WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1958, as amended, section 519 it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the Government Gazette to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: in force:

And whereas the Council of the City of Nunawading has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, used for a street, be so declared to be a public highway.

- (d) For a reserved seat or reserved accommodation in the Second Division and the booking thereof on any such day such additional sum as the trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Five shillings (5s.).

  (c) For admission of every person to the Fourth Division on any such day such a sum as the trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Eight shillings (8s.).

  (d) For a reserved seat or reserved accommodation in the Fourth Division and the booking thereof on any such day such additional sum as the trustees may from time to time determine not exceeding Four shillings (4s.).
