourne doth Order as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires—

"Attendant" means any person employed by the Council as a convenience attendant.

"City" means the City of Melbourne.

"Council" means the Council of the City of Melbourne.

"Melbourne General Market" means the markets described in the *Melbourne General Markets Lands Act 1917*.

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine and the singular number includes the plural and the plural the singular.

2. (a) No person shall urinate or defecate in any convenience provided by the Council except in a urinal or water closet provided for that purpose after payment of the prescribed charges (if any) for the use of such urinal or water closet.

(b) The charges for the use of any urinal or water closet in any convenience provided by the Council are—

(i) subject as hereinafter provided in any convenience in the area of the Melbourne General

Market or in that section of Queen-street lying between Victoria-street and Franklin-street:

Use of urinal—No charge.

Use of water closet—One penny.

(ii) Subject as hereinafter provided in any convenience elsewhere in any street or road or other place in the City:

Use of urinal—No charge.

Use of water closet—Three pence.

(iii) The foregoing charges shall not apply in any conveniences unless a notice specifying the charges is exhibited in such convenience.

3. (a) No male person over the age of six years shall enter or use any part of any closet privy urinal or convenience set apart or appropriated for the use of females, nor shall any female person enter or use any part of any closet privy urinal or convenience set apart or appropriated for the use of males.

(b) No person shall cause or permit any male child over the age of six years to enter or use any part of any closet privy urinal or conveniences set apart or appropriated for the use of females.

(c) No person shall cause or permit any female child to enter or use any part of any closet privy urinal or convenience set apart or appropriated for the use of males.

4. No person shall—

(a) consume intoxicating liquor in any closet privy, urinal or convenience;

(b) remain in occupation of any water closet or other facility within any closet privy or convenience for a long period than is reasonably necessary;

(c) by forcible or improper means seek admission to any closet privy urinal or convenience or to any portion or compartment occupied by any other person in any closet privy urinal or convenience;

(d) foul, pollute or defile any portion of any closet privy urinal or convenience;

(e) in any closet privy urinal or convenience place any article or thing in any urinal or other drain or in any pan or ablation facility whereby the drainage therefore is liable to become blocked;

(f) break injure, damage, destroy or tamper with any closet privy urinal or convenience or any furniture or fittings contained therein;

(g) mark or deface any closet privy urinal or convenience or any portion thereof.

5. Any person who shall wilfully break injure damage destroy tamper with mark or deface any part of any closet privy urinal or convenience or any furniture or fittings contained therein shall, in addition to any penalty incurred, be liable for the cost of repair or replacement of the thing so broken injured damaged destroyed tampered with marked or defaced.

6. No person shall in any closet privy urinal or convenience conduct himself riotously or create a disturbance or be guilty of profane swearing or of foul or abusive language or of obscenity or indecency or obstruct, hinder or resist in the execution of his duty any attendant or any other officer of the Council appointed either generally or otherwise to conduct superintend or aid in the good management of any closet privy urinal or convenience or neglect or refuse to comply with any lawful request of any attendant or any officer of the Council.

7. Any person who in any convenience contravenes any of the provisions of this By-law may be required by any attendant or any officer of the Council or any member of the Police Force to leave the convenience whereupon he shall leave the convenience forthwith and if he fails or refuses so to leave the convenience he may be summarily ejected therefrom by any member of the Police Force.

8. Any act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be an offence against this By-law.

9. This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district in relation to any closet privy urinal or convenience provided by the Council.
