**APPOINTMENT OF AUTHORITIES IN CONTROL OVER THE NAVIGATION OF CERTAIN VICTORIAN WATERS.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Part I, section 2, of the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may from time to time appoint an Authority in control over the Navigation of any Victorian Waters and that such limits may in like manner be altered, amended or repealed and other substituted in their stead:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation appoint the following bodies corporate or unincorporate to be the Authorities in control of Navigation in specified Victorian waters:—

- The Council of the City of Shepparton, in respect of Victoria Park Lake.
- The Council of the City of Nunawading, in respect of Blackburn Lake.
- The Council of the City of Ballarat, in respect of Lake Wendouree.
- The Council of the City of Bendigo, in respect of Lake Weeroona.
- The Council of the Shire of Barrabool, in respect of Lake Modewarre.
- The Lake Boga Water Supply and Public Parks Reserve Committee, in respect of Lake Boga.
- The Council of the Shire of Charlton, in respect of Lake Wooroonook.
- The Council of the Shire of Ripon, in respect of that portion of Lake Burrumbeet which lies within the Shire boundaries.
- The Beaufort Waterworks Trust, in respect of Beaufort Park Lake.
- The Council of the Shire of Stawell, in respect of Lake Fyans.
- The Council of the Shire of Ballarat, in respect of Lake Learmonth.
- The Joint Committee of the Councils of the City of Warrnambool and the Shire of Warrnambool, in respect of that area of the Hopkins River which lies between the Tooram Stones and a line joining the seaward tip of each headland on the eastern and western banks, being the entrance to the said river mouth.
- The Yambuk Progress Association, in respect of Yambuk Lake.

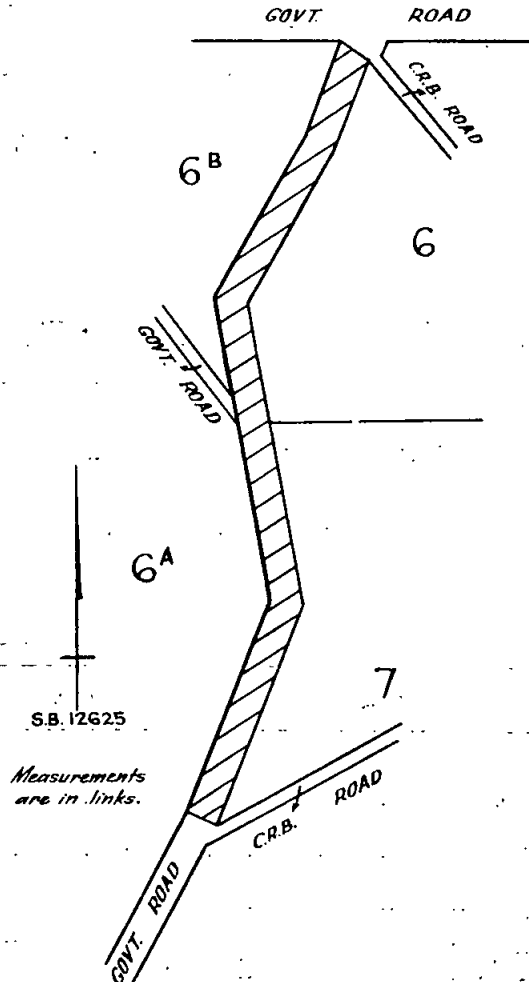

## PROCLAMATION OF STATES AND TERRITORIES FOR THE PURPOSES OF DIVISION 5 OF PART IV. OF THE COMPANIES ACT 1961.

WHEREAS sub-section (1) of section 76 of the *Companies Act 1961* provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation proclaim a State or Territory of the Commonwealth to be a proclaimed State or Territory for the purposes of Division 5 of Part IV. of the *Companies Act 1961*.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby declare the Northern Territory of Australia to be a proclaimed Territory for the purposes of the said Division 5 of Part IV. of the *Companies Act 1961*.

## Vermin and Noxious Weeds Acts.

## SIMULTANEOUS DESTRUCTION OF VERMIN.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1958* (No. 6409) as amended by section 7 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1959* (No. 6518), it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time by Proclamation in relation to land in the whole of Victoria or to land in any part of Victoria described in the Proclamation require every owner or occupier of such land to destroy the vermin on such land by means of poisoning with a derivative of mono-fluoroacetic acid strychnine or arsenic or by fumigation of burrows and warrens and specify the method by which such poisoning or fumigation shall be undertaken and further direct the time within which it will be undertaken and require such owners or occupiers to continue such poisoning or fumigation until the vermin are destroyed to the satisfaction of an Inspector:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby, in relation to land in the whole of Victoria, require every owner or occupier of such land to destroy certain vermin, to wit, rabbits, on such land by means of fumigation of burrows and warrens with calcium cyanide, chloropicrin, carbon tetrachloride or carbon monoxide and direct that such fumigation shall be undertaken within the period of four weeks commencing on Monday, the fifth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-three and require such owners or occupiers to continue such fumigation until the rabbits are destroyed to the satisfaction of an Inspector.

## GEELONG HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

## PORT OF GEELONG.

1. *New Channel light-beacons under construction.*
2. *Channel light-beacons to be permanently removed.*
3. *Alterations to Channel width.*
  1. (a) *Position.*—304 deg. distant 650 feet from existing No. 16 light-beacon Hopetoun Channel.

*Details.*—New Channel light-beacon under construction.  
(b) *Position.*—124 deg. 40 min. distant 100 feet from No. 6 light-beacon Corio Channel.

*Details.*—New Channel light-beacon under construction.  
*Structures.*—Four pile beacons surmounted by concrete battery house, painted black.

*Characteristics.*—Existing light characteristics will be re-established on respective new beacons.

*Remarks.*—During construction beacons will be lighted by temporary lights exhibiting a flashing green light every second.

2. *Details.*—On completion of new Channel light-beacons in (1) (a) and (b) above, the old No. 16 beacon Hopetoun Channel and No. 6 beacon Corio Channel will be permanently removed.

3. *Details.*—

(a) The northern margin of the Hopetoun Channel at its junction with the Corio Channel has been widened, and the widened section dredged to 36 feet L.W.O.S.T. as follows:—

Commencing at a point 204 deg. distant 40 feet from the new No. 16 light-beacon Hopetoun Channel; thence in a 104 deg. direction for 1,205 feet to the point of intersection with the existing north side Hopetoun Channel cut line.

(b) The Corio Channel between No. 4 and No. 6 light-beacons has been widened by 100 feet, and from No. 6 light-beacon to No. 8 light-beacon the widening decreases until the new Channel cut line intersects with the existing cut line abreast of No. 8 light-beacon. The widened section of Channel has been dredged to 36 feet L.W.O.S.T.

NOTE.—New Channel light-beacons are established 40 feet outside dredged Channel cut line.

BY-LAW No. 5428.—BELLARINE PENINSULA, MORNINGTON PENINSULA AND OTWAY WATERWORKS DISTRICTS.—FIXING CHARGES FOR WATER AND REVOKING BY-LAWS 5298 AND 5373.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. This By-law shall come into operation as on and from the 1st July, 1963, and shall apply to and have force in the Bellarine Peninsula, Mornington Peninsula, and Otway Waterworks Districts, except within any Urban District thereof.
2. By-laws Nos. 5298 and 5373 made by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission on the 17th November, 1958, and the 6th November, 1961, respectively, are hereby revoked as from the 1st July, 1963.
3. Minimum annual charges for water supplied by measure from the works of the Commission, except in the cases of special agreement with the Commission, shall be as set out in the Schedule hereto. Such charges shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, as follows:—

The minimum charges provide for one tapping only of the Commission's water main, and for each additional tapping there shall be a minimum charge of £5 except that in all cases where there is more than one residence upon the holding concerned there shall be an additional minimum annual charge of £5 for each additional residence supplied, and that in such cases, if required, a further tapping to serve each additional house will be allowed without further increase in the annual charge.

4. The maximum allowance of water to be supplied per annum in respect of the minimum annual charge shall in each case be the quantity which, if charged for at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would give an amount equal to such minimum annual charge, and for all water supplied in excess of such allowance the charge shall be Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

## STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 5427.

*For Establishing Advisory Boards in Irrigation Districts and Irrigation Areas and the Constitution, Functions and Duties of such Boards.*

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for establishing Advisory Boards in irrigation districts and irrigation areas and the constitution, functions and duties of such boards.

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Irrigation Districts and Irrigation Areas set out in the Schedule hereto.

## PART I.—INTERPRETATION.

2. For the purposes of this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Board" means an advisory board constituted by or under the provisions of this By-law.

"Commission" means the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission.

"Electorate" means the irrigation district or irrigation area or the part thereof in respect of which an advisory board is constituted.

"Irrigation season" means in respect to any board or its electorate the period for which an irrigation charge is made in the irrigation district or irrigation area in which the electorate is situated.

"Irrigator" means in respect to any board or its electorate an owner or part-owner or occupier (including any lessee, share farmer or any person employed in direct management) of any land which is situated within the electorate and to which a water right has been apportioned.

"Officer in Charge" means in respect to any board or electorate the officer of the Commission who is in charge of the irrigation district or irrigation area in which the electorate is situated, or an officer of the Commission named by such officer in charge to be his deputy.

## PART II.—CONSTITUTION OF ADVISORY BOARDS.

3. The bodies functioning immediately prior to the 1st day of July, 1963, as advisory boards for the respective irrigation districts or irrigation areas or parts thereof set out in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall on the said day be constituted as advisory boards within the meaning of this By-law with the names set out in column 2 of the said Schedule; and subject to the provisions of section 4 of this By-law the irrigation districts or irrigation areas or parts thereof set out in the said column 1 shall be the electorates of the respective Boards.

4. On and from the 1st day of July, 1963, there shall be a Register of Advisory Boards established and maintained by the Commission recording in respect of each advisory board a description of the electorate and the names of the members of the board. At each office of the Commission from which is administered any irrigation district or irrigation area within which the electorate of a board is situated a copy of so much of the Register as relates to such board shall be made available for inspection by any irrigator.

5. The Commission may by Resolution, after consultation with every board the electorate of which is altered by such Resolution—

(a) constitute an advisory board in respect of any irrigation district or irrigation area or part thereof defined by the Commission as the electorate of such board;

(b) unite the electorates of any two or more boards so as to form one electorate, abolish such boards and constitute a new board in respect of the united electorate;

(c) subdivide the electorate of any board, abolish such board and constitute new boards with the respective electorates formed by such subdivision;

(d) excise any portion of an electorate;

(e) add any portion excised from one electorate to another electorate;

(f) extend any electorate by the addition thereto of any land not forming part of such electorate.

6. (1) The name of any board constituted under the provisions of the last preceding section shall be assigned by the Commission.

(2) The name of any board may be altered by the Commission.

## PART III.—FUNCTIONS OF BOARDS.

7. The functions of an advisory board shall be to advise the Commission in regard to—

(a) the fixing of the times and periods for the supply of water for irrigation to lands in the board's electorate and the maximum quantity that may be taken under water-right at or during any time or period by the owners or occupiers of those lands;

(b) the operation of the Commission's works for the distribution of water for irrigation;

(c) the allocation of water including the rationing and priority of supplies in times of shortage of water; and

(d) any other matter for improving the operation of an irrigation district or area.

## PART IV.—ANNUAL MEETINGS OF IRRIGATORS.

8. (1) An annual meeting of irrigators in respect of each electorate shall be held in each year not earlier than 1st May nor later than 30th September.

(2) The business of an annual meeting may include—

(a) any matter concerning membership of the appropriate board in accordance with Part V. of this By-law;

(b) any matter referred to such annual meeting by the Commission;

(c) any matter within the functions of an advisory board referred to such annual meeting by the appropriate board;

(d) any motion within the functions of an advisory board and of which three days' notice is given to the officer in charge, in writing, signed by six or more irrigators; and

(e) any other matter within the functions of an advisory board raised by any person eligible to vote at the meeting, provided that the meeting shall determine by a majority vote whether the matter shall be discussed.

(3) Any annual meeting of irrigators shall be called by the officer in charge who shall by advertisement in a newspaper circulating in the electorate give fourteen days' notice of the meeting and of the business to be dealt with at the meeting. Additional notice may be given by radio broadcast or, in writing, to irrigators in the electorate.

9. (1) At any annual meeting of irrigators the officer in charge or his deputy shall preside.

(2) (a) For the purpose of voting at any annual meeting each entry shown in the appropriate register of lands and referring to land which is situated within the electorate and to which a water-right has been apportioned shall subject to the provisions of this paragraph entitle the owner or owners of such land to exercise one vote in his or their name:

Provided that—

(i) the occupier or occupiers (not being the owner or part-owner or an employee of the owner or owners) of land referred to in any entry shall in respect of that entry be entitled to exercise a vote in his or their own name on production at the meeting of written authority from the owner or owners transferring the vote in respect of that entry to such occupier or occupiers;

(ii) not more than one vote may be exercised in any one name whether or not the name represents more than one person; and

(iii) no person at the meeting shall exercise more than one vote.

(b) Voting for the election of members of a board shall be by secret ballot. Voting on any other matter at an annual meeting shall at the request of any five voters present at such meeting be by secret ballot.

(3) (a) Minutes of each annual meeting of irrigators shall be entered in a book kept for the purpose by the officer in charge and shall be submitted for confirmation at the next annual meeting of irrigators for the electorate.

(b) A copy of the minutes of each annual meeting of irrigators shall be forwarded by the officer in charge to the Secretary of the Commission.

## PART V.—MEMBERS OF ADVISORY BOARDS.

## Division 1.—General.

10. Any advisory board shall consist of—

(a) the officer in charge, who shall be chairman of the board;

- (b) members filling elective offices as provided in Division 2 of this Part; and
- (c) any associate member or members as provided for in Division 3 of this Part.

*Division 2.—Election and Appointment of Members.*

11. (1) The number of elective offices of membership of any board shall be not less than three nor more than—

- (a) nine if the gross area of the electorate does not exceed 200,000 acres; or
- (b) twelve if the gross area of the electorate exceeds 200,000 acres.

(2) Subject to sub-sections 1 and 3 of this section—

- (a) the number of elective offices of membership of any board constituted after 1st July, 1963, shall be determined by Resolution of the first annual meeting of irrigators of the board's electorate; and
- (b) the number of elective offices of membership of any board constituted by section 2 of this By-law shall be the same as the number of irrigators deemed to be members of the board by sub-section 3 of section 15 of this By-law.

(3) Subject to sub-section 1 of this section, the number of elective offices of membership of any board may be varied at any annual meeting of irrigators of the board's electorate by Resolution of the meeting, provided that notice, in writing, of a motion to vary the number of such offices is received by the officer in charge not less than 30 days before such meeting. Any such Resolution shall take effect immediately.

12. Some or all of the elective offices of membership of any board may be allotted by Resolution of any annual meeting of irrigators of the board's electorate so that they shall be filled respectively by representatives of particular localities or forms of production within the electorate; and any allotment so made, or varied as hereinafter provided, may be varied by Resolution of any annual meeting of irrigators of the electorate provided that notice, in writing, of a motion to vary such allotment is received by the officer in charge not less than 30 days before such meeting. Any Resolution under the provisions of this section shall take effect immediately.

13. Elective offices of membership of any board shall be filled only by irrigators in the board's electorate.

14. (1) Any elective office of membership of a board becoming vacant at an annual meeting of irrigators shall be filled by election at that meeting.

(2) (a) Subject to sub-section (3) of this section all vacant elective offices to be filled at any annual meeting shall be filled by a single election at such meeting.

(b) If the number of candidates for such offices is the same as the number of such offices then such candidates shall be deemed to have been elected.

(c) If the number of candidates for such offices exceeds the number of such offices the election shall be conducted as follows:—

- (i) Each vote cast in the election shall be cast in the form of a written list of the names of as many of the candidates as there are vacant offices to be filled.
- (ii) Each candidate shall be deemed to have received as many votes as the number of votes cast in which his name is included.
- (iii) As many candidates as are required to fill the vacant offices and as have received more votes than any of the remaining candidates shall be elected: Provided that, if two or more candidates have received the same number of votes and consequently the result of the election cannot be immediately determined, the names of those candidates only shall be drawn by lot and the first drawn shall be deemed to have received more votes than the next drawn, and so on, for the purpose of determining which of those candidates shall be elected.

(d) For the purposes of paragraph (c) of this sub-section the chairman may allot numbers which may be used in lieu of the names of respective candidates.

(3) If any of the elective offices of membership of a board has or have been allotted under the provisions of section 11 to a particular locality or form of production a separate election shall be held in respect of the office or offices allotted to each such particular locality or form of production so far as is necessary for the filling of vacancies in such offices, and a separate election shall be held in

respect of any offices not so allotted. Each such election shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of sub-section (2) of this section. Every vote exercisable at the meeting may be exercised in every such election.

(4) Any elective office of membership of a board becoming vacant otherwise than at an annual meeting of irrigators may be filled by appointment of an irrigator by the remaining members of the board, subject to the terms of any Resolution in force under the provisions of section 12.

(5) Before or during any period of three months or more throughout which a member of a board is unable to attend meetings of the board due to illness or to absence from the electorate the board may, subject to the terms of any Resolution in force under the provisions of section 12, appoint an irrigator to be an acting member of the board for such period. During the term of his appointment an acting member shall exercise all the powers of an elected member in place of the absent member.

15. (1) Subject to section 16 of this By-law any member elected to a board at an annual meeting of irrigators shall hold office until the next annual meeting of irrigators of the board's electorate.

(2) Any member appointed to a board under sub-section (4) of section 14 of this By-law shall hold office until the next annual meeting of irrigators of the board's electorate.

(3) Any irrigator who immediately prior to the 1st July, 1963, is a member of any body functioning as an advisory board shall be deemed to be a member of the corresponding advisory board constituted by section 3 of this By-law for a term of office expiring at the annual meeting of irrigators of the electorate concerned held in the year in which his membership of the advisory board would have expired.

(4) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this clause, if any member of a board who at the time of his election or appointment was required by the provisions of this By-law to be an irrigator in the board's electorate ceases to be an irrigator in the board's electorate he shall thereupon cease to be a member of the board and his office shall become vacant.

16. (1) It may be determined by Resolution at an annual meeting of irrigators on a motion written notice of which was received by the officer in charge not less than 30 days before such meeting that half or approximately half of the elected members of the board shall retire annually.

(2) Members elected to a board at an annual meeting of irrigators at which such Resolution is carried shall at that meeting draw lots to decide which of them shall retire at the next annual meeting of irrigators and which of them (being the remainder) shall retire at the second next annual meeting of irrigators, so that—

- (i) if the number of members of the board is an even number half that number shall retire at the next annual meeting of irrigators; or
- (ii) if the number of members of the board is an odd number the number of them who shall retire at the next annual meeting of irrigators shall be one less than the remainder.

(3) Any elected member of a board with respect to which a Resolution carried under sub-section (1) of this section is in force shall, except as otherwise provided in sub-sections (2) and (4) of this section, hold office until the second next annual meeting of irrigators following his election.

(4) If, as a result of a variation in the number of elective offices of membership on any board in respect of which a Resolution under sub-section (1) of this section is in force, or as a result of any vacancy occurring on such a board under the provisions of sub-section (2) of section 15 of this By-law, the number of members elected to such board at any annual meeting of irrigators exceeds by more than one the number of members continuing in office, the members elected at that meeting shall immediately draw lots to decide which of them shall retire at the next annual meeting of irrigators so that the total number of members then continuing in office shall not be less than nor exceed by more than one the total number of members then retiring.

(5) Any advisory board constituted under section 3 of this By-law some of whose members will under sub-section (3) of section 15 hold office until 1964 shall be deemed to be subject to a Resolution carried under the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section.

*Division 3.—Associate Members.*

17. (1) Any board may by Resolution recommend the appointment of any officer of a government department or instrumentality of the Commonwealth or of any State of the Commonwealth as an associate member of the board. On approval of such recommendation by the department or instrumentality concerned such officer may be appointed by the Commission as an associate member of the board for such period as the Commission specifies, and may thereafter be re-appointed from time to time by the Commission for such further periods as the Commission specifies.

(2) Any board may by Resolution recommend the appointment as an associate member of the board of any person who is not an officer of any government department or instrumentality of the Commonwealth or of any State of the Commonwealth but who has special knowledge of irrigation. Any such person on his acceptance of nomination may be appointed by the Commission as an associate member of the board for such period as the Commission specifies provided that no more than two associate members shall at the same time hold appointments on any board under the provisions of this subsection.

(3) An associate member may attend meetings of the board and join in discussion but shall not vote.

**PART VI.—PROCEEDINGS OF ADVISORY BOARDS.**

18. (1) (a) During an irrigation season each board shall hold ordinary meetings once each month or at such other intervals not exceeding three months as the board may decide from time to time.

(b) Any ordinary meeting of a board shall be convened by the officer in charge by three days' notice thereof given, in writing, to every member of the board.

(2) The officer in charge shall convene such additional meetings as he thinks fit, or as may be requested by any two elected members of the board.

19. At any meeting of a board a majority of members shall constitute a quorum.

20. The officer in charge or his deputy shall preside at every meeting of a board and shall have a casting vote but no deliberative vote.

21. Any board may appoint a committee of members under the chairmanship of the officer in charge to inquire into and report to the board on any matter within the functions of the board.

22. In regard to any Resolution passed at a meeting of a board the board shall be advised at that meeting by the officer in charge as to whether he will—

- (i) put such Resolution into effect; or
- (ii) refer such Resolution to the Commission.

23. (1) Minutes of meetings of any board shall be kept by the officer in charge and shall incorporate any explanatory matter which the board decides shall be incorporated.

(2) Minutes of each meeting shall be submitted for confirmation at the next meeting of the board.

(3) A copy of the minutes of each meeting shall be forwarded by the officer in charge to the Secretary of the Commission and to each member of the board.

(4) At any annual meeting of irrigators the minutes of meetings of the appropriate board shall be available for inspection by irrigators.

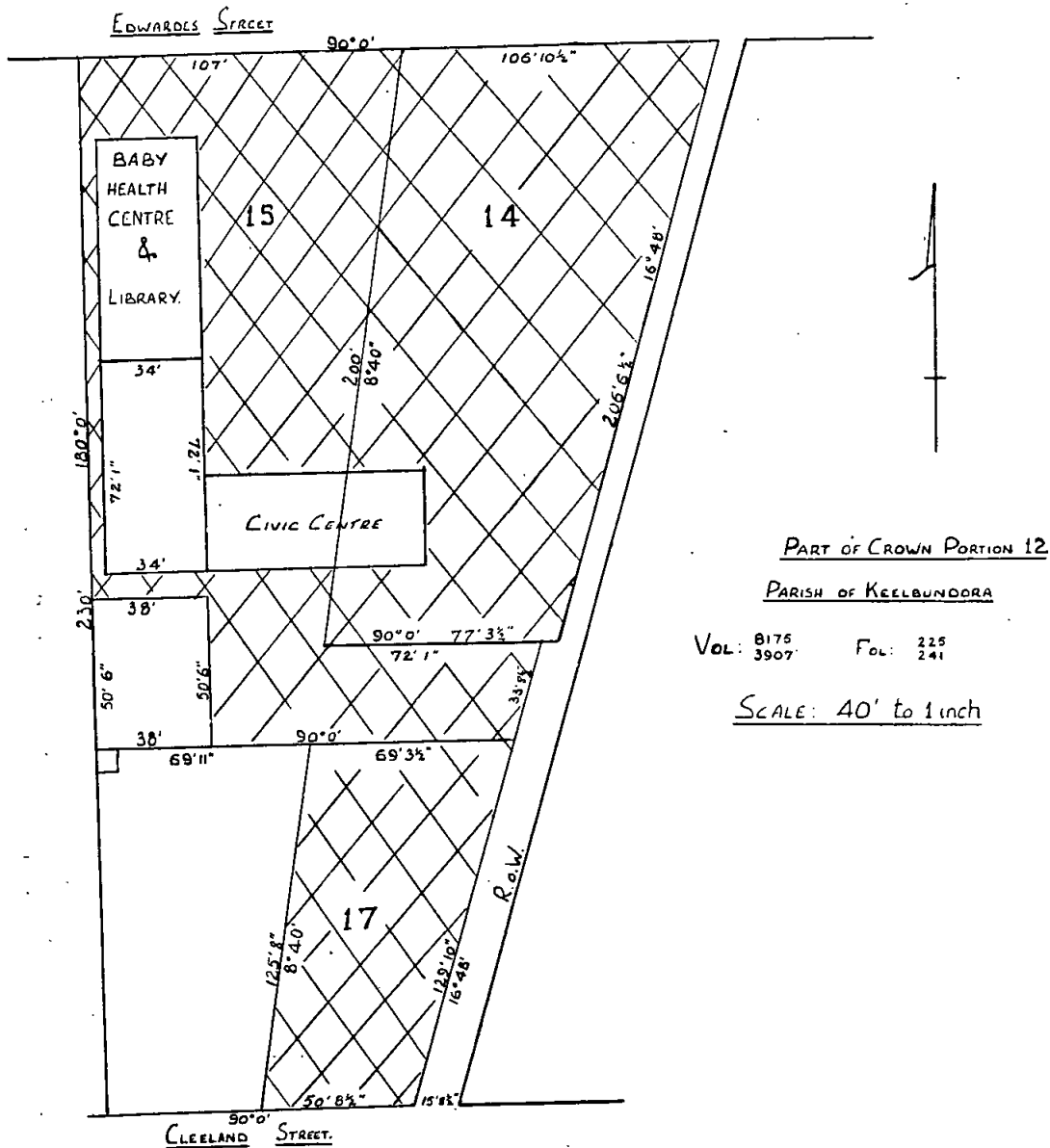

HURSTBRIDGE WATERWORKS TRUST  
CONSTITUTED.

UNDER the powers conferred by the *Water Acts* and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby approve of the application of the Councillors of the Shire of Eltham for the constitution of a Waterworks Trust, subject to the provisions of the said Acts, to construct, manage and maintain the works for the supply of water to the Townships of Hurstbridge, Pantom Hill and Wattle Glen, and doth hereby order and appoint as follows:—

1. That the name of the Trust shall be Hurstbridge Waterworks Trust.

2. That the Commissioners of the Trust shall comprise three persons elected by the Shire of Eltham, one person elected by the City of Heidelberg, one person elected by the Shire of Whittlesea, together with one other person, appointed by the Governor in Council.

3. That the estimated cost of carrying out the proposed waterworks shall be Two hundred and eleven thousand pounds (£211,000).

4. That the principal works to be constructed or carried out by the Trust shall consist of a storage reservoir, main pipe-line, service basins, pumping station and the reticulation of the Townships of Hurstbridge, Pantom Hill and Wattle Glen.

5. That the limits of the land within which the said Waterworks Trust shall have authority shall be those within the following boundaries:—

PORTION 1.

*Site of Storage Reservoir.*

## BY-LAW No. 98.

## Horses By-law.

A By-law of the City of Sunshine, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts* and all other powers thereunto enabling passed by a special order of the Council of the City of Sunshine sealed with the common seal of the City of Sunshine advertised in accordance with the provisions of the *Local Government Acts* approved by the Governor in Council and numbered 98 for the purposes of:

- (a) suppressing nuisances;
  - (b) regulating the keeping of horses;
  - (c) limiting the number of horses kept on any property;
  - (d) maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality;
- and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act, 1958*, and in pursuance of all other powers it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Sunshine orders as follows:

## Short Title.

1. This By-law may be cited as the Horses By-law.

## Commencement and Area of Operation.

2. This By-law operates:

- (a) 12 months after:
  - (i) this By-law; or
  - (ii) notice of its making;
 is published in the *Government Gazette*;
- (b) throughout the municipal district.

## Definitions.

3. In this By-law, unless the contrary appears—

- (a) the under-mentioned words and phrases bear the following meanings:
  - (i) "approved" means approved by the proper officer;
  - (ii) "clause" means a clause of this By-law;

- (iii) "Council" means the Council for the municipal district;
- (iv) "horse" includes colt foal filly gelding and mare;
- (v) "masonry" means stone brick terra cotta block solid or hollow concrete block or other similar building unit or a combination of same laid up unit by unit and set in mortar;
- (vi) "municipal district" means the municipal district of the City of Sunshine;
- (vii) "offence" means any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law;
- (viii) "open space" means in relation to any property that part of the ground surface upon which no building is erected and is measured as a contiguous whole;
- (ix) "proper officer" means an officer appointed by the Council to do the relevant act matter or thing;
- (x) "stable" includes any building and any place other than open space in which a horse is housed kept or stabled or is allowed to stand or run;
- (xi) "street" includes any part of a carriage-way footpath lane passage or road (whether a public highway or not);
- (xii) "written" includes duplicated lithographed photographed and printed.

(b) Words of:

- (i) singular meaning include the plural;
- (ii) masculine gender include the feminine; and vice versa.

*Keeping of Horses.*

4. No horse shall be kept on any property which is not registered under this By-law.

5. Every property on which a horse is kept shall be so fenced that a horse upon it cannot come within the following minimum distances:

Feature.	Minimum Distance.
Dwelling .. .. .	30 feet.
Premises on which food is manufactured packaged processed stored or sold .. .. .	40 feet.
Street (except when the horse is being taken onto or from the property) .. .. .	10 feet.

*Stables Manure Pits and Open Space.*

6. Every stable shall comply with the following requirements:

- (a) external walls shall not exceed 11 feet in height from the level of the ground to the top plate of the wall;
- (b) floors shall be paved with hard bricks or stone pithers set in cement mortar or with cement concrete or other approved impervious material;
- (c) every part of a stable shall be distant not less than:
  - (i) 50 feet from the boundary of the street or road to which the property has a frontage;
  - (ii) 10 feet from any other street or road of a greater width than 25 feet;
  - (iii) 5 feet from any other street or road of a lesser width than 25 feet or from the boundary of any land not in the same occupation; and
  - (iv) 30 feet from any building used as a dwelling-house;
- (d) the provisions of clause 6 (c) (iii) shall not apply to an external wall constructed of masonry or concrete not less than 9 inches in thickness;
- (e) no room other than a store room shall be constructed over or adjoining a stable;
- (f) a manure pit or pits constructed of impervious material and fitted with approved covers shall be provided in connexion with every stable and every such manure pit shall conform to the requirements set out in clause 6 (c) for stables.

7. The interior of every stable shall be thoroughly:

- (a) cleansed of all manure or other putrescible matter—daily;
- (b) limewashed—once a year;
- (c) sprayed with an approved germicidal spray—once every 3 months;
- (d) swept—daily.

8. If a horse is kept on any premises on which there is no stable a manure pit or pits constructed of impervious material and fitted with covers approved by the proper officer shall be provided on the premises and shall comply with the minimum distances specified in clause 6 (c) in respect of stables.

9. The interior of every manure pit shall be thoroughly:

(c) The Council shall grant the application and register the premises if they comply with this By-law and shall otherwise refuse the application.

12. (a) A registration under this By-law shall unless rejected be current until the ensuing 1st day of October.

(b) The owner or occupier of premises registered under this By-law shall on or before the 15th day of August in the period for which the premises are registered:

- (i) apply for renewal of registration in the form of the schedule to this By-law; or
- (ii) give the Council written notice signed by him personally that no horses will be kept on the premises after the ensuing 1st day of October.

(c) The Council shall renew the registration of the premises if they comply with this By-law and shall otherwise refuse to renew the registration.

13. (a) The Council may at any time revoke registration under this By-law if there is a breach of any clause in respect of the registered premises.

(b) The revocation of registration shall take effect 72 hours after written notice of revocation has been delivered or posted by the proper officer to the owner or occupier of the premises.

*Directions by Proper Officer.*

14. (a) The proper officer may by written notice delivered or posted to the owner of any property direct:

- (i) the removal of any horse kept contrary to this By-law;
- (ii) compliance with clause 7, 9, 10 (a) or 10 (c);
- (iii) cleansing limewashing spraying or sweeping additional to the requirement of clause 7 or 9 if the stable or manure pit is insanitary or offensive;

within the time specified in the notice.

(b) If any notice under this clause is not complied with the Council may cause the action specified in the notice to be carried out.

(c) the expenses incurred by the Council under clause 14 (b) shall be:

- (i) conclusively ascertained and declared by the City Engineer of the Council;
- (ii) paid to the Council by the person to whom the notice was addressed;
- (iii) if not paid to the Council within fourteen days after they were incurred—recoverable summarily by the City of Sunshine in any court of competent jurisdiction.

1. No person shall leave any derelict or unregistered motor car standing in any street or road.
2. (a) No person being the owner or having the possession, care, charge, custody, control or supervision of any derelict or unregistered motor car shall—
  - (i) permit the same to remain standing in any road or street, or
  - (ii) fail, neglect or refuse to remove any such motor car so standing after the expiration of seven days after the service upon him of a notice from the Council requiring him to remove the same.
 (b) Any notice under this clause may be served upon the person to whom it is addressed—
  - (i) by delivering it to him personally,
  - (ii) by leaving it at his usual or last known place of abode, or
  - (iii) by posting it in a registered envelope addressed to him at his usual or last known place of abode or business or his usual or last known postal address.
3. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of the provisions of clauses 1 or 2 of this By-law shall, in addition to paying the charges prescribed by clause 4 (h) hereof, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence and in the event of a continuing offence, to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court.
4. In addition to and without in any way effecting the provisions of clause 2 hereof—
  - (a) Any officer of the Council authorized by it in that behalf may remove or cause to be removed any derelict or unregistered motor car left standing in any street or road by such reasonable means as he may think fit to some place set aside by the Council for that purpose.
  - (b) So soon as reasonably may be after any such motor car has been removed as aforesaid, the Council shall cause to be published in a newspaper generally circulating in that part of the said Shire in which the motor car concerned shall have been left standing, as aforesaid, a notice in the form of the Schedule hereto.
  - (c) If within fourteen days after the publication of such notice as aforesaid, any person (hereinafter called "the Owner") shall produce to the Council proof to its satisfaction that he is the owner of the motor car referred to in such notice, and shall pay to the Council the appropriate charges prescribed by clause 4 (h) hereof, such motor car shall be released to the owner.

- (d) If any such motor car shall not be released in accordance with the provisions of clause 4 (c) hereof within the time limited by such notice as aforesaid, the Council may at any time after the expiration of such notice sell or cause to be sold such motor car by public auction or by private treaty or by such other means as it may deem meet.
- (e) The proceeds of the sale of any such motor car as aforesaid shall be applied first in payment of the costs and charges attendant upon the sale thereof and secondly in payment of the cost of the removal thereof as hereinafter fixed and the residue (if any) shall be paid to any person producing to the Council within three months of the date of such sale, proof to its satisfaction that he was, prior to such sale, the owner of such motor car.
