AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

ABOLITION OF AN URBAN FIRE DISTRICT AND ALTERATION OF BOUNDARIES OF A RURAL FIRE DISTRICT IN THE NINETEENTH FIRE CONTROL REGION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Governor in Council issued on the 16th day of November, 1954, and published in the Government Gazette of the 17th day of November, 1954, for the purposes of the Country Fire Authority Act 1944, certain parts of the country area of Victoria were proclaimed as fire control regions; and certain parts of such fire control regions were proclaimed to be urban fire districts; and the remainder (if any) of such fire control regions (being the area not included in any urban fire district) was proclaimed to be a rural district: district:

And whereas by section 16 of the Country Fire Authority Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time, after consideration of a report submitted by the Country Fire Authority by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette—

(1) Abolish any urban fire district; and

(2) amend or alter the boundaries of rural fire districts within any region;

And whereas the Country Fire Authority has submitted a report that it is necessary to abolish an urban fire district within the Nineteenth Fire Control Region;

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, after consideration of the said report of the Country Fire Authority, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Country Fire Authority Act, do by this my Proclamation—

(1) Abolish the urban fire district within the Nine-teenth Fire Control Region described in the Schedule hereto.

(2) Alter the boundaries of the rural fire district within the Nineteenth Fire Control Region by the addition thereto of the area described in the Schedule hereto.





- 7. No person shall spit or expectorate on any footpath.
- 8. No person shall use any street or road for the purpose of washing, painting or (save in case of emergency) repairing, dismantling or assembling any vehicle.
- 9. No person shall at any time between the hours of Eight o'clock in the morning and Six o'clock in the afternoon of any day obstruct or annoy passengers along any street or road by raising or discharging dust or causing water to flow upon or across such street or road.
- 10. No person shall permit to run from any land or premises into or upon any street or road any offensive liquid or matter.
- 11. No person shall on any premises owned or occupied by him burn or cause or permit to be burned any substance in such manner or to such an extent as shall cause such quantities of smoke to be emitted from the said premises as will cause a nuisance to any other person under our other person. upon any other land or upon any public highway.
