AREA OF LAND COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1958* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1958*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6), shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided; Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Class 6 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1958* aforesaid, to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say) :—

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1958*, as amended, Section 519, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time and from time to time upon the request of the Council of any municipality by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved used or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street road highway thoroughfare bridge square court alley or right-of-way or any street road lane or passage made or laid out or proposed to be made or laid out on any land of which a plan delineating that street road lane or passage has been lodged with the Registrar of Titles to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force.

## ROCHESTER TOWN PLANNING SCHEME.

*Interim Development Order.*

**BY** virtue of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1961*, and of every power enabling it in that behalf, the Shire of Rochester (hereinafter referred to as the Responsible Authority) having commenced the preparation of a Planning Scheme in accordance with the said Act on the 3rd day of June, 1965, hereby makes the following Interim Development Order for the purpose of regulating, restricting, restraining or prohibiting the use or development of any land or the erection, construction or carrying out of any buildings or works, that is to say:—

1. Except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the Responsible Authority, no person shall use, subdivide or otherwise develop any land or erect, construct or carry out any buildings or works on any land within the areas described in the First and Second Schedules hereto.

2. After the coming into operation of this Interim Development Order:—

(a) No person shall subdivide into allotments any land in that part of the Shire of Rochester described in the First Schedule hereto except in accordance with the provisions of a permit issued by the Responsible Authority.

(b) No person shall subdivide any land in that part of the Shire of Rochester described in the Second Schedule hereto into allotments having an area of less than 20 acres.

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of clause 2 (b) hereof the Responsible Authority may permit a parcel of land lesser in area than is prescribed to be excised for the purpose of:—

- (a) increasing the area of an existing allotment;
- (b) erecting one only additional dwelling-house;
- (c) erecting a hall, church and building used principally for religious purposes;
- (d) erecting a school and buildings used principally for educational purposes;
- (e) erecting a utility service structure, depot or works, constructed by a Government Department or public authority; or
- (f) any use or development or the carrying out of any building or works which the Responsible Authority deems fit.

4. Every application for a permit under the provisions of this Order shall be made on the prescribed form, copies of which may be obtained from the office of the Responsible Authority at the Shire Office, Rochester.

5. Nothing in this Interim Development Order shall prevent:—

- (a) the continuance of the use of any land or any existing building or works which was or were being lawfully used immediately before the coming into operation of this Order;
- (b) any dealing or the registration of any dealing with any land in a subdivision of which a plan has been sealed by the Council of the Shire of Rochester, pursuant to section 569 of the *Local Government Act 1958*, before the coming into operation of this Order.

## FIRST SCHEDULE.


ROAD DISCONTINUED—CITY OF COBURG.

WHEREAS it is provided in section 528 (2) of the Local Government Act, as amended, that where a road (whether or not a public highway but not being a road set out on land of the Crown) or any part thereof is not required for public use the Governor in Council on the request of the Council of the Municipality in which such road is situated made not less than one month after publishing in a newspaper generally circulating in the district and posting to the registered proprietor (if any) of the land and any person known to have an interest in the land notice of intention to make such a request may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* direct that such road or part shall be discontinued and thereupon such road or part shall be discontinued accordingly.

And whereas the Council of the City of Coburg has requested that the Governor in Council direct that Steel-street, Coburg, be discontinued and not less than one month previously has published in a newspaper generally circulating in the district and posted to the registered proprietor of the land in the road and to all persons known to have an interest in the said road notice of intention to make such request.

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, hereby directs:

- (a) that the said road, which is shown by hachure on the plan hereunder, shall be discontinued;
- (b) that notwithstanding such discontinuance the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works shall continue to have and possess the same right title power authority or interest in or in relation to the land shown by hachure on the said plan as it had or possessed prior to such discontinuance with respect to or in connexion with any pipes laid or erected in on or over such land for the purposes of drainage or sewerage;

LIMITATION OF USE OF GENERAL VALUATION—SOUTH YARRA WARD—CITY OF PRAHRAN.
