








Parish of Koonda, County of Weeah, being the road between allotments 17, 19 and allotments 16, 20.—(K.203⁽¹⁾) (M.54482).



The Council of the City of Sunshine may at any time cause to be served on the owner or occupier of any property or premises a notice, in writing, requiring such owner or occupier, within a time limited by such notice, to destroy all such noxious weeds as may be specified in such notice and which are upon such property or premises and on the adjacent half-width of any street, road, lane or right-of-way on which the property or premises abuts and which weeds are declared by this By-law to be noxious weeds.

2. Any notice to be served as provided by paragraph 1 of this By-law may be signed by the Town Clerk or By-laws Officer of the municipality.

3. If any such owner or occupier shall within the time limited by such notice fail to comply with the requirements thereof, the Council may take such measures as may be reasonably necessary to destroy such noxious weeds at the expense of such owner or occupier and may recover the cost thereof from such owner or occupier as a civil debt recoverable summarily.
