AUTOMOTIVE MACHINIST TRADE PROCLAIMED TO BE AN APPRENTICESHIP TRADE.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 13 of the *Apprenticeship Act 1958* provides, *inter alia*, that after the Minister has taken into consideration any recommendation made by the Apprenticeship Commission the Governor in Council, for

the purposes of the said Act, may from time to time by Proclamation proclaim any trades to be apprenticeship trades:

AND WHEREAS the Apprenticeship Commission, having notified in the manner prescribed by the said Act its intention to recommend that the trade of Automotive Machinist (first class), as carried on in the vehicle industry in the whole of the State of Victoria, be so proclaimed, and having considered representations made by or on behalf of employers or employees in the said trade has recommended to the Minister that the said trade be so proclaimed:

AND WHEREAS the Minister has taken the said recommendation into consideration:

NOW THEREFORE I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation proclaim the trade of Automotive Machinist (first class), as carried on in the vehicle industry in the whole of the State of Victoria, to be an apprenticeship trade.

##### RATING BY-LAW 1965.

**T**HE Devenish Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes on lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Devenish Urban District.

On such lands and tenements a rate of Four shillings in the pound on the amount of the annual municipal valuations not exceeding Twenty-five pounds, and One shilling in the pound on the amount of municipal valuations exceeding Twenty-five pounds, but not exceeding Seventy-five pounds and Six pence in the pound exceeding Seventy-five pounds.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust, is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at the charge of Two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the said Trust.

ROAD DISCONTINUED—CITY OF MALVERN.

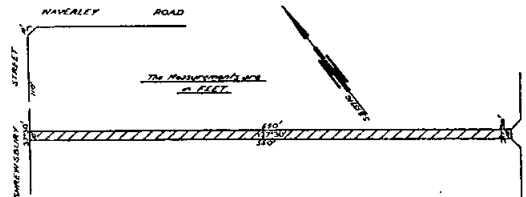

*Staffing of Consolidated and Group Schools.*

1. The position of Head Teacher of a Consolidated or Group School shall be advertised as a special position.
2. Head Teachers may be appointed to or retained in accordance with the following scale:—
  - (a) A head teacher of the Special Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of at least 500 pupils.
  - (b) A head teacher of the First Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of at least 260 pupils.
  - (c) A head teacher of the Second Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of at least 100 pupils.
  - (d) A head teacher of the Third Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of at least 20 pupils.
3. Infant mistresses may be appointed to or retained in accordance with the following scale:—
  - (a) An infant mistress of the Special Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of at least 620 pupils.
  - (b) An infant mistress of the First Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of at least 340 pupils.
  - (c) An infant mistress of the Second Class to or in a school which has a net enrolment of at least 140 pupils.



4. The number of assistant teachers including specialist subject teachers shall be fixed on the following basis, except as otherwise determined by the Tribunal:—

- (a) One assistant teacher for every 30 pupils in net enrolment in Grades I to VI; and
- (b) One assistant teacher for every 20 pupils in net enrolment beyond Grade VI.
