MILK PASTEURIZATION ACT 1958.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c.,

WHEREAS by Section 4 of the Milk Pasteurization Act 1958 (No. 6319) it is provided that a day be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the Government Gazette in relation to a prescribed district: And Whereas the following municipal district and portion of a municipal district have been prescribed as districts for the purposes of the said Act:—

 (ii) That portion of the Shire of Diamond Valley which includes the South West, Central and South East Ridings, and all that portion of the North Riding within the boundary formed by commencing at a point being the junction of Diamond Creek and Wadeson Road, thence westerly by Wadeson Road to Broad Gully Road, thence southerly by Broad Gully Road to Iron Bark Road, thence southerly by Iron Bark Road to Clyde Street, thence westerly by Clyde Street to Lambert Street, thence southerly by Lambert Street to Larch Crescent, thence westerly by Larch Crescent and Sutherland Road to Heard Avenue, thence northerly by Heard Avenue to Ashley Road, thence westerly by Ashley Road and a line in continuation of Ashley Road to the Plenty River being the Municipal boundary, thence following the Municipal boundary downstream along the Plenty River to the South East Riding boundary, thence following the South East Riding boundary, thence following the Municipal boundary, in an easterly, northerly, westerly and thence in a generally northerly direction upstream along the Diamond Creek to the point of commencement.

Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Monday, the 10th May, 1965, as the day after which no person shall in the prescribed districts set out above—

(a) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing premises and bottled and sealed as prescribed; or

- (b) (in the case where the milk is sold and delivered at a shop for immediate consumption by a customer at the shop) sell or deliver milk except milk pasteurized at licensed pasteurizing



WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, Section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

The contractor shall bear the cost of removing the rags, and of the return of the empty bags, from and to Spencer-street, Mont Park, Royal Park, Kew and Pentridge; railway freight from the institutions will be covered by a Stores and Transport consignment note issued by the institution concerned when forwarding the rags.
- 5. The contractor shall be duly notified of each consignment, and shall bear any cost that may be incurred for demurrage, or for any delay in taking delivery of the rags consigned.
- 6. In the event of the contractor failing to remove the rags at the times directed, the officer of the Department ordering the removal is hereby empowered to send them to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, and, on report to the Tender Board, the amount will be deducted from the security money or added to any account that may be payable by the contractor.
- 7. Payment is to be made on the net weight of the rags. No allowance will be made for any foreign material that may be mixed with them. All practical care will, however, be exercised to keep them free from such impurity.
- 8. The contractor must make payment within one month of delivery to the officer of the Department ordering the removal of the rags. In the event of payment not being made within the prescribed period, the amount outstanding will be deducted from the security money.
- 9. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract the security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited, and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure, and may be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of two years from the date of such disqualification.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise, and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

CITY OF COBURG. By-LAW No. 101.

- A By-law of the City of Coburg made under section 756 of the Local Government Act 1958 and numbered 101 for regulating the use of the Coburg Olympic Swimming Pool and the conduct of persons using or being on the premises of the Coburg Olympic Swimming on the Pool.
- IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act 1958 and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Coburg order as follows:—
- 1. Wherever appearing throughout this By-law unless otherwise stated or inconsistent with the context, the word "Council" shall mean the Council of the City of Coburg; the word "baths" shall include the swimming pool, showers, dressing-rooms, conveniences, passageways and the grounds fenced in with and known as the Coburg Olympic Swimming Pool and the premises thereof; the words "baths attendant" shall include the Council's employee or employees in charge of the baths; words in the singular shall include the plural; the words in the plural shall include the singular and words importing the masculine gender shall include females.

 2. No person shall enter upon any portion of the baths
- 2. No person shall enter upon any portion of the baths without having paid the fees chargeable or being otherwise authorized by the Council.
- 3. No person shall use the baths unless he be properly attired in a bathing costume so as to preserve public decency.
- 4. No child under the age of eight years will be admitted to the baths unless in the opinion of the baths attendance such child is in the care of a responsible person.
- 5. No person shall use the swimming pool whilst in an uncleanly condition, nor any portion of the baths while suffering from any cutaneous, infectious or contagious

- 6. No person shall wilfully interfere with the use and enjoyment by any person of the baths, and any person so doing or otherwise behaving in an unseemly, offensive, insulting or improper manner shall immediately leave the baths upon being requested so to do by the baths attendant or any officer of the Council; and such baths attendant may refuse to sell a ticket of admission to any person whom he may consider undesirable.
- 7. No person shall enter or remain in any portion of the baths whilst in a state of intoxication and no person shall at any time introduce into the baths or consume or cause to be consumed any spirituous or intoxicating liquor in any portion of the baths.
- 8. No person shall bring into the baths premises or have in his possession or custody or under his control in the baths premises any bottle or can.
- 9. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently break or injure or improperly interfere with the due and efficient action of any lock, tap, valve, pipe, work, engine or machinery in connexion with the baths, or carelessly or negligently defile, injure or destroy any furniture, fittings or conveniences in any part of the baths and shall not by cutting or writing thereon deface any wall, fittings or any portion of the baths.
- 10. No person shall at any time while being upon any portion of the baths use any indecent, insulting or offensive language or behave in an indecent, insulting, offensive or riotous manner.
- 11. No person shall spit in the swimming pool or on the floors or walls of any portion of the baths.
- 12. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person or under his control to enter or remain in any portion of the baths.
- 13. Any person finding any article which may have been left in any portion of the baths shall at once deliver the same to the baths attendant who shall thereupon register a description of the same in a book kept for that purpose and any person claiming such article shall upon giving satisfactory proof of ownership receive such article from the baths attendant upon entering his signature and address in the book referred to.
- 14. No person shall obstruct, hinder or interfere with attendant, officer or servant employed at the baths in the performance of his duty at the baths.
- 15. The Council will not be responsible for articles lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.
