EXTENSION OF THE ECHUCA MEAT AREA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958 (No. 6270), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation extend the limits of the Echuca Meat Area so that it shall comprise the municipal districts of the city of Echuca and the shire of Deakin, and those parts of the shire of Rochester which lie within a distance of six miles from the Echuca Post Office.

This Proclamation shall take effect on the first day of May, 1965.

MAXIMUM FEES AND DUES WHICH MAY BE PRESCRIBED BY BY-LAWS OF A COUNCIL FOR SPECIFIED SERVICES AT ABATTOIRS AND MEAT INSPECTION DEPOTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the Health Act 1958 (No. 6270), I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, on the recommendation of the Commission of Public Health and by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation rescind all the previous Proclamations relating to meat supervision fees made under sub-section (2) of section 317 of the Health Act 1958, and in accordance with the powers conferred by section 317 of the said Act, I now specify in the attached Schedule the maximum fees and dues which may be prescribed by By-laws of a Council for certain services at abattoirs and meat inspection depots.

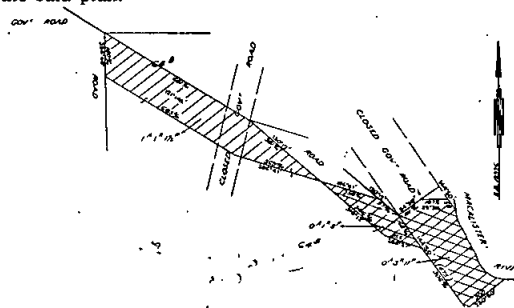

DROUIN SEWERAGE AUTHORITY. — SEWERAGE DISTRICT PROCLAIMED, AUTHORITY CONSTITUTED AND APPROVAL TO ACQUISITION OF LAND.

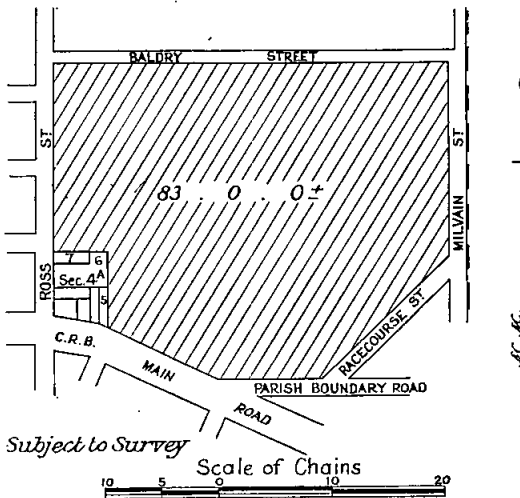

And whereas an application has been made by the Council of the Shire of Alexandra advising that it does not desire to continue with the preparation of that part of the Shire of Healesville Planning Scheme in respect of land now within the municipal district of the Shire of Alexandra:

And whereas it is provided by section 52 of the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961* that an interim development order, in force immediately before any alteration in a municipal district shall continue to have the same force and effect after the alteration but that the responsible authority after any Order is made, pursuant to section 51 of the said Act, shall be specified for that purpose in the said Order:

And whereas an interim development order was made by the Council of the Shire of Healesville and approved by the Governor in Council on the 9th day of January, 1962, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* No. 3, dated the 10th day of January, 1962:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council doth hereby make the following Order, that is to say:—

1. That the planning scheme commenced by the Council of the Shire of Healesville on the 1st day of June, 1960, is divided into two parts, first that part being the area of the scheme within the municipal district of the Shire of Healesville, the boundaries of such municipality being defined in the *Victoria Government Gazette* No. 36, dated the 8th day of May, 1963, and secondly that part being the area of the scheme within the municipal district of the Shire of Alexandra the boundaries of such municipality being defined in the *Victoria Government Gazette* No. 36, dated the 8th day of May, 1963.

2. That the Council of the Shire of Healesville is hereby authorized to continue the preparation of the said planning scheme for that part of the scheme within its municipal district and the said Council shall be deemed always to have been the responsible authority in relation to the said part of the scheme and no act, matter or proceeding relating to the preparation of the scheme or the relevant part thereof shall be affected or abated by reason of the alteration in the municipal district.

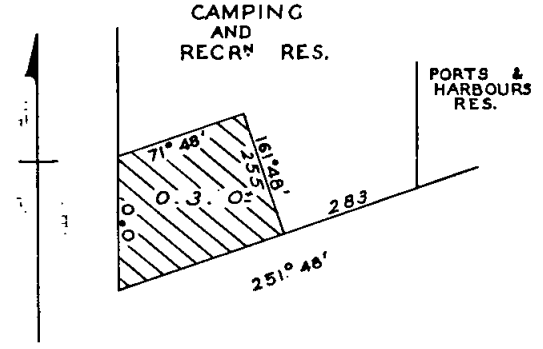

CITY OF RINGWOOD.

BY-LAW No. 67.

A By-law of the City of Ringwood made under Sections 197 and 198 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, Section 93 of the *Health Act 1958* and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria for:—

- (a) Regulating the keeping of birds;
- (b) Prescribing the construction of fowlhouses green-houses aviaries and similar structures, and
- (c) Other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the *Health Act 1958* the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria and of any and

every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor Councillors and Citizens of the City of Ringwood orders as follows:—

Part I.—General.

1. This by-law shall be known as the Poultry By-law.
2. In By-law No. 21 of the Borough of Ringwood—
 - (a) Clauses 6, 7 and 8 are hereby repealed;
 - (b) the provisions of Clauses 4, 9 and 10 shall not apply to poultry as defined herein.
3. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:

“Approved Materials” means materials approved by the Building Surveyor or Health Inspector of the Municipality.

“Area” of a poultry house means the superficial area of a horizontal section thereof made at ground level.

“Battery Cage” means a wire and metal mesh cage divided into one or more compartments in which poultry is kept.

“Dwelling” includes a living room sleepout or tent and all rooms for sleeping living and cooking.

“Frontage” means the boundary line between any land and the street on which such land abuts or where such land abuts on more than one street then the boundary line between such land and the street to which the main building fronts or where there is no building on the said land then the shortest boundary line between such land and any street on which such land abuts.

“Poultry” means and includes any fowl chicken turkey goose gander duck duckling pigeon squab or other edible bird.

Part II.—Poultry.

4. Except as hereinafter provided no person shall on any property not situated within the area specified in Schedule “A” hereto keep or suffer to be kept more than twenty-five head of poultry.

5. Nothing in the last preceding clause shall prevent any person keeping up to one hundred and seventy-five head of poultry on any land which has an area of not less than fifteen thousand square feet (15,000 sq. ft.) nor keeping more than one hundred and seventy-five head of poultry on any land which has for each one hundred and fifty head of poultry in excess of one hundred and seventy-five an additional area of seventy-five hundred square feet over and above fifteen thousand square feet.

6. No person shall on any land keep any poultry within a distance of:—

- (a) 50 ft. from any street or road to which such land has a frontage;
- (b) 25 ft. from any other street or road;
- (c) 5 ft. from the boundary of any adjoining land.
- (d) 40 ft. from any dwelling whether on the same or adjoining land.

7. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept any poultry except in a poultry house constructed in accordance with this By-law provided always that a poultry house may have attached thereto for the use of the poultry kept therein a poultry run which is enclosed by wire netting and maintained in such manner as to prevent the escape of poultry therefrom.

8. No person shall keep or suffer to be kept in any poultry house and/or in any poultry run attached thereto a number of poultry greater than the number produced by dividing the area into square feet of such poultry house by four.

9. (a) Every poultry house other than a poultry house within the area specified in Schedule “A” shall:—

- (i) be roofed with galvanized iron or other approved impervious material and such roof shall be provided with guttering and spouts leading to adequate storm water drains.
- (ii) have the external walls thereof constructed of galvanized iron fibrous cement sheets or other approved material.
- (iii) be paved with concrete at least three inches thick and the surface of such paving shall be at all points at least three inches above the level of the ground.
- (iv) be rendered rat proof by placing galvanized iron jointed brickwork or concrete around the foundation to a depth of at least eighteen inches below ground level.

(b) Every poultry house within the area specified in Schedule “A” shall:—

- (i) be roofed with galvanized iron or other approved impervious material and such roof shall be provided with guttering and spouting leading to adequate storm water drains.
- (ii) have the external walls thereof constructed of galvanized iron fibrous cement sheets or other approved materials.
- (iii) be rendered rat proof by placing galvanized iron jointed brickwork or concrete around the foundations to a depth of at least eighteen inches below ground level.

10. Every battery cage system in which poultry is kept in any area shall have a permanent roof with any walls constructed of approved materials and having a floor raised at least three inches above the level of the surrounding ground.

Part III.—Cleanliness.

11. The ground surrounding any poultry house shall be well drained.

12. The occupier of any land on which any poultry house is erected shall keep the area of land within five feet of such poultry house free from all dry grass, weeds, refuse, rubbish, and/or other materials capable of harbouring rats or vermin.

13. No person shall keep or store or cause or permit to be kept or stored on any land where poultry is kept any food for consumption by such poultry unless such food is kept or stored in rat proof receptacles or rat proof buildings.

14. The occupier of any land shall cause any poultry house and poultry run thereon to be thoroughly cleaned from time to time as often as may be necessary and shall keep the same at all times in a clean wholesome and sanitary condition.

15. The occupier of any land on which any poultry is kept shall cause any bird kept thereon which shall develop diphtheria, tuberculosis or other contagious or infectious disease injurious to human beings to be forthwith destroyed and disposed of to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector of the Municipality.

16. Save as otherwise herein provided this By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal district.

Save as to piggeries, this By-Law shall have force and operation throughout the municipal district of the Shire of Cranbourne, and as to piggeries this By-Law shall have force and operation in so much of the municipal district of the Shire of Cranbourne as is constituted by the Cranbourne and Tooradin Ridings and Crown Allotments 4, 5, 6, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 13A, Parish of Lang Lang, County of Mornington, and the northern part of Crown Allotment 14, said Parish and County, such part being bounded on the south by a prolongation of the southern boundary of the said Crown Allotment 12, bearing S. 80 deg. 5 min. W. to the eastern boundary of the aforesaid Crown Allotment 14.

5. Any party who shall wilfully offend against any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty of not more than Five Pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-Law is continued after a conviction or order by any Court in respect thereof against such party.
