APPRENTICESHIP COMMISSION OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

- (2) The Shires of Altona, Croydon, Doncaster and Templestowe, Fern Tree Gully, Frankston, Knox, Lillydale, the Eltham and West Ridings of the Shire of Eltham, the East and Central Ridings of the Shire of Werribee, the Thomas-town and Morang Ridings of the Shire of Whittlesea.
- (3) The lands vested in the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners.

Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958 (No. 6407).
PARASITES DECLARED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred upon me by the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958* (No. 6407), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation—

(1) Revoke all Proclamations made heretofore declaring the insects, fungi and diseases named therein to be insects fungi and diseases within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Acts*, excepting the Proclamation made on the 18th day of July, 1961, in so far as it relates to the introduction of certain trees, plants and vegetables into the Shires of Mildura, Swan Hill and Kerang, the City of Mildura and the Borough of Swan Hill.

(2) Declare the parasites named in the First Schedule to this Proclamation to be parasites within the meaning and for the purposes of Part 1 of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958*.

(3) Declare the parasites named in the Second Schedule to this Proclamation to be parasites and pernicious parasites within the meaning and for the purposes of Part 1 of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1958*.

For making and levying such rate the valuation for the time being of such lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined in the manner provided in the Sewerage Districts Acts.

6. Such person or persons as the Bendigo Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect and recover the said rates and charges.

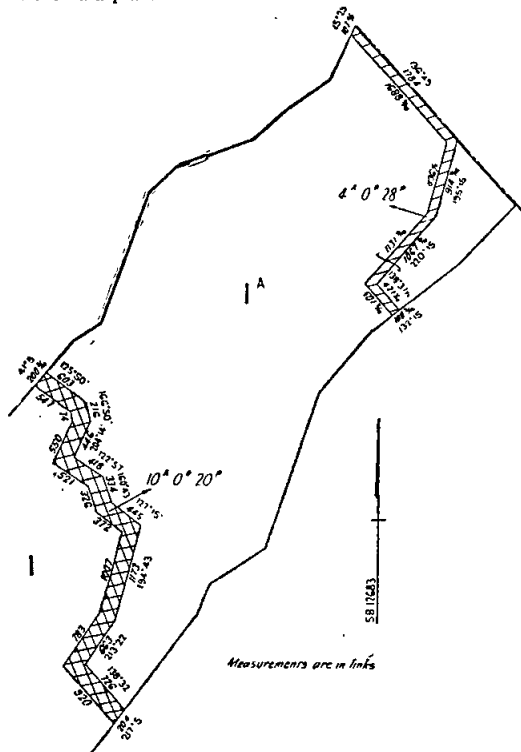

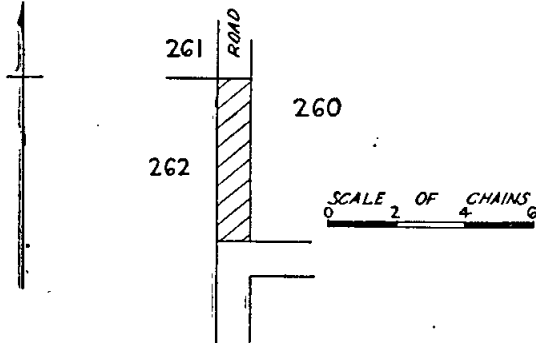

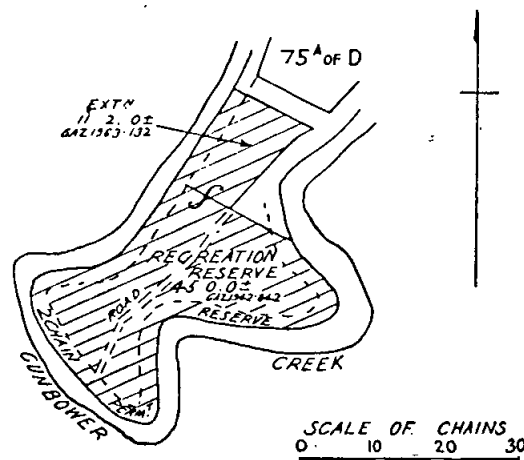
