Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 (No. 6304).
TOBACCO LEAF DECLARED A COMMODITY.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 7 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council when requested to do so by a petition signed (a) where the number of producers of the product does not exceed two hundred—by at least fifty per centum of the total number of such producers or (b) where the number of producers of the product exceeds two hundred—by at least one hundred of such producers plus five per centum of the number by which the total number of such producers exceeds two hundred, may by Proclamation declare that such product or any specified variety or grade thereof shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act: And whereas the Governor in Council has been requested by a petition signed in accordance with the above-mentioned sub-section to declare that Tobacco Leaf shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of this Act: And whereas the said petition sets forth the particulars required by the provisions contained in sub-section (2) of section 7 of the said Act: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby declare that Tobacco Leaf shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act.

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the twelfth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Elizabeth II., intitled the

HEALESVILLE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW 1964.

THE Healesville Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling in the pound on the net annual valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Healesville Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any property be less than Two pounds.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1964, and shall be payable on the 2nd day of January, 1964, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand, at the office of the Trust.

KOO-WEE-RUP WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW NO. 35 FOR THE YEAR 1964.

THE Koo-Wee-Rup Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and six pence in the pound of municipal valuation of lands and tenements to be rated within the Koo-Wee-Rup Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Seven pounds, and in respect of land on which there is no building Thirty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied on the occupiers or owners of said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1964, and shall be payable on the 7th day of January, 1964, at the office of the Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which at a charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

The Secretary of the Trust for the time being is hereby authorized to demand, collect, and recover on behalf of the Trust the rates and charges imposed by this By-law.

MOE WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1964.

THE Moe Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling in the pound of the net annual valuation (municipal) of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Moe Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable per annum in respect of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Six pounds and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Four pounds.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1964, and shall be due and payable on the 3rd day of January, 1964, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which at a charge of One shilling and nine pence per 1,000 gallons would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such minimum quantity, computed as in the preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and nine pence per 1,000 gallons. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, up to 1,000,000, and excess over at 9d. per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable on demand at the office of the Trust.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such quantity, computed as in the preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and three pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Council.

Dairy Products Act.
QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, GILBERT LAWRENCE CHANDLER, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be forty-five point five seven per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of January, 1964.

CHEESE QUOTA.

I, GILBERT LAWRENCE CHANDLER, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of cheese at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for cheese as follows:—

The proportion shall be thirty-seven point nought four per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of January, 1964.

MARKETING OF PRIMARY PRODUCTS ACT 1958.

PARTICULARS of a petition by producers of Tobacco Leaf requesting the Governor in Council to declare by Proclamation that such product shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958*.

- (1) That each of the petitioners is a producer of tobacco leaf within the meaning of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958*.
- (2) That the petitioners, in pursuance of the said Act by this petition, request the Governor in Council to declare by Proclamation that tobacco leaf shall be a commodity under and for the purposes of such Act.
- (3) That the petitioners request that the Marketing Board which may be constituted under the said Act in relation to the said commodity shall consist of five members.
- (4) That the petitioners request that the State of Victoria be declared as one electoral area for the election of members to the said Marketing Board.
- (5) That the petitioners request that the commodity "Tobacco leaf" be tobacco leaf which has been subject to flue curing, sun or air drying or any other curing process.

The Minister of Agriculture is of the opinion that the following information with respect to the powers which will be exercisable by the said Marketing Board will sufficiently acquaint producers of the said commodity as to the nature of the said powers.

1. Subject to the said Act and for the purpose thereof, the Board may sell or arrange for the sale of the said commodity which is vested in or delivered or to be delivered to it and do all acts, matters and things necessary or expedient in that behalf accordingly and, in particular, without limiting the generality of the foregoing powers—

- (a) may appoint or authorize such agents, officers, servants and other persons as the Board considers necessary, and with the approval of the Minister of the Department concerned may make use of the services of any of the officers or employees of the Public Service;
- (b) shall, under this Act make payments to each producer of the amount realizing from the sale of tobacco leaf which the producer delivered to the Board, less any such charges or amounts that are prescribed for under the Act;
- (c) may deduct from the proceeds of sale of the commodity the expenditure incurred in or about the insurance marketing or treatment of the commodity, the costs, charges and expenses of the administration by the Board

- of the said Act and any sums necessary to repay any advances made to the Board and interest thereon;
- (d) may deduct from the payment to be made to any producer of the said commodity, the freight charges incurred in the conveyance of the commodity from the station or other places of delivery to such other place or places in Victoria as is or are prescribed by Regulations.
- (e) may do all acts, matters and things necessary for or incidental to and may enter into contracts for or with respect to the transport treatment, grading, processing, branding, labelling, storage, packing or preparing for marketing of the commodity;
- (f) may make such arrangements as it deems necessary with regard to sales of the commodity for export or for consignment to other States or Countries;
- (g) may with respect to the marketing of the commodity enter into arrangements with any body of persons in any State of the Commonwealth of Australia which has the management or control of the marketing of such a commodity in that State;
- (h) may arrange for financial accommodation with the Government of the Commonwealth or with any bank or with any other institution or person approved by the Governor in Council, and give such securities for advances as are required by the said Government bank institution or person;
- (i) may purchase contract for the use of or otherwise provide and hold any land required by the Board and any personal property whatsoever; and
- (j) may contract for the use of or erect or otherwise provide any building or structures and repair, equip, furnish and maintain the same.

ORDERING APPROVING OF WIDENING AN EXISTING STATE HIGHWAY IN THE CITY OF BALLAARAT.

WHEREAS the Country Roads Board constituted under the *Country Roads Act 1958* (No. 6229) has represented to His Excellency the Governor in Council that it appears to it desirable that the existing Western highway in the City of Ballaarat (declared to be a State highway under the said Act which declaration was confirmed by the Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th July, 1925, on pages 2371-3) should be widened by the said Board: And whereas the said Board in accordance with the requirements of section 19 of the said Act has caused to be prepared a map, plan and estimate showing the points between which and on and through what land the said widening is proposed to be made and the cost of acquiring the land: And whereas on an inspection of the said map and plan and a consideration of the said estimate His Excellency the Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the land: Now therefore be it known by this present Order that His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby approve of the said highway being widened, that is to say—

All those pieces of land in the Township of Ballaarat East, Parish of Ballaarat, the boundaries of which are as follow:—

- (a) Commencing at the north-western angle of allotment 1, section 214 of the said township; thence by lines bearing respectively 90 deg. 34 min. 232 ft. 10½ in., 90 deg. 45½ min. 395 ft. 2½ in., 99 deg. 52 min. 111 ft. 9½ in., 267 deg. 10 min. 245 ft. 7 in., 270 deg. 27 min. 493 ft. 3 in. and 0 deg. 34 min. 35 feet to the point of commencement.

ORDER APPROVING THE WIDENING OF AN EXISTING STATE HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRES OF BUNGAREE AND BUNINYONG.

WHEREAS:

I. Section 114 of the *Country Roads Act 1958* (herein called "the Act") provides (*inter alia*) in—

- (a) sub-section (1) thereof that the powers conferred upon municipal councils by Division 14 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* shall so far as applicable be conferred upon the Country Roads Board (herein called "the Board") so far as relates to the declaration of the alignment the widening and opening up of State highways and that the provisions of the said Division shall with certain modifications extend and apply accordingly;
- (b) sub-section (2) thereof that no State highway shall be widened or opened up pursuant to the said section unless the Governor in Council has by Order published in the *Government Gazette* approved such widening or opening up:

II. The Board has—

- (a) in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said section 114 and for the purpose of widening the Western Highway in the Shires of Bungaree and Buninyong (declared by the Board pursuant to the Act or some corresponding previous enactment to be a State highway which declaration was confirmed by an Order of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 8th July, 1925, at pages 2371-3 thereof) by Resolution dated the 11th day of November, 1963, fixed a new alignment for the south side of the said highway;
- (b) in accordance with the provisions of section 19 of the Act caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing—
 - (i) the points between which and the lands on and through which the said widening is proposed to be made; and
 - (ii) the cost of acquiring the land.

III. The Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the said land.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria with the advice of the Executive Council thereof by this Order approves for the purposes of sections 20, 74 and 114 of the Act—

- (a) the widening of the said Western Highway so as to include therein the land described in the Schedule hereto; and
- (b) the acquisition of the land so described.
