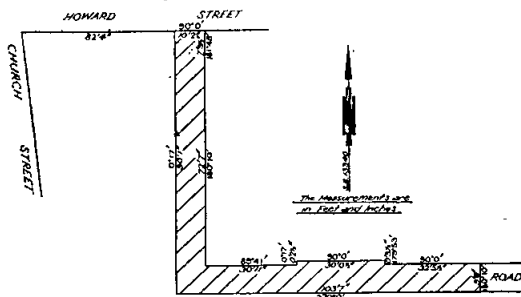

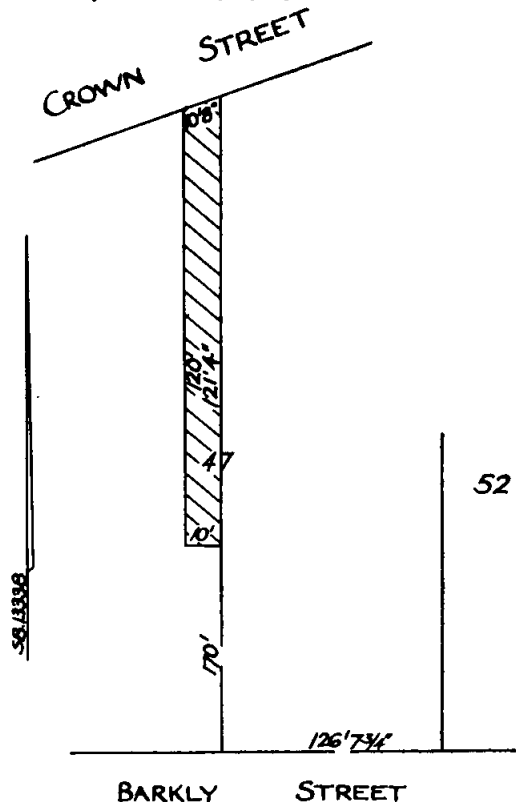

DECLARATION OF A DEVIATION FROM THE DAYLESFORD-TRENTHAM ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF GLENLYON.

WHEREAS by sections 21 and 58 of the *Country Roads Act* 1958 (No. 6229) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Act has by Resolution declared a

Resolution for Declaration of a Deviation of a Main Road under the Country Roads Act.

DECLARATION OF A DEVIATION FROM THE SOUTH GIPPSLAND HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF KORUMBURRA.

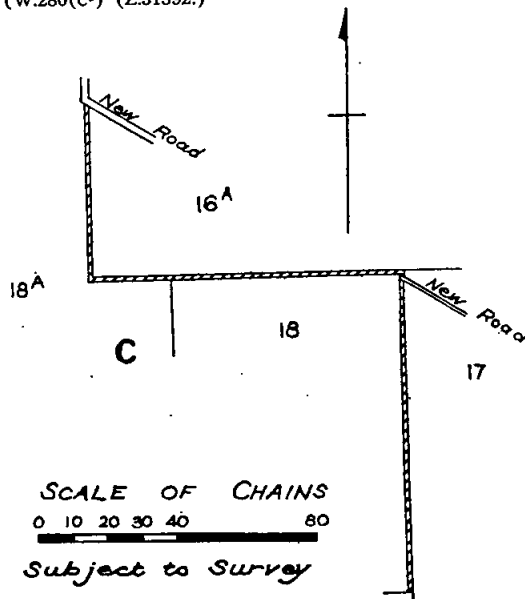
