## **PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Land Act 1958 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1958, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 3 and 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1958 aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 (No. 6304).

DECLARING THAT MAIZE SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE MAIZE MARKETING BOARD.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 17 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958, it is enacted that where a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

  (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith, upon the date of publication of the Proclamation or on, from and after a later date specified in the Proclamation, be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent Proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provision as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same:

And whereas by a Proclamation made on the fifth day of May, 1936, under the provisions of section 6 of the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935, the Governor in Council declared maize to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Governor in Council appointed a marketing Board in relation to maize and assigned to such Board the name of the "Maize Marketing Board": Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on and from the second day of May, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five all maize shall subject to and in accordance with the Marketing of Primary Products Act 1958 be divested from the producers of maize and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any maize coming into existence within two (2) years from the second day

of May, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five, it shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the Maize Marketing Board as the owner thereof: And to enable the Maize Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such maize shall subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act be delivered by the producers thereof to the Maize Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times, at such places and in such manner as the Maize Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as are prescribed by Regulations made under the said Act.

ALTERING THE CHEMICAL STANDARDS OF BRAN AND POLLARD.

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (3) of Section 16 of the Stock Foods Act 1958 it is amongst other things provided that the Chief Chemist of the Department of Agriculture shall in every year conduct chemical, physical and milling tests upon a portion of the official fair average quality wheat sample fixed for that year and that if necessary the Second Schedule to the Stock Foods Act 1958 shall by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette be amended by altering any standard provided for therein in accordance with the results of those tests: And, whereas, as a consequence of the chemical, physical and milling tests conducted by such Chief Chemist upon a portion of the official fair average quality wheat sample fixed for the year 1964-65 it is necessary to amend the said Schedule by altering the chemical standards provided for therein to accord with the results of those tests: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation amend the said Schedule as follows:—

## ROKEWOOD COMMON DIMINISHED.

Now therefor, I, the Government Gazette for one month; in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby diminish the Rokewood Common proclaimed as such on the 14th July, 1890 and the 6th August, 1903, by the excision therefrom of the land in the Township of Rokewood temporarily reserved as a site for a Rubbish Depot by Order in Council of the 26th August, 1940, and containing 1 rood 25 1/10 perches. 1. Amend Schedule One to the said  $\operatorname{Act}$  by deleting therefrom the following item—

SELENIUM, Salts of (not metal).

2. Amend Schedule Two to the said  $\operatorname{Act}$  by deleting therefrom the following item—

BRUCINE in substances containing 0.2 per centum or less of Brucine.

and by adding thereto the following items-

BRUCINE in substances containing 0.2 per centum or less of Brucine except in alcohol for use in perfumes when such alcohol is denatured by the addition of 0.02 per centum or less of Brucine.

SELENIUM, Salts of (not metal).

3. Amend Schedule Five to the said Act by deleting therefrom the following items—

KEROSENE OF COMMERCE when sold in quantities of one quart or less otherwise than in containers which comply with the provisions of this Act and the regulations and are labelled conspicuously with the words: "Warning. Kerosene. Keep away from Children."

METHYLATED SPIRIT as such.

and by adding thereto the following items-

KEROSENE OF COMMERCE packed in containers having a capacity of four gallons or less, unless such containers comply with the provisions of this Act and the Regulations made thereunder and are labelled with a warning label.

METHYLATED SPIRIT as such packed in containers having a capacity of four gallons or less, unless such containers comply with the provisions of this Act and the Regulations made thereunder and are labelled with a warning label.

## Country Fire Authority Act 1958.

VARIATION OF SUMMER PERIOD IN RESPECT OF SPECIFIED PARTS OF THE COUNTRY AREAS OF VICTORIA.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Country Fire Authority Act 1958 it is enacted that the Chief Secretary of Victoria, after consultation with the Minister of Forests, may from time to time by declaration published in the Government Gazette declare any period to be the summer period in respect of the country area of Victoria, or any specified part or parts thereof and, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, may declare different periods to be the summer period in respect of different parts of the said country area:

And whereas by the said section it is further enacted that any declaration so published may be revoked, amended or varied by a subsequent declaration so published.

And whereas by declarations issued on the dates stated in Schedule A annexed hereto, different summer periods expiring on the thirtieth day of April, 1965, were declared in respect of different parts of the country area of Victoria, including the parts of the said country area specified in Schedule B hereto:

And whereas the Chief Secretary and the Minister of Forests have consulted accordingly:

Now therefore I, the Chief Secretary of Victoria, do by this my declaration vary the aforesaid declarations by declaring that the summer period in respect of the parts of the country area of Victoria specified in Schedule Bhereto shall end at midnight on the twenty-third day of April, 1965.

## TOWN OF CAMPERDOWN

By-LAW No. 28

A By-law of the Town of Camperdown made under section 197 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 28 for the purpose of regulating the use of streets, roads and public places by street hawkers and itinerant traders dealing in goods with power to prohibit any such persons during particular hours from using any such streets, road and public places.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 and all other powers enabling them in that behalf the Mayor, Councillors and Burgesses of the Town of Camperdown order as follows:—

- 1. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the Government Gazette;
- 2. No street hawker or itinerant trader dealing in goods 2. No street hawker or itinerant trader dealing in goods shall use any street, road or public place within the boundaries of the municipal district of the Town of Camperdown between the hours of Seven o'clock and Ten o'clock in the forenoon and the hours of Eleven o'clock in the forenoon and Two o'clock in the afternoon and the hours of Three o'clock and Six o'clock in the afternoon of any Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday and the hours of Nine O'clock in the forenoon on any Saturday and noon on any Saturday.
- 3. Any person who shall by any wilful act or default offend against any of the provisions of this By-law shall on conviction for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not less than Ten pounds (£10) but not exceeding Twenty Pounds (£20).

Resolution for this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the Town of Camperdown the 24th day of February, 1965, and confirmed at a meeting of the said Council held the 24th day of March, 1965.
