By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Proclamation made on the thirty-first day of August, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-five, under part I of the *Motor Boating Act 1961*, the National Parks Authority was appointed to be the Authority under the said Act in respect of all waters contained within the Mount Eccles National Park:

And whereas the National Parks Authority has recommended that the use of the waters of the Mount Eccles National Park be prohibited for motor boating:

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the provisions of section 4 of the *Motor Boating Act 1961* and all other powers me thereunto enabling, do hereby prohibit the use of the waters contained within the Mount Eccles National Park for motor boating.

By-Law No. 9.

Rating By-Law for the Year 1965.

THE Dumbalk Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of its powers conferred by the *Water Acts*, doth hereby make a rate of three shillings in the pound on the net annual valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Dumbalk Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than thirty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building be less than twenty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1965, and ending on the 31st day of December, 1965, and shall be payable on the 16th day of December 1965, at the office of the Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of two shillings per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied to any property not rated by the Trust shall be by agreement and at the rate of four shillings per 1,000 gallons, and water in excess of 125,000 gallons at the rate of two shillings per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

DISTRICTS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following General Rates are hereby made under the provisions of the Water Acts, and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of all lands within the Kerang North-West Lakes Waterworks District, and within the respective Divisions of the Mallee, Northern Mallee, Upper Wimmera and Wimmera, Waterworks Districts, except within any Urban District thereof:—

For the supply of water for the domestic and ordinary use of persons dwelling upon such lands, and for watering cattle or other stock—

(1) Of all lands in the Kerang North-West Lakes Waterworks District—General Rates of such amounts in the pound of the unimproved capital value of such lands as are contained in column 2 opposite the name of the said Waterworks District in column 1 of the Schedule hereto.

(2A) Of all lands in the First Division of the Mallee, Northern Mallee, Upper Wimmera and Wimmera Waterworks Districts, being the lands included within the red border on the plans of such Districts, signed and sealed by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, and lodged at the office of such Commission at Melbourne, excepting and excluding all lands in the Second Division of the respective Waterworks Districts as shown stippled black on the aforesaid plans, excepting and excluding all lands in the Third Division of the respective Waterworks Districts as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plans, and excepting and excluding all lands in the Fourth Division (in respect of which no rate is made or levied) of the respective Waterworks Districts as shown coloured grey on the aforesaid plans—General Rates of such amounts in the pound of the unimproved capital value of such lands, as are contained in column 2 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts in column 1 of the Schedule hereto,

with minimum amounts of General Rate in respect of lands (excepting Crown lands held under annual grazing licence which are either not supplied with water or which are not part of a holding which is supplied) in such First Division of each respective Waterworks District as are contained in column 3 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts in column 1 of the said Schedule.

(2B) Of all lands in the Second Division of the respective Waterworks Districts as shown stippled black on the aforesaid plans—General Rates of such amounts in the pound of the unimproved capital value of such lands, as are contained in column 4 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts in column 1 of the said Schedule, with minimum amounts of General Rate in respect of lands (excepting Crown lands held under annual grazing licence which are either not supplied with water or which are not part of a holding which is supplied) in such Second Division of each respective Waterworks District as are contained in column 3 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts in column 1 of the said Schedule.

(2C) Of all lands in the Third Division of the respective Waterworks Districts as shown coloured brown on the aforesaid plans—General Rates of such amounts in the pound of the unimproved capital value of such lands, as are contained in column 5 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts in column 1 of the said Schedule, with minimum amounts of General Rate in respect of lands (excepting Crown lands held under annual grazing licence which are either not supplied with water or which are not part of a holding which is supplied) in such Third Division of each respective Waterworks District as are contained in column 3 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts in column 1 of the said Schedule.

2. Such Rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the 1st day of July, 1965, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1966, and shall be payable on the 29th day of October, 1965, at the office of the State

Rivers and Water Supply Commission at the place mentioned in column 6 opposite the name of the respective Waterworks Districts in column 1 of the said Schedule.

3. Interest will be chargeable on all Rates remaining unpaid for a period of six months from the date such Rates become payable.

4. For making and levying such Rates the value of the lands in the respective Waterworks Districts set out in

the valuations made in accordance with the provisions of the Water Acts, and adopted by the said Commission on the 11th day of October, 1965, shall be deemed and taken to be the rateable value of such lands.

5. Such person or persons as the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said Rates.

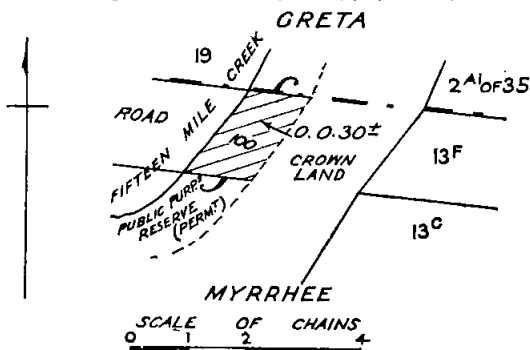


2 SCALE OF CHAINS 2

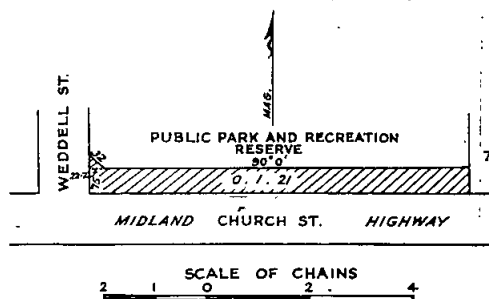

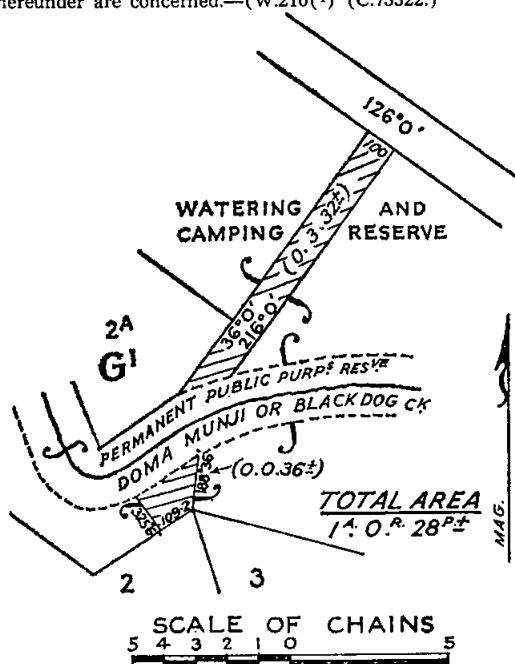

"Council" means the Council of the City of Dandenong;

2. No person shall leave standing or permit or suffer to be left standing any caravan on any street or road for a period exceeding 24 hours;

3. No person shall place or permit or suffer to be placed any caravan on any private property (other than for the purpose of sale or hire or the storing or parking of the same) without the consent in writing of the Council;

4. (1) No person shall occupy any caravan placed on any private property without the consent in writing of the Council;

(2) Every person applying for such consent shall make application in writing to the Council and supply such information as the Council may reasonably require.

(3) The Council may grant or refuse the application as it sees fit.

(4) If the Council grants the application then the permit to issue as a result shall be—

(a) for a period not exceeding 90 days;

(b) absolutely conditional upon proper sanitation facilities to the satisfaction of the Health Inspector to the Council being at all times available for the use of the occupant.

(5) In the event of such sanitation facilities at any time ceasing to be so available then any permit granted under sub-clause (1) hereof shall be immediately cancelled on service of the holder of such permit of a notice under the signature of the Health Inspector that such facilities have ceased to be available.

5. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 or more than £20 and to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order is made by any Court.

6. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the

City of Dandenong except such areas as are registered with the Council as camping areas under the provisions of Section 221 of the *Health Act 1958*.

- (a) using operating or playing any instrument; or
- (b) using operating or working any amplifier or similar device.

5. All premises within the municipal district in or upon which any business manufacture trade or industry is carried on shall be so used or controlled by the owner of any such business manufacture trade or industry as to prevent the emission of objectionable noises therefrom at unreasonable times.

6. No person shall use or permit to be used any premises in such a manner that unreasonable noises are made or permitted to be made thereon or emitted therefrom at unreasonable times.

7. This by-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Dandenong.

8. Any person guilty of a wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this by-law shall be liable to a penalty of not less than £5 nor more than £20 and to a further penalty of not more than £5 for each day on which such offence is continued after a conviction or order of any Court.

Division 1 of the *Local Government Act 1958* and numbered 458 for preserving good order and decency in buildings belonging to the Corporation or under the control and management of the Council, and for preventing damage to such buildings and to their fittings and furniture.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1958*, and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf the Council of the City of Melbourne ORDERS as follows:—

1. This By-law may be cited as the “City of Melbourne Good Order in Buildings By-law 1965”.

2. In this By-law unless the context otherwise requires:—

“authorized” means authorized by the Council, a Committee of the Council, an officer of the Corporation empowered by the Council for the purpose either generally or in any particular case or by virtue of his position, or, in the case of a workman (whether an officer or an employee) employed by the Corporation or by a contractor, a firm or a public authority doing work for or on behalf of the Corporation, by the requirements of work being done by him on a building;

“building” means a building belonging to the Corporation or under the control and management of the Council;

“City” means the City of Melbourne;

“Corporation” means the Corporation of the City of Melbourne;

“Council” means the Council of the City of Melbourne;

“fire-prevention appliance” means any appliance, fixture, machinery, plant or thing (whether part of or attached or fixed to or placed in any building) used or intended to be used for the purpose of controlling, extinguishing, preventing, or preventing the extension of fire; and includes, without affecting the generality of the foregoing, any hose, hydrant, portable fire extinguisher, sprinkler or tap.

Words importing the masculine gender include the feminine, and the singular number includes the plural and the plural the singular.

3. No person shall in any building—

- (a) behave in a disorderly, indecent, insulting, offensive, quarrelsome, riotous, threatening or violent manner; or
- (b) use any abusive, indecent, insulting, obscene or threatening words.

4. No person shall enter or remain in any building while drunk.

5. No person shall spit onto any fitting, floor, furniture or wall of any building.

6. No person shall cut, deface, mark, scribble on or write on or otherwise damage or injure any fitting, furniture or part of any building.

7. No person shall remove from any building any fitting, furniture or part of the building or any Corporation property, unless authorized to do so.

8. No person shall in any building climb, climb onto, sit on or stand on any balustrade, coping, counter, fire-prevention appliance, flagpole, gable, gate, gutter, ledge, light fitting, machinery, parapet, partition, pipe, plant, rail, roof, verandah, wall or window sill, or stand on any chair, seat or table, unless authorized to do so.

9. No person shall climb, climb onto, sit on or stand on any exterior gate, light fitting, pipe, verandah, wall, window sill or other part of any building, unless authorized to do so.

10. No person shall use any stair handrail in any building otherwise than for support or assistance by hand in ascending or descending the stair.

11. No person shall damage, destroy or injure any fire-prevention appliance on or in any building; nor shall any person in any way interfere with any such fire-prevention appliance otherwise than to use it for the purpose of controlling, extinguishing, preventing or preventing the extension of fire or, if he is authorized to do so, to renew, replace or service the fire-prevention appliance.

12. No person shall remain in any building after being requested by any officer of the Corporation to leave it.

13. No person shall drive or bring any vehicle into any building or the courtyard, the driveway or the grounds of any building, unless authorized to do so.

14. Any contravention of any of the foregoing clauses by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

15. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City.

16. The provisions of this By-law shall be in addition to and not in derogation from the provisions of any other by-law or any regulations of the City or of any regulations made under the *Land Act 1958* that relate to buildings.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the residential, industrial and commercial zones and reserves for public purposes as described in the Shire of Swan Hill Robinvale Town Planning Scheme 1958, and unless exempted by Council shall apply to every house, building and premises therein.

3. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any premises and includes the owner, occupier or any person having the management or control thereof.

“Refuse” includes all wastes (except sewage, manure, hot ashes and garden wastes) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building or premises.

“Approved receptacle” means a suitable holder approved and supplied by the Council, at the Proprietor's expense, to which is securely attached a container approved and supplied by the Council and erected in such a manner that there is a clearance of at least 42" from ground level to the bottom of the ring of the holder.

4. The Proprietor of every house, building or premises shall keep and maintain at all times upon his premises, a properly erected approved receptacle in which he shall, from time to time, cause to be deposited refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building or premises.

5. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle.

6. The Proprietor shall cause the approved receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and good condition.

7. The Proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse the container to be detached from the holder and adequately closed and be deposited close to and inside of the entrance to such house, building or premises from the street, lane or right-of-way on which such house, building or premises abut, in order that the container may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorised or employed in that behalf by the Council.

8. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such container in or upon any street, lane or right-of-way, except in the case of business premises built on the street

alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such container could be placed for collection and emptying.

9. The contractor or person authorised or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the placing (without spilling any of the contents) of such container or containers directly into a suitable vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days, not being less than once a week, as may be appointed by the Council, and for the removal of such refuse in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for closing the gate or gates of the premises from which such container is taken.

10. If any refuse is authorised to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and the contractor or the person or persons authorised and employed by the Council shall comply with any directions of the Council regarding the proper and adequate disposal of such refuse.

11. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane or passage other than in a tip established by the Council.

12. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land, other than in a tip established by the Council.

13. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty Pounds and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five Pounds.
