In accordance with previous custom, there will be no precedence in the order of presentation, but it is requested that members of services and all public bodies group themselves together for presentation, as far as possible.

It is requested that those entitled to wear uniform or official dress will do so on this occasion, but His Excellency will be pleased to receive those not entitled to wear uniform or official dress in morning suit or lounge suit.

For the guidance of those attending the Levee, it will be appropriate, for those who wish to do so, to wear Honours, Decorations and Awards.

Private Entree Cards will admit recipients to the South Door of the Spring-street Entrance at Parliament House at 9.30 a.m. All other citizens are requested to enter by the North Door of the Spring-street Entrance at 10.15 a.m.

It is particularly desired that gentlemen attending the Levee should provide themselves with a card on which should be printed or typed in capitals, or written in block letters, their styles of address for presentation in order to facilitate announcement to His Excellency.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**I**, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in Her Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, together with the short titles, that is to say:—

- No. 7282. "An Act to amend the *Health Act 1958* and the *Pesticides Act 1958* with respect to Household Insecticides, and for other purposes." (*Health (Household Insecticides) Act 1965*.)

"An Act to amend Section Thirty-eight of the *Country Roads Act 1958*, to amend the *Motor Car Act 1958*, to make Provision for the Establishment of a Fund to be applied to Special Road Projects, to amend the *Stamps Act 1958*, and for other purposes." (*Roads (Special Projects) Act 1965*.)

No. 7284. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Forty-three million eight hundred and seventy-seven thousand eight hundred and forty pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five and One thousand nine hundred and sixty-six."

## ACTS ENUMERATION AND REVISION ACT 1958.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** the *Public Works Loan and Application Act 1946* (No. 2) and the *Public Works Loan and Application Act 1947* were at the commencement of the *Acts Enumeration and Revision Act 1958* enactments in force in Victoria: And whereas those enactments were inadvertently not set out in the Second Schedule to the *Acts Enumeration and Revision Act 1958* and were accordingly repealed by virtue of that Act: And whereas section 10 of the *Acts Enumeration and Revision Act 1958* provides that the Governor in Council may by proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* indicate enactments as enactments which are to be added to those mentioned in the Second Schedule to that Act, and that thereupon the enactments shall be deemed to have been mentioned in that Schedule and the effect shall be the same as if that Schedule had

at the time of passing of that Act included those enactments: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council of that State, do by this my Proclamation indicate the *Public Works Loan and Application Act 1946* (No. 2) (No. 5199) and the *Public Works Loan and Application Act 1947* (No. 5240) as enactments which are to be added to those mentioned in the Second Schedule to the *Acts Enumeration and Revision Act 1958*.

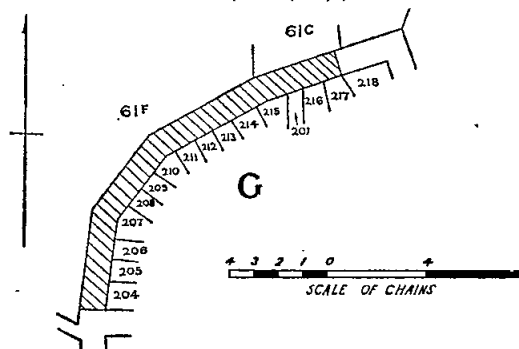

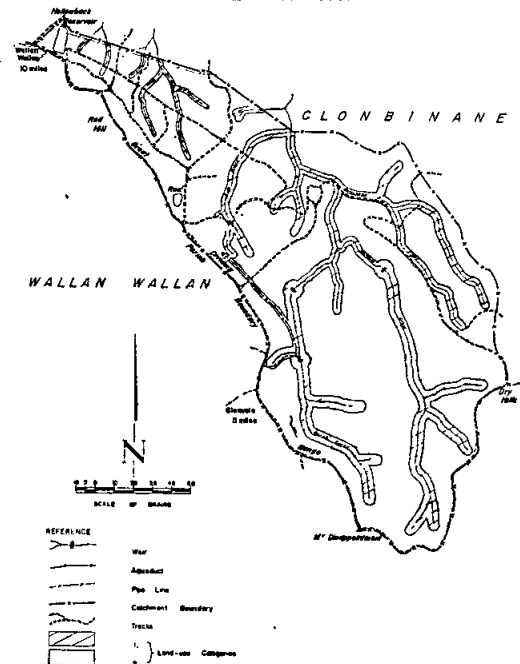
## Category 1.

## Category 2.

Land which shall be used for permanent forest, where forestry operations may be carried out only in accordance with conditions made or approved by the Soil Conservation Authority.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne made under Part VII Division 1 and Part XLIX of the *Local Government Act 1958* and Clause 815 (i) of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and numbered 451 for prescribing areas within the municipal district in which buildings of Class II. Occupancy shall not be required to comply with the provisions of Clauses 804 to 808 inclusive of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf the Council of the City of Melbourne DOTH ORDER as follows:—

1. This By-law may be cited as the "City of Melbourne Flats in Business Areas By-law 1964".

2. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Class II. Occupancy", "depth" and "width of frontage" shall have the meanings ascribed to those expressions by the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria;

"Schedule" means schedule to this By-law.

3. The areas more particularly described in the First Schedule save and except such parts as are described in the Second Schedule are hereby prescribed as areas in which buildings of Class II. Occupancy shall not be required to comply with the provisions of Clauses 804 to 808 inclusive of the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, provided that, subject to the provisions of section 452 of the *Health Act 1958*, the site of any such building shall abut on a street not less than 30 feet in width and shall have an area of not less than 3,300 square feet, a width of frontage of not less than 33 feet, and a depth of not less than 60 feet.

## FIRST SCHEDULE.

All that piece of land commencing at the intersection of the southern boundary of Dudley Street and the eastern boundary of Spencer Street and bounded by the said southern boundary of Dudley Street and its prolongation bearing north-easterly to the eastern boundary of Peel Street, thence by the said eastern boundary of Peel Street bearing northerly to Victoria Street, thence by the southern boundary of Victoria Street bearing easterly to Spring Street, thence by the western boundary of Spring Street and its prolongation bearing south-easterly to the northern bank of the Yarra River, thence by the said northern bank of the Yarra River bearing generally

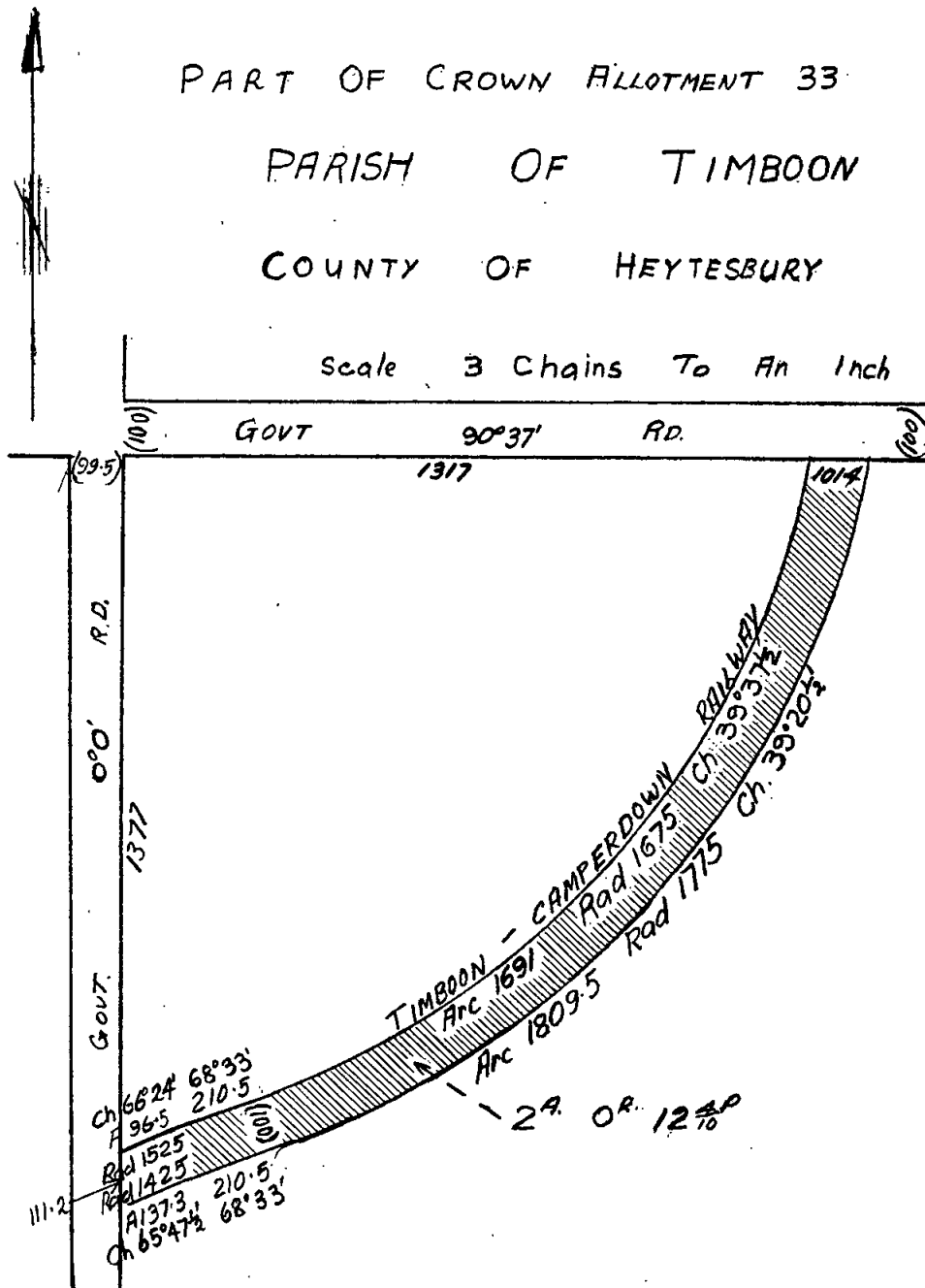
