BY-LAW No. 127.

A By-law of the City of Camberwell, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and section 93 of the *Health Act 1958*, and numbered 127 for—

- (a) Regulating the keeping of animals and limiting the number of animals kept on any property;
- (b) Suppressing nuisances and controlling and regulating the use of premises with a view to preventing objectionable noises at unreasonable times.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the *Health Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—

1. (a) In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, the expression "dog" means any dog over the age of six months.

(b) This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

2. By-law No. 75 published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* No. 37 dated the 6th day of March, 1946 is hereby repealed.

3. (a) No person, except a person to whom paragraph (b) of this clause applies, shall keep more than two dogs on any property in the Municipal District.

(b) (i) The provisions of this paragraph (b) shall apply to a person to whom the Council has given its written consent to the keeping by that person of a specified number of dogs exceeding two on a specified property in the municipal district and shall apply to that person only during the period during which such consent remains in force.

(ii) A person to whom this paragraph (b) applies shall not keep on the property to which the written consent given to him by the Council relates a number of dogs exceeding the number specified in such consent and shall not keep more than two dogs on any property to which such a written consent does not apply.

(c) Written application to the Council shall be made for a consent referred to in paragraph (b) of this clause. The application shall state:—

- (i) The name and address of the applicant;
- (ii) The number of dogs which the applicant desires to keep;
- (iii) The breed of dogs which the applicant desires to keep;
- (iv) The situation dimensions and description of the property on which it is desired to keep the dogs;
- (v) The nature of the accommodation provided or proposed to be provided for the dogs;
- (vi) The means of sanitation provided or proposed to be provided for the dogs.

(d) The Council shall grant any application for its consent if, having regard to the nature, dimensions, area and situation of the property specified in such application and for the proximity thereof to other habitations and public buildings, including schools and churches, and of the nature of the accommodation and means of sanitation provided or proposed to be provided for the dogs and of the breed of dogs intended to be kept, it is of the opinion that the keeping on the said property of the dogs to which the application relates will not:—

- (i) constitute a nuisance within the meaning of section 43 of the *Health Act 1958* or be offensive or injurious to health or dangerous to health; or
- (ii) result in the creation of objectionable noise; or
- (iii) detrimentally affect the amenity of the neighbourhood.

(e) The Council may withdraw any such consent if, having regard to any alteration in the nature of the property to which the consent relates or in its neighbourhood or in the nature of the accommodation or means of sanitation provided for the dogs or in the breed of dogs kept or any variation between the nature of accommodation and means of sanitation and breed of dogs referred to in the application for such consent and those actually provided or kept, it is of the opinion that the keeping on the said property of the number of dogs specified in the said consent will:—

- (i) constitute a nuisance within the meaning of section 43 of the *Health Act 1958* or be offensive or injurious to health or dangerous to health; or
- (ii) result in the creation of objectionable noise; or

- (iii) detrimentally affect the amenity of the neighbourhood.

BY-LAW No. 145.

A By-law of the City of Geelong made under the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 145 for—

- (a) amending By-law No. 125 of the City of Geelong;
(b) prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, passages and on any land;

- (c) requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon;

- (d) regulating the conveyance along any street of any offensive material, dust, ashes or rubbish in any vehicle.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 197 and 222 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and of every other power enabling it in that behalf the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Geelong hereby order as follows:—

1. Clauses Nos. 58 and 72 of By-law No. 125 of the City of Geelong shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any lane, passage, street or road or on any land.

3. The owner or occupier of any land shall remove or destroy all refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council of the City of Geelong has undertaken or contracted for under section 48 of the *Health Act 1958*).

4. Any person who conveys any offensive material, dust, ashes or rubbish along any street in any vehicle shall adopt such precautions as may be necessary to prevent such matter from falling therefrom and if for any reason such matter should fall or be discharged from any vehicle he shall immediately remove the same and clean the place affected.

5. No person shall convey any offensive material along any street in any vehicle unless such material is enclosed or covered so as to prevent as far as practicable the emission of any offensive smell.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Geelong.

7. Any person or persons who shall by wilful act or default be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20 or not less than £5 for each such breach. In addition to any penalty prescribed hereunder any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this By-law in removing or causing to be removed any offensive matter, dust, ashes, refuse or rubbish falling on or discharged onto any street shall be paid by the person committing such breach.
