For any subsequent year in which a member is discharged on resignation, or whose appointment is terminated, or who reaches the age of retirement, such member shall be granted ten days leave of absence for recreation in respect of each period of three months or portion of three months completed service during such year, but the aggregate of any leave so granted shall not exceed 40 days in any one year.”

2. This Determination shall come into operation upon the 1st day of January, 1965.

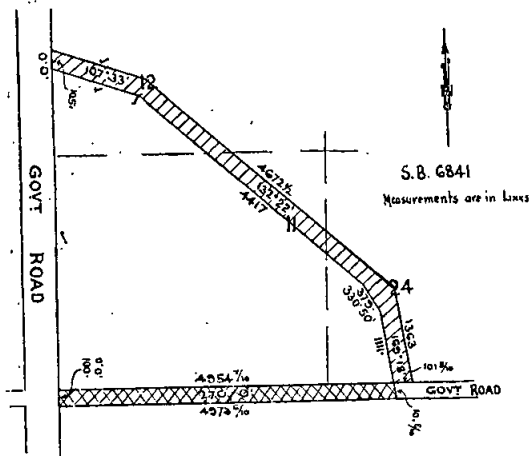

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 2 (a) hereof the Responsible Authority may permit a parcel of land lesser in area than is prescribed to be excised for the purpose of—

- (a) increasing the area of an existing allotment,
- (b) erecting one only additional dwelling-house,
- (c) erecting a hall, church and building principally used for religious purposes,
- (d) erecting a school and buildings principally used for educational purposes,
- (e) erecting a utility service structure, depot or works, constructed by a Government Department or Public Authority, and
- (f) any use or development or the carrying out of any building or works which the Responsible Authority deems fit.

4. Every application for a permit under the provisions of this Order shall be made on the prescribed form, copies of which may be obtained from the office of the Responsible Authority at the Shire Office, Belmont.

5. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 1 hereof, this Interim Development Order shall not prohibit the erection, construction or carrying out of any dwelling-house or ancillary works on any land shown as a separate allotment on a plan of subdivision sealed by the Council of the Shire of South Barwon, pursuant to section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, before the coming into operation of this Order.

6. Nothing in this Interim Development Order shall prevent—

- (a) the continuance of the use of any land or any existing building or works for the purpose for which the land or building or works was or were being lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order; or
- (b) any dealing or the registration of any dealing with any land in a subdivision of which a plan has been sealed by the Council of the Shire of South Barwon pursuant to section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, before the coming into operation of this Order.

RULES OF THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.
RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION AND ADMISSION OF CANDIDATES.

The 10th Day of August, 1964.

IN pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1958*, the said Council hereby alters its Rules made the 17th day of October, 1962, and amended the 3rd day of April, 1963, the 23rd day of October, 1963, the 25th day of November, 1963, and the 14th day of April, 1964, as follows:—

(1) By deleting from the title of Division 2 of Part IV. (both in the opening paragraph of the Rules and immediately before Rule 14) the words "Interstate, British, and New Zealand Practitioners" and substituting therefor the following words:—

"Candidates other than Victorian candidates."

(2) By inserting at the end of the definition of "Victorian candidate" in paragraph (1) of sub-rule (1) of Rule 3 the following words:—

"or an applicant for admission under Rule 17A."

(3) By deleting from Rule 17 the words "an interstate practitioner, a British practitioner, and a New Zealand practitioner" and substituting therefor the words:

"a person."

(4) By inserting immediately after Rule 17 the following new Rules:—

"17A. A person duly entitled to practise as a barrister, advocate, counsel, attorney, or legal practitioner howsoever styled, of a superior court of any part of Her Majesty's Dominions beyond the Commonwealth of Australia, other than a British or a New Zealand practitioner, may, subject to the provisions of this Division, be admitted.

17B. (a) A person desiring to be admitted in pursuance of the last preceding rule shall apply to the Council for a direction that, or as to the extent to which, his existing qualifications may be regarded as sufficient qualification for admission without compliance with the qualifications required of a Victorian candidate.

(b) The applicant shall furnish to the Council, and if the Council so requires, by affidavit, such particulars as it may require of the course or courses of legal study undertaken or completed by him and of his experience of legal practice within and outside Victoria.

(c) The Council may make such further inquiries as it thinks fit as to the nature and adequacy of the applicant's training and experience in the practice of the law and as to his fitness to be admitted to practise in Victoria. It may, if it thinks fit, act in respect of any such matter on the written advice of the Attorney-General, the Solicitor-General or the Dean or Acting Dean of the Faculty of Law at the University of Melbourne or Monash University or on the report of a sub-committee appointed by the Council for the purpose.

(d) The Council may in arriving at a decision upon any such application take into account, by way of comparison with the applicant's existing qualifications, the qualifications which would enable a British or a New Zealand practitioner to be admitted under Division 2.

(e) The Council may either determine that the applicant's existing qualifications are such that he ought to be admitted to practise without further study or practice or require the applicant as a condition of admission to complete such further study or practice (whether or not part of the qualification which would be required of a Victorian candidate) as it may specify.

(f) If the Council requires the applicant to complete specified further study or practice, he may on completion thereof to the satisfaction of the Board be admitted."

(5) By inserting in sub-rule (1) of Rule 49 immediately after the words "every British practitioner" and in sub-rule (2) of Rule 49 immediately after the words "Every such practitioner" the words:

"and every person applying to be admitted under Rule 17A hereof."

(6) By deleting the heading to Schedule F and substituting therefor the following heading:—

"STATEMENT BY A PERSON (OTHER THAN A VICTORIAN CANDIDATE) APPLYING FOR ADMISSION TO PRACTICE."

(7) By deleting the heading to Schedule H and substituting therefor the following heading:—

"AFFIDAVIT AS TO QUALIFICATION OF A PERSON (OTHER THAN A VICTORIAN CANDIDATE) APPLYING FOR ADMISSION."

(8) By repealing Rule 37 and substituting therefor the following new Rule:—

"37. Save with the approval of the Board, no clerk shall enter into articles in Victoria with any barrister and solicitor who has not been in practice for a continuous period of five years and no barrister and solicitor may have more than two articulated clerks at any one time and the number of articulated clerks which a firm of barristers and solicitors may have at any one time shall not exceed—

(a) in the case of a firm of two barristers and solicitors—four articulated clerks;

(b) in the case of a firm of three barristers and solicitors—five articulated clerks;

(c) in the case of a firm of four or more barristers and solicitors—six articulated clerks.

Notwithstanding anything in this Rule, the Crown Solicitor for Victoria may have five articulated clerks serving articles of clerkship with him at any one time and the Deputy Crown Solicitor for the Commonwealth in Victoria may have five articulated clerks serving articles of clerkship with him at any one time. In ascertaining the number of articulated clerks for the purposes of this Rule—

(a) an articulated clerk who is absent from service under articles on war service as defined in Rule 28; and

(b) a clerk entering into supplementary articles in consequence of any such absence—

shall not be counted."

(9) By inserting in Rule 39 immediately after sub-paragraph (b) thereof the following new sub-paragraph:—

"(c) leave of absence for the purpose of study and attendance at any course of instruction approved by the Council for the purpose of this sub-rule;"

(10) By re-lettering former sub-paragraph (c) of Rule 39 as sub-paragraph (d).

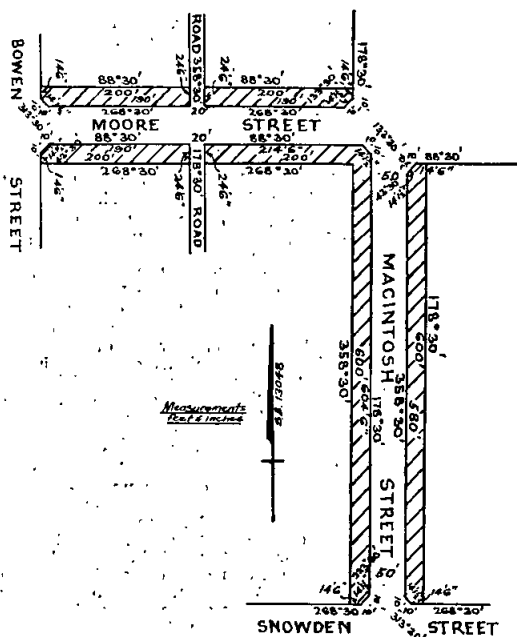

2. No person shall leave standing or permit or suffer to be left standing any caravan on any street or road for a period exceeding 24 hours.

3. No person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed any caravan on any private property (other than for the purpose of sale, or hire for use other than on such property, or the storing or parking of the same) without the consent in writing of the Council.

4. (1) No person shall occupy any caravan placed on any private property without the consent in writing of the Council.

(2) Every person applying for such consent shall make application in writing to the Council and supply such information as the Council may reasonably require.

(3) The Council may grant or refuse its consent to the application as it sees fit.

(4) If the Council gives its consent then the permit to issue as a result shall be—

- (a) For a period not exceeding one month; and
- (b) Absolutely conditional upon proper sanitation facilities to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector to the Council being at all times available for the use of the occupant.

(5) In the event of such sanitation facilities at any time ceasing to be so available then any permit granted under sub-clause (1) hereto shall be immediately cancelled on service on the holder of such permit of a notice under the signature of the Health Inspector that such facilities have ceased to be available.

5. Any person guilty of a wilful default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 or more than £20 and to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day of which such offence is continued after a conviction or Order made by any Court.

6. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Town of St. Arnaud except such areas as are registered with the Council as camping areas under the provisions of section 221 of the *Health Act 1958*.

SHIRE OF HAMPDEN.

BY-LAW NO. 59.

A By-law of the Shire of Hampden made under section 198 (1) (a) of the Local Government Act 1958, and numbered 59 for repealing clauses 3, 4 and 5 of part 3 of By-law No. 34 and for adopting the minimum area, depth and width of frontage on which houses and flats may be constructed throughout the municipality and for specifying the minimum distances to be observed between the outer walls of any such buildings and the frontage and other boundaries of the site thereof.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Hampden order as follows:—

Definitions.

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Depth" in relation to a site means the distance between the middle points of the frontage and the rear boundary.

"First Story" means that story of a building next above the ground story. The successive stories above the first story being the second story, the third story and so on to the topmost story.

"Frontage" means the boundary line between a site and the street upon which such site abuts and where the site abuts on more than one street then the boundary line between the site and the street to which any building that may be erected thereon fronts.

"Ground Story" means that story closest to ground level in which the height of the ceiling above the level of the adjoining ground is greater than the distance from such level to the floor measured at the contract the building frontage.

"House" means any building used or intended, adapted or designed for use as a separate dwelling but does not include a flat.

"Flat" means that portion of a building used or intended, adapted or designed for use as a separate dwelling.

"Story" means that portion of any building which is situated between any floor level and the floor level next above or if there is no floor above that portion between the floor level and the ceiling above it.

Repeal of Part By-law No. 34.

2. Clauses 3, 4 and 5 of part 3 of By-law No. 34 are hereby repealed.

Minimum Dimensions of House Sites.

3. No person shall construct a house on any land within those parts of the municipal district described in the Schedule hereto unless the site appertaining exclusively to such building has a clear frontage to a street a width of frontage of not less than 50 feet, a depth of not less than 80 feet and an area of not less than 5,750 square feet, provided that in the case of a site irregular in shape—

- (i) the site shall be capable of containing within its boundaries a rectangle having an area of 3,450 feet and having a minimum dimension not less than 50 feet in length; and
- (ii) the Council may permit either the width of frontage or the depth of the site to be reduced by not more than 12 ft. 6 in. or 20 feet respectively from the minimum width of frontage or depth herein prescribed.

Minimum of Dimensions of Flat Site.

4. No person shall construct a building or buildings containing any flat or flats on any land within those parts of the municipal district described in the Schedule hereto unless the site appertaining exclusively to such building or buildings has a clear frontage to a street a width of frontage of not less than 60 feet, a depth of not less than 80 feet and an area of not less than 6,500 square feet and provides a minimum of open space at ground level per flat as follows:—

- (a) for each flat containing an area of 500 square feet or over—500 square feet of open space at ground level per flat; and
- (b) for each flat containing an area of less than 500 square feet—400 square feet of open space at ground level per flat.

Provided that for the purpose of determining minimum open space at ground level per flat for the purposes of this clause of this By-law, the area of a flat shall not include the areas of common corridors, stairways, hallways, porches and the like.

Minimum Distance from Frontage.

5. No person shall construct a house or any building or buildings containing any flat or flats on any land within those parts of the municipal district described in the Schedule hereto closer than 15 feet to the frontage of such land.

Minimum Distance from Boundaries.

6. No person shall construct a house or any building or buildings containing any flat or flats on any land within those parts of the municipal district described in the Schedule hereto closer to any boundary of the site thereof (not being a boundary forming a frontage) than as follows:—

- (a) for a one story building—4 feet.
- (b) for a two story building—6 feet.
- (c) for a three or more story—ground story and building—
first story—6 feet. Stories above first story—to be within line drawn from a point on the boundary at the level of the lowest window sill of the building and forming an angle of 70 degrees to the horizontal.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the following part or parts of the municipal district, that is to say those parts of the municipal district described in the Schedule hereto.
