By-law 113.

Removal of House Refuse.

- A By-law of the City of Camberwell made under the provisions of the *Health Act* 1958 and numbered 113, for or with respect to—
  - (a) The provision, use and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish (whether temporary or otherwise) and prescribing the shape of and the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles; and
  - (b) preventing and regulating the deposit of refuse and rubbish upon streets and other lands and places under the control of the Council.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Camberwell order as follows:—
- 1. By-law No. 34 of the City of Camberwell entitled "Removal of House Refuse" is hereby repealed.
- "Removal of House Refuse" is hereby repealed.

  2. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—"Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Camberwell. "Occupier" shall mean and include the occupier, owner, tenant, the person in charge or having the management or control. "Household refuse" shall mean household refuse and rubbish including food waste and discarded food ordinarily used for human consumption. "Dry refuse" means dry and hard refuse and dry and hard waste, but does not include household refuse as hereinbefore defined, garden clippings or other garden refuse or rubbish of a vegetable nature.

- 3. The occupier of every house, building or premises within the City of Camberwell shall provide or cause to be provided and kept a receptacle or receptacles as herein prescribed and shall cause all household refuse produced, collected or accumulated on such premises to be from time to time deposited and kept in such receptacle or receptacles. Every such receptacle shall be kept in a clean and inoffensive state and shall be kept constantly covered by a lid described hereunder except when household refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom.
- 4. Receptacles.—Every such receptacle and lid shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24-gauge or approved plastic and shall be in the shape of a frustrum of a cone and shall have a capacity not exceeding three cubic feet, shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly fixed side lifting handles.
- Each such receptable shall be provided with a suitable close fitting lid with suitable handle fixed thereto, and with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle.
- 5. No person shall place, or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in any such receptacle, nor shall deposit therein any moist refuse unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in paper.
- 6. No person shall place any ashes in any such receptacle unless such ashes are securely wrapped in paper and are not sufficiently hot at the time of wrapping to ignite or scorch the paper in which they are wrapped.
- 7. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed in any such receptacle any dirt, dust or other matter obtained by the cleaning of the interior of a dwelling or similar structure unless such substance is securely wrapped in paper.
- 8. The occupier shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and condition and shall, when required by the Council, coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance.
- 9. At such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council receptacles containing household refuse for collection and disposal may be placed adjoining the premises used by the occupier in the following locations—
  - (a) Where there is an unpaved portion of footway then on such unpaved portion near to the street channel; or
  - (b) where the footway is paved to its full extent then on such footway near to the street channel; or
  - (c) in such other location as may be approved by the Council.
- 10. No person shall remove from any such receptacle any rag, cloth or similar substance except for the disposal of the whole contents of such receptacle in a manner and at a place approved by the Council.
- 11. (a) The Council shall provide for the collection throughout the municipal district of the City of Camberwell of dry refuse in one of the manners hereinafter mentioned.
- mentioned.

  (b) (i) The Council may from time to time place in streets throughout the said municipal district receptacles for the reception of dry refuse, in such manner that, within such period as the Council is conveniently able to do so, such a receptacle shall be placed within reasonable proximity of every dwelling in the said municipal district. The Council shall make known, in such manner as it thinks fit, the positions in which such receptacles are placed from time to time and the period for which they will remain there; or
- (ii) The Council may authorize by notice delivered to the premises the placing during a period specified in the notice of dry refuse on the unpaved portion of the footway, or where there is no unpaved portion, then on the footway near to the street channel and adjacent to the premises.
- (c) The Council shall remove dry refuse deposited in such a receptacle or on the footway as hereinbefore provided.
- (d) No person shall deposit in such a receptacle or on the footway any refuse, rubbish or garbage other than dry refuse.
- (e) No person, other than a person duly authorized by the Council, shall remove any dry refuse deposited for collection as hereinbefore provided.
- 12. Subject to clause 11 hereof no person shall deposit any refuse or rubbish upon any street in the municipal district of the City of Camberwell or other land or place under the control of the Council except at a place appointed by the Council.

13. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Camberwell.

14. This By-law shall come into force and have effect immediately upon its publication in the Victoria Govern-

15. Every person who shall be guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and not less than Two pounds for every such offence, or in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each and every day during which such offence is continued after a conviction or order by any court. order by any court.

  "Poultry house" means a building not greater in height than ten feet having a roof of corrugated galvanized iron or other material approved by the Health Inspector and enclosed on all sides by walls and a door or doors, all of material approved by the Health Inspector, or wire netting of half-inch mesh and attached to or enclosed within a poultry run and having a floor paved with concrete or other impervious material, the surface of which is at least three inches above the level of the surrounding ground and having foundations surrounded by galvanized iron, jointed brickwork or concrete to a depth of at least eighteen inches below the surrounding ground level. ground level.
- "Poultry run" means an area of ground enclosed on all sides by walls or wire netting and attached to or enclosing a poultry house.
- "Poultry yard" means the continuation of a poultry house and a poultry run.
- 2. No person shall keep live poultry anywhere in the City of Wangaratta otherwise than--
  - (a) in a poultry yard no part of which is
    - (i) within 75 feet from the street or road to which the premises whereon the poultry yard is situated has a frontage;
    - (ii) with ten feet from any other street or or road of a greater width than 25 feet;
    - (iii) within five feet from any other street or road of a width of 25 feet or less or from the boundary of any adjoining allotment of land; or
  - (b) at poultry sale-yards or poultry-killing premises registered under the Health Acts or at any General Market of the City of Wangaratta; or
  - (c) in the case of pigeons only, in lofts, hatches or aviaries, the construction of which is approved in writing by the Town Clerk of the Council.
- 3. Subject to Part IV, of the Health Act 1958 no person shall keep any poultry within or partly within a distance of 40 feet from any dwelling in the City of Wangaratta whether on the same allotment of land or adjoining land.

If any person constructs or uses any poultry yard in breach of any of the provisions of this By-law the Health Inspector may serve notice, in writing, on the owner or occupier of the land on which such poultry yard is constructed requiring the person served with such notice forthwith to pull down, remove, alter, or cleanse such poultry yard or any part thereof.

If the pulling down or removal of any poultry yard or part thereof required by notice served under Clause 7, hereof is not commenced within seven days after the service of such notice or is not proceeded with and completed as speedily as the nature of the case will admit, the Council may call upon the owner or the occupier of the land on which the poultry yard has been constructed to show cause why an order should not be made for the pulling down or removal of such poultry yard or part thereof, and if such owner or occupier does not show cause as aforesaid the Council may order such owner or occupier to pull down or remove such poultry yard or part thereof within a time to be fixed by the Council.

In the event of non-compliance with an order made by the Council under clause 3 hereof the Council may pull down or remove such poultry yard or part thereof or may authorize any person whom it thinks fit to do so, and may sell the materials pulled down or removed in such manner as it thinks fit to do so, and may apply the proceeds of such sale in or towards reimbursing itself for the expenses of such pulling down or removal, and may also recover any balance of such expenses not satisfied as aforesaid from the owner or occupier in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 10. Any person who fails to comply with any order of the Council under clause 8 hereof shall be guilty of an offence.
- 11. Subject to Part IV. of the Health Act 1958, no person shall keep any swine anywhere in the City of Wangaratta save and except at the City Abattoirs or at any general market of the City of Wangaratta, or at any other place or places from time to time authorized, in writing, by the Town Clerk of the Council.
- 12. No person shall keep any cattle, sheep, or goats anywhere in the City of Wangaratta save and except at the City Abattoirs, or any general market of the City of Wangaratta, or at any other place or places from time to time authorized, in writing, by the Town Clerk of the Council.

Any person who, by any wilful act or default, contravenes the provisions of this By-law, shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds, and shall be liable in respect of each day on which such offence is continued after conviction or order to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds, but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred records. pounds.

    - (d) in any part of any such tip neglect or refuse to obey the instructions of any employee of the Council;

- (e) tip, leave or deposit or cause to be tipped, left or deposited in any such tip any refuse or rubbish in any part thereof other than the part or parts directed by any notice board or signs erected therein by the Council;
- (f) disfigure, damage, destroy or interfere with any notice board, sign post, fence, gate or other equipment placed in or about any such tip by the Council.

The Proprietor of every such premises as aforesaid shall cause all refuse or rubbish arising from or on such premises to be deposited in such receptacle or receptacles and shall, between such hours and on such days appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse and rubbish, cause such receptacle or receptacles to be placed in such place as may be directed by the Council from time to time.
- 4. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 2 cubic feet, shall be constructed of 26 gauge iron or other impervious material of not less than equal strength and shall be light enough to be carried easily by one man. It shall be provided with a handle on each side and a close fitting lid and shall be kept constantly covered save when refuse or rubbish is being deposited therein or removed therefrom and shall be kept in an inoffensive condition and in recod order. condition and in good order.
- 5. Refuse and rubbish, the contents of vacuum cleaners and ashes which must be cold and dead, shall be wrapped in paper before being placed or deposited in the receptacle or receptacles.

- 6. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than Five pounds (£5) or more than Twenty pounds (£20) for every such breach and if such breach be a continuing offence an additional penalty of not less than Ten shillings (10s.) or more than Two pounds (£2) for every day or part thereof during which such breach shall continue
- 7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Hampden.

(a) Where any motor car shall not be so released within fourteen days after the publication of such notice as aforesaid, the Council may, after the expiration of 21 days after the expiration of such notice, cause the same to be sold in such manner as the Council may think fit, whether by public auction, private contract or otherwise.
- (b) The proceeds of such sale shall be applied firstly in payment of the appropriate charge for the removal thereof and the residue (if any) shall be payable to any person satisfying the Council that he is entitled to receive the
- (c) If within three months after the date of such sale no person shall have claimed such residue and satisfied the Council that he is entitled thereto, such residue shall be paid into the Municipal Fund.
- 5. If the Council shall be unable to sell such motor car of 21 days referred to in clause 4 (a) hereof or if the Council is of the opinion that such motor car has no commercial value, the same may be disposed of by the Council in such manner as it may think fit.
- 6. Where in consequence of the disposal of any such motor car in accordance with the provisions of this By-law the appropriate charge or any part thereof for the removal of such motor car has not been recovered, the Council may recover the same in any court of competent jurisdiction from the person who left or caused to be left such motor car standing on any street or road.

- 7. The appropriate charge hereinbefore referred to shall include such of the under-mentioned expenses of the Council as are applicable—
  - (a) The sum equivalent to 20s. for each mile or part thereof of the distance between the place where such motor car was left standing, and the place set aside or designated, pursuant to clause 2 hereof, but in no case shall such sum be less than;
  - (b) the costs of advertising the notices pursuant to clause 3 hereof;
  - (c) any auctioneer's fee and other charges or ex-penses reasonably incurred by the Council for the removal, sale or disposal of any such motor
- 8. Any person offending against the provisions of this By-law shall for any wilful act or default contrary thereto be guilty of an offence and shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.
- 9. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire
