Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that Warwick-road, coloured brown on plan of subdivision No. 11814, lodged in the Office of Titles, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

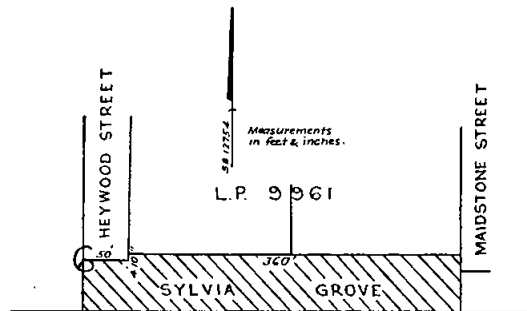

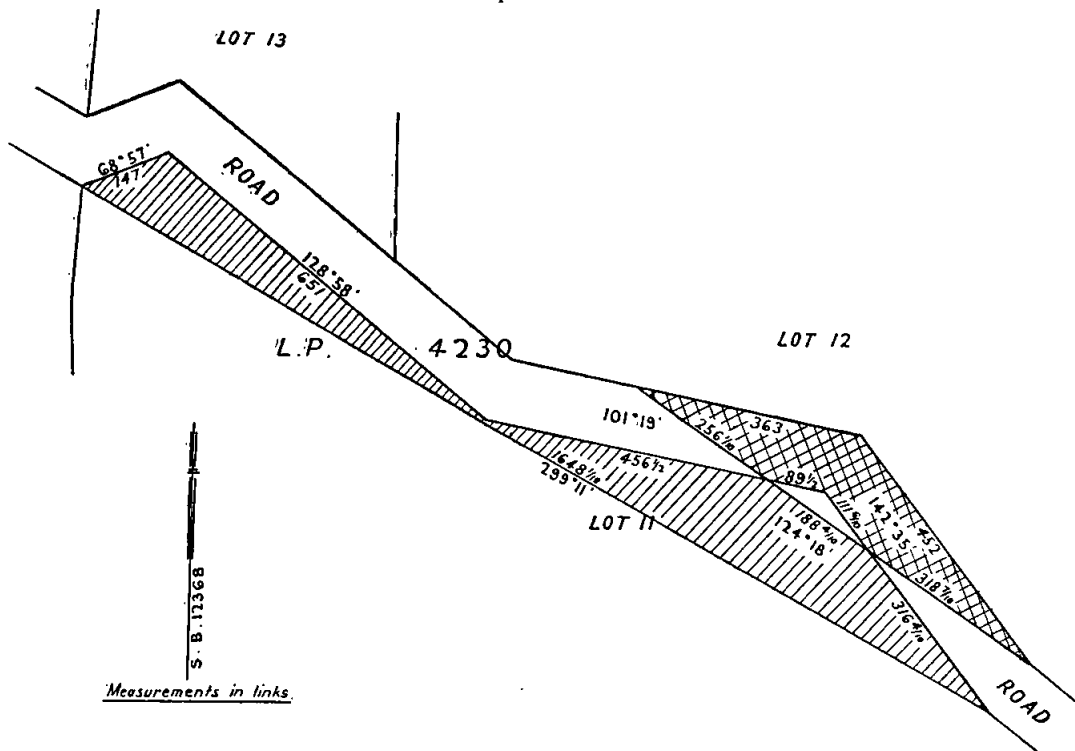

SHIRE OF KNOX CONSTITUTED AND SHIRE OF FERN TREE GULLY REDUCED.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that subject to the provisions of the said Act the Governor in Council may from time to time make Orders exercising certain powers therein set forth, amongst others to constitute as a shire any portion of Victoria containing rateable property capable of yielding upon a rate not exceeding One shilling in the pound on the net annual value thereof a sum of Three thousand pounds, and

every Order constituting a new shire shall assign a name to such shire, describe the boundaries thereof, determine of how many members the council shall consist and whether the municipal district is to be subdivided or not and in case it is to be subdivided name and describe the subdivisions, and

every Order severing any part of a subdivided municipal district may abolish the subdivisions and either constitute the municipal district an unsubdivided municipal district or resubdivide the same; and as regards every subdivision of which portion only is severed, may cancel such subdivision and annex the residue thereof to some other subdivision, or may declare that such residue shall thenceforth be deemed such subdivision.

And it is further enacted that notwithstanding anything in the said Act any such Order may provide for any election of councillors necessary to be held consequent thereon to be held on a day appointed therein whether before or after the taking effect of any other provision of the Order; and any Order constituting a new municipality may in relation to any such election make provision as to voting by post, compulsory voting the time for the closing of the poll and any other matter expedient to be provided in relation to the election; and may provide that until a date specified in the Order the Order shall not for all or any specified purposes of the Act operate to constitute the municipality or sever its municipal district from any other municipality; and any such Order shall be published in the Government Gazette and shall take effect from the day or days specified therein and different days may be specified for different purposes.

And whereas a request pursuant to the said Act for the constitution as a shire of portion of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully has been received by the Governor in Council and the proposal set out in the request has been carried at a poll of ratepayers entitled to vote in respect of property in such portion.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth by this Order grant such request with modifications, and doth constitute a shire to be named the Shire of Knox, and doth further order that—

- (1) The municipal district of the Shire of Knox shall be the area contained within the boundaries described in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) The municipal district of the said Shire shall be subdivided into three ridings to be named the North, Scoresby and Rowville Ridings being the areas contained within the boundaries respectively described in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (3) The council of the said Shire shall consist of nine councillors.
- (4) The first elections of councillors of the said Shire shall be held on Saturday the 16th day of November, between the hours of 8 o'clock in the forenoon and 6 o'clock in the afternoon.
- (5) Ralph Brockenshire Webb shall prepare the voters' rolls and be the returning officer for such first elections.
- (6) The regulations relating to voting by post and compulsory voting at elections of councillors made under the provisions of section 149 of the Local Government Act shall apply to such first elections.
- (7) Notice of the elections shall be published in *The Age*, *The Sun News Pictorial*, *The Mountain District Free Press*, *The Ringwood and Croydon Mail* and *The Dandenong Journal*, on Thursday, 24th day of October, 1963.
- (8) The municipal district of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully shall be the area contained within the boundaries described in the Third Schedule hereto.
- (9) The Centre, South and East Ridings shall be the areas the boundaries of which are respectively described in the Fourth Schedule hereto and the Emerald Riding shall remain unaltered.

This Order shall take effect on and from the 16th day of November, 1963, except that for the purposes of the first elections of councillors and matters relating thereto it shall take effect on and from the 9th October, 1963.

CITY OF WARRNAMBOOL.

BY-LAW No. 122.

A By-law of the City of Warrnambool, made under section 197 (XL.) of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 122 for providing for the care, protection, management and use of any lands provided by the Council as landing grounds for aircraft and of any buildings, erections, apparatus and equipment of such lands and prescribing reasonable fees for the use of such lands, buildings, erections, apparatus or equipment.

1. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise indicates or requires, the following terms shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

"Act"—The Air Navigation Acts 1920-1960 of the Commonwealth of Australia or other Act or Acts of the Commonwealth relating to air navigation for the time being in force.

"Aerodrome"—Any area of land under the control of the Council and gazetted as an aerodrome whilst and so long as licensed for the purpose of an aerodrome under the Act.

"Council"—The Council of the City of Warrnambool.

"Authority"—The City of Warrnambool Aerodrome Authority.

"Control Officer"—The officer appointed by or under the control of the Authority for the time being directing and controlling the traffic of aircraft on any aerodrome or of persons having business with aircraft on any aerodrome.

"Groundsman"—Any person appointed by or under the control of the Authority to control and supervise the use generally of any aerodrome, or for the time being acting in the discharge of such duties.

"Owner"—Includes lessee, charterer, and person for the time being in control of the aircraft.

"Pilot"—The person actually controlling an aircraft at the relevant time. If there is no such person, then the person entitled to such control.

Any term defined in the Act or Regulations shall have the same meaning in this By-law.

2. (a) The owner of every aircraft shall be entitled, upon and subject to compliance with this By-law to use any aerodrome in daylight hours for the landing, servicing, and departure of his aircraft and the embarkment and disembarkment of aerial passengers and freights.

(b) Unless and until so determined by the Authority, any aerodrome shall not be open to use for night flying. Nevertheless, in case of emergency, night landings may be made entirely at the owner's risk.

3. Subject to the Act and Regulations, the Authority may—

(a) Erect, make or place upon the aerodrome in such positions as it may see fit such buildings, structures, barriers, conveniences, amenities, sign posts, notices, markings, and other things as it may see fit for the more complete, effective, convenient, and safe use and enjoyment of any aerodrome as a public landing ground for aircraft.

(b) Grant to any person, upon application, permission to erect buildings, refuelling sites, or any other structure or thing, consistent with the use of the land as a aerodrome, subject, if the Authority considers fit, to the payment of a rental for the use of the land upon which such buildings, refuelling sites, or other structure or thing is or are erected. Such permission may be granted by the Authority subject to such terms and conditions as it may deem fit.

(c) By Resolution of the Authority, fix charges or fees for the landing of aircraft.

4. (a) Save as herein provided, a person other than—

(i) Persons lawfully employed upon duties in or about the supervision and control of any aerodrome, or in or about the arrival, departure, or servicing of, or other attention upon aircraft lawfully using any aerodrome; or

(ii) Passengers or intending passengers by aircraft lawfully using any aerodrome—

shall not be entitled to enter or be upon any aerodrome or any part thereof.

(b) The Authority may, from time to time, set apart any specified part or parts of any aerodrome—

(i) To which persons other than those mentioned in part (a) (i) of clause (4) of this By-law shall not be admitted.

(ii) To which the general public, or any limited classes of the general public may be admitted, either at all times or at specified times, or for limited periods and generally upon such terms and conditions as the Authority may determine.

(iii) To which no vehicle may be admitted, or to which vehicles may be admitted only on such terms and conditions as the Authority may determine.

(c) Suitable notices shall be placed by the Authority indicating the limits of any part of any aerodrome set apart for any special or limited use under this By-law.

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of this By-law, the Authority may on any special occasion, such for instance as an aerial pageant or other event of public interest, make such arrangements for the control of any aerodrome and charge such fees for participating and for admission as it may by Resolution impose.

(e) No person shall bring, or permit to stray, on to aerodrome, any birds, dogs, horses, cattle, sheep or goats without authority from the Authority. Any such bird or animal so found trespassing without authority may be removed from the aerodrome by any officer or employee of the Authority, or by any person authorized so to do. Any person bringing, or permitting any such bird or animal to stray on to aerodrome without authority shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

(f) Freightened animals or birds of any kind shall be crated or caged or under effective control at all times.

5. It shall be an offence, punishable by a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, for any person without permission of the Authority to enter or be upon any part of any aerodrome to which he is not entitled under the provision of the preceding clause to admission.

6. Every person admitted to or being upon any aerodrome shall whilst thereon behave himself in a proper and becoming manner and so as not to cause any annoyance or inconvenience to any other person lawfully thereon; and shall obey any directions reasonably given to him by the groundsmen or any person acting under him, for the purpose of preserving order or promoting or facilitating the proper use and enjoyment of any aerodrome.

7. All passengers and intending passengers by any aircraft shall, whilst upon any aerodrome, obey the directions of the groundsmen or control officer as to their conduct and movements.

8. Any person, whether or not a passenger or intending passenger by an aircraft, who the groundsmen or control officer may consider to be intoxicated or so under the influence of intoxicants as to make his presence on any aerodrome dangerous to himself or others, or offensive to others, or otherwise undesirable, may be refused admission to any aerodrome, or if upon any aerodrome may be removed by the groundsmen or control officer or any person acting under the direction of the groundsmen or control officer.

9. A person shall not use any building, structure, convenience or amenity provided upon any aerodrome for any purpose other than that for which it is provided or intended, or destroy, remove, obliterate, deface, alter or otherwise interfere with any barrier, notice, sign, or marking designed or intended for the direction, guidance, warning or information of persons using any aerodrome.

10. All occupiers of buildings on any aerodrome shall provide adequate fire-fighting equipment and shall take all precautions necessary for fire prevention.

11. Any person who commits any offence against this By-law shall, where no other penalty is provided, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and in addition to any penalty to which he may be liable such person may, if upon any aerodrome, be summarily removed therefrom by any police officer, or by the groundsmen or control officer or any person acting under his direction.

CITY OF WAVERLEY.

BY-LAW No. 85.

Street Traders and Collectors By-law.

A By-law of the City of Waverley made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 85 for:—

(a) Regulating the use of streets, roads and public places by street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in goods.

(b) Prohibiting or regulating the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows, boxes, baskets, crates, bags and other vehicles or receptacles standing or placed on any street, road or public place within the areas set forth herein.

(c) Prohibiting the erection or use on any land within the municipal district of tents or other temporary structures or buildings for the sale of goods therein or therefrom and the sale of goods in or from such tents, structures or buildings.

(d) Prohibiting or regulating the sale of goods from stalls, motor cars, carts, trucks, barrows or any other receptacles standing or placed on vacant land.

(e) Prohibiting or regulating the soliciting or collection in any road or street or from house to house adjacent thereto of gifts of money or of subscriptions for any purpose.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Waverley orders as follows:—

1. This By-law shall be known as the *Street Traders and Collectors By-law*.

2. No street hawker or itinerant trader dealing in goods shall use any street, road or public place between the hours of 5 o'clock in the afternoon of any day and 9 o'clock in the forenoon of the succeeding day.

3. Subject as is hereinafter provided no person shall sell any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, box, basket, crate, bag or other vehicle or receptacle standing or placed on any street, road or public place.

4. Any person may lodge with the Town Clerk of the municipality an application in the form set out in the

First Schedule hereto for a permit to sell goods. Such application shall be signed by the applicant and by at least five ratepayers of the City of Waverley.

5. The Council may in its discretion grant any such application or refuse to grant the same and if any such application be granted the Council shall cause a permit in the form set out in the Second Schedule hereto to be issued to the applicant under the hand of the Town Clerk.

6. Any such permit shall continue in force for the period of twelve months from the date of its issue or renewal and shall thereafter become null, void and of no effect unless renewed by the Council on the application in writing of the holder made prior to its expiry.

7. If at any time the holder of any such permit shall in the opinion of the Council fail to comply with all the terms and conditions thereof or if at any time in the opinion of the Council any obstruction shall be caused or the orderly flow of traffic shall be interfered with by the exercise of any rights granted by such permit or by any assemblage of persons caused thereby the Council may revoke such permit and the same shall thereupon become null, void and of no effect.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 3 of this By-law the holder of any such permit may during its continuance during the times specified therein sell any goods of a type specified therein from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow, box, basket, crate, bag or other vehicle or receptacle specified in such permit standing or placed on any part of any street road or public place specified in such permit.

9. No person shall erect or use on any land within the municipal district any tent or other temporary structure or building for the sale of goods therein or therefrom or sell any goods in or from any such tent, structure or building.

10. No person shall sell any goods from any stall, motor car, cart, truck, barrow or any other vehicle, box, basket, crate, bag or other receptacle standing or placed on vacant land (not being Crown land or land under the care and management of the municipality or a public place within the meaning of section 3 of the *Police Offences Act 1958*).

11. No person shall without the prior consent in writing of the Council under the hand of the Town Clerk solicit or collect in any road or street or from house to house adjacent thereto any gift of money or any subscription for any purpose.

12. No child (as defined by the *Labour and Industry Act 1958*) shall be employed as a street hawker or itinerant trader nor be permitted to manage or occupy a stand in any street, road or public place.

13. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

- (a) Adopting column 5 of Table 804 of the Regulations in regard to a certain portion of the municipal district and specifying a greater area, depth and width of frontage in regard to the remainder of the municipal district.
- (b) Specifying a minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy from a frontage in excess of that provided in column 5 of Table 804 of the Regulations.

Part I.—Definitions.

In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Building” includes any building, whether temporary or permanent, and any part thereof, and includes out-buildings, fences, walls, provision for lighting, heating, water supply, drainage and sewerage and other appurtenances of a building.

“Construct” includes build, construct, erect and place in position, re-build, reconstruct, re-erect and replace in position, and alter and do any structural work, and “construction” has a corresponding interpretation.

“Frontage” means the boundary line or lines between a site and the street or streets upon which such site abuts.

“Regulations” means the *Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria* (as amended), made pursuant to the provisions of the *Local Government Acts*.

For the purposes of this By-law buildings shall be divided into classes according to the nature of the use or occupancy in the like manner set out in clause 601 of the Regulations, and the categorization, designation and definition of such classes therein set out are hereby adopted.

Part III.—Site Requirements.

(a) The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in column 5 of Table 804 of the Regulations are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy shall be constructed in that portion of the municipal district described in the First Schedule hereto.

(b) The area, depth and width of frontage specified in the Second Schedule are hereby specified as the minimum dimensions of land on which a building of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy shall be constructed in the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Croydon other than that portion thereof described in the First Schedule hereto.

(c) No person shall construct or cause to be constructed any building of Class I. or Class II. Occupancy the outer walls of which are not a minimum distance of 25 feet from the frontage of any land.

BY-LAW No. 17.

A By-law of the Shire of Yackandandah under the Local Government Acts and numbered 17 for regulating the use and conduct of the swimming pools within the Shire of Yackandandah.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of any and every power it thereunto enabling the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Yackandandah order as follows:—

1. All swimming pools within the Shire of Yackandandah will be open to the public during such hours as the Committees of Management of each swimming pool shall from time to time by Resolution fix.

2. The Committees of Management of each of the said swimming pools may at any time and from time to time close the premises or any part thereof, for such periods as may be necessary for the purposes of cleansing, repairing, rebuilding, or reconstructing the same or for any other like purposes.

3. Every person using any of the said swimming pools shall wear a suitable bathing costume and the said Committees or the authorized officers shall be the sole judge of the suitability of each costume.

4. No person shall expectorate on the concourse of the said swimming pools, or in the entrance to the dressing rooms, compartments, passages or conveniences of the said swimming pools or in the vicinity of the kiosks.

5. No boy or girl under the age of ten years, and who is unable to swim shall use the adult section of the said swimming pools without the permission of the attendants in charge.

6. No boy or girl under the age of six years will be admitted to the said swimming pools unless such child is, in the opinion of the attendants in charge, in the care of a responsible person.

7. No person shall climb or jump over the fences or walls of the said swimming pool areas or roll or throw stones or other articles into the said swimming pools.

8. No person shall damage or remove any placard or notice board within the area of any of the said swimming pools.

9. No person shall use the said swimming pools whilst in an unclean condition, or suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious disease and any such person shall retire from the said swimming pools immediately upon being requested to do so by any attendants on duty at any of the said swimming pools.

10. No person shall improperly foul or pollute the water in the said swimming pools, or the shower baths, or wilfully and improperly soil or defile any towel or bathing costume, or any bathroom, dressing room, closet, box or compartment or any part of the said swimming pools or any furniture or article therein.

11. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with any lock, tap, or fitting in connexion with the baths, nor any towel, bathing costume, furniture or any other article supplied for any of the said swimming pools or write upon or deface the walls or partitions or other parts of the said swimming pools.

12. No person shall interfere with the use or enjoyment of any of the said swimming pools by any other person, and any person so acting or otherwise behaving in an unseemly or improper manner, shall immediately leave the premises when required to do so by any attendants in charge of the said swimming pools.

13. No person shall cause, permit or allow any dog or other animals under his control to enter or remain in any of the said swimming pools, or any part thereof.

14. No person shall at any time bring any intoxicating liquor into any of the said swimming pools or any part thereof.

15. No person shall enter or remain in any of the said swimming pools whilst in a state of intoxication.

16. No person shall enter or attempt to enter any shower or convenience occupied by another person.

17. No male over the age of six years shall enter any dressing room, shower, convenience, separate passage or approach thereto reserved for the use of females.

18. No female over the age of six years shall enter any dressing room, shower, convenience, separate passage or approach thereto reserved for the use of males.

19. No person shall use blasphemous, profane, obscene, indecent, offensive or abusive language in any of the said swimming pools.

20. No person shall loiter, misconduct himself, or commit a nuisance, or behave in an unseemly, improper, indecent, offensive, riotous or noisy manner in any of the said swimming pools.

21. No person shall dress or undress or remove any part of his or her bathing costume in any part of the premises of the said swimming pools open to public view or in any other part of the said premises except places specifically reserved for such purpose.

22. No person shall smoke within 15 feet of any of the said swimming pools.

23. No person shall bring into or deposit in the said premises any rubbish, filth, or other offensive matter nor deposit or leave therein any tins, bottles, broken glass, fruit or other peel, papers, cast-off, or discarded clothing, or other litter.

24. No person shall use any soap or other substance or preparation in any place or manner in the said premises whereby any water in any of the said swimming pools may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the use of bathers.

25. No person shall use or interfere with any rope, raft, lifebuoy or other life-saving appliance in the said premises unless in the case of accident or danger to a bather rendering their use necessary for the saving of life.

26. No person shall sell or offer for sale any goods or services in the said premises without the consent, in writing, of the Committees of Management.

27. Every person not being the holder of a seasonal or monthly ticket shall before entering the said premises pay to the authorized attendants the price of payment for entrance as fixed from time to time by the Committees of Management and every person shall before being furnished with any towel, bathing costume or locker, pay to the authorized attendants the price of payment for the use thereof and the deposit for same as fixed from time to time by the Committees of Management and after use shall return same to the attendants in charge who will return deposits lodged.

28. No seasonal or monthly tickets shall be transferable and any holder of such tickets who allows any other person to use same shall immediately forfeit such tickets and all moneys paid thereon and all rights and privileges given by such tickets.

29. Any person hiring any article from an attendant shall return same before leaving the premises.

30. In the event of the Committees of Management holding or permitting to be held a swimming carnival or other entertainment in any of the said swimming pools, it shall have the power by Resolution to prohibit bathing in any of the said swimming pools whilst such carnival or entertainment is being held, and to fix the prices which shall be charged for admission to such carnival or entertainment. A seasonal ticket shall not admit any person during the time fixed by the Committees of Management as the time for such carnival.

31. For the purpose of maintaining good order, the attendants in charge of any of the said swimming premises may refuse admission to any person.

32. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with any attendants, member of the Committees of Management or any Officer of the Council in the performance of his duties thereat.

33. No person, club or association shall organize or hold any carnival, aquatic display or other function in any of the said swimming pool areas without the consent, in writing, of the Committees of Management.

34. Neither the Committees of Management nor the Shire of Yackandandah nor any of its officers or employees shall be responsible for any article lost or stolen from any person whilst within the said premises. Valuables may be handed to the attendants in charge for safe keeping.

35. Any person who finds any article in the said premises shall immediately after finding same deliver it to an attendant, who shall thereupon register a description of the article and all particulars relating thereto in a book kept for the purpose. Any person who shall have lost such article shall upon giving satisfactory proof thereof be entitled to receive such article from the attendant upon placing his signature and address in the book above referred to.

36. The Committees of Management reserve the right by its officers and employees to refuse admission to any person and to remove any person misconducting himself in any manner whatsoever.

37. Any person guilty of any Act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds (£20) for every such offence.

38. This By-law shall come into effect immediately upon its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
