Public Service Act 1958.

REGULATIONS.—PART IV.—SALARIES AND INCREMENTS.

The Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Public Service Act 1958*, hereby amends the Public Service (Public Service Board) Regulations as on and from the 30th June, 1963, as follows:—

The First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, and Seventh Schedules to these Regulations are revoked and the following Schedules substituted therefor:—

Provided that an officer shall not be paid under this sub-regulation a rate of salary in excess of the maximum rate prescribed for Class 'D' in the Third Schedule."

Regulation 95.

Sub-regulation (2) is revoked and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

"(2) An officer who is not eligible by reason only of age to receive an allowance under sub-regulation (1) of this Regulation shall, on the recommendation of the Permanent Head, be paid an allowance at the rate of £200 a year for a male officer and £170 a year for a female officer provided that the total emolument shall not exceed £1,108 for a male officer and £921 for a female officer and that an officer receiving an allowance under this sub-regulation shall not also receive an allowance under Regulation 94."

Regulation 96.

Sub-regulation (2) is revoked and the following substituted in lieu thereof:—

"(2) An officer who is not eligible by reason only of age to receive an allowance under sub-regulation (1) of this Regulation shall, on the recommendation of the Permanent Head, be paid an allowance at the rate of £200 a year provided that the total emolument shall not exceed £1,108 a year and that an officer receiving an allowance under this sub-regulation shall not also receive an allowance under Regulation 94."
