LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACTS.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 928 (2) of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, provides—*inter alia*—that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the Government Gazette, at the request of the council of

any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Act to the municipal district of such municipality or any part thereof:

And whereas by Proclamations published in the Government Gazette on the 22nd January, 1947, the 6th October, 1954, the 29th October, 1958, and the 3rd April, 1963, the operation of the Uniform Building Regulations was extended to parts of the municipal district of the Shire of Towong:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Towong has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to a further part of the municipal district of the said municipality:

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under Part XLIX. of the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, to that part of the municipal district of the Shire of Towong described hereunder:—

Commencing at the point where the 636 contour of the Hume Reservoir intersects the south-eastern boundary of allotment 8b, section 1, Parish of Berringa, County of Benambra; thence generally north-easterly along this boundary and across a road reserve to the south-eastern angle of lot 10A, section 2A, Parish of Berringa; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the said lot 10A to the intersection with the southern boundary of lot 9A, section 2A, Parish of Berringa; thence easterly by the said southern boundary of lot 9A to the south-eastern angle of this said lot 9A; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of lot 9A, section 2A, Parish of Berringa, to its north-eastern angle; thence across a road reserve to the south-eastern angle of lot 8A, section 2A, Parish of Berringa; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the said lot 8A to the north-eastern angle of this said lot 8A; thence westerly by the northern boundary of lot 8A, section 2A, Parish of Berringa, to the south-eastern angle of lot 7A, section 2A, Parish of Berringa; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the said lot 7A, to the north-eastern angle of this said lot 7A; thence westerly by the northern boundary of lot 7A, section 2A, Parish of Berringa to the south-eastern angle of lot 6, section 2A, Parish of Berringa; thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of lots 6, 5 and 3A, section 2A, Parish of Berringa, to the north-eastern angle of the said lot 3A; thence across a road

reserve to the south-eastern angle of lot 1, section 2A, Parish of Berringa; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of lot 1, section 2A, Parish of Berringa, to the north-eastern angle of the said lot 1; thence westerly by the northern boundary of lot 1, section 2A, Parish of Berringa, to the south-eastern angle of lot 3, section D, Parish of Berringa; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the said lot 3, on a bearing 179 deg. 39 min. and across a road reserve to an intersection with the southern boundary of lot 2, section D, Parish of Berringa; thence generally north-easterly by the eastern boundary of the said lot 2 to its intersection with the southern boundary of lot 2A, section D, Parish of Berringa; thence easterly along this said southern boundary of lot 2A, to the south-eastern angle of lot 2A, section D, Parish of Berringa; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of lot 2A, section D, Parish of Berringa, to the south-eastern angle of lot 8A, section A, Parish of Berringa; thence north-easterly by the eastern boundary of the said lot 8A, and across a road reserve to the south-eastern angle of lot 7A, section A, Parish of Berringa; thence generally north-easterly by the eastern boundary of the said lot 7A, to the south-eastern angle of lot 1, section A, Parish of Berringa; thence across a road reserve to the south-western angle of lot 3, section A, Parish of Berringa; thence generally easterly and northerly by the southern and eastern boundaries of the said lot 3, to the most eastern angle of lot 3, section A, Parish of Berringa; thence across a road reserve to the most northern angle of lot 3A, section A, Parish of Berringa; thence 300 links on the bearing 122 deg. 43 min. by the boundary of the said lot 3A, to the north-eastern angle of this said allotment 3A; thence across a road reserve to the north-western angle of lot 9, section A, Parish of Berringa; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the said lot 9, to the south-eastern angle of lot 25, section F, Parish of Talgarno; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the said lot 25, to the south-western angle of lot 27, section F, Parish of Talgarno; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said lot 27, to the south-eastern angle of this said lot 27; thence northerly on the bearing 359 deg. 58 min. by the eastern boundary of lot 27, section F, Parish of Talgarno, and across a road reserve to a point on the southern boundary of lot 16, section F, Parish of Talgarno; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said lot 16, to the south-western angle of lot 21, section F, Parish of Talgarno; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said lot 21, to the south-western angle of lot 14, section B, Parish of Talgarno; thence on a bearing of 125 deg. 45 min. by the southern boundary of the said lot 14 and across a road reserve and along the southern boundary of lot 16, section G, Parish of Berringa to the most westerly angle of lot 15, section G, Parish of Talgarno; thence southerly by a western boundary of lot 15, section G, Parish of Talgarno, to the most southerly angle of the said lot 15; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said lot 15 to the north-eastern angle of lot 5, section G, Parish of Talgarno; thence southerly by the western boundary of lot 7, section G, Parish of Talgarno, to the south-western angle of the said lot 7; thence easterly by the southern boundary of lot 7, section G, Parish of Talgarno to the north-western angle of lot 9A, section G, Parish of Talgarno; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the said lot 9A on a bearing of 81 deg. 9 min. and across a road reserve to a point on the western boundary of lot 8, section H, Parish of Talgarno; thence northerly by the western boundary of the said lot 8 to the north-western angle of lot 8, section H, Parish of Talgarno; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the said lot 8 to the south-western angle of lot 4, section H, Parish of Talgarno; thence northerly and north-easterly by the western and northern boundaries of the said lot 4 to the northernmost angle of the said lot 4, section H, Parish of Talgarno; thence generally south-easterly by the eastern boundary of lot 4, section H, Parish of Talgarno, a distance of 2,906 links; thence easterly on a bearing of 80 deg. 49 min. across a road reserve and by the southern boundaries of lots 2B and 2C, section H, Parish of Talgarno to the south-eastern angle of the said lot 2C; thence southerly by the western boundary of lot 3, section H, Parish of Talgarno to the south-western angle of the said lot 3; thence easterly on a bearing of 80 deg. 47 min. by the southern boundary of lot 3, section H, Parish of Talgarno, and across a road reserve to a point on the western boundary of lot 14 of section D, Parish of Talgarno; thence northerly by the western boundary of lot 14, section D, Parish of Talgarno to the north-western angle of the said lot 14; thence easterly by the southern boundaries of lots 3A and 8, section D, Parish of Talgarno to the south-western angle of the said lot 8; thence northerly by the western boundary of lot 17, section D, Parish of Talgarno, to the north-western angle of the said lot 17; thence easterly by the northern boundary of lot 17, section D, Parish of Talgarno to

the north-eastern angle of the said lot 17; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of lot 17, section D, Parish of Talgarno to the north-western angle of lot 30A, section D, Parish of Talgarno; thence easterly on a bearing of 89 deg. 18 min. by the northern boundary of lot 30A, section D, Parish of Talgarno and across a road reserve to the north-western angle of lot 30, section D, Parish of Talgarno; thence easterly by the northern boundary of lot 30, section D, Parish of Talgarno to the north-eastern angle of the said lot 30; thence northerly, westerly, and northerly by the eastern boundary of lot 16, section D, Parish of Talgarno and continuing northerly across a road reserve on a bearing of 358 deg. 19 min. to the south-eastern angle of lot 5, section D, Parish of Talgarno; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of lot 5, section D, Parish of Talgarno to the south-eastern angle of lot 5A, section D, Parish of Talgarno; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of lot 5A, section D, Parish of Talgarno to the intersection of this boundary with the 636 contour of the Hume Reservoir; thence along this contour to the point of commencement,

and order that the said Regulations shall come into operation in the above-mentioned part of the municipal district of the Shire of Towong on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, provided that Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof shall not be deemed to come into operation till the 5th May, 1964, except in so far as may be necessary to enable the Council of the said municipality to make By-laws pursuant to the powers conferred by Part III. of the said Chapter, and provided further that no such By-law shall come into operation before the 5th May, 1964.

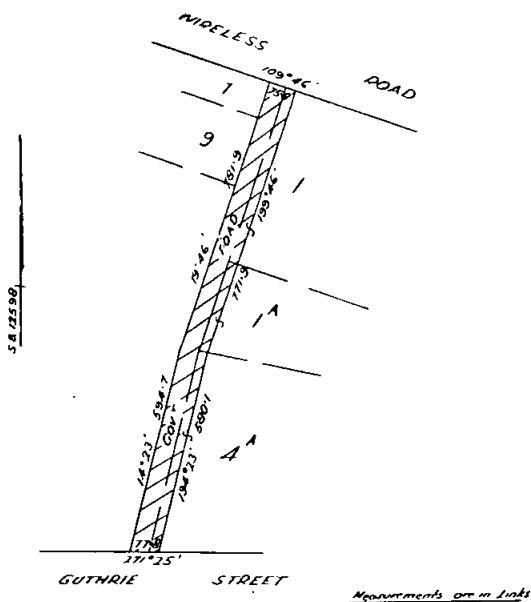
#### PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.  
WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government*

*Gazette*, to proclaim any land reserved, used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley or right-of-way or any street, road, lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street, road, lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles, to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Marong has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, reserved for a street within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway:

Now therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that all that piece of land in the Township of Kangaroo Flat, Parish of Sandhurst, shown by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act.

## VICTORIAN RAILWAYS COMMISSIONERS.

## BY-LAW No. 388.

THE Victorian Railways Commissioners, in pursuance of the powers conferred in that behalf by the Railways Act, do hereby in the following manner alter By-law No. 375 made by them on the 29th day of September, 1954, and confirmed by the Governor in Council on the 5th day of October, 1954, namely:—

After sub-clause (c) of the clause headed "All Traffic" appearing in section 28, there shall be added the following sub-clause (d):—

- (d) (i) Demurrage incurred due to delay in loading shall be paid by the owner or consignor;  
 (ii) Demurrage incurred due to delay in unloading shall be paid by the owner or consignee.

The provisions of this By-law shall become effective on and from the 1st day of March, 1964.

## CITY OF ARARAT.

## REGULATION NO. 109.

A Regulation of the City of Ararat, numbered 109, made under clause 26 of Division 4 of Part I. of the Fifteenth Schedule to the Local Government Act 1958, in force in the City by virtue of a By-law of the above-named City, for regulating crossings across or over footways and channels.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Ararat make the following resolution which shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.

1. Permanent crossings across channels shall be in masonry construction. They may be of box culvert section or open paved inverts as directed by the authorized officer of the Council to suit the conditions of the particular site.

2. The minimum loading for which a crossing shall be constructed shall be that imposed by a truck having a gross vehicle weight of 15,000 lb. Where a crossing is to take a G.V.W. in excess of this figure the loading to be carried must be shown in the plans and specifications to accompany the application for approval to construct a crossing.

3. Written application for approval to construct a crossing must be submitted to the Council on the prescribed form not less than fourteen days in the case of a permanent crossing or three days in the case of a temporary crossing before the commencement of the construction. Such application must be accompanied by plans and/or specifications sufficient to enable the authorized officer of the Council to determine the ability of the proposed construction to do the job for which it is designed without detriment to Council interests in the highway.

4. Construction may only proceed in accordance with plans and specifications duly approved by the Council and stamped to that effect by the authorized officer, and the applicant must replace any work done not in accordance with those plans and specifications on being directed to do so by that officer.

5. The approach to the channel crossing from the highway shall be of a type and strength matching that of the highway it abuts.

6. The crossing of the footway between the channel crossing and the building line shall be of a type and strength that will ensure that the longitudinal traverse of the crossing by pedestrians on the footway will be similar to that of the approaches existing on each side of the crossing and the specification of this crossing shall be acceptable to the Council as signified through the approval of its authorized officer.

7. Where for any purpose a temporary crossing only is required over a footway and/or channel, application must be made on the prescribed form as mentioned in clause 3 above. Such temporary crossing shall have a currency in the case of crossings associated with building operations the same as the currency of the building permit, or for such period not exceeding twelve (12) months as the Council through its authorized officer may determine.

8. Temporary crossings over footways are to be in timber planking of suitable length and cross section, suitably spaced and continuously tied on each side with galvanized hoop iron to ensure load transmission to the footway surface at a level which will not permanently deform that surface. The ends of the planks shall be chamfered to provide a minimum obstruction to longitudinal traffic on the footway.

9. Temporary crossings over channels may be in suitably-designed timber structures in the case of paved channel or in a matching corduroy timber mat to that for the footway where the longitudinal section of the crossing permits. The sizes of timbers and their disposition must be shown on the plans and/or specification that accompanies the application.

10. The maximum anticipated load to use the crossing must be shown on the application and the means of providing suitable surfacing on the approach side from the highway to the crossing must be specified in the application.

11. Applications for temporary crossings must be accompanied by a deposit of £20 to be held by the Council until such time as the authorized officer certifies that the site has been made good following the removal of the temporary crossing. The deposit will be refunded in full in those instances where the Council is not required to make good any part of the site. Any work that the Council has to do to make good will be a charge against the deposit held.

12. Maintenance of crossings over footways and channels shall at all times be such that the structures maintain the efficiency provided for in the plans and/or specifications of the approved proposal.

The resolution for passing this Regulation was agreed to by the Council on the 23rd day of September, 1963, and confirmed on the 21st day of October, 1963.

## CITY OF ARARAT.

## BY-LAW NO. 110.

A By-law of the City of Ararat, made under section 197 of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 110, requiring that any land in the municipal district which the Council by notice, in writing, to the owner or occupier has declared to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood, shall be enclosed with a sufficient fence of such material and in such manner as is prescribed by this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Ararat order as follows:—

1. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Council" means the Council of the City of Ararat.  
"Municipality" means the municipal district of the Council.

2. (i) Every owner or occupier of land within the municipality, on being served with a notice, in writing, from the Council declaring such land to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood shall, within fourteen days from date of such notice clean up or tidy such land to the satisfaction of the Council.

(ii) Every owner or occupier of land within the municipality, on being served with a notice, in writing, from the Council declaring such land to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood, and who fails to comply with the notice served under clause 2 (i) of this By-law shall, on being served with a further notice, in writing, so to do, enclose such land with a sufficient fence of such material and in such manner as is hereinafter prescribed within 30 days from date of the service of such notice.

3. It is hereby prescribed that every such fence shall be of the materials and constructed in the manner following:—

- (i) Posts—5 in. by 3 in. redgum or jarrah, suitably constructed 2 ft. 6 in. in ground and centres not to exceed 9 feet.
- (ii) Rails—top, bottom and centre, 4 in. x 2 in. hardwood.
- (iii) Plinth—6 in. by 1 in.
- (iv) Fencing—fence to be covered by new 6-ft. sheets of 24-gauge corrugated galvanized iron lapped one corrugation on each side.
- (v) Height—not less than 6 ft. 6 in. above ground level trimmed to a line on top.
- (vi) General—lands situated at the intersection of two streets, fence to be splayed for a distance of 15 feet from the intersection of the building line of such streets as directed by Council and in order that the construction of such fence would comply with Council By-law No. 108.

4. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 or more than £20, and to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which such offence is continued after conviction or order is made by any court.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Ararat.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the City of Ararat on the 21st day of October, 1963, and confirmed on the 18th day of November, 1963.

## CITY OF MOORABBIN.

## BY-LAW No. 262.

A By-law of the City of Moorabbin made under section 756 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, and numbered 262, for regulating the conduct of persons using public swimming pools within the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, and of any and every other power enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Moorabbin order as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the subject-matter—

“Attendant” means an employee of the Council performing any duties on or in connexion with any bath premises.

“Bath premises” means any premises maintained by the Council as public baths or a public swimming pool including all buildings and structures on such premises and all appurtenances and equipment therein.

“Bottle” means any article made wholly or partly of glass, china, porcelain, bakelite, plastic or composition.

“Council” means the Council of the City of Moorabbin.

“Town Clerk” means the person for the time being holding the office or performing the duties of the Town Clerk of the Council.

2. (1) No person shall—

- bring into any bath premises any intoxicating liquor;
- consume intoxicating liquor on any bath premises;
- enter or remain in or upon any bath premises if intoxicated.

(2) No person shall—

- cause or permit any dog or other animal belonging to that person or under his control to enter or remain in or upon any bath premises;
- bring into any bath premises or have in his possession or custody or under his control in any bath premises any bottle or can.

3. No person suffering from any cutaneous infectious or contagious disease shall use or enter any bath premises.

4. No person shall use any swimming pool unless properly attired in a bathing costume sufficient to preserve public decency.

5. (1) No person shall—

- enter or remain in any swimming pool whilst he is in an unclean condition;
- enter any swimming pool until he has thoroughly cleansed himself to the satisfaction of an attendant under a shower bath on the bath premises in which the use of soap is permitted.

(2) No person shall—

- use soap in any part of any bath premises other than in a shower or slipper bath in which the use of soap is permitted;
- use any substance or preparation whilst he is in a swimming pool whereby the water in that swimming pool may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit in any way for the use of bathers;
- bring on or place in any bath premises or any part thereof any chemical substance, liquid or powder.

(3) No person shall use indecent or offensive language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner in or upon any bath premises.

(4) No person shall—

- wilfully foul or pollute the water in any shower bath, separate bath or swimming pool;

- (b) wilfully soil or defile any towel or any bathing dress, trunks or drawers the property of the Council;
- (c) wilfully foul, pollute or defile any part of the bath premises.

## (5) No person shall—

- (a) wilfully or negligently break, injure, damage, destroy, or tamper with any bath premises, or any key, towel, bathing dress, trunk or drawers the property of the Council;
- (b) wilfully or negligently mark on deface any part of the bath premises or any article, furniture or fixture therein or attached thereto.

## 6. (1) A person may deposit with an attendant any article for safe keeping subject to the following conditions—

- (a) if any article so deposited be damaged, destroyed, lost or stolen neither the Council nor any officer, employee or agent of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any such damage, destruction, loss or theft howsoever occurring.
- (b) upon production to an attendant of the receipt or token given in respect of any article deposited the attendant may hand the article to the person producing the receipt or token without proof that such person was the person to whom such receipt or token was originally issued;
- (c) if any article so deposited is not reclaimed within three months from the date of the deposit the Council or some person duly authorized in that behalf by the Council may sell or otherwise dispose of the same and shall be under no liability either to the owner or depositor thereof by reason of such sale or disposal.

(2) The attendant with whom any article is deposited for safe keeping shall deliver to the person depositing such article a receipt or token acknowledging such deposit.

7. (1) At every bath premises there shall be kept by an attendant a book (hereinafter referred to as "the lost property register").

(2) Any person finding any article left in any bath premises shall forthwith deliver the same to an attendant who shall forthwith enter or cause to be entered in the lost property register a description of the article, the time and date of its receipt and the name of the finder.

(3) An attendant may deliver to a person apparently the owner thereof any article particulars of which have been entered in the lost property register upon receiving satisfactory proof of ownership and on payment of any fee fixed by the Council and upon such delivery such person shall acknowledge receipt of the said article by signing his name and address in the lost property register.

8. It shall be a condition of any person being permitted to enter any bath premises (whether on payment to the Council of a fee or otherwise) that if such person leaves upon such bath premises any article which is taken charge of by an attendant and entered in the lost property register the Council or some person duly authorized in that behalf by the Council may, if such article be not claimed within three months of the date on which its receipt is recorded in the lost property register, sell the same and shall be under no liability either to the owner or leaver thereof by reason of such sale or disposal.

9. Neither the Council nor any officer or servant of the Council shall be in any way responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in any bath premises or for any article damaged or destroyed whilst in or on any bath premises.

10. A male person shall not enter or use any part of any bath premises for the time being set apart or appropriated for the use of females, nor shall a female person enter or use any part of any bath premises for the time being set apart or appropriated for the use of males.

11. (1) No person shall enter any bath premises or use any facility therein without first responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in any bath premises or for any article damaged or destroyed whilst in or on any bath premises.

(2) No attendant or other officer or servant of the Council shall accept any money from any person for entry in to any bath premises except in exchange for such a printed ticket or docket or other method of check of entry.

12. (1) No person shall for fee or reward instruct or coach any person in any bath premises unless registered in respect to such premises.

(2) Every person applying to be registered as a coach shall make application, in writing, to the Town Clerk stating his full name, private and business addresses and

the bath premises in respect of which he desires to be registered and any other information the Council may require.

(3) The Council may grant any such application with or without conditions or may refuse the same as it sees fit.

(4) Every registration shall be in force for the current season and no longer but may be sooner suspended or cancelled by the Council for misconduct, breach of any provision of this By-law or the conditions (if any) imposed by the Council.

(5) On every registration there shall be paid the fee (if any) fixed by the Council.

13. (1) No club or group of persons in association shall engage in or practise for competitive swimming of any type or engage in any social activities in any bath premises unless registered or exempt as hereafter provided as a swimming club or social club in respect to such premises.

(2) Every club or group of persons in association applying to be so registered or exempt shall make application, in writing, to the Town Clerk supplying such information as the Council requires and stating the full names, private addresses of the office bearers and the adopted name and business address of the club or association and the bath premises in respect of which registration or exemption is desired.

(3) The Council may grant the application for registration or exemption with or without conditions or may refuse the same as it sees fit.

(4) Every registration or exemption shall be in force for the current season and no longer but any registration may be sooner suspended or cancelled by the Council for misconduct, breach of any provision of this By-law or the conditions (if any) imposed by the Council.

(5) On every registration there shall be paid the fee (if any) fixed by the Council.

14. (1) Any person offending against this By-law shall if requested by an attendant immediately leave the bath premises.

(2) Any person refusing to carry out any such direction to leave shall (in addition to any offence he has already committed) be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

(3) An attendant may remove from the bath premises or any part thereof any person who refuses to obey such a direction.

15. Admittance to bath premises may be temporarily suspended or such premises may be cleared of all persons if in the opinion of the person in charge of the same such action is necessary.

16. No ticket, docket, token, licence, receipt or like document issued under the provisions of this By-law shall be transferable and no person other than the person to whom the same was originally issued shall enjoy any benefit therefrom or any privileges thereunder.

17. During any period for which any bath premises or any part thereof have been let for a gala or other entertainment—

(a) the charges for admission fixed by the Council shall be suspended;

(b) the right of entry or any other privilege granted by any ticket, docket, licence, or token issued by the Council shall be suspended;

(c) neither the Council, its officers or servants shall be responsible for the performance of any such gala or other entertainment;

(d) neither the Council, its officers or servants shall be responsible for any article deposited with any person; and

(e) neither the Council, its officers or servants shall be responsible for any injury to or any loss or damage sustained by any person.

18. Bath premises will be open to the public on the days and between the hours determined from time to time by Resolution of the Council.

19. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20 and to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order is made by any court.

20. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district.
