Poisons Act 1962 (No. 6889).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Poisons Act 1962* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* amend any of the Schedules One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Six, Seven or Eight to such Act by adding to any such Schedules or removing therefrom any item:

NOW THEREFORE, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State do by this Proclamation—

1. Amend Schedule Four to the said Act by removing therefrom the items—

ALLYLISOPROPYLACETYLUREA
AMIDOPYRINE
DIOXYAMIDOPYRIN

2. Amend Schedule Seven to the said Act by adding thereto the following items—

AMIDOPYRINE, derivatives thereof including Dipyron, and substances containing Amidopyrine and derivatives thereof.

METHYL CINCHOPHEN (methyl ester of phenylcinchoninic acid) and substances containing Methyl Cincophen.

ALLYLISOPROPYLACETYLUREA and substances containing Allylisopropylacetylurea.

PROCLAMATION

BY virtue of the powers conferred by sections three and three hundred and eighty-nine of the *Health Act 1958*, I, The Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made on the 2nd day of August, 1950, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 30th day of August, 1950, and the Proclamation made on the 30th day of October, 1951, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 7th November, 1951, in which certain Pre-School Centres were declared to be public buildings within the meaning of the *Health Act 1928*, and in lieu thereof do hereby declare to be a "public building" within the meaning of the *Health Act 1958* and Pre-School Centre (including creche, kindergarten, day or residential nursery, or play centre) in which more than five children under the age of six years are received for care or training and which is not required by Part XIA of the *Health Act 1958* to be registered as a child minding centre.

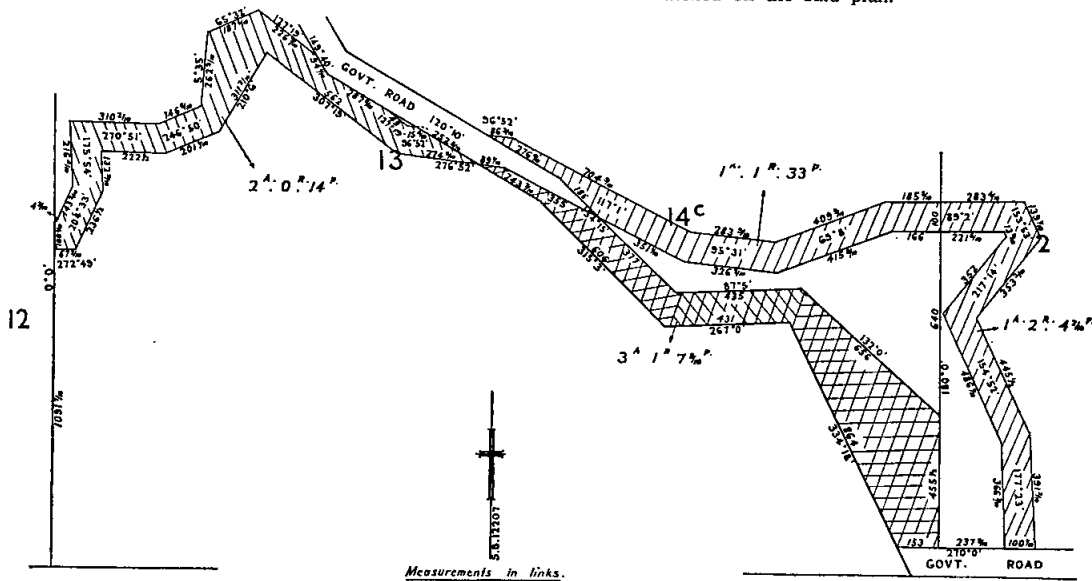

BY virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961*, and of every power enabling it in that behalf, the Shire of Rochester (hereinafter referred

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 1 hereof, this Interim Development Order shall not prohibit the erection, construction or carrying out of any dwelling-house or ancillary works on any land shown as a separate allotment on a plan of subdivision sealed by the Council of the Shire of Rochester, pursuant to section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, before the coming into operation of this Order.

4. Nothing in this Interim Development Order shall prevent—

- (a) the continuance of the use of any land or any existing building or works for the purpose for which the land or building or works was or were being lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order;
- (b) any dealing or the registration of any dealing with any land in a subdivision of which a plan has been sealed by the Council of the Shire of Rochester, pursuant to section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, before the coming into operation of this Order.

ON THE WEST by the west side of Albert Street from the north building line of Buckley Street to the south building line of Paisley Street thence west by the south building line of Paisley Street to the east building line of Victoria Street thence north by the east building line of Victoria Street to the south-east building line of Geelong Road.

ON THE NORTH by the rear of allotments of land fronting on the north side of Barkly and Hopkins Streets east from the east building line of Victoria Street to the west building line of Moore Street.

ON THE EAST by the west building line of Moore Street south to a point on the south building line of Hopkins Street opposite the west building line of Moore Street, thence east by the south building line of Hopkins Street to a point on the western alignment of the Melbourne to Williamstown railway easement thence south-west along the said alignment to the north side of Buckley Street.
