UPPER KIEWA WATER SUPPLY CATCHMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372), do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment to be known as the Upper Kiewa Supply Catchment.

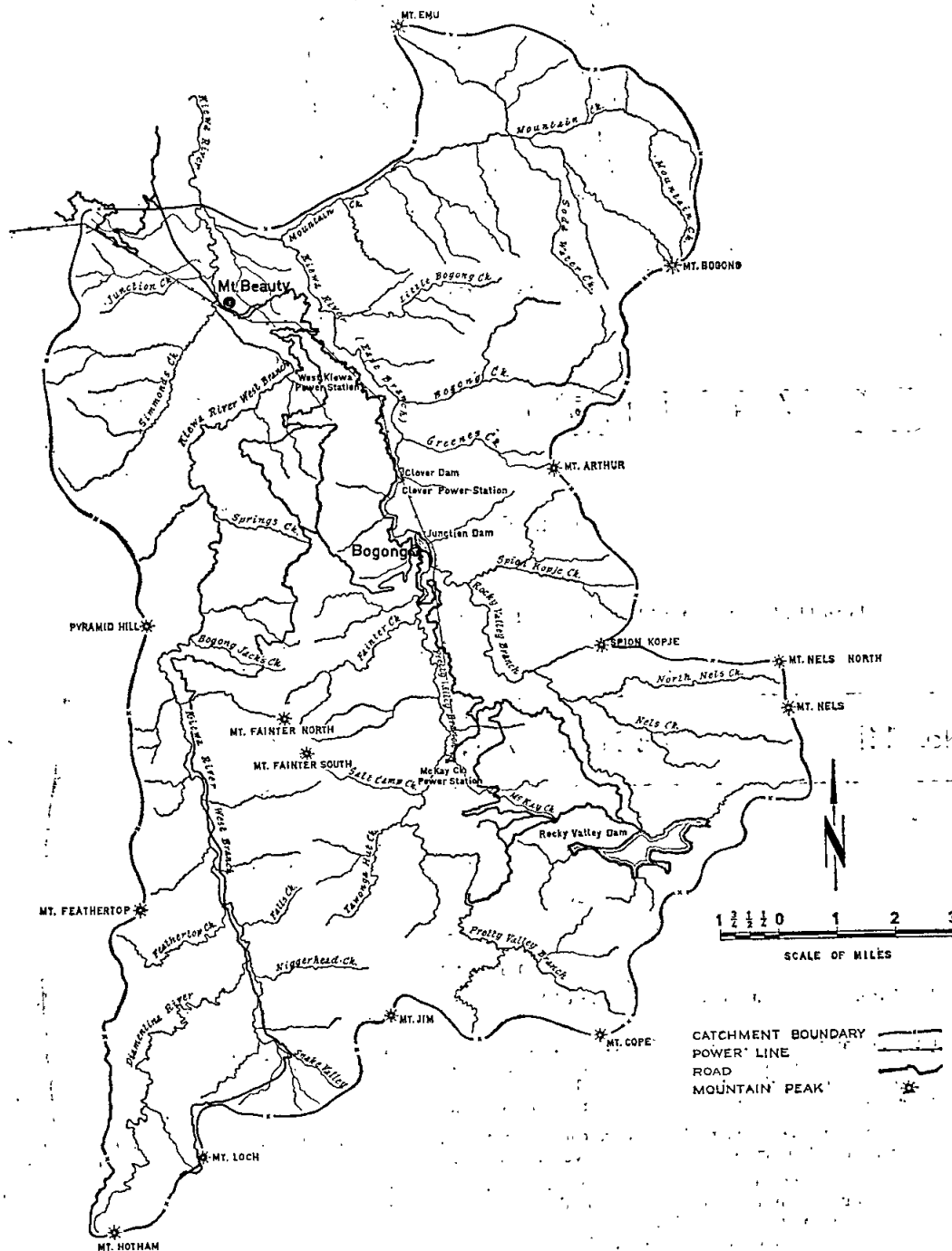
The area to be proclaimed is the catchment of that part of the Kiewa River upstream of the confluence of the East and West Branches of the said river and includes all that land defined by the following boundary:—

Commencing at the confluence of the East and West Branches of the Kiewa River and throughout following the watershed to the Kiewa River upstream from this confluence through Mount Emu to where the said watershed joins the watershed between the tributaries of the Kiewa River to the west and the Mitta Mitta River to the east as previously defined in the description of the Hume Reservoir Catchment (*Victoria Government Gazette*, 5th July, 1950, page 3754), following this common boundary through Mounts Bogong, Nelse and Loch to Mount Hotham; where the watershed between the Kiewa and Mitta Mitta Rivers separate; thence following the watershed between the tributaries of the Kiewa River to the east and the Ovens River to the west through Mount Feathertop and Pyramid Hill to the point of commencement.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to determination by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of section 23 (1) (a) of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372).

The area described is indicated on plan No. 1167. hereunder, the original of which is lodged at the head office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham-road, Kew, E.4

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

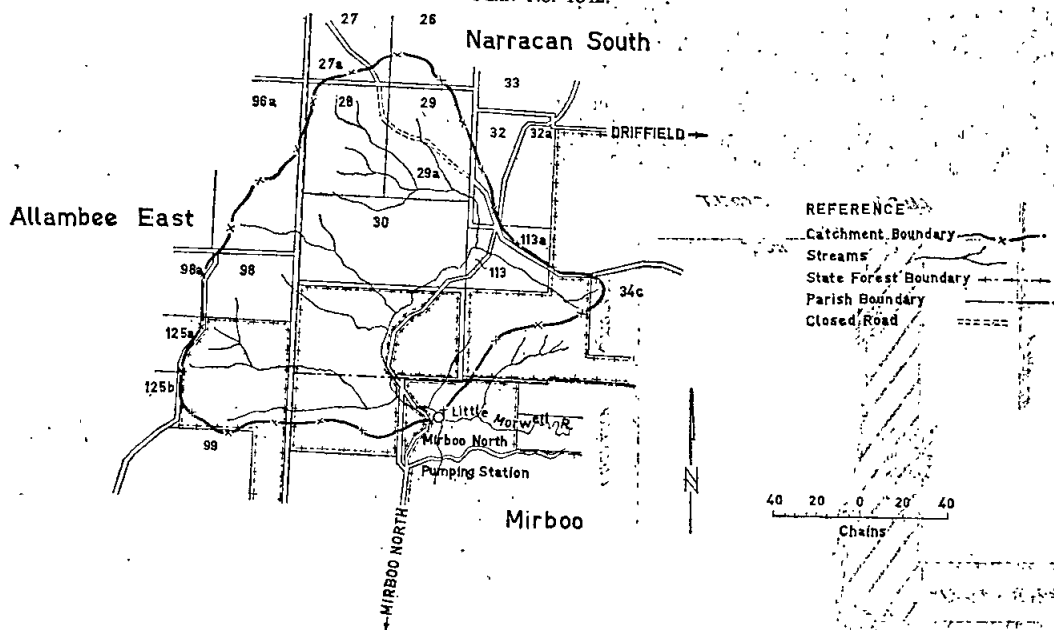
I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions contained in section 22 of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372), do by this Proclamation define the water supply catchment area to be known as Mirboo North Water Supply Catchment.

The area to be proclaimed is the catchment to the Mirboo North Waterworks Trust pipe offtake weir and pumping station on the northern arm of the Little Morwell River, situated in Reserved Forest, formerly designated as Crown allotment 122 in the Parish of Mirboo, and includes an area within a radius of 5 chains downstream of the pipe offtake weir.

The use of land within this catchment is subject to determination by the Soil Conservation Authority, acting under the provisions of section 23 (1) (a) of the *Soil Conservation and Land Utilization Act 1958* (No. 6372).

The area described is indicated on plan No. 1542 hereunder, the original of which is lodged at the head office of the Soil Conservation Authority, 378 Cotham-road, Kew, E.4

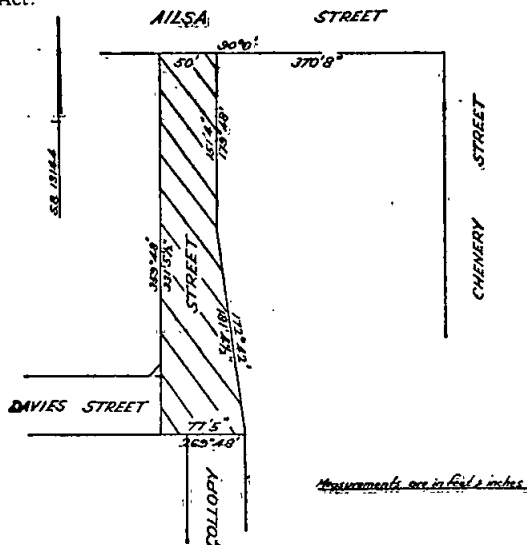
PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force:

And whereas the Council of the Shire of Mansfield has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, used for a street, be so declared to be a public highway.

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare that that portion of Collopy-street, Mansfield, shown hatched on the plan hereunder, shall be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act:

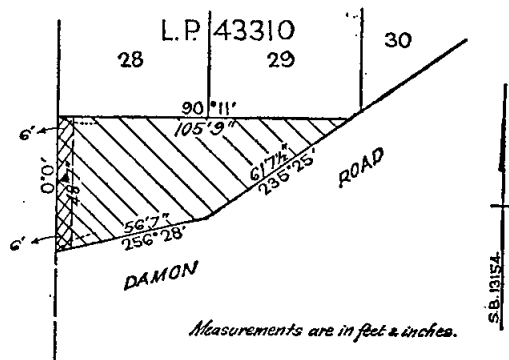

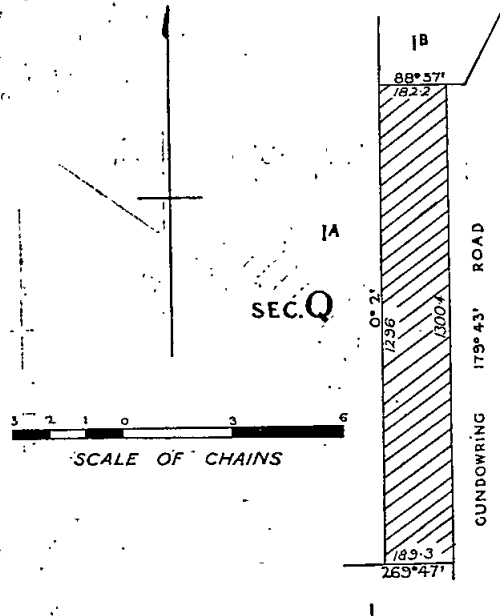

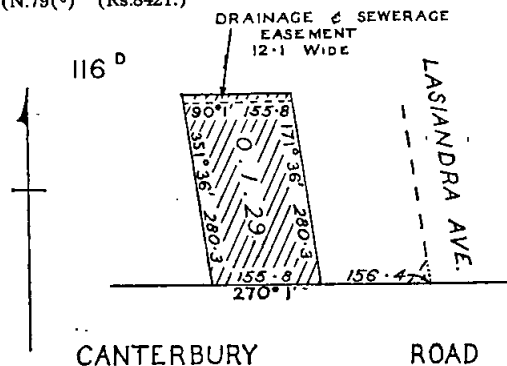

WHEREAS:

I. Section 114 of the *Country Roads Act 1958* (herein called "the Act") provides (*inter alia*) in—

- (a) sub-section (1) thereof that the powers conferred upon municipal councils by Division 14 of Part XIX. of the *Local Government Act 1958* shall so far as applicable be conferred upon the Country Roads Board (herein called "the Board") so far as relates to the declaration of the alignment the widening and opening up of State highways and that the provisions of the said Division shall with certain modifications extend and apply accordingly;
- (b) sub-section (2) thereof that no State highway shall be widened or opened up pursuant to the said section unless the Governor in Council has by Order published in the *Government Gazette* approved such widening or opening up.

II. The Board has—

- (a) in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by the said section 114 and for the purpose of widening the Midland Highway in the Cities of Geelong and Geelong West and the Shire of Corio (declared by the Board pursuant to the Act or some corresponding previous enactment to be a State highway which declaration was confirmed by an Order of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th December, 1947, at pages 6281-2 thereof) by Resolution dated the ninth day of November, 1953, fixed new alignments for the north and east sides of the said highway;
- (b) in accordance with the provisions of section 19 of the Act caused to be prepared a map plan and estimate showing—
- (i) the points between which and the lands on and through which the said widening is proposed to be made; and
- (ii) the cost of acquiring the land.

III. The Governor in Council is satisfied that there are funds legally available for acquiring the said land.

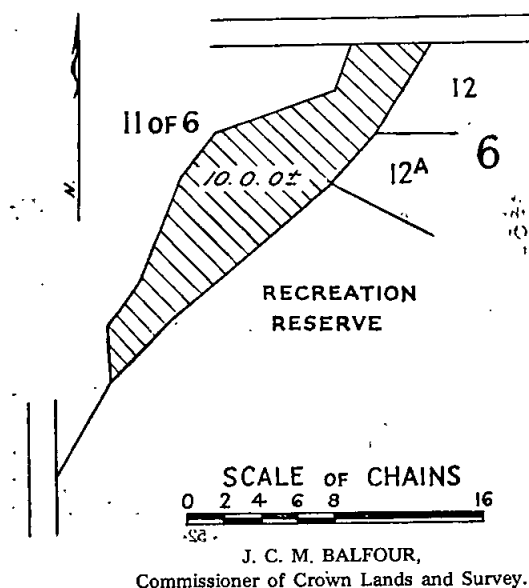

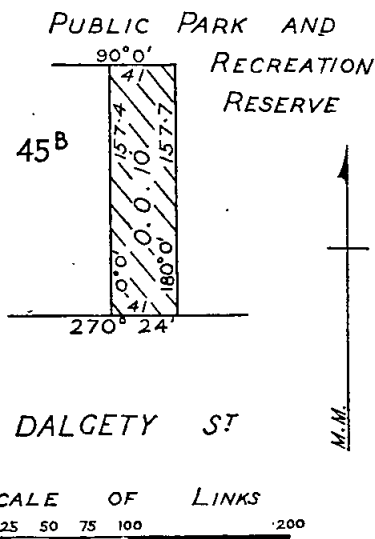

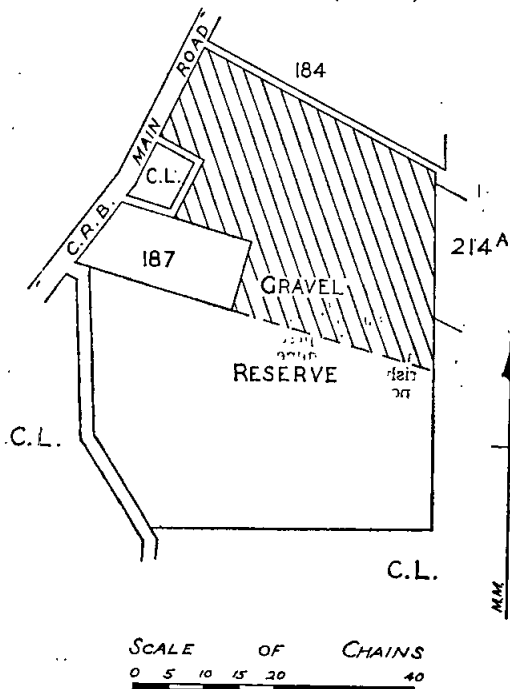
