POISONS ACT 1962 (No. 6889).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Poisons Act 1962* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* amend any of Schedules One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven or Eight to the said Act by adding to any such Schedule or removing therefrom any item:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this Proclamation—

1. Amend Schedule Two by deleting therefrom the following items—

CARBOLIC ACID (Phenol) or its homologues and substances containing more than 3 per centum by weight of Carboloc Acid or its homologues.

CREOSOTE and substances for therapeutic use containing more than 3 per centum of Creosote by weight.

CRESOL and substances containing more than 3 per centum of Cresol by weight.

and by adding thereto the following item—

CREOSOTE, cresol, phenol (carbolic acid), any homologue of phenol boiling below 220°C. and preparations containing more than 3 per centum by weight of such substances or homologues when such substances homologues or preparations are for therapeutic use.

2. Amend Schedule Four by adding thereto the following item—

DIOXYAMIDOPYRIN.

3. Amend Schedule Five by deleting therefrom the following item—

CARBOLIC ACID (Phenol) and its Homologues in substances containing 3 per centum or less by weight of Carboloc Acid or its homologues, except—

(a) Chlorinated derivatives of such poisons used for germicidal or antiseptic purposes; and

(b) Carvacol thymol and tertiary butyl-cresol.

4. Amend Schedule Six by adding thereto the following item—

CREOSOTE, cresol, phenol (carbolic acid), any homologue of phenol boiling below 220°C. and preparations containing more than 3 per centum by weight of such substances or homologues except when such substances homologues or preparations are included in Schedule Two.

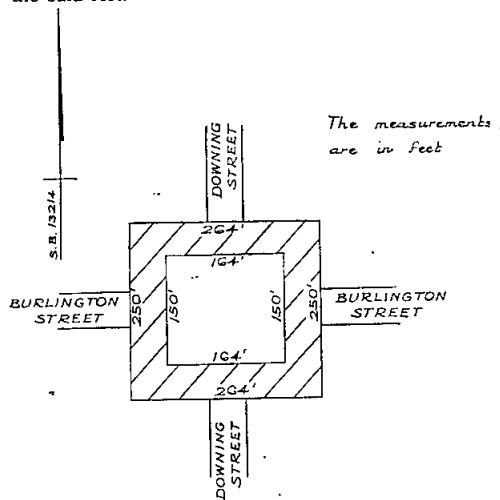

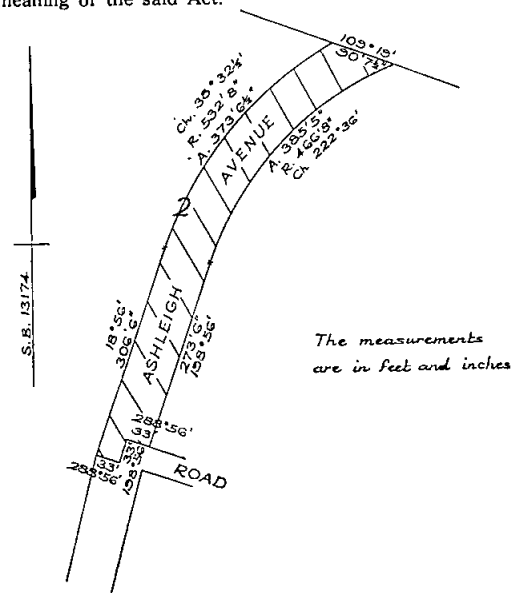

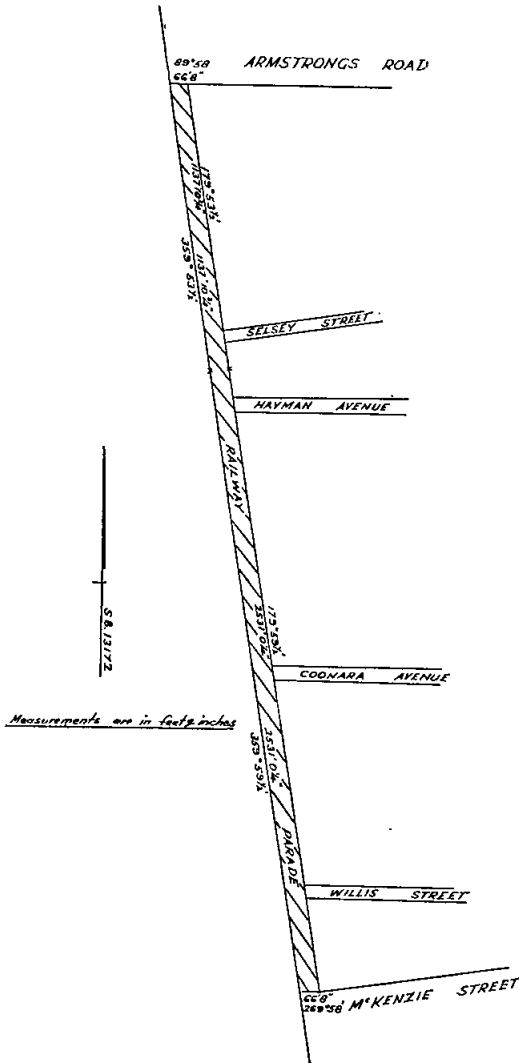

Fisheries Act 1958.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO PROHIBIT FISHING IN CERTAIN WATERS.

IT is hereby notified for general information that it is intended after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette* to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation to provide as follows:—

A. Revoke the whole of all Proclamations previously published in the *Government Gazette* relating to closed periods for fishing in various streams and waters throughout the State for various periods of the year.

B. Prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the under-mentioned waters and any waters which flow either directly or indirectly thereto and the waters impounded by any weir wall or dam constructed thereon during the period from the first day of May in each year to the last day preceding the first Saturday in September next following, both dates inclusive.

Agnes River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the South Gippsland Highway.
 Aire River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Great Ocean-road.
 Albert River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the South Gippsland Highway.
 Avoca River—Above or upstream from a point situated 50 yards below its junction with Mountain Creek.
 Avon River (Gippsland)—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river known as the Clydebank Bridge.
 Barham River—Above or upstream from an imaginary line from a post erected on the bank of such river adjacent to the Shire Pound to a post erected on the opposite bank of the said river.
 Barwon River—Above or upstream from a point situated 50 yards below its junction with the Moorabool River.
 Bet Bet or Deep Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with Carmanuel Creek.
 Boggy Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the King River.
 Broken River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river at Swanpool.
 Bruthen Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Yarram-Sale road.
 Bunroy Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the River Murray.
 Bunyip River (including Main Drain)—Above or upstream from the railway bridge over such river on the Melbourne-Yarram railway line, but not including Whisky, Gum Scrub, Dingley Dell, Muddy and Brandy Creeks (tributaries of the Tarago River) in which waters all fishing is prohibited during the whole year nor that portion of the Bunyip River and its tributaries upstream from a point 50 yards above its junction with the Tarago River and including Back Creek and its tributaries nor Ararat Creek above or upstream from the bridge over such Creek on the Princes Highway in which waters all fishing is prohibited from 1st May to the day preceding the second Saturday in December (both days inclusive) in each year.
 Burrowye Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the River Murray.
 Campaspe River—Above or upstream from the bridge at Mia Mia (but not including the Lauriston, Malmsbury and Upper Coliban Reservoirs and the waters connecting these reservoirs, all of which are open to fishing for the whole year).
 Cardinia Creek—Downstream from Princes Highway.
 Carrum Creek—See Eumemmering Creek.
 Carisbrook Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Great Ocean-road.
 Coliban River—Above or upstream from the bridge at Lyell.
 Cooyatong or Koetong Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the River Murray.
 Creightons Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Hume Highway.
 Cudgewa Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the River Murray.
 Cumberland River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Great Ocean-road.
 Curdies River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Timboon-Nirranda road.
 Dandenong Creek—Above or upstream from Pillar's Bridge.
 Deep Creek—See Bet Bet Creek.
 Deep Creek—See Maribyrnong River.
 Eglinton or Johnson's Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the Goulburn River.
 Erskine River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Great Ocean-road.
 Eumemmering Creek or Patterson River—Above or upstream from the Wells-road Bridge and including the cut from Dandenong Creek.
 Eumeralla River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Princes Highway.
 Fifteen Mile Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Hume Highway.

Fitzroy River—Above or upstream from a point 50 yards below its junction with Darlot's Creek.
 Flaggy Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the River Murray.
 Ford River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Great Ocean-road.
 Franklin River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the South Gippsland Highway.
 Gellibrand River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Great Ocean-road to the bridge over it at Gellibrand on the Colac to Gellibrand-road.
 George River—Above or upstream from a point on such stream distant 200 yards above the bridge over such river on the Great Ocean-road.
 Geromal Creek or Jeremal Creek—See Jeremal Creek.
 Glenelg River—Above or upstream from a point 50 yards below its junction with the Crawford River, but not including the waters of Rocklands Reservoir.
 Goulburn River—Upstream from the Hume Highway Bridge near Seymour (but not including the Eildon Reservoir and the Pondage Dam at Eildon, which waters are open the whole year).
 Grey River—Above or upstream from the Great Ocean-road.
 Holland's Creek, sometimes called Hollands Branch—Above or upstream from its junction with the Broken River.
 Home Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the Goulburn River.
 Honeysuckle Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Hume Highway.
 Hopkins River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Princes Highway to the bridge over such river at Wickliffe.
 Hughes Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Goulburn Valley Highway.
 Jeremal Creek or Geromal Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the River Murray.
 Johnson's or Eglinton Creek—See Eglinton Creek.
 Joyce's Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such stream on the main Newstead-Maryborough road.
 Kennett River—Above or upstream from a point on such stream distant 200 yards above the bridge over such river on the Great Ocean-road.
 Kiewa River—Above or upstream from Keegan's Bridge, also known as Keighans Bridge, over such river at Dederang.
 King River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river at Moyhu.
 Koetong or Cooyatong Creek—See Cooyatong Creek.
 Lang Lang River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the South Gippsland Highway to the bridge over it at Heath Hill.
 Latrobe River—Above or upstream from Princes Highway Bridge at Rosedale (but not including the Yalourn Storage Dam and the Hazelwood Pondage Dam, in both of which waters fishing is permitted during the whole year).
 Little Snowy Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the Mitta Mitta River.
 Loddon River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river at the Township of Newstead.
 Mackenzie River—Above or upstream from the water distribution heads at Laharum, but not including Wartook Reservoir, which is open for the whole year.
 Maribyrnong River (or Saltwater River or Deep Creek)—Above or upstream from Solomon's Ford at Braybrook.
 Merrimans Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Yarram-Sale road.
 Merri River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Princes Highway.
 Mitchell River—Above or upstream from the Wy-Yung-road Bridge.
 Mitta Mitta River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Eskdale-Mitta Mitta North road.
 Mt. Ida Creek—Above or upstream from the McIvor Highway Bridge at Derrinal.
 Mt. William Creek—Above or upstream from a point 50 yards below its junction with Fyans Creek.
 Moyne River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Princes Highway.
 Nicholson River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Omeo Highway.
 Omeo Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the River Murray.
 Ovens River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river at Rocky Point (but not including Lake Catani nor the new reservoir on Mt. Buffalo, in which waters fishing is permitted for the whole year).
 Patterson River—See Eumemmering Creek.
 Reedy or Young's Creek (sometimes called Wooragee Creek)—Above or upstream from its junction with Spring Creek (also known as Reid's Creek).

- Thomson River—Above or upstream from Pearson's Bridge near Sale (but not including Glenmaggie Weir, the waters of which are open for the whole year).
- Saltwater River—See Maribyrnong River.
- Seven Creeks—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek at Morgan's Reserve, approximately 5 miles downstream from Euroa.
- Shaw River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Princes Highway.
- Sherbrook River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Great Ocean-road.
- Skenes Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Great Ocean-road.
- Smythes Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Great Ocean-road.
- Snowy River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Princes Highway.
- Stockyard Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Princes Highway at Foster.
- Stony Creek—Above or upstream from the Great Ocean-road.
- Sunday Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with Sugarloaf Creek.
- Surry River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Princes Highway.
- Tallangatta Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the Mitta Mitta River.
- Tambo River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river at Tambo Upper.
- Tarra River—Above or upstream from the Yarram Water Trust Weir.
- Tarwin River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the South Gippsland Highway.
- Tullaroop or Deep Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the Loddon River (but not including Tullaroop or Newlyn Reservoirs, which are open to fishing for the whole year).
- Werribee River—Above or upstream from the Ford near Corpus Christi College at Werribee (but not including the waters of Melton Reservoir, also known as Exford Weir, nor the waters of Pykes Creek Reservoir, which waters are open for the whole year).
- Wild Dog Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Great Ocean-road.
- Wild Duck Creek—Above or upstream from the new bridge on the McIvor Highway.
- Woody Yallock Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with Currajuruk Creek.
- Wye River—Above or upstream from a point on such stream distant 200 yards above the bridge over such river on the Great Ocean-road.
- Yackandandah Creek—Above or upstream from its junction with the Kiewa River.
- Yarra River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river at Maroondah Highway, approximately 3 miles south of Healesville.
- C. Prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the under-mentioned waters and any waters which flow either directly or indirectly thereto and the waters impounded by any weir wall or dam constructed thereon during the period in each year from the first day of May to the last day preceding the second Saturday in December next following both days inclusive.
- Ararat Creek—Above or upstream from the bridge over such creek on the Princes Highway.
- Bass River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river at the Township of Bass.
- Bunyip River—Above or upstream from a point 50 yards above its junction with the Tarago River.
- Cardinia Creek—Above Princes Highway.
- Gellibrand River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river at Gellibrand on the Colac to Gellibrand-road.
- Lang Lang River—Above or upstream from the Heath Hill Bridge.
- Tarra River—Above or upstream from the bridge over such river on the Pound-road to the Yarram Water Trust Weir.
- D. Prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the under-mentioned waters and any waters which flow either directly or indirectly thereto and the waters impounded by any weir wall or dam constructed thereon during the period in each year from midnight on the last Sunday in August to the last day preceding the last Saturday in November (inclusive).
- Beveridge Anabranche (also known as the Little Murray)—The whole of such water from its junction with the River Murray near Swan Hill to its junction with the River Murray near Beverford.
- Broken Creek—The whole of such stream from its junction with the Broken River to its junction with the River Murray.
- Broken River—Downstream from the bridge over such river at Swanpool.
- Campaspe River—Downstream from the bridge over such river on the Murray Valley Highway.
- Chaika Creek—Upstream from its junction with the River Murray.
- Deegay Ponds—See Major's Creek.
- Gardiner's Creek—See Mitchell's Creek.
- Goulburn River—Downstream from the Hume Highway Bridge near Seymour, but not including the tributaries of such river, excepting Mitchell's Creek, Majors Creek or Deegay Ponds, Broken River and Hughes Creek, listed separately herein.
- Gunbower Creek—The whole of such creek.
- Hughes Creek—Downstream from the Goulburn Valley Highway.
- Kiewa River—Downstream from Keegan's Bridge, also known as Keighan's Bridge, over such river at Dederang.
- King River—Downstream from the bridge over such river at Moyhu.
- Loddon River—Downstream from a point 200 yards downstream from the Laanecoore Weir, but not including the tributaries of such portion of the river except the Marraboor River listed herein.
- Marraboor River (also known as the Little Murray)—The whole of such river downstream from its junction with the Loddon River to its junction with the River Murray.
- Major's Creek (or Deegay Ponds)—Upstream from its junction with the Goulburn River near Mitchellstown.
- Mitchell's Creek (or Gardiner's Creek)—Upstream from its junction with Major's Creek (near Mitchellstown).
- Mitta Mitta River—Downstream from the bridge over such river on the Eskdale-Mitta Mitta North road to the rail and road bridge at Tallangatta East, and in all that portion of the Mitta Mitta Arm of the Hume Reservoir and backwaters between such two bridges.

ORDER EXEMPTING AN ASSOCIATION FROM PROVISIONS OF ACT.

IN pursuance of the provisions of the *Benefit Associations Act 1958*, His Excellency, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, after consideration by the Minister of reports, in writing, made by the Registrar of Sickness, Hospital, Medical and Funeral Benefit Associations and the Government Statist relative to the proposed exemption and to the terms and conditions to be imposed; doth, by this Order, declare the Association, known as the Hospitals Contribution Fund of New South Wales, to be exempt from the provisions of the *Benefit Associations Act 1958*, subject to the following terms and conditions:—

1. That the Hospitals Contribution Fund of New South Wales (hereinafter referred to as the Association) shall establish accounts for Victorian contributors in respect of hospital and medical benefits respectively (such accounts are hereinafter referred to as the Victorian Accounts) which shall be credited with contributions paid by such contributors and with interest at the average interest rate earned by the funds of the Association and which shall be debited with claims paid, in respect of such contributors and/or their dependants and an appropriate share of management charges.

2. That the current rules of the Association that apply to the contributors to the Victorian Accounts be filed with the Registrar before the 1st day of April, 1965.

3. (a) That such rules of the Association be not altered without the approval of the Minister. Applications for such alterations shall be submitted in the first place to the Government Actuary for report to the Minister.

(b) That as soon as is convenient, the Registrar and the Government Actuary shall examine such recorded rules and report to the Minister, who shall notify the Association regarding any alterations which he deems necessary after consideration of such reports.

4. That the Government Actuary shall as he deems necessary but not more frequently than once every three years, conduct an actuarial investigation into the Victorian Accounts of the Association. The Association shall furnish any information or statistics required by the Government Actuary to carry out such investigation.

5. Following an investigation pursuant to condition 4 hereof, the Minister after consideration of reports, in writing, made by the Registrar and the Government Actuary, shall have power to direct any changes in tables of contributions and/or benefits in such rules which in his opinion are deemed necessary to protect the contributors.

6. Upon notice, in writing, being given by the Minister to the Association requiring any change in the rules pursuant to conditions 3 and 5 hereof, the Association shall subject to the provisions of the Commonwealth National Health Act amend such rules and file with the Registrar within six months of the date of such notice a copy of the rules so amended.

7. Any information or statistics required by the Government Actuary from time to time shall be made available by the Association.

8. That audited annual returns of the nature specified in section 14 of the *Benefit Associations Act 1958* and duplicates of all auditors' reports on the books and

accounts of the Association shall, within three months of the closing of the financial year, be furnished yearly to the Government Actuary.

9. (a) Not later than the 31st day of December, 1965, the Association shall deposit with the Treasurer of Victoria an amount of Commonwealth Inscribed Stock, at least equal to one-quarter of the total amount of contribution receipts shown in the Victorian Accounts for the year ended the 30th day of June, 1965.

Not later than the 31st day of December in any succeeding calendar year in which the amount of the said stock so deposited with and held by the said Treasurer is less than one-quarter of the total amount of contribution receipts shown in the Victorian Accounts for the year ended on the immediately preceding 30th day of June, the Association shall deposit with the said Treasurer such additional amount of the said stock as is necessary to make the total amount of the said stock so deposited with and held by the Treasurer at least equal to one-quarter of the total amount of contribution receipts shown in the Victorian Accounts for the year ended on the last-mentioned 30th day of June.

(b) The Association shall covenant under seal with the said Treasurer that it will not withdraw without his consent any of the said stock until the Association ceases to carry on hospital and/or medical benefit business in Victoria and all liabilities of the Association to contributors shown in the Victorian Accounts have been discharged with the intent that the said stock shall be available for ensuring the discharge of such liabilities provided that the Association shall be entitled to any amounts from time to time payable as interest or dividend on the said stock.

The Melbourne District will include places within a radius of 12 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office with the exception of places for which separate contracts are provided; the Mont Park District will include the Mental Hospitals, Janefield Colony, the Sanatorium, Gresswell, and Pleasant View, Preston; the Ararat, Ballarat, Beechworth, Bendigo, Castlemaine, Geelong and Sunbury Districts will include Mental Hospitals, Penal Institutions and Teachers' Hostels at any of those places. Delivery must be made at the places, institutions, &c., named in the Schedules, or as directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Packages suitable for transport of goods supplied must be provided by the contractor free of expense, and the value of these packages, whether in bulk or otherwise, is to be included in the rate tendered, except butter boxes and soap boxes (not including fancy soaps), jam jars, flour, meal, and potato bags, which will remain the property of the contractor, and only the actual net weight or quantity received will be paid for; the empties to be removed from the place of delivery at the contractor's expense.

6. The meat supplied under these conditions must, if practicable, be slaughtered at abattoirs which are under authorized inspection and supervision. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor, on report from the Tender Board to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the Treasurer may direct, and the amount will be deducted from the contractor's account, or from the security money.

7. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of the Department concerned or any officer authorized by him, and shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

8. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce the order for the same to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the stores accepted, and shall return the order to the contractor, who shall render his account as soon as possible after the delivery of the supplies, accompanied by the receipted delivery order. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.

9. Where railway facilities are available, the contractor shall use the Railways for the transport of the goods. When a contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, except for Commonwealth Departments, he shall obtain a receipt for

the goods in duplicate on the Stores and Transport consignment note at the same time handing in the triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver at the Tender Board Offices the original, the duplicate to be forwarded to the consignees and the quintuplicate retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which services the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition may subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under clause 18 of these conditions.

10. Orders must receive prompt execution; in the event of the goods not being delivered at the time mentioned in the order or within such other time as the officer ordering the supply may specify for delivery, it will be competent for such officer, or the head of the Department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the conditions.

12. If the officer in charge of stores be not satisfied as to the quantity or quality of the stores, or if, after taking delivery of any stores or material, he shall discover any deficiency or defect therein, he may return such deficient or defective stores or material to the contractor, and shall report the same to the head of his department and to the Tender Board.

13. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey composed of persons named by the Treasurer of the State for the time being; and the decision of the Board is to be considered final. In the event of the decision being against the contractor, the survey fees and expenses (if any) will be deducted as in clause 10.

14. In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or when from some other cause injury would be sustained either by the person to whom the rations or stores are due or by the contractor in waiting for a Board to survey, the head of the Department or officer authorized to take delivery will have power to reject such article or articles as are, obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing, and that the contractor must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be obtained by the officer requiring it as in clause 10. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies so rejected or returned.

15. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it, or any like supply suitable for the Service, will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

16. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will be competent for a Board of Survey, consisting of the medical superintendent (or, in his absence, of the medical officer) and any two officers named by him, to examine and reject any supplies that may be objected to. It must be distinctly understood, however, that the contractor will have a right of appeal to the Treasurer of the State for the time being, such appeal to be made in writing within 24 hours of the rejection; but, pending such appeal, he must at once supply others of approved quality; failing which, the supplies required, or any like supplies suitable for the Service, may be obtained by the officer concerned, and the expense charged as in clause 10.

17. In the case of supplies for Mental Hospitals, it will also be competent for two or more of the official visitors, in conjunction with the medical superintendent, to reject any supplies that they may consider not in accordance with contract; and in such cases the reference to a Board of Survey will not be deemed to be necessary.

18. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, or delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding Fifty pounds, as the said Treasurer may direct, and the amount may be deducted as in clause 10. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer, upon such refusal, irregularity or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and forfeit the whole or any part of the

security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of twelve months from the date of such disqualification.

19. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. *If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm and not in that of the individual—then the Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.*

20. It will be competent for the Tender Board to terminate the contract, without notice, should there be reason to know that the contractor takes advantage of his contract to communicate with a prisoner.

21. The contract entered into under these conditions is not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Imperial Commissariat; or by the consumption of the produce or surplus stock of any Government establishment, or by any article being made at and supplied for the use of any Government establishment.

22. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last known place of business or abode.

23. Under no circumstances other than those mentioned in clause 22 will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

24. For the purposes of these contracts the word "Government" shall mean the Government of the State of Victoria; and the word "Treasurer" shall mean the Treasurer of the said State.

2. This By-law shall from the time of its coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 115.
3. Clause 2 of By-law No. 115 is hereby amended by including therein after the words "Schedule 'A' and Schedule 'B' thereto" the words "and Schedule 'A' of By-law No. 138".
4. Each of the areas of land in the said Municipal District set out and described in Schedule "A" hereto is hereby prescribed as an area of land on which a building or buildings of Class II Occupancy shall contain in the aggregate not more than the number of flats as set out against the particular area.
5. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—
 - (a) "Building of Class II Occupancy" has the meaning assigned to that expression in Chapter 6 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.
 - (b) "Flat" has the meaning assigned thereto in Chapter 1 of the said Regulations.
 - (c) "Site" shall have the same meaning as in Clause 815 of the said Regulations.

- (7) Lighting etc. of Obstructions generally—Clauses 38 and 39.
- (8) Houses etc. encroaching on streets etc.—Clause 40.
- (9) Obstructions etc. to streets etc. by Cattle etc.—Clauses 41 (a), 42-45 both inclusive.
- (10) Undermining Streets—Clause 46.
- (11) Miscellaneous—Clauses 47-49 both inclusive.

PART II. Waterworks Drains etc.—Clause 6.

PART IV. Places of Improvement and Recreation etc.

- (1) Public Libraries and Museums—Clauses 1 and 2.
- (2) Public Gardens—Clauses 3-11 both inclusive.

PART V. Regulation etc. of Buildings.

- (2) Ruinous or Dangerous Buildings etc.—Clauses 5-8 both inclusive.

PART VI. Buildings etc. for Public Meetings etc.—Clauses 1-4 both inclusive.

3. (a) The owners or occupiers of houses or buildings shall, on the gate or gatepost or on the letter box or on a place on the front fence immediately adjacent to the entrance of the houses or buildings, mark such houses or buildings with such numbers or names for the purpose of distinguishing the same, as the Council may from time to time direct or approve.
- (b) In addition to complying with the requirements of paragraph (a) of this clause, the owners or occupiers of buildings in which there are two or more separate dwellings shall on the front door of each such separate dwelling or in such other conspicuous position as the Council determines mark such separate dwelling with such numbers or names for the purpose of distinguishing the same as the Council may from time to time direct or approve.
- (c) Such owners or occupiers shall renew the numbers or names of such houses, buildings or separate dwellings as often as they are obliterated or defaced.
- (d) If any owner or occupier of any such house, building or separate dwelling neglects for one week after notice to him from the Council to mark such house, building or separate dwelling with such number or name as the Council may direct or approve, or to renew the number or name thereof as aforesaid, he shall forfeit a sum not exceeding Forty shillings; and the Council may cause such number or name to be so marked or renewed, and recover the expense thereof from the owner or occupier of such house, building or separate dwelling before any justice; and where such expense is paid by or recovered from the occupier he may deduct the same from any rent payable by him to the owner.

4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.

- A By-law of the City of Caulfield made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958* (as amended) and numbered 134 for adopting certain provisions of the 15th Schedule to the Act and carrying out certain purposes provided for in the said Schedule.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958* (as amended), and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Caulfield order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 16 of the Shire (now City) of Caulfield adopting Part XI of the 13th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1874* and By-law No. 13 of the Shire (now City) of Caulfield amending the same are hereby repealed.

2. Such of the Clauses of Part XI of the 15th Schedule to the *Local Government Act 1958* (as amended), entitled "Regulation of Proceedings of Council, Officers, etc." as are set out hereunder are hereby adopted, namely:

- Clause 1,
- Clauses 4-30 (both inclusive)
- Clauses 32-39 (both inclusive)
- Clauses 41-44 (both inclusive)
- Clauses 46-51 (both inclusive)
- Clause 53.

3. At every meeting of the Council the first business thereof shall be:—

- (a) If a copy of the minutes of the preceding meeting shall have been delivered to each Councillor at least forty-eight hours before such meeting the putting a question for the confirmation of such minutes;
- (b) If a copy of the minutes of such preceding meeting has not been so delivered, the reading and putting a question for the confirmation of such minutes. No discussion shall be permitted on such minutes except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings, and the said minutes of the proceedings at the preceding meeting shall then be signed as by this Act required.

4. (1) After the signing of the minutes as aforesaid the order of business of an ordinary meeting shall be as follows, or as near thereto as may be practicable, but for the greater convenience of the Council at any particular meeting thereof it may be altered by resolution to that effect:—

- (i) Resumption of debate on motions or orders of the day lapsed at previous meeting.
- (ii) Reading the summary of correspondence referred to in Clause 5 hereof and considering and ordering thereon.
- (iii) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
- (iv) Presentation of reports.
- (v) Payments.
- (vi) Ordinary business not elsewhere included.
- (vii) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from proceedings of former meetings.
- (viii) Extraordinary business not elsewhere included.
- (ix) Other motions of which previous notice has been given.
- (x) Notices of motion.

- (2) The order of business at a special meeting shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof.

5. The Town Clerk shall prepare and shall place before each meeting of the Council a summary of correspondence received since the last preceding meeting of the Council.

6. (1) A motion moved at a meeting of the Council need not be reduced into writing by the mover unless the Chairman of the meeting so directs.

- (2) The Town Clerk shall cause to be recorded in the rough minutes all motions moved and seconded at a meeting of the Council.

7. (1) It shall not be necessary to keep minutes of the proceedings of any Committee.

- (2) All reports of Committees shall be entered into a Committees Report Book, signed by the Chairman of the Committee and shall contain a recommendation to the Council on the matters considered.

8. Every petition presented to the Council shall be in writing (other than in pencil) typing or printing, and shall contain the prayer of the petitioners at the end thereof, and be signed by at least one petitioner on every sheet on which it is written.

9. (1) Subject to as in hereinafter provided, plans and specifications for any public work shall be laid before the Council at least six days prior to the same being considered and ordered upon, and be open for inspection by any ratepayer during that time.
- (2) Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore provided, plans and specifications for any public work which the Council may resolve to be urgent may be considered and ordered upon at any meeting of the Council.
10. The common seal of the municipality shall be kept in the custody of the Town Clerk and it shall not be affixed to any document except in the presence of one Councillor and the Town Clerk.
11. Any one or more of the rules or regulations in Clauses 3 to 10, both inclusive, of this By-law or in those provisions of Part XI of the 15th Schedule hereby adopted (including Clauses 49 and 50 thereof) may be suspended for a special purpose on motion upon notice duly given or (without notice of motion) by a unanimous vote of the whole of the Councillors present at the meeting.
12. Every person guilty of an offence under this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.
13. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.

A By-law of the City of Caulfield made under Section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, and numbered 135 for suppressing nuisances, regulating traffic and processions, regulating or prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing or affixing of any letter, figure, device, poster, sign or advertisement upon any footpath, street or road, and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Caulfield do hereby order as follows:—

1. That the following By-laws of the City of Caulfield be and they are hereby repealed—
- (a) By-law No. 1 made by the said City (then Shire) for the prevention of injuries to roads.
- (b) By-law No. 5 made by the said City (then Shire) for regulating traffic and processions.
- (c) By-law No. 21 of the said City (then Shire) for regulating the traffic through and over the roads and streets of the shire and for preserving order therein.
- (d) By-law No. 28 of the said City (then Town) for suppressing nuisances, regulating traffic and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.
- (e) By-law No. 30 of the said City (then Town) for regulating traffic and processions.
- (f) By-law No. 34 of the said City for regulating traffic along the roads and streets of the City—for regulating or prohibiting the writing, painting, printing, stencilling, placing or affixing of any letter, figure, device, poster, sign or advertisement upon any footpath, street or road, for suppressing nuisances and generally for maintaining the good rule and government of the municipality.
- (g) By-law No. 36 of the said City for prohibiting or regulating the locking of the wheels of any vehicle when descending a hill.
- (h) By-law No. 45 of the said City for regulating traffic and processions.
- (i) By-law No. 47 of the said City for regulating traffic and to regulate the heavy motor vehicles used in the said City and for other purposes.
- (j) By-law No. 56 of the said City for prohibiting the standing of vehicles in Hawthorn-road, east side, between North-road and Sheffield-street.

- (k) By-law No. 83 of the said City for prohibiting the leaving of motor cars or other vehicles standing unattended between the hours of 2 o'clock and 5 o'clock in the forenoon of any day in specified streets and roads.
- (l) By-law No. 98 of the said City for the purposes of regulating traffic.
- (m) By-law No. 115 of the said City appointing standing places for motor cars.
- (n) Regulation No. 7 of the said City for regulating traffic on the Dandenong-road.
2. No person shall permit or allow any cart, carriage, motor car or other vehicle to remain in or on any street, road, lane or right-of-way so as to obstruct any such street, road, lane or right-of-way or so as to impede or interfere with the traffic therein or thereon.
3. No person shall tie, secure or fasten any horse to any tree or tree guard in or on any street, road, lane, or right-of-way nor to any fence abutting on any such street, road, lane or right-of-way.
4. No person shall spill or permit material to be spilt or to fall from any motor car or other vehicle on or upon any street or road or to be deposited on any street or road in any manner whatsoever except in terms of any contract which any such person aforesaid shall have with the said Council or with the written consent of the Council.
5. No person shall drive, ride, or impel any vehicle or any motorcycle, bicycle or like means of locomotion upon any footway made or set apart for the use of pedestrians, provided however that such vehicle or any motorcycle bicycle or like means of locomotion may be taken across any footway direct to or from any premises abutting thereon by means of a crossing.
6. No procession of persons or of vehicles, or both, for other than funeral purposes shall parade or pass through any street or road, unless with the previous consent in writing of the Council and only by the route specified in such consent.
7. 7. This By-law shall have force and apply throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Caulfield.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the Shire of Swan Hill order as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter "Council" means the Council of the Shire of Swan Hill, "Municipality" means the municipal district of the Council.

2. Every owner or occupier of land within the municipality on being served with a notice in writing from the Council declaring such land to be unsightly or destructive of the amenity of the neighbourhood shall enclose such land with a sufficient fence of such material and in such manner as is hereinafter prescribed within 30 days of the service of such notice.

3. It is hereby prescribed that every fence shall be of the materials and constructed in the following manner:—

- (i) posts—5" by 3" red gum or jarrah suitably constructed 2' 0" in the ground and centres not to exceed 9' 0";
- (ii) rails—top, bottom and centre, 3" by 2" hardwood;
- (iii) plinth—6" by 1";
- (iv) palings—fence to be covered by new ½" sawn palings lapped 1" on each side;
- (v) height—not less than 6' 3" above ground level trimmed to a line on top;
- (vi) general—lands situated at the intersection of two streets, fence to be splayed for a distance of 30' from the intersection of the building line of such streets.

Provided that the Council may approve an application made in writing by any owner or occupier for permission to have a fence constructed of other suitable materials or to vary any of the above provisions.

4. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20 and to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which such offence is continued after conviction or order is made by any Court.

5. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Swan Hill.

1. OPERATION.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in those parts of the Shire of Swan Hill known as Nyah, Nyah West and Woorinen and more particularly described as follows:—

- (i) Crown allotments 34 and 35, section 2, Parish of Tyntynder North. Crown allotment 11, Parish of Tyntynder West, the Township of Nyah West (Gaz. 15-2981), Parish of Tyntynder West and Crown allotments 1 and 1A, section 1, Parish of Tyntynder West.

The minimum area, depth and width of frontage specified in Column 4 of Table 804 of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building of Class 1 or Class 2 occupancy as defined by the said Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, shall be constructed throughout those portions of the Shire of Swan Hill set out and described in Clause 1 hereof.

3. DISTANCE FROM STREET FRONTAGE.

No person shall construct a building of Classes 1 and 2 occupancy, the outer walls of which are closer to the frontage of any land than 25 feet throughout those portions of the Shire of Swan Hill set out and described in Clause 1 hereof.
