Land Act 1958.

AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

MALDON SHIRE COMMON DIMINISHED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 12 of Part I. of the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: And whereas notice of the intention to diminish the Maldon Shire Common has been duly published in the *Government Gazette* for one month:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Maldon Shire Common by deducting therefrom the portion in the Township of Maldon being allotment 5, section 6, containing 1 rood 2 perches.—(Rs.353.)

LICENSING (AMENDMENT) ACT 1960 (No. 6659).

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION OF SUB-SECTION (3) OF SECTION 4.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the ninth year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intitled the *Licensing (Amendment) Act 1960* (No. 6659), it is enacted that subsection (3) of section 4 of the said Act shall come into operation from and after a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, being a day not less than two years after the commencement of the said Act:

And whereas a period of not less than two years has elapsed since the said *Licensing (Amendment) Act 1960* came into operation on the 11th day of July, 1960, by a Proclamation issued on the 28th day of June, 1960:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix Wednesday, the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, as the day upon which sub-section (3) of section 4 of the said *Licensing (Amendment) Act 1960* (No. 6659), shall come into operation.

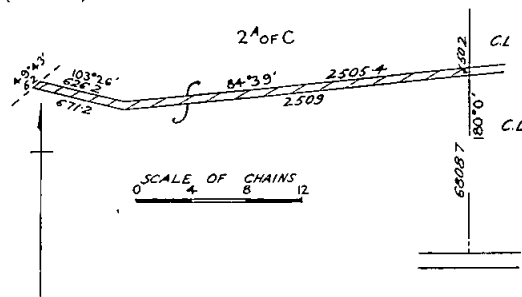

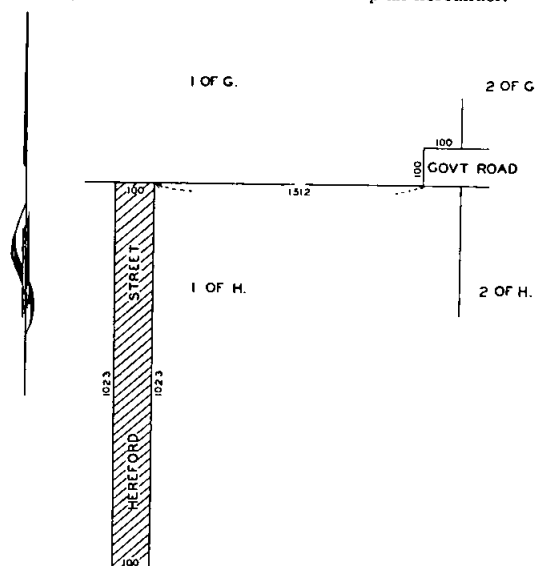

*Legal Profession Practice Act 1958.***SOLICITORS (AUDIT AND PRACTISING CERTIFICATES) RULES 1963.**

PURSUANT to section 88 of the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1958* and all other provisions in that behalf enabling, the Council of the Law Institute of Victoria doth hereby make the following Rules of the Institute (that is to say):—

Rules published in G.G. 16.6.60 as amended by rules published in G.G. 6.1.61 and G.G. 18.7.62.

1. These Rules may be cited as the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1963 and shall be read and construed with the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules 1960 and all other Rules amending the same, all of which Rules and these Rules may be cited as the Solicitors (Audit and Practising Certificates) Rules.

2. These Rules shall come into operation on the fifteenth day of August, 1963.

3. Rule 16 is amended—

(a) by inserting the following sub-rule after sub-rule (1) thereof:—

“(1A) For the purpose of making the general test examination referred to in paragraphs (a) and (c) of the last preceding sub-rule, the auditor shall be entitled to examine such number of dealings representative of every phase of the solicitor’s practice as the auditor shall in the circumstances consider reasonable.”;

(b) by inserting the following sub-rule after sub-rule (2) thereof:—

“(2A) The auditor shall report to the Council any deficiency in the trust bank accounts of the solicitor or any substantial illegality or irregularity in relation to his trust accounts as soon as is practicable after the auditor becomes aware of or has reasonable grounds for suspecting the existence thereof.”

4. The following rule is inserted after Rule 29:—

“29A. The register of negotiable securities shall form part of the solicitor’s trust accounts within the meaning of Rule 16 hereof and shall be subject to audit accordingly.”

“The solicitor shall not later than the 31st day of October in each year lodge with the Secretary a true copy of the reconciliation statement so kept by him for the month of June in that year duly signed by the solicitor and certified as a true copy by his auditor”.

6. The following rule is inserted after Rule 32A:—

“32B. (1) Every solicitor shall not later than the 31st day of October in each year lodge with the Secretary a statement in writing showing the amount standing to the credit of each account in the solicitor’s trust ledger at the preceding 30th day of June and the total of such amounts together with the name of the person on whose behalf each such amount is respectively held.

(2) Such statement shall be signed by the solicitor and shall be certified as correct by his auditor.

(3) It shall be sufficient compliance with this Rule if, instead of containing the names of the several persons on whose behalf the moneys are held, such persons are clearly identified by reference to the relevant number of the account in the trust ledger or some other easily identifiable symbol.”

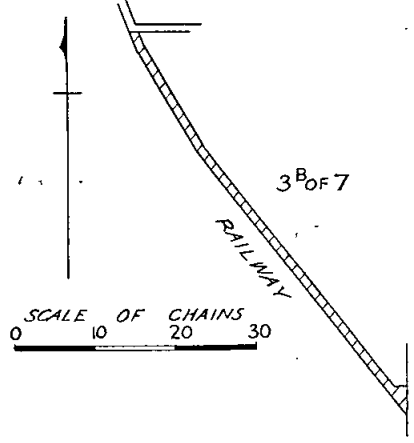

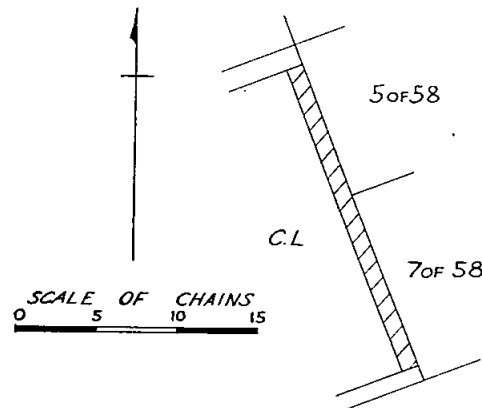

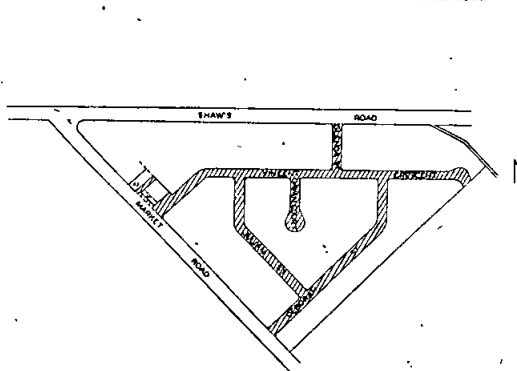
DECLARATION OF PRIVATE STREETS AS PUBLIC HIGHWAYS WITHIN THE SHIRE OF WERRIBEE.

The Council may at any time by notice, in writing, under the hand of the Town Clerk require (within a time specified in such notice) the owner of any land to reduce to a height not exceeding three feet six inches any portion of a fence upon such land and within 30 feet of the junction of any streets or roads.

6. Any owner upon whom any notice under clause 4 or clause 5 hereof is served shall comply with the requirements of such notice within the time therein limited.

- (a) Lop any tree, shrub or hedge growing or being on private property situate at the junction of any streets or roads which is not lopped as required by any such notice as aforesaid.
- (b) Reduce in height any portion of a fence which is not reduced in height as required by any such notice as aforesaid, and the amount of any such expense as aforesaid may be recovered by the Council in a Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily.

BY-LAW No. 49.

A By-law of the Shire of Seymour made under the Local Government Act and Health Act, Victoria, and numbered 49 for the determining, applying, dispensing with or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with or regulated by the Council of the said Shire under Local Government and Health Acts, Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and Health Act, Victoria, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Seymour order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall apply to all land within the area described in the First Schedule.

2. In this By-law—

“Fowlhouse” means any building or structure for the housing or use of poultry and includes any area of land attached to such building or structure and which is fenced in for the use of such poultry.

“Poultry” includes fowls, ducks, geese and turkeys.

“Kennel” means any building or structure for the housing or use of two or more dogs and includes any area of land attached to such building or structure used as a pen for such dogs.

3. Fowlhouses or kennels or similar structures may be constructed appurtenant to any house or flat provided that such structures:—

- shall be constructed with such materials as may be approved, in writing, by the Council,
- shall have a height not exceeding 8 feet and a total superficial area not exceeding 100 square feet,
- the area of land fenced in for the use of such poultry shall not exceed 200 square feet including structures,
- shall not be within 40 feet of any dwelling, place of living or sleeping,
- shall be distant not less than 4 feet from side and rear boundaries, and
- shall be distant not less than 50 feet of front street frontage and not less than 25 feet of any side street or road of a greater width than 25 feet.

4. The Council may, in writing, permit areas exceeding those specified in clauses 3 (b) and 3 (c) of this By-law.

5. General provisions—

- No person shall keep in any poultry house or similar structure a number of fowls greater than the number produced by dividing the area in square feet of such poultry house or similar structure by four unless confined in approved Battery Cages.
- No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored in any poultry house where poultry is kept any food for consumption by poultry unless such food is kept or stored in rat-proof receptacles or rat-proof buildings.
- The owner or occupier shall cause the poultry house or similar structure to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same in a clean wholesome and sanitary condition at all times.

6. All structures used for the housing of poultry or two or more dogs in use before this By-law is approved and published in the *Government Gazette*, Victoria, shall be brought into conformity with the requirements of this By-law before the expiration of six months after the date of approval and publication in the *Government Gazette*, Victoria.

7. Any person guilty of any contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

Rubbish and Tips, &c.

A By-law of the Shire of Traralgon made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and section 93 of the *Health Act 1958*, and numbered 59.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the above-mentioned Acts the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Traralgon order as follows:—

1. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes or passages other than in authorized tips.

2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land other than a rubbish tip established by the said Shire.

3. The owner or occupier of any land on which any refuse or rubbish is deposited or left on receiving written notice from such Council under the hand of its Shire Secretary, or such other officer of the municipality who may for the time being be acting on behalf of the Shire Secretary requiring such owner or occupier to remove or effectively destroy any such refuse or rubbish shall comply with any such notice within seven days after receipt thereof.

4. No person shall do or suffer to be done any of the following matters at any refuse tip or incinerator under the control of the Council of the Shire of Traralgon:—

- (a) Trespass on any part of such land.
- (b) Obstruct, disturb, interrupt or annoy any person lawfully using such area.
- (c) Neglect or refuse to obey the lawful directions of the Council's Engineer or other officer or employee in charge of any such area.
- (d) Deposit or leave any rubbish, refuse, waste or any other material which in the opinion of the Council's Engineer or other officer in charge of such area is liable to ignite spontaneously or if ignited to cause smoke or fumes of a nature dangerous to the public provided that this prohibition shall apply for only such period of the year as the Council or its Engineer or other officer in charge of any such area shall determine.
- (e) Bring, deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish obtained from any place outside the municipal district of the Shire of Traralgon or Borough of Traralgon without the written authority of the Shire Secretary of the said Shire.
- (f) Light any fire in any part of the tip.
- (g) Interfere with the surface of the tip or with any materials deposited or about to be deposited at the tip.
- (h) Disfigure, damage, destroy or interfere with any notice board, fence, building, appliance, machine, tree, gate or other equipment at the tip.

5. No person in or upon any road, street, footway or public place within the municipal district of the Shire of Traralgon shall drive any vehicle laden with rubbish or refuse which may drop or be blown about unless such vehicle is provided with adequate sides and where necessary enclosed to the satisfaction of the Council.

6. Any person guilty of a contravention of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and in the case of any offence continuing after such conviction to a further daily penalty of not more than One pound, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds.

7. Clauses 2, 3, and 4 of By-law No. 32 are hereby repealed.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have effect throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Traralgon.
